*Agricultural Superintendent, Class "A."*

*Yearly Salary.*—£800.

*Qualifications.*—Degree of Bachelor of Science, with chemistry as the major subject, or Degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science, with evidence of some specialization in Agricultural Chemistry, or the equivalent of such degrees and specialization. Evidence of capacity to control chemical laboratory and to initiate and prosecute chemical research on problems relating to agriculture.

*Senior Veterinary Officer, Class "B."*

*Duties.*—Under the Chief Veterinary Inspector to control the Veterinary Officers and Stock Inspectors in the duties to be carried out under the Dairy Supervision Act, Horse Breeding Act, Stock Diseases Act, and Cattle Compensation Act; to organize control of contagious diseases of stock; to draft correspondence arising from any of the aforementioned Acts or dealing with disease of stock, and to lecture on veterinary and live stock subjects to farmers.

*Qualifications.*—Applicants must be graduates of an Australian Veterinary School or of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, England, who have had experience in the administration and have a thorough knowledge of the Dairy Supervision, Horse Breeding, Stock Diseases, and Cattle Compensation Acts, and the methods adopted for the control of contagious diseases of stock, and must present evidence of experience in conducting departmental correspondence, and in lecturing.

*Veterinary Officer, Classes "G?" and "B."*

*Duties.*—Examination of dairy cows for determination of disease, particularly diseases of the udder: conducting Tuberculin and Mallein tests, and such other biological tests as may be required; control of stock quarantine; investigation of outbreaks of disease in stock; examination of stallions under the Horse Breeding Act; examination and valuation of stock under the Cattle Compensation Act; demonstrating and lecturing on stock diseases, and feeding and management of stock.

*Qualifications.*—Applicants must be graduates of an Australian University or other approved Veterinary School, or a Member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, England, and have experience in veterinary practice. *Marine Act 1915.*AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING TO  
THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPERANNUATION FUND.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1915*, the Pilot Superannuation Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

(1) *Short Title*.—These Regulations may be cited as “The Pilot Superannuation Regulations 1925.”

(2) *Construction and Date of Operation*.—These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with “The Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations 1909,” as from time to time amended (hereinafter referred to as “the Principal Regulations”), and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1925.

(3) *Computation of Pension*.—In computing the annual pension payable to or in respect of a pilot who, in addition to his completed years of service, has also served for a broken portion of a year, the pensioner shall be entitled to receive for each complete month served by the pilot in addition to any completed number of years, a proportionate amount for each such month of additional service, based upon the amount which would have been payable in accordance with the prescribed schedule for the last year of service had the same been completed.

(4) *Lump Sum in Lieu of Pension*.—Paragraph 3 of the Pilot Superannuation Regulations 1923 is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted and read as paragraph 8 of the Principal Regulations:—

“Lump Sum in Lieu of Pension.—8. Where any pilot shall have become entitled to a pension and he is desirous of obtaining a lump sum in lieu thereof, he shall be entitled to be paid a sum calculated at the rate of £40 for the first year of complete service, £41 for the second year of such service, £42 for the third year of such service, and so on, increasing One pound for each additional year of complete service thereafter up to 35 years. Provided, nevertheless, that if the pilot retire in any year prior to the anniversary of the date when his services commenced he shall be entitled to have included in the lump sum aforesaid for each complete month of the broken year a proportionate part of the sum which he would have received had he completed that year. And provided further that the right hereunder of a pilot to claim a lump sum in lieu of a pension shall be conditional on the pilot granting a release to the Board from all future claims against the fund on behalf of himself and of his wife and of his children (if any). And provided lastly that no payment shall in any case be made for a greater length of service than 35 years.”

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Pilot Superannuation Board, held this 3rd day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

TAILINGS LICENCES, AND WATER RIGHT LICENCES.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Mines Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2698), doth hereby rescind clause 58 of the Regulations relating to Mining Leases, Tailings Licences, and Water Right Licences, made on the 7th August, 1916, and doth substitute therefor the following:—

PURPOSE.

58. A licence may be granted—

- (a) to remove or to treat tailings for the purpose of extracting therefrom any metal or mineral; or
- (b) to remove tailings other than for extraction purposes.

Clause 56 of these Regulations shall not extend and apply to an application for or a licence under (b), and only to an application for or a licence under (a) the following shall apply:—

Application shall be made to the Minister by letter stating the mine dump or tailings deposit from which it is desired to remove tailings. A fee of £1 for licence shall accompany the application.

More than one mine dump or tailings deposit may be included in a licence.

The licence shall be for one year, but the term may be extended by the Minister for not longer than one year at a time on payment of £1 for each year.

The Governor in Council shall determine the conditions of licence and the royalty per cubic yard to be paid for the tailings removed.

Provided that the clause now rescinded shall continue to have full force and effect until the coming into operation of the clause now made.

A licence to remove tailings (Crown land) other than for extraction purposes shall be in Form Q (a).

LICENCE TO REMOVE TAILINGS.

On behalf of His Most Gracious Majesty King George V., I, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, hereby, in pursuance of the *Mines Act 1915*, give, for a term of one year from the date hereof, unto in the said State, licence and authority to remove tailings (be it mullock, battery sand, gravel, or mining débris) from the undermentioned mine dumps or deposits.

This licence is subject to the restrictions and limitations expressed in the *Mines Act 1915*, or any amendment thereof, and in the Regulations thereunder, and to the following conditions:—

1. The tailings shall not be treated for the purpose of extracting therefrom any metal or mineral without first obtaining the licence provided for by clause 58 (a) of the Regulations relating to Mining Leases, Tailings Licences, and Water Right Licences.

2. This licence shall not be transferable.

3. The licensee shall pay the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ for every cubic yard of tailings removed from the said dumps or deposits, payable quarterly from the date hereof.

4. The licensee shall keep proper books of account of all tailings removed from the aforesaid dumps or deposits, and shall furnish to the Secretary for Mines quarterly from date hereof a return, verified by statutory declaration, showing the quantity of tailings removed, accompanied by the sum due under condition 3 hereof.

5. The licensee shall permit an Inspector of Mines to examine the said books, and to do all things necessary to determine what quantity of tailings has been removed, which determination shall be final and binding on all parties.

6. The licensee, if required by an Inspector of Mines or by a police constable, shall produce this licence for inspection.

7. The licence may be forfeited for any breach or neglect of the above conditions.

8. Notwithstanding the issue of this licence, the Governor in Council may grant licences to others (a) to remove or treat the tailings for the purpose of extracting therefrom any metal or mineral, and for (b) to remove the tailings other than for extraction purposes.

9. The Governor in Council may also grant gold-mining or mineral leases of the land on which the tailings are situated, and in that event the licensee shall carry on the work of removing the tailings in such a manner as not to unreasonably interfere with the working by the lessee under any such lease.

10. By endorsement thereon the Minister of Mines may extend the term of licence, for not longer than one year at a time, on payment of a fee of One pound for each year's extension, provided application for such extension, accompanied by the fee, reach the Minister prior to expiry of licence.

Security will be required either in Victorian or Commonwealth Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular description indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In the event of the tender being accepted for goods of Commonwealth or British manufacture (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.

3. The value of all packages, cases, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, &c. The net quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of this contract, Melbourne will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary for Education or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 8, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account under the Audit Act and Regulations for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time being allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to be made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority to the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 12. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in Clause 7.

12. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall

acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in Clause 7.

13. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

14. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be, by the contractor, forwarded by post to the teacher to whom such parcel is directed, for him to sign and return.

15. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

16. The members of Boards of Survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

19. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-24, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. The foregoing provision, however, shall not apply to contracts for imported goods in which fixed and definite quantities to be delivered at stated times are expressed in the Schedules. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

20. Should an increase or reduction take place in the prices at present charged for books and school requisites contained in the said schedule hereto by the publishers or manufacturers, a corresponding increase or reduction shall be made to or by the contractors in the prices of the articles supplied by them. In case of any disagreement as to the amount of increase or reduction the same shall be decided and settled by the Director of Education.

21. Under no circumstances will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. Should the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being decide to discontinue the use of any book, map, or any other article in the schedule, or to direct that any book, map, or any other article other than those enumerated therein be taken into use, he shall at any time give six months' notice of such intention or decision to the contractor, and after the expiration of the period of such notice the Education Department shall not be bound to take any further supply of such book, map, or any other article, nor shall the contractor be bound to supply the same, and all books or maps not in the schedule, but which it may be decided to introduce, shall be supplied by the contractor after expiration of such notice at a price to be agreed on between the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being and the contractor.

 Common lodging-house—Ten shillings.  
 Eating-house—Ten shillings.  
 Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice-cream, ginger-beer, hop-beer or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda-water, lithia-water or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings.  
 For any transfer of registration of the above-named—Two shillings and sixpence.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Malvern.

## TOWN OF GEELONG WEST.

## BY-LAW No. 47.

A By-law of the Town of Geelong West made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for regulating the use of the streets, roads, and public places by street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs or flowers, and fixing the amount of tolls and dues payable by such persons.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Geelong West order as follows:—

1. No person shall trade within the Town of Geelong West as a street hawker or itinerant trader dealing in foodstuffs or flowers without first obtaining from the Council a permit to do so, and paying the fees provided under this By-law.
2. Such person or persons, when not actually engaged in selling, shall travel at a reasonable pace along the streets, roads, ways, or places in the municipality, and shall not occupy any fixed stands therein.
3. No child (as defined by the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) shall be employed as a street hawker or itinerant trader, nor be permitted to manage or occupy a stand in any street, road, or public place.
4. No cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle shall be used for hawking purposes unless the same has been previously approved by the Council's inspector.
5. The following tolls and dues shall be demanded, received, and had by the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Geelong West from all persons hawking foodstuffs or flowers in the municipality:—

For every cart laden with foodstuffs or flowers—  
 Ten shillings (10s.) per quarter.  
 Four shillings (4s.) per month.  
 Two shillings (2s.) per week.  
 Sixpence (6d.) per day.

For every hand-basket or barrow laden with foodstuffs or flowers—

Five shillings (5s.) per quarter.  
 Two shillings (2s.) per month.  
 One shilling (1s.) per week.  
 Threepence (3d.) per day.

6. Every person guilty of any breach of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole of the municipality.

Every occupier of any hall or other building which may, subsequent to the coming into operation of this By-law, be used for public meetings, or of any building or any ground in which, subsequent to the coming into operation of this By-law, public amusements may be conducted, shall register at the said office of the Council such building or ground within seven days from the date when the same shall be first used or within seven days from the date when public amusements shall be conducted therein (as the case may be), and thereafter in every year on or before the corresponding date of the original registration.
3. Every such occupier as aforesaid shall make written application to the said Council stating the particulars set forth in section 1 of Part VI. of the said Schedule.
4. No person shall cause, and no occupier of any such premises shall permit, any public meeting to be held or any public amusements to be conducted in or on any such premises as aforesaid which shall not have been registered for the purpose, or without a certificate of registration for the same having been obtained for the same, as mentioned in the said Part VI. of the Schedule.
5. The said Council may at any time suspend for a stated period the effect of or cancel any registration of any such premises, and shall forthwith give notice of such suspension or cancellation to the occupier of the registered premises, and during such suspension or after such cancellation such premises shall be deemed to be unregistered in respect of the purpose mentioned in the certificate of registration, and such certificate shall be of no force or virtue.
6. The proper officer of the Council may at all reasonable times enter and inspect any such registered premises as aforesaid.
7. The times and hours during at or at which respectively any such registered building or ground shall be used for the purpose for which it is registered or shall be closed shall be those set forth in regulations made or to be made from time to time by the said Council under the power in that behalf contained in section 4 of the said Part VI. of the Schedule.
8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Mornington.
9. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to any church or to any school used or occupied by or in connexion with any religious body.
10. Any person who shall wilfully commit a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10.

4. Every person who shall wilfully offend against any provision of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

## REGULATION.

Regulation of the Shire of Mornington, numbered 1, made under section 4 of Part VI. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the shire by virtue of a By-law of the above-named shire, numbered 32, for regulating or appointing the times and hours during or at which respectively any registered building or ground shall be used for the purpose for which it is registered, or shall be closed.

On the Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week, from the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning until the hour of Twelve o'clock midnight, when the same shall be closed, and on Saturday in each week from the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning until the hour of half-past Eleven o'clock at night, when the same shall be closed. Where the building is used for picture shows or for dancing it shall not be used for either of such purposes between half-past Eleven on Saturday night and Eight o'clock in the morning of the Monday in the week following. Provided that nothing in this Regulation shall apply to any ball, private party, or social held in any registered building on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday in any week. Provided further that nothing in this Regulation shall prevent the premises registered being used on Sundays for the purposes of the sale of refreshments and/or the rendering of band or orchestral music, if no charge be made either directly or indirectly for admission to the said premises or any part thereof, or (prior to admission or entrance) for the supply of refreshments, and if subsequent to such admission no payment be demanded or taken for refreshments prior to the actual service of such refreshments, if any, as may be ordered.

Every occupier of any such premises who wilfully permits the same to be used for the purpose for which the same is or are registered during or at any other time, or after any such hours as aforesaid respectively, shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
