I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to enable the Treasurer of Victoria to arrange for the Repayment of certain Moneys to be advanced by Banks to the Victorian Wheatgrowers' Corporation Limited in connexion with the Marketing of Wheat of the Seasons 1925-1926 to 1927-1928 inclusive, and for other purposes.”

“An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Irrigation Works and Water Supply Works and for Drainage and Flood Protection Works in Country Districts and for Works under the River Murray Water Acts and for Public Works and other purposes.”

“An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Irrigation Works, Water Supply Works, Drainage and Flood Protection Works in Country Districts and for Works under the River Murray Water Acts and for other purposes.”

BY-LAW NO. 1612.—FLOOD PROTECTION CHARGE.—CARDINIA  
FLOOD PROTECTION DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following Flood Protection Charge is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Cardinia Flood Protection District:—

For the service rendered to such district by the flood protection works constructed for such service—

2. Such charge is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1925, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1926, and shall be payable on the 30th day of October, 1925, at the office of the said Commission, at Pakenham.

All water supplied by the Trust for domestic use and for other than domestic use shall be charged for by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust).

Water supplied by the Trust by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon.

The minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for such premises so supplied; water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Meter rent shall be at the rate of Seven shillings per annum.

THE Commissioners of the Kilmore Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for one year from the 1st January, 1926, payable in two moieties, on the 1st January, 1926, and the 1st July, 1926. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by

measure for domestic purposes within the Urban District of Kilmore, as such district was proclaimed and defined on the 30th January, 1894:—

On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and under, the sum of Twenty-five shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds, One shilling in the pound on the municipal valuation.

On every house which has been unoccupied for twelve months or more, the owner, by making a written application to the Trust, may have the rate reduced by one-half.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and under, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water, above the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds, One shilling in the pound on the municipal valuation.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land containing one acre or under not supplied with water, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land of a greater area than one acre not supplied with water, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence.

The owner of every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water must provide a trough with approved self-acting ball-tap to prevent overflow.

The charges for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1926, from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—

1. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such boiler.
2. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, Ninepence for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (a) The quantity for which the charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

Where water is supplied for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons. Charges for water shall be due and payable on the 1st January and 1st July, 1926.

4. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1926.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

## MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust do hereby, under the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Mortlake Waterworks District of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust, and with the minimum charges, and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust:—

(1) For every house, including not more than  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre of land, and of annual municipal value of £20 and under, the maximum charge shall be Thirty shillings.

(2) For every house, &c., of annual municipal value of £21 to £60 inclusive, a rate of Two shillings in the £1 shall be paid, and any such properties exceeding £60 annual municipal value, shall pay a rate of One shilling in the £1 for every £1 over and above £60 annual valuation.

(3) All shops and places of business, with an annual municipal value below £20, shall be rated at Two shillings in the £1.

(4) Land adjoining house properties of value not exceeding £20, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for each  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre over and above the  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre allowed with the house, up to a maximum of Ten shillings.

(5) Detached allotments shall be charged for as follows:—Not exceeding  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre, Five shillings; not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre, Seven shillings and sixpence; not exceeding 1 acre, Ten shillings; not exceeding  $1\frac{1}{2}$  acres, Twelve shillings and sixpence; not exceeding 2 acres, Fifteen shillings; and if more than 2 acres, Twenty shillings.

(6) The charge for water supplied by the Trust, by measurement, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(7) For water supplied to public buildings, and other similar properties, the charge shall be as follows:—Police Station, Post Office, Railway Station, and Stationmaster's Residence, £2. Mechanics' Institute and Recreation Reserve, £1 10s. Masonic Hall and Temperance Hall, £1 per annum. The water for church and Sunday school grounds shall not be charged for.

(8) For every public water trough, with or without stand-pipe, the charge shall be £2 per annum.

(9) The Trust may, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier, using water for domestic or other purposes, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within 21 days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, and at his own expense, provide and fix an approved meter, failing which the property shall be disconnected until such meter is installed.

(10) Provided that where any person desires to have the service pipe of the Trust extended to his property, and is willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have the power to make a special arrangement with him regarding the payment of the water supplied.

(11) In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

(12) In the event of any dispute which may arise regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special charge.

(13) The beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the first day of February, 1926, except in the cases of water supplied by measure, the charges for which shall be annual and payable on the first day of December in each year.

(14) For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge of 1s. for every 200 gallons or under.

(15) Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of this By-law, the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Mortlake Waterworks Trust.

4. For water supplied from the works of the Trust by measure, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity charged for shall be 27,000 gallons per annum.

5. The said rate and charges shall be payable in two equal portions, the first on the first day of January and the second on the first day of July, 1926.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint shall be authorized to receive and demand the rate.

2. A rate of Fifteen shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. For the water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rates payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

5. The foregoing rate is made payable on the 1st day of April, 1926.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

**YARRA JUNCTION WATERWORKS TRUST.**

**BY-LAW No. 2.**

**T**HE Commissioners of the Yarra Junction Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law :—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose, and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

4. Where water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through service-pipes of the following diameter, according to the assessed annual municipal value of the property supplied, viz. :—

- (1) for premises so assessed at or under £20, half-inch (½-inch) pipe;
- (2) and over £20 per annum, three-quarters of an inch (¾-inch) pipe;

except when a special agreement is made.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery stables or carriers' stables, or manufacturing or irrigation purposes, or for public baths.

6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering, nor shall any such person water by means of such hose or pipe the ground, trees, plants, or shrubs, or wash any house, walls, or carriage, or use such hose or pipe for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach. This clause shall be enforced in case of shortage of water after notice is given by advertisement in a newspaper circulating through the Waterworks District.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing in any manner, interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Before any licence is granted by the Trust, the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power to cancel such licence at any time.

9. Each licence issued by the Trust shall be for the period ending on the 31st December next ensuing after the date of the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of a holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be the sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of Five pounds (£5), and for each renewal the sum of One pound (£1).

10. The quality of material required in laying private services shall be as follows :—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service-pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.
- (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 500 feet.
- (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

- (6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 12 inches.
- (7) A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed to each service immediately within the property served, properly secured and covered with an approved cap.
11. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust; each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.
12. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
14. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
15. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.
16. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any land or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provisioning and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.
17. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenement supplied by such pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
18. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
19. Any person wilfully or carelessly breaking, injuring, or opening any lock, valve, pipe, or other work belonging to the Trust, or turning any tap, or carelessly or wilfully doing any other act whereby the water of the Trust may be wasted, or who carelessly or wilfully does any of the aforementioned acts with the intent that the water of the Trust may be wasted, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
20. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all times between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, to enter any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect or examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
21. The water supply in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with this By-law, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with this By-law, and not otherwise.
22. In the construction of this By-law, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole. The word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf, and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Yarra Junction Waterworks Trust.
23. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
24. Before any person licensed under clause 9 of this By-law shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds (£2), and in case he shall not proceed with the laying on of such water as aforesaid, or shall not immediately after laying on the water as

aforesaid make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath, or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

25. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to supply such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

26. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, weir, channel, reservoir, settling basin, or injure the property of the Trust, and who shall wilfully trespass on the Trust's works or property, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

WHEREAS by section 184 of the *Land Act* 1915 it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council or the Board of Land and Works to appoint and remove any number of persons, not less than three, or any municipal council, or the governing body of any corporation, to be a Committee of Management of any specified Crown land reserved either temporarily or permanently for any of the purposes set out in section 10 of the *Land Act* 1915, and not conveyed to or vested in trustees: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby rescind the appointment made on 12th January, 1910, and notified in the *Government Gazette* of 19th January, 1910, whereby the Council of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings was appointed a Committee of Management of such portion of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the 26th May, 1873, for Public purposes, as is indicated by pink tint on the plan marked A/12.1.10, attached to Lands Correspondence Rs. 3203.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR SHOW GROUND AND PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF EUREKA, KNOWN AS "CHINKAPOOK RECREATION RESERVE AND SHOW GROUNDS."

WHEREAS, Luke Fay, Martin Thomas Malone, Henry Neill, John Sutherland, Joseph Charles Roy Whitehouse, and Charles William Howley, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Show Grounds and Public Recreation in the Parish of Eureka, known as the "Chinkapook Recreation Reserve and Show Grounds," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding eighteen in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Four shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the

cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

12. No persons, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

A By-law of the Shire of Berwick, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 19, for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in the said section, viz.:—Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections, and for requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and for selling the materials and applying the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and any fees and penalties due by the owner thereof and appointing fees to be charged and received by the Council of the Shire of Berwick for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council, and for other purposes in connexion with the foregoing purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Berwick order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. No person shall erect, build or construct, or cause to be erected, built or constructed any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

3. No person shall commence any building or any addition to any building without first having paid to the Council the necessary fees in accordance with the following scale:—

- (a) New buildings of an area of four squares, £1—and 5s for each additional square or room over and above four squares.
- (b) Additions to buildings, 5s. for each square or room.
- (c) Sheds, outhouses, stables, cowbails, and fowlhouses, each 5s.
- (d) Verandahs, either back or front, 5s.
- (e) For any permit to build, erect, or construct any boarding, 10s.

4. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be built, erected, or constructed, or make any alterations or addition to any existing building on any land in the Shire of Berwick without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, and without first submitting to the Council, its secretary, or building inspector an application in writing for the same, together with a properly prepared plan, drawn to scale, and complete specifications, together with an estimate of cost of the proposed building, alteration, or addition, and the location and dimensions of the land on which such building, alteration, or addition is proposed to be erected, and leaving a copy of ground plan of same showing the position of the building, alteration, or addition on the allotment, together with the position of the proposed drains, closets, outhouses, and other erections with the Council, and also stating whether such building, alteration, or addition is intended to be used as a shop, dwelling-house, or in any other and what manner, and obtaining a permit or licence from the Council to erect such building or make such alteration or addition in accordance with the plan, specification, and other particulars submitted. And any person offending against this Part of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

5. No person shall erect any building or make any alteration or addition to any existing building on any land in the Shire of Berwick except in accordance with the plan, specification, estimate, location, and dimensions submitted and particulars set out in the application for a permit, and any permit or licence so obtained as aforesaid shall only be deemed to be a permit or licence to erect a building or make alterations or additions in accordance with the plan, specification, estimate, and other particulars referred to in the application for the same, or submitted to or left with the Council as aforesaid.

6. The Council may, if it is of opinion that any permit granted as aforesaid should not have been issued or granted, or that the building is not being used for the purposes mentioned in the application, revoke any such permit or licence.

7. Any person having obtained a permit or licence under clause 4 hereof who fails to commence such building, or having commenced to erect such building fails to complete the same within such time as the Council may appoint or direct, shall forfeit such permit or licence, and the same shall be deemed to have been cancelled, and every permit or licence issued under the aforesaid clause shall expire six months from the date of issue; and any building not completed in six months shall not be proceeded with unless the permit or licence is extended by resolution of the Council.

8. If any building be erected upon any land or street within the Shire of Berwick before an application has been made and the permit or licence of the Council obtained as aforesaid for the same, or if any building be not erected in accordance with the permit or licence of the Council as aforesaid, or be used for any purpose or in any manner other than the purpose or

manner set out in the application for permit, or be not completed within the time appointed and directed by the Council as aforesaid, the Council may, by notice in writing, signed by the Shire Secretary, given to such person or placed on some conspicuous part of the building require such building to be forthwith pulled down and removed, and if such person does not begin to pull down and remove such building within seven days after such notice has been given or placed as aforesaid and complete the pulling down and removal of such building as speedily as the nature of the case will permit, or within a date to be fixed by the Council, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £20.

9. And in case any such building be not pulled down and removed within the time aforesaid the Council may, with all convenient speed, cause such building to be pulled down and removed, and for that purpose may break down any fences surrounding the land on which such building is situate, and may enter upon such land, and the Council may sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses incurred in or connected with the pulling down or removal of such building, and any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof, and the Council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale to the owner on demand.

10. No building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house and no addition to any such building shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of twenty feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front.

11. Except as hereafter provided no building with an external wall of wood which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition with an external wall of wood to any building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house shall be built, constructed, or erected—

- (a) within a distance of six feet measured horizontally of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of any such building;
- (b) within a distance of six feet measured horizontally of land not in the same possession or occupation;
- (c) within a distance of eight feet measured horizontally of another building or erection with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation.

Provided always that any such building or addition may abut on the building line of any street, road, lane or right-of-way at the side of such building or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom or from land not in the same possession or occupation or from a building or erection with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation used or intended to be used wholly or partially as a dwelling, provided that the walls or wall which abut on or face within the prescribed distance such street, road, lane, right-of-way, land not in the same possession or occupation or building or erection as the case may be shall be of concrete of approved thickness or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness projecting in all cases at least one inch beyond the woodwork front and back and at least one foot through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same. Where a parapet wall is constructed or erected it shall have two damp courses.

12. The roof of every building or erection which is intended to be or shall be used as a dwelling-house shall be covered on the outside with incombustible coverings and approved sound boards shall be used for any external wall or walls thereof if of wood.

13. Stables, coach-houses, and outbuildings shall be subject to the like conditions as are hereinbefore imposed in regard to dwelling-houses by clauses 10, 11, and 12 hereof, except that clause 11(a) shall not apply to them as far as it relates to any lane or right-of-way.

14. (1) The main rooms in every dwelling-house hereafter built or rebuilt shall be in every part not less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling.

(2) Provided nevertheless that the main rooms in every dwelling-house of more than one story hereafter built or rebuilt, except rooms on the ground floor, shall not be less than nine feet in height from floor to ceiling. Main rooms on the ground floor shall be subject to the preceding sub-clause hereof. Living rooms wholly or partly in the roof shall not be less than nine feet in height from floor to ceiling throughout nor less than one-third the area.

(3) Every main room and kitchen in a dwelling-house shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air with a total superficies of glass clear of sash frames free from obstruction to light equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room and so constructed that a substantial part of the windows equal in general to at least one-twentieth of floor area can be opened for ventilation. The requirements of this sub-clause may under special circumstances be dispensed with or modified by the Council or the building inspector subject to review by the Council, but in such cases other approved provision for lighting or ventilation must be made.

(4) For the purpose of this clause the expression "main rooms" shall be deemed to mean rooms used or intended to be used as bedrooms, dining-rooms, and ordinary living rooms, but not kitchens. The decision of the Council, or of the building inspector subject to review by the Council as to whether a particular room comes within the scope of this clause or not shall be final and conclusive.

(5) The provisions of this clause in reference to the height, lighting, and ventilation of main rooms in dwellings shall so far as applicable be extended to all shops.

15. The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used or shall or may be used as a dwelling-house shall be constructed of lath and plaster, wood, or approved fire-resisting materials.

(2) Bricks used in any building shall be good, hard, and well burnt, and if old shall be thoroughly cleaned before being used.

(3) All timbers used in any building shall be of good, sound material, free from rot, large and loose knots, shakes, or any imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

(4) The following conditions shall apply as to spacing and scantlings of timber:—

- (a) Stumps to be not less than 4 inches x 4 inches, redgum or other approved timber, spaced to 4 feet centres, and placed on a brick soleplate (where considered necessary by the building inspector).
- (b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches, spaced not more than 18 inches apart centre to centre and properly braced.
- (c) Rafter not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches spaced 3 feet centre to centre in the case of iron roofs, and 18 inches centre to centre in the case of slate or tile or other similar roofs securely braced with purlins and collar ties.
- (d) Floor joists to be not less than 4 inches x 2 inches, spaced 18 inches apart centre to centre on 4 inch x 3 inch bearers spaced 4 feet apart. Floors to be fixed level and in all buildings to be in no part less than nine inches over the surface of the ground.
- (e) Vermin plates to be provided to all walls.

16. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only or as a combined shop and dwelling unless the whole of the said building or erection of whatever material constructed shall cover an area of not less than 750 square feet.

17. Every wall of brick or stone shall have an approved damp-proof course or courses of asphalt or other impervious material above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same materials.

18. The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate same.

19. No person shall erect, build, or construct or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only except in conformity with the following:—

- (a) The site or curtilage of such dwelling-house shall have a superficial area of at least 5,000 square feet, and have a frontage of not less than 50 lineal feet to a street or road, and that except in the cases of corner sites the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site.
- (b) The dwelling-house and other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any site or curtilage included in any subdivision of land made with the approval of the Council prior to the coming into operation of this By-law and not provided for in sub-clause (a) shall, except in the case of corner sites, cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site or curtilage fronting a street or road.
- (c) The dwelling-house and other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any corner site or curtilage fronting to two streets or roads shall cover not more than one-third of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

20. Two or more buildings or houses may be erected together in one block provided that they shall be separated from each other by a wall of concrete of approved thickness or of brick or stone at least eight and a half inches in thickness projecting in the case of wooden houses at least one inch through the woodwork front and back, and in all cases projecting one foot at least through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same whether belonging to the same owner or not. Each building or dwelling-house in a block shall be subject to the provisions of this By-law applicable to its class.

21. Clauses 10, 11, and 12 hereof shall apply to any building which is intended to be or shall be used as a shop or combined shop and dwelling, provided nevertheless that with the consent of the Council or the building inspector subject to review by the Council the said clauses 10 and 11, or either of them, may be modified in the case of any such building by permitting the same to abut wholly or partially on the building line of the street or road in front or to be less than the prescribed distance therefrom.

22. No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any portico or verandah over the footway of any street in the municipality without first obtaining the consent of the Council

in writing, and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, figure, and dimensions and materials as set forth on the plan and specification adopted by the Council, but the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than eight feet above the level of the outer edge of footway.

23. No opening shall be made in the roof of any such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such opening is properly framed and glazed with approved glass protected underneath with a fine mesh wire netting or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the building inspector.

24. No fowl-houses shall be erected at a less distance than 25 feet from any building used as a dwelling on the same allotment or allotments adjoining. No buildings of the description referred to in this clause of this By-law shall be erected except to the rear of any dwelling-house on same allotment.

25. No privy, closet, or urinal, unless it has a septic tank or other system approved by the Shire Council, shall be erected or allowed to remain at a less distance than 25 feet from the door or window of any dwelling-house on the same allotment or allotments adjoining or a less distance than 9 feet from any street, and shall in each case be effectively screened from public view. Provided that in case there is a right-of-way abutting on such allotment the privy, closet, or urinal may be erected to the boundary between such allotment and right-of-way.

26. Proper provision shall be made for effectively removing storm water and sanitary drainage away from every building.

27. The distances mentioned in clauses 10, 11, 25, and 26 of this By-law shall be respectively measured from the verandah or any other projection nearest to the point at which such building may be from such other building, street, lane, right-of-way, or boundary line.

28. The building inspector at all reasonable times during the progress and during fourteen days next after the completion of any building or addition to any building affected by any of the provisions of this By-law may and he is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition, and the owner or builder thereof shall produce to the building inspector or shire secretary for the time being for inspection the original plans and specifications approved by the Council for the building demanded by him.

29. If any building shall be partly or wholly built contrary to the provisions of this By-law the Council by its shire secretary, building inspector, or other authorized agent may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building, fourteen days' notice in writing to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions or requiring the pulling down and removal of such building, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council, by its building inspector or other authorized agent, to enter upon such building and upon the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen and for that purpose to break down any fence surrounding the land on which the building is situated and to demolish and pull down the said building or any parts or part thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose and to remove the material thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit and all expenses incurred by the Council, its shire secretary, building inspector, or other authorized agent in demolishing and pulling down the said building or any part thereof or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore any surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner or builder or other person legally entitled thereto on demand.

30. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, green-house, fernery, aviary, or to temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding 12 months.

31. Provided always that notwithstanding anything herein-after provided to the contrary, the Council may, under special circumstances and for special causes, and at a meeting at which due notice of the business has been given to each councillor, declare that the provisions of this By-law, either in the whole or in part, shall not apply to any particular building. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Berwick:—

- Twenty chains in depth on each side of the Princes Highway throughout the shire.
- The sanitary areas of Pakenham, Bunyip, Gembrook, and Cockatoo.

This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the State of Victoria, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, or Shire of Berwick.

32. Penalties.—Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound and not exceeding Twenty pounds. And if such offence is a continuing one to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

33. All words importing the singular shall include the plural, and the plural the singular.

- “Shop” means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment, and also includes the saloons or shops of barbers and hairdressers, and offices of agents and auctioneers. A bona fide private boarding-house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied to persons other than boarders.
- “Square” applied to the measurement of any area means the space of 100 square feet.
- “Street” or “road” means and includes “street” and “road” and “private street” and “private road” as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 3.
