Factories and Shops Acts.

SHOPS BOARD No. 15 (GROCERS).

Note.—This Determination on the 8th March, 1924, applied to the following parts of Victoria, viz.:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN THE COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS.

The above-mentioned Appeals, coming on for hearing by this Court on the 11th, 12th, 14th, and 27th February, 1924, and this day. Upon Reading the Notices of Appeals, and upon Hearing what was alleged by Mr. Stanley Lewis, of Counsel, and the evidence of witnesses in support of the employers' Appeal, and by Mr. Maurice Blackburn, of Counsel and evidence of the witnesses on behalf of the employees and the other evidence for and against the appeals: This Court poth Order and Determine:—

(1) That on the 8th day of March, 1924, the Determination of the Shops Board No. 15 (Grocers), dated the 26th September, 1923, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination as to the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the business of a grocer, including a seller of tea.
