I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million three hundred and fourteen thousand nine hundred and four pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six."

"An Act to amend the *Horse Breeding Act 1919* and for other purposes."

"An Act to constitute Anzac Day a Public and Bank Holiday and for other purposes."

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1926 for Free Places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these Free Places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his Free Place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his Free Place, and, if his Free Place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his Free Place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the Free Place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, and progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

Forms of application are obtainable at this office. Each application must be made on the prescribed form, and must be forwarded through the Permanent Head of the Department in which the applicant is employed, to the Secretary, Education Department, Melbourne, not later than 1st December, 1925.

ACT 391.—SECOND SCHEDULE.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of Presbyterian Church of Victoria under the provisions of the "Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion," for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the second day of November, 1925, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

Description of Land.—One acre two roods, county unnamed (now Kara Kara), Parish of Banyenong, Town of Donald, being allotments 1, 2, and 15 of section 3: Commencing at the west angle of allotment 1; bounded thence by a street (Blair-street) bearing N. 42 deg. 35 min. E. five chains; thence by allotments 14 and 13 (now Park-street) bearing S. 47 deg. 25 min. E. three chains; thence by allotment 3 bearing S. 42 deg. 35 min. W. five chains; and thence by a street (Woods-street) bearing N. 47 deg. 25 min. W. three chains to the point of commencement.

Name of Trustee.—The Presbyterian Church of Victoria Trusts Corporation.

Power of Disposition.—With the consent of the General Assembly of "The Presbyterian Church of Victoria," to mortgage, sell, lease, exchange, and transfer, and grant easements over the said land, or any part or parts thereof, and subject to such powers and the exercise thereof, to hold the said land, or so much thereof as may from time to time remain vested in the said trustees, upon such trust for the said Presbyterian Church of Victoria, and for such purposes, and with and subject to such powers and provisions as are contained in the document enrolled by the Registrar-General of the State of Victoria, pursuant to the provisions of the *Presbyterian Trusts Act 1890*, and styled "The Presbyterian Church of Victoria Model Trust Deed for Church Site" as to part, and as to the remainder on the trusts of "The Presbyterian Church of Victoria Model Trust Deed for Manse Site."

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied.—To pay the money coming to the hands of such trustees by virtue of any such power of disposition to the treasurer for the time being of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria, to be by him applied first in payment of all incidental costs, next in payment to the said Presbyterian Church of Victoria of all deductions heretofore or hereafter to be authorized by the General Assembly of the said church, and as to residue, for such purposes as the said Assembly has heretofore authorized or may hereafter authorize.

Commencing at eastern end of allotment 7a, section 6, Parish of Walwa; thence following the course of the River Murray to the south-western corner of allotment 5, section 1, Parish of Burrowye; thence southerly along the western boundary of that allotment; thence across main Murray road; thence easterly along same; thence southerly along western boundary of allotment 6, section 1, Parish of Walwa; thence westerly along boundary of allotment 71a, section 1, Parish of Burrowye; thence southerly along boundary of that allotment and allotment 69a, section 1; thence easterly along allotment 69a, section 1; thence southerly along boundary of allotment 10a, section 9, Parish of Walwa; thence westerly, southerly, and easterly along allotment 12, section 9; thence southerly along allotment 3a, section 9; thence easterly along the southern boundary of allotments 3a and 3 to the western boundary of allotment 11, section 10; thence southerly and easterly along allotment 11, section 10; thence south-easterly through the Parish of Jemba to its south-eastern corner; thence following the Cudgewa Parish boundary in a northerly direction to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that the area proposed to be severed is geographically part of the district comprising the Tintaldra Riding of the Shire of Upper Murray; that Corryong, the meeting place of the Upper Murray Shire Council, is the principal town in the district proposed to be severed, and the principal distributing centre and the place where the chief sales of stock attended by petitioners are held; that Corryong is less than 30 miles from Walwa, whereas Tallangatta, where the Towong Shire Council meets, is distant 45 miles from Walwa; and that at the present time councillors from the Walwa district occupy the best part of three days in attending a meeting of the Towong Shire Council at Tallangatta, while the return journey between Walwa and Corryong, owing to good motor roads, only occupies about four hours.

The petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Murray Riding of the Shire of Towong, and annex such area to the Tintaldra Riding of the Shire of Upper Murray.

RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—BY-LAW No. 1635.—LOCKINGTON URBAN DIVISION WITHIN THE ROCHESTER IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with

the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Lockington Urban Division within the Rochester Irrigation and Water Supply District.

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—A rate of Forty-two pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Eighty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—A rate of Forty-two pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such lands shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—One-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof—One-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

3. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1925, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1926, and shall be payable on the 13th day of November, 1925, at the office of the said Commission, at Rochester.

4. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

5. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1926 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Trust District:—

I. For each vacant allotment of land of an area not exceeding one acre in extent, and on which no service-pipe has been laid, but which abuts on a street or road on which a main is laid, a rate of Five shillings shall be paid for the year; and for each such allotment of land of an area exceeding one acre in extent, a rate of Threepence for each additional acre shall be paid. Vacant allotments on which a service-pipe is laid shall be charged double the above rate.

II. For all lands and tenements within the Trust District of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound five shillings per annum.

III. For all lands and tenements of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Seymour.

IV. For every steam boiler supplied with water, a charge of Five pounds will be made for the year 1926.

V. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:— For each trough or tub in an allotment of five acres or under, a charge of Fifteen shillings shall be made for the year; and for each acre above five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre shall be made in addition to the payment of Fifteen shillings for the first five acres. But this charge shall not be enforced on tubs or receptacles of any kind in a house yard unless used to water stock. The maximum amount to be paid for a supply of water to any trough shall be Five pounds per annum. For the supply of water to each hotel trough, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be paid for the year.

VI. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum amount so charged for the year 1926 shall be 10,000 gallons.

VII. Gardens or orchards using water will be supplied by meter at the following charges:—Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; the minimum amount to be charged for the year 1926 shall be 15,000 gallons.

VIII. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1926, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1926, and such rate shall be payable on the first day of July, 1926.

The charge for water shall be payable quarterly or at such time as payment may be demanded by the Trust. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926 FIXED BY THE COMMISSIONERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POWERS CONFERRED ON THEM UNDER THE WATER ACTS.

THE following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1926 in respect of water supplied to them by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant lands, of the annual municipal valuation of £20 and under, the sum of Two pounds (£2).

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal valuation of £20 and upwards to £75, the sum of 2s. in the £1 shall be paid.

3. From £75 upwards the sum of 1s. 6d. in the £1 shall be paid on the municipal valuation, provided that in all cases the minimum rate shall be not less than Seven pounds ten shillings (£7 10s.) per annum.

4. The rate to be paid in respect to vacant lands shall be 2s. in the £1 according to municipal valuation, provided that in no case the rate shall be less than £1 per annum.

5. For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of two pounds (£2) per annum shall be paid.

6. The water supplied to troughs other than public troughs shall be paid for by meter or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and persons requiring the supply may agree to adopt.

7. For water supplied by meter a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that no person shall pay an amount other than that based upon 2s. in the £1 on the municipal valuation, or less than the minimum rate; any quantity over the foregoing amount to be charged in excess.

8. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1926.

9. Water must not be used for other than strictly household purposes during the hours of 12 noon and 8 p.m. on Sundays during the months of January, February, March, October, November, and December.

For the purposes of conserving the water, the Trust may in its discretion cut off the water during certain hours of each day.

Such persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges, and enforce regulations.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence on municipal valuation shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of each and every vacant or unoccupied allotment of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.

4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one half of the beforementioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a main, one quarter the beforementioned rate to be paid.

5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1925.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

A By-law of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust, made under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, for the purposes of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.
RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1926.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1926 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds and not exceeding Nineteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Nineteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

4. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be—Under Seven pounds, Seven shillings and sixpence; over Seven pounds, the rate shall be One shilling in the pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

5. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons on such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 40,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to engines for cutting firewood to be charged at rate of £8 per annum for each engine.

Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922 (No. 3195).

REGULATIONS PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF A BONUS OR REWARD FOR THE DESTRUCTION OF FOXES, WILD DOGS, WOMBATS, AND VERMIN GENERALLY.

WHEREAS by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* (13 Geo. V. No. 3195), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may as to the whole or any part of Victoria make regulations for or with respect to certain matters therein referred to: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the twenty-sixth day of May, 1924, providing for the payment of a bonus or reward for the destruction of Foxes and Wild Dogs and Vermin generally, and make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

DIVISION 1.—INTRODUCTORY.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Bonus for Vermin Destruction Regulations 1925, and shall take effect from the first day of July, 1925, and shall be divided as follows:—

Division 1.—Introductory, 1-2.

Division 2.—Payment of Bonus for Destruction of Foxes, 3-10.

Division 3.—Payment of Bonus for Destruction of Wild Dogs, 11-18.

Division 4.—Payment of Bonus for Destruction of Wombats, 19-23.

Division 5.—Power to Pay for Destruction of Vermin Generally, 24.

Division 6.—Schedules.

2. In these regulations the terms hereunder shall have the respective meaning assigned to them.

“Minister” shall mean the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey.

“Superintendent” shall mean the Superintendent of Vermin and Noxious Weeds Destruction appointed under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922*.

“Vermin” shall mean any animal or bird which the Governor in Council by proclamation declares to be vermin for the purposes of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922*.

“Wild dog” shall mean a dingo or any undomesticated dog generally known as a wild dog inhabiting the bush and apparently having no owner and being under no control, and which in the opinion of the dog inspector of any municipality is a wild dog [and not a dog apparently belonging to a breed commonly owned or kept by persons residing in Victoria].

DIVISION 2.—PAYMENT OF BONUS FOR DESTRUCTION OF FOXES.

3. In so far as the power conferred by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* permits the Governor in Council by regulation to sanction the payment of a bonus or reward by the council of any municipality for the destruction of foxes, the council of every municipality may, out of the municipal funds thereof, pay from time to time by way of a bonus or reward such sum as to such council seems fit, for the destruction of every fox destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality.

4. Every person claiming a bonus or reward for the destruction of a fox shall, before payment is made, furnish to the council of such municipality a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the one in the First Schedule hereto, setting forth the parish and the particular place in such municipality in which and when such fox was destroyed, and shall also hand to the secretary or other authorized officer of the municipality the skin of every such fox, with the brush and scalp attached thereto, and without any letter perforated thereon.

5. Such skin, with the brush and scalp attached thereto, shall, when handed to such officer, be thoroughly dry and free from weevils, fat, or other objectionable matter.

6. The secretary or other authorized officer of a municipality shall, after receiving such skin with the brush and scalp attached thereto, legibly perforate such skin as nearly as possible in the middle with five or more small holes representing the letter V.

7. Such skin, with the brush and scalp attached, after being so perforated, shall belong to and shall be sold by such municipality.

8. In the event of the council of any municipality paying or having paid a bonus or reward for the destruction of foxes destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality, the Treasurer of the State of Victoria (hereinafter referred to as the “Treasurer”) shall in each year pay to the council of such municipality a sum equal to one half of the difference between the amount paid by such council during the twelve months ending the thirtieth day of June in each year by way of bonus or reward for the destruction of foxes, and the amount received by such council for skins received and sold by such

council during such twelve months: Provided, however, that the Treasurer shall not pay to the council of any municipality any sum exceeding One shilling and threepence for any fox destroyed.

9. No sum shall be payable by the Treasurer for any year under the provisions of these regulations unless on or before the thirty-first day of July in such year the council of the municipality forwards to the Minister through the superintendent the following statement, declarations, vouchers, and receipts:—

(a) A statement supported by statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the one in the Second Schedule hereto setting forth the number of skins, with the brushes and scalps attached, received and paid for by such council, the dates of payment, and the names and addresses of the sellers of such skins.

(b) The statutory declarations in the form or to the effect of the one in the First Schedule hereto furnished to the council of such municipality by the persons to whom the bonus or reward has been paid.

(c) The council's vouchers or receipts signed by the persons to whom the bonus or reward has been paid.

(d) The credit notes, receipts, or account sales received by the council from the purchasers or selling agents showing the amounts received by such council by the sale of skins included in the statement provided for in clause (a) of this regulation.

10. The amount which in any financial year may be paid to municipalities under the provisions of these regulations for the destruction of foxes shall not in the whole exceed Three hundred pounds.

DIVISION 3.—PAYMENT OF BONUS FOR DESTRUCTION OF WILD DOGS.

11. In so far as the power conferred by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* permits the Governor in Council by regulations to sanction the payment of a bonus or reward by the council of any municipality for the destruction of wild dogs, the council of any municipality may, out of the municipal fund thereof, pay from time to time by way of a bonus or reward such sum as to such council seems fit, for the destruction of every wild dog destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality.

12. Every person claiming a bonus or reward for the destruction of a wild dog shall, before payment is made, furnish to the council of such municipality a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the one in the Third Schedule hereto setting forth the parish and particular place in such municipality in which and when such wild dog was destroyed, and shall also hand to the secretary or other authorized officer of the municipality the skin of every such wild dog, with the scalp attached thereto, and without any letter perforated thereon.

13. Such skin, with the scalp attached thereto, shall, when handed to such officer, be thoroughly dry and free from weevils, fat, or other objectionable matter.

14. The secretary or other authorized officer of a municipality shall, after receiving such skin with the scalp attached thereto, legibly perforate such skin as nearly as possible in the middle with five or more small holes representing the letter V.

15. Such skin, with the scalp attached, after being so perforated, shall belong to and shall be sold by such municipality.

16. In the event of the council of any municipality paying or having paid a bonus or reward for the destruction of wild dogs destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality, the Treasurer shall in each year pay to the council of such municipality a sum equal to one half of the difference between the amount paid by such council during the twelve months ending the thirtieth day of June in each year by way of bonus or reward for the destruction of wild dogs, and the amount received by such council for skins received and sold by such council during such twelve months: Provided, however, that the Treasurer shall not pay to the council of any municipality any sum exceeding Fifteen shillings for any wild dog destroyed exceeding the age of six months, and Seven shillings and sixpence for any wild dog destroyed under the age of six months.

17. No sum shall be payable by the Treasurer for any year under the provisions of these regulations unless on or before the thirty-first day of July in such year the council of the municipality forwards to the Minister through the superintendent the following statement, declarations, vouchers, and receipts:—

(a) A statement supported by statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the one in the Fourth Schedule hereto setting forth the number of skins, with the scalps attached, received and paid for by such council, the dates of payment, and the names and addresses of the sellers of such skins.

(b) The statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the one in the Third Schedule hereto furnished to the council of such municipality by the persons to whom the bonus or reward has been paid.

- (c) The council's vouchers or receipts signed by the persons to whom the bonus or reward has been paid.
- (d) The credit notes, receipts, or account sales received by the council from the purchasers or selling agents showing the amounts received by such council by the sale of skins included in the statement provided for in clause (a) of this regulation.

18. The amount which in any financial year may be paid to municipalities under the provisions of these regulations for the destruction of wild dogs shall not in the whole exceed five hundred pounds.

DIVISION 4.—PAYMENT OF BONUS FOR DESTRUCTION OF WOMBATS.

19. In so far as the power conferred by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* permits the Governor in Council by regulations to sanction the payment of a bonus or reward by the council of any municipality for the destruction of wombats, the council of any municipality may, out of the municipal fund thereof, pay from time to time by way of a bonus or reward such sum as to such council seems fit, for the destruction of every wombat destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality.

20. Every person claiming a bonus or reward for the destruction of a wombat shall, before payment is made, furnish to the council of such municipality a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the one in the Fifth Schedule hereto setting forth the parish and particular place in such municipality in which and when such wombat was destroyed, and shall also hand to the secretary or other authorized officer of the municipality the scalp of every such wombat, and when payment has been made therefor such scalp shall be destroyed.

21. In the event of the council of any municipality paying or having paid a bonus or reward for the destruction of wombats destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality, the Treasurer shall in each year pay to the council of such municipality a sum equal to one half of the amount paid by such council during the twelve months ending the thirtieth day of June in such year by way of bonus or reward for the destruction of wombats: Provided, however, that the Treasurer shall not pay to the council of any municipality any sum exceeding two shillings and sixpence for any wombat destroyed.

22. No sum shall be payable by the Treasurer for any such twelve months unless on or before the thirty-first day of July in any year the council of such municipality forwards to the Minister through the superintendent the following statement and declarations:—

- (a) A statement supported by statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the one in the Sixth Schedule hereto setting forth the number of scalps received and paid for by such council, the dates of payment, and the names and addresses of the sellers of such scalps.
- (b) The statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the one in the Fifth Schedule hereto furnished to the council of such municipality by the persons to whom the bonus or reward has been paid.
- (c) The council's vouchers or receipts signed by the persons to whom the bonus or reward has been paid.

23. The amount which in any financial year may be paid to municipalities under the provisions of these regulations for the destruction of wombats shall not in the whole exceed two hundred pounds.

DIVISION 5.—POWER TO PAY FOR DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN GENERALLY.

24. In so far as the power conferred by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* permits, the council of any municipality may, subject to the provisions of these regulations relating to foxes, wild dogs and wombats, pay out of the municipal fund for the destruction of vermin, whether killed within or without the boundaries of the municipality, such sum as the council deems fit.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood or charcoal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. 3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood or charcoal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood or charcoal at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width of the length of the firewood specified in the various schedules, with space between stacks for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply.

7. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood or charcoal as to the quality, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

9. If the board shall decide that the firewood or charcoal is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 3.

10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood or charcoal as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood or charcoal, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. 2. It amends clauses (c), (g), and (m) of the "Objects" clauses of By-law 81—

Firstly—By insertion of words as follows:—

(c) "including buildings erected, adapted for use, or used," after the word "constructed" first occurring.

(g) "or any shop or any dwelling-house and shop combined," after the words "dwelling-house."

(m) "the use of any land or," after the words "such residential area" and "such classes of," after the words "purposes of."

Secondly—By striking out of clause (l), sub-clause (v), the words "or shop for foodstuffs."

Thirdly—By inserting in clause (l) new sub-clause (vi) as follows:—

(vi) The minimum area to be covered by any dwelling-house or any dwelling-house and shop combined.

3. It repeals clauses 19A, 19B, and 19C of Div. 5, Part III., of By-law 81, and re-enacts clauses—

19A. Prescribing residential areas.

19B. Prohibiting the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of all classes of trade, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements within such residential areas.

19C. By-law not to preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for such purpose.

4. It amends Part XV. of said By-law by inserting in clause 1 thereof the words "adapted for use or used" after the word "constructed" first occurring.

By striking out of sub-clause (a) of said clause the word "or," and inserting the word "and."

By striking out of sub-clause (b) of said clause the words "demolish and," and by inserting after the words "pull down" the words "and remove."

By striking out the whole of sub-clause (c) of said clause and inserting new sub-clause (c) providing for the application of proceeds of sale of materials of building pulled down.

5. It amends clause 2 of said Part XV., and provides penalty for a continuing offence.

6. It amends Schedule "B," and names streets or roads within residential area under clause 19A.

7. It amends Schedule "E," and names streets or roads within residential area under clause 19A.

- (3) This By-law shall apply to the whole of the Shire of Mulgrave, and shall have operation in any portion of the Shire as the Council may from time to time direct.
- (4) The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
- (5) The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
- (6) The occupier aforesaid or any other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
- (7) The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in day time, and the other pan left in its place.
- (8) Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause same to be cleansed by superheated steam, and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.
- (9) The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
- (10) The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.
- (11) If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
