- (3) As to whether further and better police protection throughout the State or any part thereof is necessary; and, if so, what would be the most effective means for ensuring such protection.

PENAL STAFF.—EXAMINATIONS.

14A. Warders, on probation, before having their appointments confirmed, shall pass an examination in—

- (a) English;
- (b) Arithmetic; and
- (c) Rules and Regulations relating to Penal Establishments and Reformatories.

The standard required in English shall not exceed that required for Grade VIII. of elementary schools, and in arithmetic that required for Grade VI. of elementary schools.

To pass the examination a candidate must obtain at least fifty per centum (50 per cent.) of the marks available in each paper.

A candidate possessing a merit certificate, or approved equivalent, will be exempted from the examination in English and arithmetic.

**NOTICE OF INTENTION RE BOATS AND NETS ON THE WERRIBEE RIVER AND WATERS CLOSED TO NETTING AT ITS MOUTH.**

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a proclamation providing that trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, or any boats having attached thereto or on board or in tow any such trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, shall not, from sunset until sunrise on every day throughout the year, be left or allowed to remain in or upon the waters of the Werribee River, and the waters at the mouth thereof, in which the use of nets is prohibited by Proclamation made the 9th day of April, 1919, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th day of April, 1919.

**RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE TOWN OF MILDURA (FORMERLY PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF MILDURA).**

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, the Honorable Sir Leo Finn Bernard Cussen, as Administrator for the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the municipal district of the Town of Mildura, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke, in so far as they relate to the area which was formerly portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Mildura, but is now the municipal district of the Town of Mildura, the regulations made on the ninth day of November, 1915, directing that all shops—

(Except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the municipal district of the Shire of Mildura, shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

**RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE SHIRE OF MILDURA.**
