IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VII. of the *Public Service Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 50.

A By-law for making and levying the rates for the year commencing the 1st day of July, 1925.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called the "Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the Water Acts and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such works:—

1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area, and supplied with water for domestic purposes other than by measure:—

- (1) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £16—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (2) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £16—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (3) On lands on which there is no building—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1925, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1926, and shall be payable in two equal instalments, on the 26th day of September, 1925, and the 1st day of January, 1926.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

ORDER APPROVING OF A DEVIATION FROM A DEVELOPMENTAL ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF FERNTREE GULLY.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing The Patch road in the Shire of Ferntree Gully (declared to be a developmental road under the Developmental Roads Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the Government Gazette of the 25th February, 1920, on page 715) should be made by the said Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

All that piece of land in the Parish of Monbulk and being a roadway generally one chain wide, the south-eastern boundary of which commences at the northern angle of allotment 6, section J, of the said parish; thence south-westerly through that allotment and allotment 7, section J, and westerly through allotment 8, section J, to a point on the western boundary of that allotment distant 244 deg. 15 min. 250 links and 191 deg. 18 min. 69.1 links from the north-western angle of the said allotment.

NOTE.—The route of the portion of the roadway above described is more particularly delineated and shown coloured red on survey plan No. 1726, lodged in the office of the Country Roads Board.

DECLARATION OF A DEVELOPMENTAL ROAD UNDER THE DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS ACT IN THE SHIRE OF WALPEUP.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK IN THE TOWNSHIP OF DONALD.

3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, trees, shrubs, flowers, or any improvements in the Park, nor shall any fires be lighted therein, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Park, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw any stones in the Park.
5. No person shall put in the Park any cattle, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Park, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Park any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Park, nor erect any building or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall hawk, sell, or offer for sale in the Park any article without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
10. No person shall bet in any part of the Park, and any person found betting therein shall be liable to expulsion from the Park.
11. No person shall remove from the Park any soil, sand, or other material.
12. No person shall engage in any kind of game in the Park on Sunday of any week.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor light fires therein, without the written permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall—
 - (a) Climb upon or jump over any gate, fence, tree, or rockery situate in or around the Reserve or plantations.
 - (b) Place any bill, placard, or other document on, or writing or painting on, or otherwise deface any gate, fence, structure, building, seat, wall, or tree situate in or around the Reserve.
 - (c) Throw, place, or leave any glass, filth, dirt, paper, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature in the Reserve.
 - (d) Roll, throw, or discharge any stone or other missile in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, nor allow or suffer to wander into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, but nothing herein shall prevent any person from riding or driving any horse along the road in the Reserve.
6. No person shall take into the Reserve any dog, unless led or controlled by a chain or cord, without the written permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any tent or building, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the written permission of the Committee of Management, and no person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any article without such permission first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment, amusement, or meeting of any sort in the Reserve without the written permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve, nor on the floors thereof.

10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays, nor on any other day, without the written consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall place any obstruction upon any road or footpath, or upon any other portion of the Reserve, whereby life or limb is likely to be endangered.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fête, sport, entertainment, or amusement, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee of Management, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management, and in addition the Committee of Management may charge a fee for the use of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 George V. No. 2686), and numbered 178, to amend or add to By-law No. 168, for regulating and restraining the erection and construction or alteration of buildings, erections, or boardings, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and of every other power in that behalf then enabling, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall, from and after the date of the same coming into operation, be read and construed as one with By-law 168, intituled a By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 George V. No. 2686), and numbered 168, to repeal By-law 131, and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction or alteration of buildings, erections, or boardings, and for other purposes, and the penalties prescribed under Part XV. of By-law 168 shall be applicable to any person for wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

2. Immediately after section 43 of Part V. of the said By-law 168 the following new section shall be inserted, that is to say:—

43. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, a bathroom and water-closet annexed to bedrooms in hotels may be constructed subject to the provisions herein contained, although none of the walls thereof may be an external wall of such hotel. Provided, however, that—

- (a) In every such case a mechanical system of ventilation approved by the surveyor and capable of entirely changing the air contents of such bathroom and water-closet eight times an hour shall be installed in connexion therewith.
- (b) Upon completion, the builder or owner or occupier of such hotel shall carry out such tests of the mechanical system referred to as the surveyor may deem necessary.
- (c) Such mechanical system shall at all times be in the continuous charge of one or more properly qualified persons, and shall be continuous in operation.
- (d) An auxiliary mechanical plant of equal capacity approved by the surveyor, and capable of instant operation in the event of such first-mentioned mechanical system failing to operate, shall also be provided in connexion with any such hotel as aforesaid.
- (e) Any such mechanical system as aforesaid shall be open to inspection by the surveyor at all reasonable times, and shall be subject to such tests as the surveyor shall from time to time direct.
- (f) The failure of any such mechanical system at any time to pass such tests as aforesaid shall be an offence by the occupier of such hotel against this By-law, and the owner thereof shall also in respect of such failure be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, hoardings, or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings, or fences, and in paying into the municipal funds any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council of the municipality for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, or for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ringwood order as follows:—

PART I.

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. No person shall alter, erect, build, or construct, or cause or commence to be altered, erected, built, or constructed any building except in accordance with the provisions of this By-law and the plans and specifications produced under the provisions of this By-law to and approved of by the surveyor.

3. *Areas to which By-law Applies.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Borough of Ringwood.

PART II.

PAYMENT OF FEES AND PERMIT.

1. *Permit.*—No person shall commence any building, or any addition to or alteration of any existing building, or the reinstatement of any building, or the demolition of any building, without having first obtained from the surveyor permission for the commencement of same, and without having first paid to the treasurer the fees in respect thereof set forth in the First Schedule hereto, having regard to the class of building, erections, structure, addition, or alteration proposed to be built, erected, or made, or building demolished.

2. *Notice of Intention to Build and Lodgement of Plans, &c.*—No person shall proceed or commence to erect or construct, or cause to be erected or constructed, any building, or any addition or alteration to any building, without first delivering to the surveyor properly prepared plans and specifications of the proposed building or addition or alteration, together with a tracing or copy of such plans and a copy of such specification, which shall (*inter alia*) include details of dimensions, sizes, and qualities of all materials, and enumerating any old materials proposed to be used in the construction of same, and also such details, sections, elevations, and specifications as surveyor may require. All plans, elevations, sections, specifications, giving details of dimensions, sizes, and qualities of all materials shall comply with or shall be amended to comply in every respect with Council's requirements.

3. *Provisions as to Plans, Specifications, &c.*—All plans, elevations, sections, and specifications of any building submitted to the surveyor shall show or state—

- (a) The purpose for which it is intended to be used.
- (b) The situation of the proposed erection or building, specifying the number of the lot, plan or subdivision, or Crown allotment, and giving the dimensions and area of the land on which it is proposed to build.
- (c) A plan with dimensions marked thereon showing the ground plan, drainage plan, road frontage, and the finished aspect of the building or erection, in front, side, and rear elevations.
- (d) A specification giving particulars of all materials proposed to be used in the construction and finishing of all walls, partitions, verandahs, porches, windows, chimneys, outside doors, and roof.
- (e) An estimate of the cost of the proposed work when finished.
- (f) Such other particulars in writing as shall be necessary to enable the Council or its surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law have been complied with.

4. Plans and specifications in pencil will not be considered by the surveyor. The plans, elevations, sections, and specifications approved by the surveyor shall be kept at the building therein referred to, and shall be available for inspection by the surveyor at all reasonable times on demand during the construction of, and for fourteen days next after the completion of, the building.

5. The original plans and specifications, when approved, shall be returned to the owner or his agent, but the tracing or copy of the plans and the copy of such specifications and details of materials shall be retained by the surveyor.

6. A written permit to erect a building, tent, or addition obtained pursuant to this Part shall expire after twelve months from its grant, unless extended by resolution of the Council.

PART III.

GENERAL PROVISIONS AS TO BUILDINGS.

1. No person shall build, erect, or construct, or cause or permit to be built, erected, or constructed—

- (a) Any building the external walls of which are of other material than stone, or brick, or concrete, on land abutting on any streets or roads, or portions of streets or roads, set forth in the Second Schedule, Part I.
- (b) Any building of materials other than brick, stone, or concrete, within 15 feet of any street.
- (c) Any building which is intended to be used as a shop or dwelling-house upon any land the surface of which is so situated as not to admit of being efficiently drained at all times by gravitation into an existing storm-water sewer or channel.

2. *Distances from Boundaries or Other Buildings.*—Except as hereinafter provided, no dwelling-house with an external wall of wood or verandah attached thereto, and no addition with an external wall of wood to any dwelling-house, or verandah attached thereto, shall be built, constructed, or erected—

- (a) within a distance of 5 feet, measured horizontally, of any side, street, or road;
- (b) within a distance of 5 feet, measured horizontally, of any land not in the same possession or occupation;
- (c) within a distance of 10 feet, measured horizontally, of another building or erection with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation. Provided always that any such building or addition may abut on the building line of any street or road at the side of such building, or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom, or from land not in the same possession or occupation, or from a dwelling-house with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation; provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance of such street, road, or land not in the same possession or occupation, or building, as the case may be, shall be of concrete of approved thickness, or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness, projecting in all cases at least 1 inch beyond the woodwork front and back, and at least 1 foot through the roof, covering, or gutter adjoining the same.

3. All distances stipulated for any building from any boundary or other building shall be measured as from the nearest part or projection of such building or structure, other than eaves, to such boundary or nearest part of projection of the other building or structure. Verandahs shall, in the calculation of space occupied, be included as part of the dwelling-house to which they belong.

4. Every dwelling-house shall be provided with a kitchen, a bathroom, and a wash-house.

5. *Roofs.*—The roof of every building which is intended to be used as a dwelling-house shall be covered on the outside with incombustible and impervious coverings, and the walls of sound impervious coverings, and if of wood the material shall be sound weatherboards or block boarding, or asbestos sheeting.

6. *Height of Main Rooms.*—The main rooms in every dwelling-house hereafter built or rebuilt shall be every part not less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling, and no main room shall have a floor area less than 100 square feet. The minimum height for wash-house or bathroom shall be 8 feet.

- (a) Every main room and bathroom in a building used or intended to be used as a dwelling-house shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air, with a total superficies of glass clear of sash frames free from obstruction to light equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room, and so constructed that a substantial part of the windows equal to at least one-twentieth of the floor area can be opened for ventilation. The requirements of this sub-clause may under special circumstances be dispensed with or modified by the Council, but in such cases other approved provision for lighting or ventilation must be made. For the purpose of this clause the expression "main rooms" shall be deemed to mean and include rooms used or intended to be used as bedrooms, dining-rooms, ordinary living rooms, and kitchens.

(b) All rooms shall be ventilated by ventilators communicating directly with the outside air, placed near the ceiling of each room, and of an area satisfactory to the Council.

(c) The provisions of this clause in reference to the height, lighting, and ventilation of main rooms in dwelling-houses shall, as far as applicable, be extended to all shops.

7. *Attic Rooms*.—Every room wholly or partly in the roof of any building shall be at least 8 ft. 6 in. in height from floor to ceiling throughout not less than one-half its area.

8. In all buildings of brick, stone, or concrete, the materials and their compositions shall be subject to the approval of the surveyor.

9. *Height of External Walls, Wooden Buildings*.—The external walls of all wooden buildings shall not exceed in height 15 feet, measured from floor level to top of wall plates.

10. *Open Space at Rear of Buildings*.—Every building, with the exception of buildings rebuilt, must have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an enclosed back yard or open space at the rear of the building of at least 1,000 square feet, exclusive of any building thereon.

11. *Damp-proof Course*.—Every wall of brick or stone shall have two approved damp-proof courses of asphalt or other impervious material at approved levels for full width of walls.

12. *Ventilation Under Floors*.—The space under the ground floor of every building shall have sufficient openings through all walls and sleeper walls under floor, and an air space of at least 6 inches clear of all earth, such height being determined by the Council.

13. *Minimum Area of Dwelling-house*.—Every dwelling that is to be used or that is intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house only, and erected, built, or constructed on any land abutting on the streets or roads, or portions of the streets or roads, as defined in Second Schedule (2) hereto, shall cover on the ground floor an area of not less than 1,000 square feet. In all other parts of the municipal district the minimum area to be covered by such buildings shall be not less than 800 square feet on the ground floor.

(b) *Ascertainment of Area*.—In the ascertainment of the area covered, the area of verandahs forming part of the main building, but not exceeding 100 square feet in area, and the thickness of the external walls, will be allowed as part of the area covered, but no detached outbuildings or verandah area in excess of 100 square feet shall be so included.

14. *Minimum Area of Land for Dwelling*.—No person shall build any dwelling-house except in conformity with the following:—

(a) The site or curtilage of such dwelling-house shall have a superficial area of at least 9,000 feet, and have a frontage of not less than 60 feet to a street or road, and that except in cases of corner sites the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such sites. This subsection shall not apply to existing sites, but shall be enforced in all future subdivisions of land.

(b) The dwelling-house or other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any site or curtilage included in any subdivision of land made with the approval of the Council prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and not provided for in sub-clause (a) shall, except in the cases of corner sites, cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site or curtilage fronting a street or road.

(c) The dwelling-house or other building to be erected, built, or constructed upon any corner site or curtilage fronting to two streets or roads shall cover not more than one-third of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

15. *Minimum Area for Two Attached Houses*.—Not more than two houses shall be attached together. The minimum area upon which such attached houses may be erected shall be 5,250 square feet for each of such houses, and the minimum frontage of such area shall be 35 feet, and each of such houses shall have a clear space of not less than 10 feet along the side thereof.

16. *Minimum Area for Lock-up Shop or Combined Shop and Dwelling*.—Lock-up shops or shops having a dwelling-house or living compartment attached shall only be built on land having a frontage of not less than 20 feet by a depth of 120 feet, and shall have a yard or open space of 1,000 square feet at the least, apart from passages under 3 feet in width, exclusive of any building thereon. Provided that where any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore prescribed was, in the opinion of the Council, owned by any person prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the Council further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land, the Council may on application in writing, by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of members of the Council, at a meeting of which seven clear days' notice has been given, permit a shop to be erected upon such land.

17. *No Building Allotment to be Reduced in Area*.—No land upon which any dwelling-house has been erected shall thereafter be reduced in area below the minimum area prescribed by the By-law.

18. *Verandahs*.—(1) Every verandah constructed over the footway of any street shall be of the cantilever type, and not less than 9 feet in height or more than 12 feet in height, measured from the pavement to the underside of the cantilever girder at the building line. The Council shall stipulate the height at which the verandah shall be erected.

(2) The fascia of every such verandah shall finish flush with the kerb line in all cases. The cantilever and fascia girders shall not exceed 8 inches nor be less than 7 inches in depth for all verandahs 12 feet or under in width. The face girder shall be carried along the several frontages in true horizontal line, the lowest point being at a minimum height of 10 feet above the kerbing, and be carried along in that manner until the maximum height of 13 feet is reached, when the line shall be discontinued and shall re-commence at the minimum.

(3) In all cases the roof of the verandah shall slope inwards towards the building, and have a pitch of one-half of 1 inch per foot of width. All verandahs to which this regulation applies shall be covered with not less than No. 26 gauge galvanized corrugated iron, secured to purlins with galvanized iron bolts or clips and washers at the top of the corrugation. The iron shall be lapped two corrugations at the sides, and not less than 9 inches at the ends of the sheets, and shall be riveted every 12 inches at sides and every third corrugation at the ends. Purlins may be of either wood, tee or angle iron. Box gutters shall be formed at or near the building line, and shall be made out of not less than No. 24 gauge galvanized sheet iron, well lapped, riveted, and double-soldered at every joint, and be supported on metal straps.

(4) Down-pipes shall be of sufficient number and capacity to efficiently discharge all water falling on or running from or off the verandah roof. Down-pipes shall be of wrought or cast iron, chased into walls or piers to a height of not less than 8 ft. 6 in. above the pavement, and shall discharge by a wrought-iron pipe or pipes under footway into street channels.

(5) Skylights glazed with wired rolled plate-glass in single lengths and set in approved glazing bars, may be provided in verandahs.

(6) The whole of the work shall be executed in accordance with this specification, and subject to the satisfaction and approval of the surveyor. All eyes in walls to fascias and rod eyes to be welded.

OUTBUILDINGS.

19. *Privies, Closets, &c.*—No privy, closet, or urinal shall without the consent of the Council be erected at a less distance than 30 feet from the door or window of any dwelling-house on the same allotment or allotments adjoining, or at a less distance than 30 feet from any street, and shall in every case be effectively screened from public view. Provided that in case there is a right-of-way abutting on such allotment, any privy, closet, or urinal may be erected on the boundary between such allotment and right-of-way.

20. *Fowl-houses*.—No fowl-house shall be erected or remain at a less distance than 50 feet from any building used as a dwelling-house on the same allotment or allotments adjoining. No building of the description referred to in this clause of the By-law shall be erected except at the rear of any dwelling-house on the same allotment.

21. *Outbuildings, except stables and cow sheds*, of not more than two squares in area, and not exceeding 9 feet in height, may be erected on any boundary, provided—

- that any such outbuilding is 20 feet distant from the frontage of any road or street;
- that any such outbuilding is 25 feet distant from the frontage of any side road or street;
- that any such outbuilding is 10 feet distant from any building used as a dwelling-house on the same allotment or on any allotment adjoining.

22. *Outbuildings exceeding two squares in area, or 9 feet in height, including roof structures or erections, for storage of timber or other materials*, may be erected, provided—

- that any such outbuilding complies with all the conditions and limitations of this By-law;
- that any such outbuilding complies with the requirements in regard to outbuildings set forth in the preceding clause.

23. *Stables and cow sheds may be erected, provided—*

- that any such stable or cow shed is 100 feet distant from the frontage of any road or street;
- that any such stable or cow shed is 30 feet distant from the frontage of any side road or street;
- that any such stable or cow shed is 30 feet distant from any building used as a dwelling-house on the same allotment or on any allotment adjoining;
- that any such stable or cow shed is 5 feet distant from land not in the same occupation, or if less than 5 feet distant from land not in the same occupation, is built with a 9-inch brick dividing wall having a parapet 12 inches high above its own roof or gutters;
- that manure pits are suitably covered to the satisfaction of the surveyor and comply with the foregoing conditions, as to distance, &c.

24. Motor garages of single story may be built in wood, iron, brick, stone, or concrete on the boundaries of adjoining occupations, provided—

- (a) that any such motor garage is at least 50 feet distant from the frontage of any road or street;
- (b) that any such motor garage is at least 25 feet distant from the frontage of any side road or street;
- (c) that the floor area does not exceed 3 squares;
- (d) that the over-all height does not exceed 9 feet;
- (e) that where the over-all height exceeds 9 feet a parapet wall of brick, stone, or concrete shall be erected on the boundary.

25. Motor garages exceeding 3 squares may be built in wood, iron, brick, stone, or concrete anywhere in the municipal district, provided that they comply with clauses (a) and (b) of the preceding clause, and the conditions and limitations of this By-law in regard to buildings.

26. *Tents and Sleeping-out Rooms.*—No person shall erect, or cause or permit to be erected, any building, tent, or buildings intended to be used as sleeping-out rooms detached from the main dwelling unless the following conditions are complied with, namely:—

- (a) No detached sleeping-out room or tent shall be erected on any land unless a dwelling-house has already been erected thereon, and the area of such land on which such dwelling stands is not less than 5,000 square feet.
- (b) No sleeping-out room or tent shall be erected unless the area of the floor thereof shall be not less than 80 square feet nor more than 300 square feet, and shall have a minimum floor dimension in any one way of not less than 8 feet; with floors constructed with wood.
- (c) Such buildings are distant not less than 50 feet from the building line of the street or road to which such property has a frontage.
- (d) Are distant not less than 20 feet from any other street or road exceeding 25 feet in width.
- (e) Are distant not less than 5 feet from any other boundary of the allotment on which the same stands.
- (f) The height of the walls of such sleeping-out rooms or tents shall not be less than 8 feet measured vertically from the floor, and the outside walls shall be boarded up for at least half their height.
- (g) An air space for ventilation, either open or with a gauze covering, shall be provided along the top of each wall equal in area to one-third of the floor area.
- (h) Not more than one person for each 40 square feet of interior floor space shall be permitted to sleep in any sleeping-out room or tent.
- (i) In this clause, sleeping-out room shall mean any room, building, or erection detached from any dwelling, and used for no purpose other than as a sleeping apartment.

27. *Projections.*—No coping, cornice, string course, fascia windows, window dressing, portico, balcony, balconette, bridge connecting building, balustrade, and architectural projection, or decoration, shall project beyond the building line of any street or alley unless it be of brick, stone, tile, artificial stone, slate, cement, or fire-resisting material other than wood. No projection shall extend more than 3 inches beyond the building line at any height less than 10 feet from the level of the footway. Every porch, gangway, outside landing, and outside step shall be of fire-resisting material, and shall not project beyond the building line of any street or alley.

28. *Hoardings, Sign-boards, &c.*—Save as hereinafter provided, no person shall erect, alter, or add to any hoarding, sign-board, or erection for advertising purposes without first obtaining consent of the Council, and unless such hoarding, sign-board, or erection is erected, built, or constructed, altered, or added to in accordance with the plan and specification prepared by such person, and previously approved of by the Council. No hoarding, sign-board, or erection shall be within a distance from the building line of any street or road equal to the greatest height of such hoarding, sign-board, or erection, and the lowest part of such hoarding, other than the main supports thereof, shall not be less than 3 feet from the level of the land.

29. *Green-houses, Ferneries, Fences, Builders' Sheds Exempted.*—This By-law shall not apply to any fence, green-house, fernery, or conservatory, or to any shed on areas of more than 5 acres used entirely for agricultural or gardening purposes, or to the temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any buildings at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding six months.

30. Provided always that, notwithstanding anything herein provided to the contrary, the Council may, on application in writing, setting forth the grounds of the application, under special circumstances, and for special causes, and at a meeting of which due notice has been given to each councillor, declare that the provisions of this By-law, either in whole or in part, shall not apply to any particular area of land, or any particular building.

31. *Excavations, Foundations, and Footings.*—(a) All excavations for footings of buildings other than wood shall be taken down to a solid bottom, to be approved by the surveyor, but not less than an average of 18 inches in depth below the natural surface of the ground, except in the case of construction of footing approved by the surveyor, and no footing or foundation shall, except with the written consent of the surveyor, be of less width than 8 inches wider than the wall standing thereon. Should the excavation or foundation finish on a clay bottom, the excavated trenches shall be covered with a layer of 3 inches of approved sand before the concrete is put in. No footing or foundation shall be commenced to be placed in position until at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given to the surveyor that the trenches are ready for inspection, and have been inspected and approved by him. If the trenches, in the opinion of the surveyor, are not ready, and additional inspections become necessary, such fees as set out in Schedule "A" shall be paid for each additional inspection.

(b) The surface of the ground between all walls of buildings shall be levelled up higher than the finished surface outside, and evenly graded to prevent any accumulation of water or drainage beneath the floors.

(c) Every pier and story post, as well as every external wall and every party wall, shall have footings.

(d) Every building must have a footing which, by itself or with a foundation, is at least 21 inches in height.

(e) In the case of wooden buildings where wooden stumps are used for the foundations, such stumps shall consist of redgum or jarrah, and be not less than 4 inches by 4 inches, spaced not more than 4 feet apart, sunk not less than 18 inches below the natural surface of the ground, and shall rest on sole plates of a size and upon a bottom approved by the surveyor.

PART IV.

MATERIALS.

1. Bricks used in any building shall be good, hard, and well burnt. When old bricks are used in any wall, they shall be thoroughly cleaned before being so used, and shall be whole and good, hard, well-burnt bricks.

2. Sand used for mortar in any building shall be clean and sharp, free from loam, dirt, and salt or organic matter.

3. Lime mortar shall be composed of freshly-burnt lime and sand in the proportions of at least one part by measure of lime, and not more than three parts by measure of sand. All lime intended to be used for mortar shall be thoroughly burnt, of good quality, and be properly slacked before being mixed with the sand.

4. Cement mortar shall be composed of good Portland cement, or other cement of equal quality approved of by the surveyor, mixed with clean, sharp sand in the proportions of at least one part by measure of cement and not more than four parts by measure of sand.

5. Concrete for foundations shall be composed of clean broken stone or other hard material approved by the surveyor, broken to a gauge not exceeding 2 inches, and sand, well mixed on a wooden floor with freshly-burnt lime, hydraulic lime, or cement, in the proportions of one part by measure of lime to not more than five parts, or one part of cement to not more than six parts of the other materials.

6. All timbers and wooden beams used in any building shall be good, sound material, free from rot, large or loose knots, shakes, or any other imperfections whereby the strength may be impaired, and shall be of such sizes, dimensions, and spacings as set forth in Third Schedule of this By-law.

7. Roofs shall be covered with tiles, slates, metal, or other material approved by the surveyor.

8. In the construction of all wooden buildings, except sheds, vermin plates shall be used.

9. The interior of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used, or shall or may be used, as a dwelling-house shall be finished in plaster, wood, or other approved material.

PART V.

SEPTIC TANKS.

Septic Tank Installation.—No person shall build, construct, or put in any septic tank, or septic tank installation, or other works, or works for the reception, screening, disintegration, precipitation, settlement, clarification, oxidation, or purification of drainage matter without the consent in writing of the surveyor, subject to review by the Council, and such consent shall be given only upon written application by the person desiring such consent, and such application shall be supported by plan, drawings, and specifications in duplicate of such septic tank, or septic tank installation, which shall fully disclose the situation of the proposed work relatively to the nearest habitable building, human food stores, public thoroughfare, well bore, or other source of water supply, also the nature of the intended process of treating the drainage of residual solids, liquids, or gases thereof, so that nuisance or injury to health shall not be caused thereby; also the form, material, dimensions, levels, and the extent of the work, and the data concerning the character, volume, and extreme rates of flow of the drainage upon which the design thus disclosed shall have been based. A fee of 5s. must be lodged with application.

PART VI.
REMOVED BUILDINGS.

1. *Removed Building Prohibited.*—From and after the date of this By-law coming into force, it shall not be lawful for any person to remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported, any wooden building from any place without the municipality of the Borough of Ringwood for the purpose of re-erecting the same within any part of the said municipality (except as hereinafter provided in clause 2), and such prohibition shall apply to every wooden building or erection, whether removed in whole or in sections or in parts.

Exemption.—The foregoing prohibition shall, however, not apply to temporary offices or sheds used by builders on or about the site of any building being erected, repaired, or altered, or used by contractors in carrying out works for any public body or corporation, provided that such offices or sheds are used exclusively for the purpose of such buildings or works. Such exemption shall, however, only continue during the time occupied in completing such building or work, and in any case shall not exceed a period of six months except by special permission of the Council.

2. *Small Buildings.*—The Council may, however, in its discretion, grant permission for the removal from without the municipality and re-erection within the municipality of any wooden building not exceeding 3 squares in superficial area for use as a stable, workshop, shed, or outbuilding, subject to the following provisions being complied with:—

Application for permission must be made to the Council in writing, and must be accompanied by the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building or erection proposed to be removed.
- (b) The situation of the land on which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.
- (c) The external dimensions and height of such building.
- (d) The purpose for which such building is to be used when re-erected.
- (e) The purpose for which it was being used prior to its removal.

The Council, upon receipt of such application, and on payment of the hereinafter mentioned fee for inspection, may cause the building or erection to be inspected by its surveyor before removal, and, in its discretion, re-erection within the municipality, subject to such conditions as it may see fit to impose.

3. *Removal Within the Municipality.*—Nothing, however, herein contained shall prevent the Council from granting permission for the removal of a wooden building from one part of the municipality and its re-erection in another part of the municipality, subject to the following conditions being complied with:—

Application for such permission must be made to the Council in writing, and must be accompanied by the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is intended to remove.
- (b) The situation of the land on which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.
- (c) The purpose for which such building is to be used when re-erected.
- (d) The purpose for which such building was used before removal.
- (e) A ground plan giving the dimensions of the building, including the alterations or additions thereto (if any), and an elevation and a vertical section of the building; also a tracing or copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.
- (f) A specification giving particulars of the construction, sizes of timber, &c., of the existing building, and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is re-erected.

The Council, on receipt of such application, and on payment of the hereinafter mentioned fees for inspection, may, before the building is removed, cause the building to be inspected by its surveyor, and may, in its discretion, either refuse permission or grant permission for its removal and re-erection, subject to such conditions as it may see fit to impose.

4. Any permission given under this Part shall be in writing, and signed by the Town Clerk of the municipality.

5. *Building to Comply with By-law.*—Every building for the removal of which permission has been granted shall, when re-erected, comply with all the provisions of this By-law.

6. *Wooden Buildings Defined.*—For the purpose of this Part, wooden buildings shall be deemed to include every building or erection the framework of which is of wood, whether covered with timber, iron, or other material.

7. Nothing, however, contained in clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Part shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands, provided that such building when so altered is otherwise in compliance with the provisions of this By-law.

PART VII.
GENERAL.

1. *Putting Down and Removal of Buildings.*—If the surveyor shall certify in writing that any building has been removed into or re-erected within the municipality contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building has been left in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be unsightly or dangerous to the public, the owner of such building upon receiving from the Council, its Town Clerk, or its surveyor, a notice in writing requiring him to alter or repair or pull down or remove the said building, shall alter or repair or remove or pull down such building within the time limited by such notice; and if default shall be made in complying with such notice the Council may, on the expiration of the time therein limited, cause such building to be pulled down or removed, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the costs and expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

2. *Unsightly or Dangerous Fence.*—When, in the opinion of the Council, any fence abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road within the municipal district is in a dangerous or unsightly state, the Council may, by notice in writing to be served on the owner of such fence, secure or repair such fence as the case may require.

3. *Government and Municipal Buildings Exempted.*—This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the State of Victoria, or the Borough of Ringwood.

4. *Authority to Inspect.*—The surveyor or inspector duly authorized, at all reasonable times during the progress and during fourteen days next after the completion of any building or addition to any building affected by any of the provisions of this By-law, may and is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition, and the owner or builder thereof shall produce to the surveyor or inspector for the time being for inspection the original plans and specifications approved by the Council for the building demanded by him.

5. *Action by Council Prescribed if Building Contrary to By-law.*—If any building shall be partly or wholly built contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council, by its Town Clerk, surveyor, or other authorized officer, may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building, fourteen days' notice in writing to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council, by its surveyor or other authorized agent, to enter upon such building, and on the site thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen, and for the purpose of breaking down any fence surrounding the land on which such building is situated, and to demolish and pull down the said building, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council, its Town Clerk, surveyor, or other authorized officer in demolishing and pulling down the said building, or any parts thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore any surplus, if any, arising from such sale to such owner or builder, or other person legally entitled thereto on demand.

6. *Notice to Surveyor to Inspect.*—Seven days' notice shall be given in writing by the builder to the surveyor, at the Town Hall, Ringwood, that the framing of any building being erected under the provisions of this By-law is completed and ready for inspection.

7. (1) *Dispensation.*—Notwithstanding anything in this By-law contained or implied, the Council, in any special case or under exceptional circumstances (of which it shall be the sole judge), may by resolution dispense with any of the requirements of this By-law, either permanently or temporarily, for such period as it may deem fit, and subject to such terms and conditions as it may see fit to impose.

(2) *Conditions to be Observed.*—Where any dispensation has been granted subject to any terms or conditions as aforesaid, such terms and conditions shall be observed and performed by the applicant in accordance with the tenor thereof.

(3) *Passing of Resolution.*—The resolution hereinbefore mentioned may be dealt with at any ordinary meeting as extraordinary business of which previous notice has been given, and may be carried by a majority of the members of the Council present at such meeting.

Penalties.—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

PART VIII.

SCAFFOLDING INSPECTION ACT.

1. Written notice of intention to erect scaffolding (other than scaffolding to be used solely by painters) shall in all cases be given by post or otherwise to the inspector of the municipality in which such scaffolding is to be erected, at least twenty-four hours before the erection of such scaffolding is begun.

2. Any person who commences to set up or erect any scaffolding, unless such notice has been given and such period of twenty-four hours has elapsed, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

3. All scaffolding and all gear being used in connexion therewith shall comply with the requirements of the regulations in the Schedule to this Act, and shall be set up, erected, maintained, and used in accordance with such regulations.

PART IX.

DEFINITIONS.

In this By-law, save where the context is inconsistent therewith—

“Surveyor” means the surveyor, engineer, or acting engineer for the time being of the said borough.

“Council” means the Council of the Borough of Ringwood.

“Dwelling-house” means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

“Hoarding” means any board or sign used for advertising, direction, or display purposes, greater in either dimension than 3 feet.

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk, or Acting Town Clerk, for the time being of the said borough.

“Shop” means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale, or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment, and also includes saloons or shops of barbers and hairdressers, offices of agents and auctioneers. A bona fide private boarding-house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied to persons other than boarders.

“Street” or “road” means and includes street and road, and private road, and private street, as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 3.

“Building” includes any structure capable of affording protection or shelter, either roofed or intended to be roofed, and whether enclosed by walls or not.

“Builder” includes owner or occupier of the premises whereon any building is being erected or built, master builder or other person employed to execute any work.

PART X.

SPECIAL CLAUSE.

All shops erected on railway land fronting main Whitehorse-road are to be of a modern uniform design, to be approved of by the Council, and must conform to the levels as directed by the engineer.

The fee for permission to erect a tent covers only a permit to erect a tent during the year ending 30th September of the annual period during which the tent may have been erected. If it is desired to retain the tent a fresh permit must be obtained on or before the 1st day of October in each year. The decision of the Council or the surveyor, subject to review by the Council, as to the area of a new building or the value of an addition under this clause, shall be final and conclusive.

No portion of these fees will be returned. Permit must be taken out before the road is opened, otherwise legal proceedings will be instituted.

Permit must be kept on the job, so as to be available whenever demanded.

Permit is granted subject to the conditions printed hereinafter.

The engineer may insist upon any plumber or workman engaged in any work such as pipe laying, &c., boring under the road instead of making an open cut, if he considers it practicable.

CONDITIONS ON WHICH PERMISSION TO OPEN GROUNDS IN THE BOROUGH OF RINGWOOD IS ISSUED.

Excavating.—In all cases, the earth used for filling trenches, &c., must be wetted and thoroughly rammed with a heavy rammer every 6 inches.

Pitching.—In re-laying pitchers, they are to be set on at least 3 inches of good sand, with close joints properly flushed up with sand, well rammed, impervious joints grouted at least 3 inches deep with cement mortar, or tar and sand.

Kerbing.—All holes required in kerb are to be neatly cut out to the size and shape of the pipe or shoot, and to come through at the joints, one-half of the opening in each stone. Any broken stone to be replaced by new one at the expense of the person disturbing the street.

Metal.—Whenever a metal roadway is disturbed, the trench is to be filled as before described, and afterwards covered with 6 inches of good clean metal, properly spread, and left clear of all obstructions.

Gravel or Screenings.—All unflagged footpaths, after having the trench filled in as before described, are to be covered with good, clean gravel or bluestone screenings at least 2 inches thick, properly spread, and finished level with the rest of the footpath; and, in the case of asphalt, to be re-asphalted.

Tap Covers.—Whenever an asphalt path is opened for the purpose of getting at the water pipe for any purpose, a proper cover must be placed over the stop tap. They are to be set perfectly square with kerb, 6 inches from the building line, neatly finished into 1-inch rebate, and run with molten lead, the rebate being so cut that the space allowed for lead shall not be more than one-quarter of an inch.

Temporary Crossing.—Whenever permission is obtained for the purpose of carting across a footpath, temporary crossing must be formed by placing a bridge over the channel and planks on the footpath, and adopting such other means as may be pointed out by the surveyor or his representative, so as to protect the footpath and channel from damage without impeding the water-course.

Service Pipes.—All water service pipes from the mains shall be laid at least 1 foot from the service, so as to ensure freedom from damage as far as possible. Service pipes must not be laid longitudinally under footpaths, pitched channels, or in water channels, unless expressly allowed by the regulations of the Council, which are in all cases to be observed.

Responsibility.—The recipient of this permit is responsible for all damages resulting to the public from its exercise.

NOTE.—(a) Should the above conditions not be properly carried out, a further charge sufficient to bring the work into conformity with these conditions will be made.

DETERMINATION OF THE BRICKLAYERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 9th October, 1925, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than labourers) wheresoever employed in the process, trade, or business of a bricklayer" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 9th October, 1925, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) ALLOWANCES.—The following extra rates shall be paid to any persons wheresoever employed:—

1. (a) On all work distant from the centre two miles and up to six miles, 6d. per day or portion of a day.
- (b) On all work distant from the centre over six miles and up to twelve miles, 9d. per day or portion of a day.
- (c) On all work distant from the centre over twelve miles and up to twenty miles, 1s. per day or portion of a day.

"Centre" shall be taken to mean the Melbourne General Post Office for the metropolitan district, and shall in all other cases mean the chief post office of the city, town, borough, or shire in or nearest to which the employee resides.

Provided always that where the locality of the work is nearer to the employee's residence than to the centre, all distances shall be reckoned from the employee's residence, which in such case shall be deemed to be the centre.

(4) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.—The time of beginning and ending work for persons (other than those employed on sewerage work, drainage work, or underground work not connected with building construction) shall be—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
7.45 a.m.	5.15 p.m. on each of five days in the week.
and 7.45 a.m.	12 noon on the other working day of the week on which the half-holiday is usually observed.

(5) OVERTIME.—(a) Persons employed on sewerage work, drainage work, or underground work not connected with building construction shall be paid—

For work done in excess of 44 hours in any week Time and a quarter.

(b) Persons employed on any other work shall be paid—

For work done within the hours fixed as the time of beginning and ending work in excess of 44 hours in any week Time and a quarter.

For work done on the weekly half-holiday—

Between 12 noon and 5 p.m. Double time.

Between 5 p.m. and midnight Double time.

For work done on the other working days of the week—

Between 5.15 p.m. and 8 p.m. Time and a half.

Between 8 p.m. and midnight Double time.

Between midnight and 7.45 a.m. Double time.

(6) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—All work done on—

Sundays, Good Friday, and Easter Monday, 26th January (Foundation Day), 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted.

PIECE-WORK.

(7) That the lowest piece-work prices which may be paid to any person for doing any of the undermentioned kinds of work shall be those fixed in the following Schedule, viz. :—
