NOTICE TO MARINERS.—VICTORIA.

[No. 15 of 1925.]

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC ON ARRIVAL OF UNITED STATES FLEET.  
**T**HE following Port Rule is published for general information:—

Port of Port Phillip.

Regulation of traffic to provide for the safe navigation of the United States Fleet through the waters of the Port of Port Phillip on their arrival thereat:—

The inwards and outwards traffic through the entrance to Port Phillip and the South Channel within such port shall be suspended from about half-past Nine a.m. to Eleven a.m. on the 23rd July, 1925, while the Fleet is being navigated through such waters.

During the progress of the naval procession of the ships of the Fleet from the South Channel to an anchorage ground at the head of Port Phillip Bay no person shall cause or permit any vessel to obtrude on the course or break into the line of the procession. Persons in charge of vessels desiring to join the procession shall cause their ships to fall into line astern of the rear war-ship or other vessel that may have already formed into line in such procession.

Persons in charge of vessels are required to keep at least a quarter of a mile from the above-mentioned anchorage ground.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT ALL FISHING IN THE UPPER DELEGATE, BONANG, QUEENBORO, AND BENDOC RIVERS FROM 14TH APRIL TO 31st OCTOBER IN EACH YEAR.

**I**T is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prohibiting all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Upper Delegate, Bonang, Queenboro, and Bendoc Rivers from 14th April to 31st October in each year (both dates inclusive).

The whole of the above routes are prescribed for the period ending the 31st December, 1925, and will be reviewed at the end of the period specified.

*Stopping Places on Routes.*

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

*Fares to be Charged.*

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

## SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT MORDIALLOC.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1915*.
