Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the State Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, the 31st October, 1925. An entry on the proper form must also, on or before such date, be lodged with the Registrar of the Melbourne University, and candidates must state therein that they have entered for the Public Service Examination, and indicate the subjects they desire to be examined in for that examination.

The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School Leaving or School Intermediate Examination, as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which, and forms of application (both Public Service and University) may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, on or before Saturday, the 21st November, 1925, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Fifteen shillings (15s.). No fee is payable to the University if a candidate enters for the Public Service Examination only.

Fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks (25 from those who pass the School Leaving and 25 from those who pass the School Intermediate Examination). Candidates must, on the first day of the examination, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty-one years at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £91, rising to a maximum of £273 a year, with a long-service increment of £13 a year.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any eligible returned sailor or soldier. Provided his certificate of discharge is furnished with his application, he may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £234 a year.

NAVIGATION OF RIVER MURRAY.

IN connexion with the construction of bridges across the River Murray in the vicinity of Gonn Crossing and Euston, masters of steamers are hereby cautioned that they must pass all obstructions in the river connected with bridge building operations at "dead slow."

No vessel proceeding down stream will be allowed to tow punt or barge through the openings—they must be drifted through. When proceeding up stream punts or barges must be towed in single file.

RIVER MURRAY.—COFFER-DAM, No. 11 LOCK.

MASTERS of vessels and others plying on the River Murray are advised that a coffer-dam at Lock No. 11, about half a mile below Mildura Wharf, is in course of construction. A channel for the use of river craft will be kept on the right-hand side of the river proceeding downstream. The open channel, which will have a minimum width of about 200 feet, will be marked as follows:—

By Day.—On the right-hand side of the channel proceeding downstream a black beacon with diamond-shaped top. On the left-hand side of the channel a red beacon with circular top.

By Night (from sunset to sunrise).—On the right-hand side, one green light. On the left-hand side, one red light.

The position of the right-hand marks will be subject to alteration without notice from time to time as the work progresses.

Steamers, approaching the works at No. 11 Lock, with intention to pass, must blow two long blasts on the whistle when half a mile away from the lock if bound downstream and one long blast if bound upstream, and must pass the coffer-dam at a moderate speed.

Should circumstances at any time render it impossible or dangerous for steamers to pass the works, by day a red flag will be hoisted on the right-hand (black) beacon, and vessels must not attempt to pass until such flag has been hauled down, but must anchor or make fast to the bank, if necessary, until it is indicated by the flag being hauled down that the channel is clear; by night a red light under the green light will be used instead of the flag used by day.

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Woomelang Urban District within the Sea Lake Waterworks District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty-three pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty-three pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1925, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1926, and shall be payable on the 23rd day of October, 1925, at the office of the said Commission, at Birchip.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

## MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW No. 19.

THE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1926 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said district:—

1. For every house or tenement fronting any street wherein a pipe for the supply of water shall have been laid, or where houses or tenements if not fronting such streets are supplied with water by reticulation, and being of an annual valuation of Ten pounds (£10) or under, the sum of One pound (£1).
2. For every house or tenement so situated of an annual value of above Ten pounds (£10), the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.
3. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under situated in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.).
4. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of One shilling in the pound on the annual value of such property.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1926, and shall be payable on the first January, 1926.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

8. Water supplied to Government departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Trust area, shall be by measure or special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of water supplied by special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. In cases of large consumers of water by meter, the Trust by special agreement may make a reduction to not less than Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. A charge of 7½d. per 1,000 gallons will be made to the Wimmera Inland Freezing Co. for pumping water.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the previous clauses, the minimum charge for water supplied by measurement or under special agreement must not be less than the charge would be if the property was rated in the usual way according to the shire valuation. This By-law also applies to the freezing works.

11. On properties where the officers consider it necessary, a meter will be ordered to be put on, and in case of non-compliance the water will be cut off, according to the powers conferred by the Water Acts.

RE-DEFINITION OF THE AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD CARTERS BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Order, that is to say:—

The area or locality within which the Determination of the Bread Carters Board shall be operative shall be the metropolitan district as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the Towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell, and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk, Echuca, Hamilton, Sebastopol, and Wonthaggi; the Moorpanya Riding of the Shire of Corio; the Township of Kangaroo Flat in the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye; such portions of the Shires of Ballarat, Bungaree, Buninyong, and Grenville as are within a radius of 3 miles of the Ballarat Post Office; such portion of the Shire of Hampden as is within a radius of 2 miles of the Camperdown Post Office; such portion of the Shire of Huntly as is within a radius of 10 miles of the Bendigo Post Office; and such portion of the Shire of South Barwon as is within a radius of 5 miles of the Geelong Post Office.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE WEST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF BALLAN.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the West Riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Ballan of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of February, 1916, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within the West Riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Ballan, shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

REGULATION OF BOOKSELLERS' AND NEWS-AGENTS' SHOPS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) of the particular class or kind to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All booksellers' and news-agents' shops (being shops of a class or kind mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within the metropolitan district as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, shall be closed in each and every week during the whole of each year from the hour of—

(a) Seven o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday;

(b) Nine o'clock on the evening of Friday;

(c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Saturday;

and such closed shops shall be permitted to reopen on the evening of Saturday in each week from the hour of Five o'clock until Nine o'clock.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## GOROKE TO MOREA RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST.

## REGULATION No. 1.

At the State Government House, Melbourne, the twelfth day of October, 1925.

## REGULATIONS FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, AND GENERALLY FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE TRUST.

WHEREAS by section 32 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1915* (8 Geo. V. No. 2715) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes following:—

- (a) Prescribing the mode in which the meetings of the members of Trusts under this Act are to be convened;
- (b) prescribing the form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under this Act;
- (c) regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of every such Trust and the numbers of members to form a quorum thereof, and the appointment of the chairman of each Trust; and
- (d) generally for carrying into effect the provisions of this Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of section 32 of the above-recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, and known as the Goroke to Morea Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulations following, viz:—

1. *First Meeting*.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
2. *Time and Place of Meeting*.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
3. *Quorums of Meetings*.—There shall be present at least three members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of two members, exclusive of the Chairman.
4. *Chairman*.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal Council of his district, and may be willing to act.
5. *Vacancy of Chairman, how Filled*.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.
6. *Appointment by Minister*.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal Council of his district, and be willing to act.
7. *Vice-Chairman*.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.
8. *Special Meetings*.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
9. *General Conduct of Business*.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
10. *Meetings, Notice of*.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.
11. *Minutes of Meeting to be Read at Subsequent Meeting*.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting of a question for the confirmation

of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

12. *Order of Business of Meetings*.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

13. *Addresses to the Governor in Council*.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

14. *Motions*.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

15. *Notice of Motion to be Given*.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

16. *Petitions*.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

17. *Motions to be Moved in Order*.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

18. *Motion to be Moved by Member giving Notice*.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

19. *Mover of Motion Appointing Committee to be a Member*.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

20. *Draft of Address or Petition to be Submitted at Previous Meeting*.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

21. *Order, &c., of Debate*.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair may proceed with his subject.

22. *Nature of Motion to be Stated*.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

23. *No Motion to be Withdrawn without Leave*.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

24. *Motion to be Seconded*.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

25. *Mover of Motion*.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

26. *Motions, &c., how Decided*.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

27. *Resolutions, how Revoked or Altered.*—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

28. *Priority of Members.*—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.

29. *Members to Stand while Addressing the Trust.*—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

30. *Points of Order.*—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

31. *Members not to Digress.*—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

32. *Members to Apologize for Disorderly or Offensive Expressions.*—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

33. *Members Called to Order to Sit Down.*—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

34. *Members Twice Offending to be Liable to a Penalty.*—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

35. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

36. *Members may Demand Documents.*—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

37. *No second Amendment until Previous One Disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

38. *Mover of Motion to have Right of Reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

39. *No Discussion on Motion for Adjournment of Trust.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

40. *Protests.*—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

41. *Lapsed Questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. *Lapsed Order of the Day may be Restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

43. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committee shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

44. *Meetings of Committees.*—The Secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the committee.

45. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

46. *No Debate shall take place upon Petitions.*—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

47. *Secretary.*—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

48. *Treasurer.*—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

49. *Collector.*—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

50. *Appointment, &c. of Officers.*—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

51. *Salaries of Officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

52. *Expense of Preparing Security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

53. *Common Seal.*—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

54. *Suspension of Rules.*—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

55. *Penalty.*—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And the Honorable Frederic William Eggleston, His Majesty's Minister of Railways for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**Infectious Diseases Hospital Act 1914 (No. 2493).  
REGULATIONS.—INFECTIOUS DISEASES HOSPITAL  
ELECTION.**

At State Government House, Melbourne, the twelfth day of October, 1925.

PRESENT:

His Excellency, the Governor of Victoria.

Dr. Argyle | Mr. Eggleston.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Infectious Diseases Hospital Act 1914* to make regulations with respect to the times for and manner of conducting elections of members of the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital Board under the said Act, and the appointment and duty of Returning Officers, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the regulations following (that is to say):—

**Short Title.**

1. These regulations may be cited as the "Infectious Diseases Hospital Election Regulations 1925."

2. All regulations heretofore made relating to matters herein provided for are hereby repealed.

*Chief Health Officer under Health Act 1919 to be Returning Officer.*

3. The Chief Health Officer under the *Health Act 1919* for the time being (hereinafter referred to as the "Returning Officer") shall be the Returning Officer in connexion with the conduct of elections under the Act and these regulations, or in the event of a vacancy in that office, or during the temporary absence or incapacity of the holder thereof, such other person as the Governor in Council shall from time to time appoint.

*Council of City of Melbourne to Nominate on Receiving Notice.*

4. In the month of August in the year 1926, and in the same month in every third year thereafter, on or before a day to be specified by the Returning Officer and notified in the *Government Gazette* and by circular to such Council, the Council of the City of Melbourne may nominate a suitable person to be its representative member on the Hospital Board. On receiving notice of such nomination, the Returning Officer shall by notice in the *Government Gazette* declare such person so nominated to be duly elected to be the member of the Hospital Board for the City of Melbourne.

*Municipalities Composing Group to Nominate Member.*

5. In the month of August in the year 1926, and in the same month in every third year thereafter, on or before a day to be specified by the Returning Officer and notified in the *Government Gazette* and by circular to each Council, the Council of each of the municipalities composing the "A" Group, the "B" Group, the "C" Group, the "D" Group, and the "E" Group (as the case may be) may nominate a suitable person to be a representative member for such group on the Hospital Board.

*Mode of Nominating Representatives.*

6. In the Council of the City of Melbourne the proceedings for the nomination of representatives on the Hospital Board shall be conducted as nearly as may be in the same way as the election of the Lord Mayor is conducted, and in the Councils of other municipalities the proceedings for the nomination of representative members shall be conducted as nearly as may be in the same way as the elections of the chairman of the Council are conducted.

*If only One Person Nominated, Returning Officer to Declare Elected.*

7. If on the day so specified and notified only one candidate is nominated by any group, the Returning Officer shall by notice in the *Government Gazette* declare such candidate so nominated to be a representative member for such group.

*If More than One Person Nominated by Group, Returning Officer to Supply Voting Lists.*

8. If on the day so specified and notified the number of candidates so nominated for any group exceeds the number to be elected therefor, the Returning Officer shall for each such group prepare a list of the names of all persons so nominated for such group, and shall send one of such lists to the Council of each and every municipality composing such group. Each such Council shall place the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom it votes as its first preference, and shall place the figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on, as the case requires) opposite each name on the list, so as to indicate the order of preference. The Council shall return such list, filled up as directed, to the Returning Officer before the day specified by him on such list.

*On Day Specified, Returning Officer to Count Votes.*

9. On the day so specified, the Returning Officer shall count in the manner hereinafter provided all votes received by him from the Councils composing each group, and shall by notice in the *Government Gazette* declare the candidate shown by the voting to be entitled (having regard, if there be more than one candidate, to the order of preference disclosed by a consideration of the figures placed opposite the names of the several candidates on each of the lists returned by the Councils concerned) to be a representative member of such group on the Hospital Board.

*Mode of Conducting Elections.*

10. Incidental to the election of representative members under preferential voting conditions, the procedure (so far as the same can be conveniently applied) laid down in Division 14 Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, shall be followed by the several Councils concerned and the Returning Officer hereunder respectively.

*No Election to be Questioned for Certain Defects.*

11. No election shall be liable to be questioned by reason only of any Council from any cause whatsoever not having nominated a representative, or not having received from or returned to the Returning Officer a list as aforesaid, or by reason of any defect whatever in the constitution of any such Council, or in relation to any nomination or election.

And the Honorable Stanley Seymour Argyle, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND  
MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE PARISHES  
OF NEPEAN AND FINGAL, KNOWN AS "OCEAN  
PARK."

WE, William Henry Brown, William Henry Goss, William Henry Hurley, David Macfarlan, William Herman Schroeder, Henry William Burdett Coutts Wilson, Walter Spinner Henry Stringer, and James Wilson Tayton, the majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve in the Parishes of Nepean and Fingal, known as "Ocean Park," Sorrento, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations the word "Park" shall embrace the whole of the Reserve known as "Ocean Park," including that portion of the beach abutting thereon to low water mark, and the word "committee" shall mean the members for the time being of the committee of management of such Reserve.
2. No person shall disturb the soil within the Park in any manner or for any purpose, or erect any bathing box, tent, pavilion, building, fence, wall, bridge, or other structure without the previous consent, in writing, of the committee. Such consent may be issued subject to such orders, terms, fees, and conditions as are deemed desirable by the committee, which shall have the power to collect and receive all tolls, entrance fees, or other charges in connexion with the Park.
3. No person shall bathe from the shore of the Park unless attired in a proper bathing trunk or bathing dress, or such other costume as shall be necessary to preserve public decency.
4. No person shall kindle or maintain any fire within the Park without leave of the officer appointed by the committee, and then only in such place as he shall indicate; and no person shall cut or in any way injure or interfere with the timber, trees, shrubs, flowers, wells, or birds, or with any vegetation, or break or damage the rocks in the caves and arches, or the thatchings in the banks, or commit any nuisance in the Park.
5. No person shall climb, walk, or jump or get upon or over the thatched banks or any of the fences or gates of the Park, or cut, carve, break, or in any way remove, injure, or damage any of such fences or gates, or any of the seats, buildings, bowers, posts, fences, gates, pavilions, rooms, or other erections therein, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any of such fences, gates, seats, or buildings, or roll or throw stones or missiles, or leave any bottle, glass, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter or rubbish in the Park.
6. No person shall hawk, or sell or offer for sale in the Park anything of any description without the previous written permission of the committee.

7. No person shall ride or drive any horse, bicycle, tricycle, or vehicle of any description upon the footpaths in the Park, and no vehicle plying for hire shall be allowed to proceed beyond the upper turntable without permission of the Park Ranger.

8. No person shall behave in the Park in a disorderly or noisy manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency, or offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

9. No person shall put in the Park any horses, cattle, goats, pigs, or poultry.

10. No person shall drive any vehicle in the Park at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour.

11. No person shall be allowed to park their motor car, cab, or other vehicle in the Park without payment of parking fee, and then only on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic. The fee to be charged shall be 1s. per day per vehicle.

12. No person shall ply for hire in the Reserve with motor cars, cabs, or other vehicles without the permission in writing of the committee of management first obtained, and then only on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic. The fees to be charged for admission to the portions of the Reserve specially provided for wheeled traffic of motor cars, cabs, or other vehicles plying for hire shall be as follows:—

- For every motor car licensed to carry six passengers or under, £1 10s. per annum.
- For every motor car licensed to carry seven passengers or over, 5s. per passenger per annum.
- For every cab and other vehicle carrying ten persons or under, £1 per annum.
- For every cab and other vehicle carrying more than ten persons and under sixteen persons, £1 5s. per annum.
- For every cab and other vehicle carrying sixteen persons or over, £1 10s. per annum.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten pounds (£10).
