Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 17 (TOBACCONISTS).

Note.—This Determination on the 10th March, 1924, applied to the following parts of Victoria, viz.:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol,

accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in a Tobacconist's shop" has made the following Determination, namely:—

- (5) Time Rate.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall or each hour worked up to 24 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum. (6) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or
- (7) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, Good Friday, and Christmas Day, and time and a half the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
