Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE JEWELLERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 12th September, 1925, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturing jeweller," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 12th September, 1925, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

.. 8 a.m. (4) OVERTIME.—The following rate shall be paid for all work done-

(a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause (3)
 (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause (3) in excess of 48 hours in any week

(5) Time Rate.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three per centum.

(6) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday (3rd June), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day: but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
