Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE STATIONERY BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 18th February, 1924, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

- (a) wholly or partially preparing or manufacturing stationery or articles (other than paper flowers or paper patterns), made of paper, cardboard, or similar materials:
 - (b) Brushing,
Calandering,
Cutting from reel, or
Surface coating
- } Paper, cardboard, or similar materials

but not including any process subject to the jurisdiction of the

- Cardboard Box Trade Board,
- Paper Bag Trade Board,
- Paper Trade Board, or
- Perambulator Board,

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(3) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
8 a.m.	12.30 p.m. on Saturday or the day on which the half-holiday is usually observed.
8 a.m.	6 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

(4) OVERTIME.—The rate for all work done within the hours of beginning and ending work in excess of 48 hours in any week, or for work done outside such hours of beginning and ending shall be—

Males	Time and a third.
Females	Time and a half.

(5) TIME RATE.—That any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours, be paid at the ordinary wages rate, with an addition of thirty-three and a-third per centum.

(6) SPECIAL RATE.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(8) **PIECE-WORK WHICH MAY BE FIXED BY AN EMPLOYER.**—The Board determines, under the provisions of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which this Board has not fixed piece-work prices, but has fixed a minimum wage; provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

20. *The Registrar to Receive all Fees, Fines, &c.*—The Registrar shall receive all fees, fines, subscriptions, donations, and other moneys which may be imposed or become due or payable under the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1915* or under these Regulations, for which he shall give a printed receipt and no other for the same, retaining the block counterpart of such receipt. 21. *Form of Register for Veterinary Surgeons.*—The Registrar shall keep *The Veterinary Register of Victoria* in the form prescribed in the second Schedule to the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1915*.

22. *Signatures of Registered Veterinary Surgeons.*—The Registrar shall keep and maintain a signature-book, containing the signature of each and every registered veterinary surgeon and shall produce such book for the inspection of the Returning Officer appointed by the Board on the day of the holding of each and every election provided for by these Regulations.

TREASURER.

23. *Appointment of Honorary Treasurer.*—The Board shall from time to time appoint one of their number as Honorary Treasurer, who may be required to find security in the sum of One hundred pounds sterling in some fidelity or guarantee society, the premiums upon which shall be recouped to him by the Board.

24. *Duties of Treasurer.*—It shall be the duty of the Honorary Treasurer to receive all moneys from the Registrar, and to lodge the same in some bank appointed by the Board, to the credit of an account, headed "Veterinary Board of Victoria", and to pay by cheque, signed by the Treasurer and two members of the Board, such accounts as the Board may from time to time order by resolution, which shall specify the sums of money to be paid, and to whom.

25. *Quarterly Statement of Treasurer and Annual Balance-sheet.*—The Treasurer shall present to the Board a quarterly statement, showing the receipts and expenditure for the past quarter and he shall also, in the month of March in each year, prepare and present to the Board an annual balance-sheet showing the exact financial position of the affairs of the Board at the 31st December next preceding.

26. *Appointment of Auditor.*—The Board shall appoint, in the month of December in each year, an Auditor who shall hold office until the month of December in the following year, and the Board may pay out of the moneys accruing under the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1915* a fee of Two pounds two shillings to such Auditor. The Auditor shall inspect the books and accounts of the Board, and examine the annual balance-sheet prepared by the Treasurer, and shall certify to the same if correct.

FEES.

27. *Fees.*—The scale of fees specified in Schedule II. to these Regulations shall be those payable to the Registrar of the Board before registration, as provided by section 14 of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1915*, in lieu of, and in substitution for, the fees specified in the second Schedule to the said Act.

28. *Appropriation of Fees.*—The Board shall be at liberty, out of any moneys coming to its hands under the provisions of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1915*, or of these Regulations, to pay and discharge all costs, charges and expenses, debts, liabilities, and obligations incurred by it howsoever in connexion with framing these Regulations or carrying out the provisions of the said Act and Regulations, and all matters and things done thereunder.

Every application for registration shall be in the form of a declaration by the applicant, showing that he is entitled thereto under the provisions of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1915* supported by such corroborative evidence as the Board may in each case, in its absolute discretion, require. The application of a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons of Great Britain or of any college or school recognised by the Board shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule IV., and the application of any other person shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule V., and shall be supported by a declaration in the form prescribed in Schedule VI. to these Regulations, and every applicant shall, before registration, sign his name in the Registrar's signature-book hereinbefore referred to.

30. The veterinary colleges and schools whose certificates or diplomas of competency, as a veterinary surgeon will be recognised by the Board are the following:—

The University of Melbourne,
The University of Sydney,
The Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons of Great Britain,

and such other colleges and schools as may from time to time be recognised by the Board.

31. The Board shall, on approval of the application of a person entitled to registration under the said Act, and payment of the proper fees, grant and cause to be issued to him

a certificate of registration in the form specified in Schedule I. to these Regulations under the seal of the Board.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE FROM SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA AND ANNEXATION TO SHIRE OF BARRARBOOL.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2684, section 46), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Winchelsea described in the petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Winchelsea, and annexed to the Coast Riding of the Shire of Barrarbool.

Area described in petition—

Commencing at a point on the Coast at the mouth of the Angelsea River; thence northerly by that river to its junction with the Salt Creek; thence westerly by the Salt Creek to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 44, Parish of Wornhate, and the north-western angle of the Parish of Angahook; thence generally southerly by the western boundary of that parish to the north-western angle of allotment 21A of the said parish; thence westerly to the north-western angle of allotment 34, Parish of Bopnah; thence southerly by the western boundary of that allotment to the south-western angle of the said allotment; thence westerly, southerly, and easterly by allotment 30 to the south-western angle of allotment 31 of the said parish; thence generally southerly, south-westerly, and south-easterly to the mouth of the Stony Creek at the southern angle of allotment 5, Parish of Lorne; thence north-easterly along the sea coast to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that the area is, by reason of bad roads, remote and inaccessible from the head-quarters of the Shire of Winchelsea; that the resident ratepayers of the area have no community of interest with the rest of the Shire of Winchelsea; that the Council of the Shire of Barrarbool has to bear the whole of the municipal contribution towards the cost of construction and maintenance of the Main Road to Angelsea, which road bears the whole of the greatly increasing traffic to and from the area sought to be severed; that for the

above reasons the whole of the trade and business interests of the residents is directed towards Geelong by the main road referred to; and that it is considered that the municipal rates in the area sought to be severed should be paid to and collected by the Shire of Barrarbool, which has to provide the road facilities leading to the area, and not to the Shire of Winchelsea, which accepts no financial responsibility for same.

The petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Coast Riding of the Shire of Winchelsea, and annex such area to the Coast Riding of the Shire of Barrarbool.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the municipal district of the Borough of Echuca of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the fourteenth day of September, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1912, as amended by the Factories and Shops Acts Amendment Act 1914) within the municipal district of the Borough of Echuca shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF STRATHMERTON.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Act 1915, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Township of Strathmerton, within the municipal district of the Shire of Numurkah, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the fourteenth day of December, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within the Township of Strathmerton, within the municipal district of the Shire of Numurkah, shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF CASTLEMAINE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the Borough of Castlemaine, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) of the particular class or kind to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) The Regulation made on the sixth day of January, 1915, in so far as same relates to the closing hours of shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the Borough of Castlemaine, shall, from and after the date hereof, be and the same is hereby repealed.
- (2) All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the Borough of Castlemaine shall be closed in every week—
 - (a) on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, from the hour of Five o'clock in the evening;
 - (b) on Friday, from the hour of Six o'clock in the evening.

REGULATION OF HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS AND TOBACCONISTS' SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF MOE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the Shire of Narracan, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of each of the particular classes to be affected within the Township of Moe, in the said municipal district, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any hairdresser or of any tobacconist within the Township of Moe, within the municipal district of the Shire of Narracan, to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until Eight o'clock.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS.

CLAUSE 8 OF CHAPTER IX, REVOKED AND OTHER REGULATIONS MADE IN LIEU THEREOF.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the Government Gazette, from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: And whereas it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, if the Minister has certified that any manufacture, plant, process, or labour used in factories is dangerous to life or limb generally, may make such regulations as may be deemed necessary and reasonably practicable to decrease or prevent danger from such manufacture, plant, process, or labour: And whereas the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, has certified that the plant named in certain certificates dated respectively the 30th March, 1921, and the 31st day of March, 1924, is dangerous to life or limb generally: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited, as well as under all other powers by the said Acts him enabling in that behalf, doth by this Order revoke Clause 8 of Chapter IX., Miscellaneous (Guarding of Machinery), of the Regulations made on the twentieth day of February, 1923, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations regarding such dangerous plant, that is to say:—

REGULATION REGARDING CERTAIN DANGEROUS PLANT.
GUARDING MACHINERY.

Belts or Ropes.

The occupiers of all factories where belts or ropes are used for transmitting power shall take such steps—

- (a) as will prevent every belt or rope, when not transmitting power, from resting on any revolving shaft;
- (b) as will prevent any belt or rope from being joined or mended while the machinery is in motion, unless such belt or rope is suspended on a suitable and efficient perch during the whole of the time occupied in such joining or mending.

Chaff-cutting Machines.

The occupiers of all places where power-driven machines are used for cutting chaff shall equip each of such machines with—

- (a) a guard which will at all times cover the feed box for a distance of twenty-five (25) inches from the centre of the feed rollers; the height of this guard measured from the bottom of the feed box to the top of the guard shall not in any case exceed twenty (20) inches (inside measurement);
- (b) a reversing lever which must be carried over the top of the guard, in line with and three (3) inches above the edge of the guard nearest the operator.

Mincing Machines.

The occupiers of all factories in which power-driven Enterprise or similar mincing machines with open necks are used shall guard such machines in such a way as to prevent the hand of the person operating the machine reaching the worm knives.

Tannery (Shaving and Crop Rolling) Machines.

The occupiers of all factories used as tanneries shall guard—

- (a) all shaving machines used therein by either bringing down the cover and so adjusting it as to leave an opening between the cover and the knives of not more than five-sixteenths (5-16ths) of an inch when the roller is brought up to its working position, or by using Plain's automatic guard;
- (b) all crop-rolling machines used therein by means of a guard roller suspended on each side of the main roller. The bottom of the guard roller to be not more than one and a half (1½) inches above the top of the table and not less than nine (9) inches from the centre of the main roller to the centre of the guard roller.

WOOD-WORKING MACHINES.

(1) Chain Mortising Machines.

The occupiers of all factories in which chain mortising machines are used shall provide a guard to, as far as practicable, enclose the cutter chain.

(2) *Band Saws.*

The occupiers of all factories in which band saws (other than log saws and band re-sawing machines) are used shall guard same as follows:—

- (a) The rim and front of both top and bottom pulley shall be completely encased in sheet metal or other suitable material;
- (b) All portions of the blade shall be enclosed, except the portion of the blade between the table and the top guide.

(3) *Circular Saws.*

The occupiers of all factories in which circular saws (except saws which move towards the timber) are used shall so guard the top, back, and lower portion of each saw that accidental contact therewith will not be possible. The guards must conform to the following conditions:—

- (a) All guards shall be readily adjustable to the different sized saws used in the bench;
- (b) The top guard shall be kept as close to the top of the saw as is practicable;
- (c) The back guard shall at all times cover the back of the saw and extend from the top of the bench to the underside of the top guard, and at the bench level be not more than five-eighths of an inch distant from the saw teeth (this condition not to apply to firewood saws guarded with flat strap guard);
- (d) The portion of the saw beneath the bench shall (if not completely enclosed in a dust-collecting hood) be enclosed by means of boards or sheet iron; the enclosure must extend at least two inches below the saw teeth, and the opening therein through which the sawdust passes shall not exceed three inches in width;
- (e) Guards shall be kept in an efficient state, securely fixed, and may only be removed when the nature of the work renders their use impracticable.

(4) *Pendulum or Swinging Crosscut Saws.*

The occupiers of all factories in which pendulum or swinging crosscut saws are used shall guard same as follows:—

- (a) All teeth above the centre line shall be covered with a hood made of metal or other suitable material;
- (b) If the back of the bench is in such a position that operatives may come in contact with the saw, the back of the saw shall be completely enclosed;
- (c) A check chain shall be attached. The said chain shall be made of not less than a quarter-inch welded steel links, and be securely bolted at one end to the saw frame, and at the other end to a permanent fixture. It shall be of such a length that it will at all times prevent the projection of any portion of the saw past the front edge of the saw bench.

(5) *Surface Planing Machines.*

The occupiers of all factories in which wood-working surface planing machines, commonly known as buzzer planes, are used, shall—

- (a) fit circular head cutters to such wood-working surface planing machines in all cases where circular head cutters are not already fitted;
- (b) provide, adjust, and keep properly adjusted to such machines an improved automatic guard;
- (c) keep the edges of the opening in which the cutter head revolves adjusted as near together as possible consistent with the proper working of the machine.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

G. For all other scaffolding—40s.
