HENLEY-ON-YARRA.

Notice to Boatmen, &c.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with the Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley Course on the Upper Yarra on the 24th October, 1925, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz. :—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the River Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such as have permission of the River Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the River Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 p.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

No motor or other boats will be allowed to ply for hire between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

All motor boats shall be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m., and shall remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

All motor boats on south bank must moor bow up stream, and all motor boats on north bank must moor bow down stream.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the River Officer, 110 Spencer-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, or with a beam exceeding 9 feet overall, unless the River Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the River Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, and must moor at post bearing same number as shown on permit.

Mooring or holding on to the booms or buoys is strictly forbidden.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 8 feet.

The use of paddles as a means of propulsion for rowing boats is preferred.

Boats over 25 feet in length or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats and canoes shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 24th day of August, 1925, approved, pursuant to the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, of the following Regulations, viz. :—

CITY OF MELBOURNE.

Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of Carlton Gardens Children's Wading Pool, in the City of Melbourne, and the preservation of good order and decency therein.

Whereas by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne and their successors in respect of Carlton Gardens, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted (hereinafter called the said Gardens) and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be at all times thereafter maintained and used as and for a public garden and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas the Governor in Council did on the ninth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, in pursuance of section 183 of the *Land Act 1915*, appoint the Council of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called the Trustees) to be a Committee of Management of (inter alia) the said Gardens: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Trustees do hereby make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of

such portion of the said Gardens as is set apart for and hereinafter designated the Children's Wading Pool, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said Gardens.

CARLTON GARDENS CHILDREN'S WADING POOL.

Rules and Regulations for the Management of the Wading Pool.

1. The Children's Wading Pool shall not be used after sunset.
2. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the Children's Wading Pool, provided, however, that parents or other attendants shall be at liberty to enter the Wading Pool to watch over children who are in their charge.
3. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Wading Pool.
4. The Children's Wading Pool shall only be used for the purpose for which it is provided.
5. All paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Council for the purpose, and such paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall not be deposited in the Wading Pool.
6. Every person in the Children's Wading Pool shall obey the direction of any officer of the Council in respect of his or her conduct therein.
7. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the Children's Wading Pool.
8. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, or any scooter in any part of the Children's Wading Pool, or bring any animal into the same.
9. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Wading Pool any person who commits a breach of any of these Regulations or who wilfully damages the Wading Pool, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty herein-after provided for any such offence.
10. Every person offending against these Regulations shall in accordance with section 182 of the Land Act 1915, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence, and every person who so offends and who after he has been warned by any bailiff, or Crown lands officer, or officer or servant of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, numbered 51, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1915, as amended by the Local Government Act 1921 (No. 3167) and by the Local Government Act 1924 (No. 3388), for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential area, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of such residential area the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. The area within the municipal district hereinafter specified shall be and is hereby described as a residential area, that is to say, all land abutting—

On the east side of Hyde-street in that part thereof which commences at the north-east corner of the intersection of Parker and Hyde streets, and thence continues north to the south side of Napier-street, to a depth of 165 feet.

On the east side of Hyde-street in that part thereof which commences at the north-east corner of the intersection of Hyde and Napier streets, and thence continues north to the south side of Bunbury-street, to a depth of 165 feet.

On the south side of Bunbury-street in that part thereof which commences at the south-east corner of the intersection of Bunbury and Hyde streets, and thence continues east to the west side of Cowper-street, to a depth of 132 feet.

On the south side of Bunbury-street in that part thereof which commences at the south-east corner of the intersection of Bunbury and Cowper streets, and thence east to the west side of Whitehall-street, to a depth of 132 feet.

On the west side of Whitehall-street in that part thereof which commences at the south-west corner of the intersection of Bunbury and Whitehall streets, thence continues south to the north side of Napier-street, to a depth of 165 feet.

On the west side of Whitehall-street in that part thereof which commences on the south-west corner of the intersection of Whitehall and Napier streets, thence continues south to the north side of Parker-street, to a depth of 165 feet.

On the north side of Parker-street in that part thereof which commences on the north-west corner of the intersection of Whitehall and Parker streets, thence continues west to the east side of Cowper-street, by a depth of 132 feet.

On the north side of Parker-street in that part thereof which commences at the north-west corner of the intersection of Cowper and Parker streets, and thence continues west to the east side of Hyde-street, to a depth of 132 feet.

On the south side of Napier-street in that part thereof which commences on the south-east corner of the intersection of Napier and Hyde streets, and thence continues east to the west side of Cowper-street, to a depth of 132 feet.

On the south side of Napier-street in that part thereof which commences on the south-east corner of the intersection of Napier and Cowper streets, and thence continues east to the west side of Whitehall-street, to a depth of 132 feet.

On the north side of Napier-street in that part thereof which commences at the north-east corner of the intersection of Napier and Hyde streets, and thence continues east to the west side of Cowper-street, to a depth of 132 feet.

On the north side of Napier-street in that part thereof which commences at the north-east corner of the intersection of Cowper and Napier streets, and thence continues east to the west side of Whitehall-street, to a depth of 132 feet.

On the west side of Cowper-street in that part thereof which commences at the north-west corner of the intersection of Cowper and Parker streets, and thence continues north to the south side of Napier-street, to a depth of 165 feet.

On the west side of Cowper-street in that part thereof which commences at the north-west corner of the intersection of Cowper and Napier streets, and thence continues north to the south side of Bunbury-street, to a depth of 165 feet.

On the east side of Cowper-street in that part thereof which commences at the south-east corner of the intersection of Bunbury and Cowper streets, and thence continues south to the north side of Napier-street, to a depth of 165 feet.

On the east side of Cowper-street in that part thereof which commences at the south-east corner of the intersection of Napier and Cowper streets, and thence continues south to the north side of Parker-street, to a depth of 165 feet.

2. The erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any land or any building for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement within such residential area shall be and is hereby prohibited.

3. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, re-building, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, re-building, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law was in the same ownership.

4. If any person erects or constructs, or uses or adapts for use, or causes to be erected or constructed, or used or adapted for use, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law, it shall be lawful for the Council or city surveyor to serve on the owner or occupier of the land upon which the same is built or erected a written notice to pull down and remove such building or erection by giving such notice to such owner or occupier, and in the event of such owner or occupier thereof refusing or neglecting to pull down and remove such building or erection for seven days from and after the service of such notice, it shall be lawful for the Council to pull down and remove, or cause to be pulled down or removed, any buildings or erection built, constructed, or erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to this By-law, and in addition may sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings or erection, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees and penalties due by such owner or occupier.

5. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence, and in case an offence against this By-law is continued after notice has been given as aforesaid to such person of the commission of the offence, to a further penalty not exceeding £10 for each day such offence is continued after such notice.

6. By-law numbered 50 of the City of Footscray is hereby repealed.

BY-LAW No. 96.

A By-law of the City of Geelong for establishing safety zones and regulating pedestrian traffic across streets within the city.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915* and of any and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Geelong doth hereby order and direct that the following By-law shall be observed and in force within the said city:—

1. In this By-law the expression "Safety zone" shall, unless such meaning be inconsistent with the context, mean a place of refuge for pedestrians established by the Council hereunder.

2. The Council may, by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Mayor, or, in his absence, of the Town Clerk, establish one or more safety zones in any street, and the same shall thereupon be marked or defined in such street in such manner as the city engineer may from time to time direct or determine.

3. No driver of any vehicle or motor car, and no rider of any horse, shall drive or impel, ride, or lead the same across, over, or along any safety zone.

4. No pedestrian shall cross any street except at right angles to the kerb line, and every such pedestrian shall, on leaving the footway, proceed by the shortest line from the point on the kerb line from which he left the footway to a point on the other kerb line of the street immediately opposite the first-mentioned point.

5. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 88 of the said city.

In the event of the work not being satisfactorily completed within the time specified, the Shire Engineer shall have power to complete the work at the cost of the applicant, and the cost of such completion shall be thereafter deducted from the amount of the deposit, and the applicant shall have no claim to such deposit or part deducted, and any further cost than is covered by the deposit may be recoverable from the applicant.

5. The applicant shall observe all the conditions written or printed on the permit and shall perform all acts which the said conditions may require to be done, or which may be specified by the Shire Engineer.

6. Every application for a refund of the deposit lodged shall be made in writing on the form specified in Schedule "A" hereto, and the deposit or any balance thereof shall be paid according to the certificate of the Shire Engineer to be furnished in form specified in Schedule "B."

Regulation No. 5, made under Part IV. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for the care, protection, and management of the Croydon Recreation Reserve.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale do hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. That the Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, or any mechanically propelled vehicle, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For the admission of every additional horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water thereon, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.

6. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles thereon, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

9. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a cord or chain, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management; and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall place in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall engage in any game or sport or dancing in the Reserve on Sundays.

13. Every person hiring or erecting in the Reserve any booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, shall pay such fee as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine.

14. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve.

15. Any person offending against this Regulation shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

Nature of Premises, Fees Payable.

All offensive trade premises included in the Second Schedule of the above Act, with the exception of piggeries—Twenty shillings.

Piggeries containing from 1 to not more than 5 pigs—Two shillings and sixpence.

Piggeries containing from 6 to not more than 15 pigs—Five shillings.

Piggeries containing from 16 to not more than 25 pigs—Seven shillings and sixpence.

Piggeries containing from 26 to not more than 35 pigs—Ten shillings.

Piggeries containing from 36 to not more than 45 pigs—Fifteen shillings.

Piggeries containing 46 pigs and over—Twenty shillings.

Cattle sale-yards—Twenty shillings.

Boardinghouses—Ten shillings.

Common lodginghouses—Ten shillings.

Eating houses—Ten shillings.

Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings.

For any transfer of registration of any of the above named—Two shillings and sixpence.
