PART III. OF ADMINISTRATION AND PROBATE ACT TO APPLY TO THE COLONY OF STRAITS SETTLEMENTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 58 of an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His present Majesty King George V., intituled "An Act to consolidate the Law relating to the Administration of the Estates of Deceased Persons," and numbered 2611, it is provided that the Governor in Council, on being satisfied that the Legislature of any British Possession has made adequate provision for the recognition in that Possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court of Victoria, may, by Proclamation, declare that Part III. of the *Administration and Probate Act 1915* of the State of Victoria shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the Proclamation, apply to that Possession, and that thereupon, while such Proclamation is in force, the said Part III. shall apply accordingly: And whereas I, the Governor in Council of the said State of Victoria, being satisfied that the Legislature of the Colony of Straits Settlements, a British Possession within the meaning of the said recited Act, has, under Ordinance No. 102 (Civil Procedure Code), promulgated by the Governor in Council of the Colony of Straits Settlements, made adequate provision for the recognition in that Possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court of Victoria, do now therefore, by and with the advice of the said Executive Council, hereby by this my Proclamation declare that Part III. of the said *Administration and Probate Act 1915* of the State of Victoria shall, without exception or modification, apply to the Colony of Straits Settlements aforesaid, and that henceforth while this Proclamation is in force the said Part III. shall apply accordingly.

Marine Act 1915.

AMENDMENT OF THE PASSENGER (SAILING AND MOTOR) BOAT REGULATIONS 1915.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Marine Act 1915*, to make and to amend Regulations for the licensing of all boats plying for hire or let out for hire or valuable consideration in any port in Victoria, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of the Governor in Council of the said State, doth make the amended Regulations following (that is to say) :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1924" and shall take effect as on and from the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be read and construed with "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1915", hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations".

2. There shall be substituted for sub-clause (b) of clause 22 of the Principal Regulations, as amended by "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1921", the following new regulation :—

"(b) A motor boat plying on any river or on any lake or other land-locked water only must be furnished with two (2) approved life buoys, an approved life belt for every person licensed to be carried on board including the person or persons in charge and with a lantern similar to that described in subdivision (a) hereof unless in the case of a motor boat intended to ply in shallow waters exclusively the Board in its discretion think fit to dispense with the obligation to provide all or any of such furnishings."

3. Clause 7 of "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1922" is hereby revoked and in substitution therefor it is ordained that after clause 22 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the new clause following :—

"22A. *Buooyancy*.—No motor boat other than one intended to ply in shallow water exclusively in respect of which boat the Marine Board has determined the requirements hereby prescribed are unnecessary, shall be licensed under these Regulations unless such boat is provided with internal buoyancy fittings equal to 25 per centum in excess of the weight of the propelling machinery, ballast and all equipments of a non-buoyant nature, either in the form of muntz metal or copper casings, or enclosed water-tight air spaces. Sealed oil drums secured in position to the boat will according to their capacity nevertheless be accepted as portion or the whole of the buoyancy fittings required, provided they are painted or otherwise prevented from rusting and are readily removable for periodical inspection and testing."

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1924 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

No. 1. On every house, or tenement on which a dwelling house is erected of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

No. 2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Ten shillings.

No. 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds, a rate of Ten per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.

No. 4. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds shall be made.

No. 5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and Sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such provision as may be deemed necessary.

No. 8. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 9. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance, on the 13th day of February, 1924.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 15.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) For every house, building, or tenement, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house, building, or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound five shillings and sixpence per annum and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer owning or occupying one house, building, or tenement only shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation.
- (b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.
- (c) And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings, or tenements within the Waterworks District to each of which water meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of the said houses, buildings, or tenements (and in all cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure), shall for that part or the whole of the year, as the case may be, during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings, or tenements, but for no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of the total sum of the municipal valuations of all the said houses, buildings, or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantity be exceeded the excess shall be paid for by measure at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) For water supplied by measure a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid. Provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 17,000 gallons per annum, and that the minimum charge for Government premises supplied with water shall be Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by measure to all consumers outside the water area and Urban District, a rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum charge shall be Three pounds per annum.

2. The rates and charges herein are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1924, and shall be payable in one sum on the 13th day of February, 1924.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rates.

SHIRE OF RIPON.

BY-LAW NO. 28.—MAKING AND LEVYING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

PART I.

1. A rate for year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of

the *Local Government Act 1915*, within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council, according to the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes other than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

PART II.

The Beaufort Water Supply.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water) save as hereinafter provided, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden upon a tenement and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement. For each water trough (public) supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings; for every steam boiler supplied, the sum of Fifteen shillings. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made.
- (b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and the Goldfields Reservoir, situate to the north and south respectively of the Township of Beaufort, and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

PART III.

The Joint Water Supply.

4. The rates and charges hereinafter mentioned are those which the owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the joint water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council and which is supplied by the Council with water from the joint water supply, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

5. The "Joint Water Supply" means the race running from the springs at Mt. Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

PART IV.

The Waterloo Water Supply.

6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of One pound per annum.

7. "The Waterloo Water Supply" means "The Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about five miles in a northerly direction from the Township of Beaufort.

PART V.

8. Such rate as aforesaid is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of October, 1923, and ending on the thirtieth day of September, 1924, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the Water Acts.

9. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Donald, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the Riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

(a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

(a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and

(b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—

(a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and

(b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole Riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

(a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and

(b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the Shire of Donald of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

DECLARATION OF DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS UNDER THE DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS ACT IN THE SHIRE OF BALLAN.

WHEREAS by the resolution set out below and dated the eighteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, the Country Roads Board, incorporated under the Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635), being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land (whether alienated from the Crown or not) by providing access to a railway station or to a main road leading to a railway station, and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Developmental Roads Act 1918 (No. 2944), declared such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Developmental Roads Act 1918. And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the Government Gazette confirm such resolution, whereupon any road or part thereof mentioned in such resolution shall be a developmental road. And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby confirm such resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such resolution of the Country Roads Board developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Developmental Roads Act 1918.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop the area of land by providing access to a railway station or to a main road leading to a railway station acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Developmental Roads Act 1918 (No. 2944) doth by this resolution hereby declare such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Developmental Roads Act 1918.

1. For the purpose of these Regulations

"Export" means to forward or export from Victoria to any other part of the Commonwealth, and includes causing, suffering, or attempting to so forward or export or deliver for export as aforesaid, and "Exported" has a corresponding meaning.

"Package" means any box, case, sack, or receptacle used or capable of being used or intended to be used for containing fruit or vegetables.

HANDLING, STACKING, LOADING, OR UNLOADING FRUIT AND VEGETABLES.

2. No person shall handle, stack, load, or unload any fruit or vegetables for export whereby, in the opinion of an inspector, such fruit or vegetables are subjected to shock or pressure sufficient to bruise or injure such fruit or vegetables.

PENALTIES.

3. The following penalties are hereby prescribed as those to be inflicted for a contravention of these Regulations (that is to say):—

(a) In the case of a first offence, any sum not exceeding One pound.

(b) In the case of a second or subsequent offence, any sum not exceeding Two pounds.

A By-law of the City of Ballarat, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 105, for the purpose of adopting portion of Part X. of the 13th Schedule to the said Act and for repealing By-law No. 87 of the City of Ballarat and part of By-law No. 38 of the Town of Ballarat East.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballarat order as follow:—

1. That the following provisions of Part X. of the 13th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915* be and are hereby adopted in and for the said city:—

Part X.—Carriage of persons and goods—

- Subdivision (1)—Passenger vehicles.
- Subdivision (2)—Carts and carters.
- Subdivision (4)—Porters.

2. That By-law No. 87 of the City of Ballarat be and is hereby repealed.

3. That the following words in By-law No. 38 of the Town of Ballarat East be and are hereby repealed:—

Part X.—Carriage of persons and goods—

- Subdivision (1)—Passenger vehicles.
- Subdivision (2)—Carts and carters.
- Subdivision (4)—Porters.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Ballarat.

CITY OF RICHMOND.

REGULATION No. 32.

A Regulation of the City of Richmond, made under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, for keeping order in the carriage and footways, and public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Police Offences Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond make the following Rules and Regulations:—

Regulation of Traffic Generally.

The driver of a vehicle or motor car upon any street and the rider of a horse or other animal upon any street shall except in so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause:—

1. Keep the same as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side.

2. When meeting a vehicle, motor car, tramcar, horse, or pedestrian, keep on the left or near side of the street.

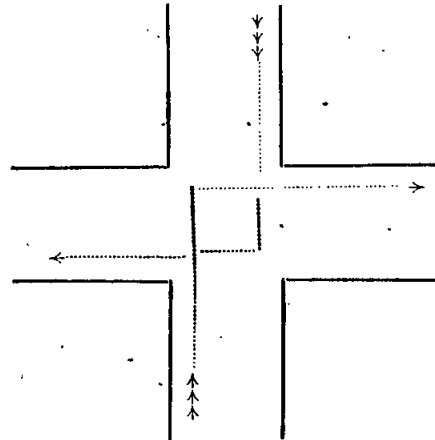
3. When passing by any vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian, going in the same direction go on the right or off side of such vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian.

4. When passing by a tram car going in the same direction pass the same on the left or near side thereof.

5. Before stopping or turning round in any street or turning from one street into another give notice of his intention so to do by holding up his whip or his hand so that the same may be seen by any person immediately following and (in the case of the driver of a vehicle or a motor car) upon stopping so place his vehicle or motor car as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle or motor car he shall upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or motor car or by any member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council, remove his vehicle or motor car so as to permit such other vehicle or motor car to pass, and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic he shall remove his vehicle or motor car so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

6. Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or

near side of the street upon which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left hand side of the street which he is entering, as shown in the subjoined diagram.



7. When drawing up at any street intersection to await the signal of the Police Officer or Officer of the Council directing the traffic to proceed, if desirous of turning to the left into an intersecting street, stand as near as practicable to the kerb.

8. No person shall ride any horse or drive any vehicle or motor car along any street in such manner or in such order that more than two horses, vehicles, or motor cars are travelling side by side in the same direction. The foregoing provisions of this clause shall not apply to horses, vehicles, or motor cars which form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.

9. No person shall ride any horse or other animal, or drive or impel any vehicle or motor car upon any footway. Provided, however, that a bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.

Pedestrian Traffic.

10. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his right hand side of the footway, and shall, when meeting or overtaking any person, pass on the left hand side of such person.

11. No pedestrian shall cross any street except at right angles to the kerb line, and every such pedestrian shall, on leaving the footway, proceed by the shortest line from the point on the kerb line from which he left the footway to a point on the other kerb line of the street immediately opposite the first mentioned point.

12. In this Regulation unless the context otherwise requires—

“City” means the City of Richmond.

“Council” means the Council of the City of Richmond.

“Driver” means any person in charge of a vehicle or motor car.

“Footway” includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the city habitually used by pedestrians, and not by vehicular traffic.

“Horse” includes mule and donkey.

“Motor Car” means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

“Rider” means any person in charge of a horse.

“Street” includes every highway, road, carriageway, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the city other than a footway.

“Vehicle” means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.

Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

Resolution for passing this Regulation agreed to by the Council of the City of Richmond this 29th day of January, 1924.
