REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognized by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognized by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A. B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C. D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a

plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognized by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognized by an Australasian University or from recognized public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from

the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £3 3s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visu voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognized by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his

passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1915*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF PORTION OF RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF WANNAEUE, KNOWN AS THE ROSEBUD FORESHORE RESERVE.

WE, William Charles Norquay, Reginald Laurence Leach, William Alderson, David Cairns, and Thomas Chadwick, the duly appointed Committee of Management of portion of the Reserve for Public purposes in the Parish of Wannaeue, known as the "Rosebud Foreshore Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 161 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge, excepting such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as may be fixed by the Committee of Management.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except with the written consent of the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall injure in any way any of the buildings, fences, or seats in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, sheep, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any tent nor any building without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee of Management, and paying the following fees:—
 - (a) For each tent containing not more than five persons, Five shillings per week or part thereof, and for each additional person above five in each tent, Sixpence per week or part thereof.
 - (b) Fees for parties of fifty persons or over, fees to be fixed by special arrangement with the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall occupy a fisherman's residence area without the written consent of the Committee of Management. The rent to be paid for such fisherman's area shall be Five pounds (£5) per annum, payable in advance on or before the 7th day of January in each year.

8. The lease for the fisherman's residence area shall be for twelve months.

9. No bathing-box or boatshed shall be erected without the plan for same having first been approved by the Committee of Management.

10. The fees to be paid for bathing-boxes and boatsheds erected on the Reserve shall be—

- For each bathing-box—Ten shillings per annum.
- For each double bathing-box—Fifteen shillings per annum.
- For each boatshed—One pound per annum.
- For each combined bathing-box and boatshed—Thirty shillings per annum.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserves.

12. No person shall carry or discharge firearms in the Reserve.

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member

of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CITY OF ESSENDON.

BY-LAW No. 52.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 52, for—

- (a) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house or any shop, or any dwelling-house and shop, may hereafter be erected.
- (b) Providing that every dwelling-house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof a prescribed area of open land.
- (c) Providing with respect to buildings hereafter erected for—
 - (1) The ventilation and lighting thereof.
 - (2) The minimum area to be covered by any dwelling-house or any dwelling-house and shop combined.
- (d) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to any By-law made pursuant to section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, or erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to any By-law made pursuant to section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921*, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (e) Amending By-laws No. 38 and No. 50.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon (hereinafter called "the Council") order as follows:—

INTRODUCTORY.

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
2. This By-law shall not apply to any building proposed to be erected or constructed by the Government of the State of Victoria or the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.
3. This By-law shall, so far as it is not inconsistent therewith, be read and construed in conjunction with By-laws No. 38 and No. 50 of the City of Essendon, and any By-laws amending such By-laws.

PART I.

Division A.—Dwelling-houses.

1. The minimum area of land upon which any dwelling-house may be erected or constructed (which land is hereinafter in this division called "such land") is 5,000 square feet. The minimum depth of such land is 100 feet, and the minimum width of frontage of such land is 50 feet.
2. Not more than one dwelling-house shall be erected upon land of the minimum area prescribed in clause 1 of this division.

3. Except in the case where such land has frontages to more than one street or road, the buildings proposed to be erected or constructed thereon shall be so erected or constructed that a portion of such land not less than 3,333 square feet in area is not built upon. Where such land has frontages to more than one street or road, the buildings proposed to be erected or constructed thereon shall be so erected that a portion of such land not less than 2,500 square feet in area is not built upon.

4. There shall be attached to every dwelling-house for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an area of open land of an aggregate extent of not less than 600 square feet. Such open land shall be free of any erection or construction above the level of the adjoining pavement.

5. The Council, by resolution, or an officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, by notice in writing to the person proposing to erect or construct any dwelling-house, may dispense with the observance of the requirements of clause 1 hereof as to minimum width of frontage and/or minimum depth of such land, provided that the area of such land is not less than 5,000 square feet.

Division B.—Shops.

1. No shop shall be erected or constructed upon land which has a less area than 256 square feet, or a less width of frontage than 16 feet, or a less depth than 16 feet.

2. Not more than one shop shall be erected or constructed upon land of the minimum area prescribed in clause 1 of this division.

3. The Council, by resolution, or an officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, by notice in writing to the person proposing to erect or construct any shop, may direct what portion and what area of the land upon which it is proposed to erect or construct such shop shall be reserved for the purpose of providing lighting and ventilation for such shop, and may in like manner direct that no building shall be erected or constructed upon such portion or area.

Division C.—Dwelling-houses and Shops Combined.

1. The provisions of Part I., Division A, of this By-law shall apply to the erection and construction of dwelling-houses and shops combined, save where the Council or its authorized officer, under clause 2 of this division of this By-law, dispenses with the requirements of such provisions.

2. Where it is proposed to erect or construct a dwelling-house and shop combined, the Council, by resolution, or any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, by notice in writing to the person proposing to erect or construct any dwelling-house and shop combined, may dispense with the observance of the requirements of Part I., Division A, of this By-law as to minimum width of frontage and/or minimum depth of land upon which it is proposed to erect or construct such dwelling-house and shop combined, provided that there is attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an area of open land of an aggregate extent of not less than 600 square feet free from any erection or construction above the level of the adjoining pavement.

Division D.—Existing Building Allotments.

1. The Council by resolution or an officer authorized in that behalf by the Council by notice in writing to the person proposing to erect or construct any building or erection—

- (a) upon any land of which the area is less than the minimum area prescribed by this By-law and which is shown as a lot upon any plan of subdivision approved by the Council under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts* prior to the coming into operation of this By-law;
- (b) upon any land of which the area is less than the minimum area prescribed by this By-law and which is at the time of the coming into operation of this By-law the whole of the land comprised in any certificate of title registered under the *Transfer of Land Acts*;

may dispense with the observance of all or any of the requirements of this By-law.

PART II.

Pulling Down and Removal of Buildings and Erections.

In case any building or erection has been either partly or wholly erected or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, or of By-law 38, or of By-law 50, or of any amendment of such By-laws, or contrary to the provisions of any other By-law of the City of Essendon relating to the erection and construction of buildings and erections, or of any other By-law made under the provisions of section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921*—

- (a) The Council may give to the owner or builder fourteen days' notice, in writing, signed by the municipal clerk, requiring that such building or erection be brought into conformity with the provisions of the said By-laws, and notifying such person that on failure within a reasonable time to bring such building or erection into conformity with such provisions, the Council will take all necessary steps to pull down and remove such buildings and erections and sell the materials thereof.

- (b) If default is made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the Council, through its surveyor, to enter upon such building or erection and upon the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purposes, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place; and if the Council in their discretion think fit, the Council may sell the same in such manner as the Council think fit.
- (c) Out of the proceeds of the sale of such material the Council may—
- (i) reimburse itself all expenses of or in connexion with the pulling down and removal of such buildings and/or erections;
 - (ii) pay into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building or erection.
- (d) The Council shall pay over any surplus arising from such sale on application being made by the person entitled thereto.

PART III.

Enforcement of By-law and Penalties.

1. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.
2. Where any person is guilty of an offence against any By-law made pursuant to section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921* the Council may give notice to such person that he is guilty of such offence.
3. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of any By-law made pursuant to section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921*, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each day on which an offence against such By-law is continued, after notice has been given to such person by the Council of the commission of the offence.

SHIRE OF ROMSEY.
BY-LAW NO. 11.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919* and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Romsey, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following areas within the said shire:—

(a) *Township of Romsey.*

Commencing at the north-west corner of Crown allotment 6, section A, Township of Romsey, Parish of Lancefield; thence east by the north boundary of that allotment and allotment 16, south by the eastern boundary of the latter allotment, east and south by the northern and eastern boundaries of allotment 19 to the Government road on the south of that allotment; thence east by that road to the eastern boundary of the Public Park; thence south and west by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said Public Park to the Government road on the west of the said Public Park; thence south by the latter road 4 chains to a road; thence west by that road to the main Melbourne-Lancefield road; thence south-west across that road to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 40, section A, Parish of Monegeetta; thence west by the southern boundary of the latter allotment to a point due south of the commencing point; thence north by a line and by the western boundaries of allotments 9 and 6, section A, Parish of Lancefield, to the commencing point.

4. The occupier or other person having the control or management of any premises on which there is a pan-closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the pan-closet or privy to be kept in good repair and in a cleanly condition.

5. The Council shall cause every pan-closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and the occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept in a proper position under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant, or lime, sawdust, or other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved dépôt.

9. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam, and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

10. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

11. No person shall place or cause to be placed any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

12. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

13. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
