VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

REPORT OF THE BOARD APPOINTED TO INQUIRE INTO AND REPORT UPON THE CANTERBURY RAILWAY ACCIDENT.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 27th day of February, 1924, directed that the Report of the Board appointed to inquire into the Canterbury railway accident be published, and such Report appears hereunder.

We have the honour to present to the Governor in Council our Report in connexion with the above matter.

The circumstances surrounding the accident were that on 24th December, 1923, a passenger train, with a full load of passengers, left Fern Tree Gully at 5.56 a.m., and when approaching Canterbury Railway Station on a down grade and on a curve of 20 chains radius, a wheel of the engine climbed a rail, and later the other wheels of the engine left the rails, crossed the down track, and the train was pulled up just short of the Canterbury platform.

As to the cause of the accident, we regret that our Report may be considered unsatisfactory, inasmuch as we have been unable to determine such cause.

We find that both the rolling-stock and permanent-way were in good order, and provided conditions well within the limits of tolerance recognised by standard railway practice, and, therefore, to greater degree within the limits of safety when operated under the conditions prescribed by the Regulations.

It was, however, suggested that the speed of the train must have been excessive, and that the accident was probably due to such excessive speed.

While it may have been that at the point of derailment the speed exceeded that prescribed by the departmental instructions (viz., 20 miles per hour), nevertheless, although there was a conflict of evidence on this point, it was not proved to our satisfaction that such speed exceeded the pace within the safe limit for curves similar to the one in question, or that the accident was due to such cause.

In these circumstances we have to report that we are unable to determine the cause of the said accident, and we do not feel able to make any recommendations that would be of material assistance to the Railway Department.

We would like to express our appreciation of the assistance afforded to us by Dr. Ellis, who had been appointed to assist the Board; and who displayed marked industry and ability in presenting to us all the material at his disposal.

TONGALA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924 WITHIN THE TONGALA URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Tongala Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1924, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates and charges to be paid half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1924. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum in advance on 1st January, 1924:—

1. On every house or tenement, vacant or unoccupied land according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement or vacant or unoccupied land during the said year, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation, with a minimum of Twenty shillings.

2. Water supplied to Government Departments, police station, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special arrangement.

3. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, the charge for every one thousand (1,000) gallons, or portion of same, to be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand (1,000) gallons, with minimum of Sixpence for any one tank or load.

4. Supplies of water for any purposes not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.

5. Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an unauthorized manner, or who does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises, the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be re-connected to the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of eight (8) o'clock p.m. and six (6) o'clock a.m. For the purposes of conserving the supply during dry weather, the Trust, in its discretion, may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN LANDS RESERVED FOR MUNICIPAL PURPOSES AT NORTH MELBOURNE, AND KNOWN AS "CLAYTON RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the regulations following in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 20th January, 1890, for Municipal purposes in the Town of North Melbourne (now included in the City of Melbourne), and hereinafter designated "Children's Playground."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Children's Playground shall not be used after sunset.
2. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the Children's Playground, or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents and other attendants shall be at liberty notwithstanding to enter the Children's Playground to watch over children who are in their charge.
3. The swings or other appliances erected in the playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.
4. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
5. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Playground.
6. All paper, fruit, peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Council of the City of Melbourne for the purpose.
7. Every person in the Children's Playground shall obey the directions of any officer of the said Council in respect of his or her conduct therein.
8. The said Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.
9. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playground, or bring any animal into the same.

10. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the said Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of these Regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A CERTAIN RESERVE FOR PARK, GARDENS, AND CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND, KNOWN AS "POWLETT RESERVE," IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE, AND THE PRESERVATION OF GOOD ORDER AND DECENCY THEREIN.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant entered in the register book, volume 4505, folio 900983, the surface and down to a depth of 50 feet below the surface of all that piece of land in the State of Victoria, being section 26, at East Melbourne, in the said city, was granted to the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne, to provide a site for park, gardens, and children's playground. And whereas by section 182 of the No. 57.—3455.—4

Land Act 1915 power is given to the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne (as trustees of the said land), with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of such land, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein. Now therefore the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called the Council), in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby in respect of such part of the said land as is set apart for and hereinafter designated "Children's Playground" make the regulations following:—

Regulations.

1. The Children's Playground shall not be used after sunset.
2. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the Children's Playground, or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch over children who are in their charge.
3. The swings or other appliances erected in the playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.
4. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
5. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Playground.
6. All paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Council for the purpose.
7. Every person in the Children's Playground shall obey the directions of any officer of the Council in respect of his or her conduct therein.
8. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.
9. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playground, or bring any animal into the same.
10. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of these regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.
11. Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence, and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff or Crown lands officer, or officer or servant of the Council, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BOROUGH OF CLUNES.

BY-LAW No. 30.

A By-law of the Borough of Clunes made under the Health Acts, and numbered 30, for prescribing the fees to be charged for the registration of premises and for the renewal of such registration, or for any transfer of registration thereof, pursuant to the said Acts.
