PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to make provision on a Contributory Basis for Superannuation Benefits for certain Public Officers and Employees and Benefits for certain of their Dependents; and for other purposes."

Division II.—Relieving in Higher Positions.

The provisions of clause 2 are not applicable in respect of the duties performed by Storeman J. Stoddart during the currency of this award.

AWARD No. 8.

Division VI.—Suburban Broken Shifts.

The provisions of this Division are not applicable in respect of the shifts worked by telegraphists at Spencer-street.

Division XIV.—Travelling and Incidental Expenses.

(1) The provisions of clause 9 are not applicable in the case of any officer or employee whose shift has not a definite terminating time.

(2) The words "three (3) days" appearing in clause 14 mean three (3) full days.

Division XX.—Conditions Associated with the Running of Trains.

In the case of the Sunday trip run by Guard A. C. Campbell, viz., between Flinders-street and Belgrave, and known as 68 shift, the "terminal point" for booking off referred to in clause 1 is Upper Ferntree Gully.

These references having come on for hearing before the Railways Classification Board, and the said Board having heard the representations made on behalf of the parties concerned, it is ordered that the matters referred to be and the same are hereby interpreted as follows:—

AWARD No. 6.

Salaries and Wages.—Officers (All Branches).

The time served by E. J. Mayne, clerk, as a supernumerary ticket sorter in the Audit of Receipts Branch during the period from 20th August, 1919, to 11th October, 1921, should not be regarded as time served on clerical duties in a supernumerary capacity for the purpose of determining his commencing salary on appointment to the permanent staff as a junior clerk.

Salaries and Wages.—Way and Works Branch.—Employees.
The classification prescribed for the grade of ganger (Spencer-street and Flinders-street yards) is applicable to gangers in charge of lengths carrying either passenger or goods traffic in such yards, including what is known as the Melbourne Yard.

AWARD No. 8.

Division VI.—Suburban Broken Shifts.

The provisions of this Division are not applicable to the time worked at the beginning or at the end of a month by clerks who, in addition to working their ordinary shift, are called upon to work for two (2) hours in the morning or evening in connexion with the booking of periodical tickets.

Division VII.—Minimum Allowances.

The provisions of this Division are not applicable to casual employees at Ballarat.

Division VIII.—Overtime.

(1) The provisions of sub-clause (g) of clause 1 are not applicable in respect of the following shifts worked by the stationmaster and the operating porters at Jeparit, viz.:—

27th February, 1925—From 9 a.m. till 10.30 p.m.;

28th February, 1925—From 9 a.m. till 11.15 p.m.;

6th March, 1925—From 9 a.m. till 10.50 p.m.,

in each of which shifts there was one break of one hour and one break of two hours.

(2) The time worked by certain high-tension linemen and their assistants on 11th and 12th December, 1923, viz., from 7 a.m. to 7.15 p.m. on the former date, and from 11 p.m. on that date to 7 a.m. on the following day, constituted two separate shifts, and accordingly such employees are not entitled, under the provisions of this Division, to payment at double rate during the period from 12.45 a.m. to 7 a.m. on 12th December, 1923.

Division XVII.—Youths Living away from Home.

Unless otherwise determined by the Commissioners, the allowances provided in this Division are not applicable in respect of any period of annual leave, whether such period form the whole or part of the annual leave due to any junior clerk, lad, or apprentice.

AWARD No. 13.

Salaries and Wages.—Rolling-stock Branch.—Employees.

The classification prescribed for the grade of block and tackle hand (employed at the Newport Workshops), viz., 1s. per day in excess of the wage of the employees under his control should be applied in such a manner that the employee occupying the position shall, in respect of any day during any portion of which he is engaged in lifting and turning the floors of cars, or stretching canvas on the roofs of cars, or performing block and tackle work incidental thereto, receive a rate of 1s. per day in excess of the wage paid to Car Construction Shop labourers, with whom he is at times associated in the performance of such duties, and who are paid in accordance with the timber workers' award of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration. On days on which he is not so engaged he should be paid in accordance with the classification fixed for the grade of block and tackle hand in the Rolling-stock Branch.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Apollo Bay Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz. :—

By-law No. 2.

The following are the rates and charges which occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the half-year ending 31st December, 1925, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District of the said Trust :—

(1) For every house and tenement up to £16 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £2 (Two pounds) per annum.

(5) For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unoccupied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, the amount of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.

(6) Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show grounds, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement at 1s. 6d. (One shilling and sixpence) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 15,000 gallons.

(7) For a supply during the erection of new buildings there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent, on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or; if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

(8) Except hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rates which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

(9) The fees to be paid for plumber's licence shall be £1; renewals, 5s.

1. For every house and tenement of £15 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £1 2s. 6d. (One pound two shillings and sixpence).
2. For every house and tenement of £16 annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.
3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months in all during the year, shall be charged two-third rates.
4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings sterling.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.
6. Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of 20s. per annum where the valuation of the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate of valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20 the trough to be exempt from rating purposes except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
7. Water supplied to cricket, bowling, or tennis clubs and to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement at 6d. (Sixpence) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 45,000 gallons per annum.
8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under of the sum of One shilling.
9. For a supply during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
10. Except hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.
11. Water supplied to market gardeners shall be charged for by measurement only.
12. For water supplied to botanic gardens, the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through the meter.
13. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be £1; renewals, 5s.
14. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipe of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supply so as to cover their outlay.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable yearly on the fourteenth day of July, 1926.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Colac Waterworks Trust.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.
RATING BY-LAW 1926.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities contained by Water Acts, make the following By-law :—

By-law number 44 fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust district, such rate being made for the year commencing on the first day of January and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1926.

The rates and charges shall be payable by the occupiers and owners of the lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District who are supplied with water by the Trust, as follows :—

1. On every house or tenement, not being a hotel or wine-shop, of the annual value of £20 or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.
2. On every house or tenement, not being a hotel or wine-shop, above the annual value of £20 and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. on the valuation.
3. On every house or tenement, not being a hotel or wine-shop, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.
4. On every hotel or wine-shop of the annual value of £30 or under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.
5. On every hotel or wine-shop above the annual value of £30, the sum of £6 per cent. on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.
6. On unoccupied lands and lands on which there is no tenement erected nor water laid on, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings. Should the water be laid on the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this By-law for tenements.
7. On every livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered one stall.
8. Water supplied by meter is to be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand (1,000) gallons; except to manufacturers, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the cost will be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons; provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
9. Water supplied by meter separate from house connexions for irrigation for gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.
10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering, or should the Trust require a meter to be put on, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
11. For water supplied to steam boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.
12. The charge for water for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.
13. The rates and charges shall be payable in one instalment in advance, on the first day of January, except in cases where the Trust has made special agreement regarding the time of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.
14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, or recover such rates or charges.
15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in case of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity at which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water was supplied other than by measure.
16. For a garden licence issued to occupiers of tenements under clause 1, rated at under £20 per annum, the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum, payable on 1st January. Water used under a garden licence to be used during daylight and through a hose held in the hand.

1. The rates and charges shall be payable by the occupiers and owners of the lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Hepburn Waterworks District as follows:—

1. On all properties of an annual valuation of £16 or over, the sum equivalent to a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling per annum.

2. On all properties of an annual valuation of and under £16, the sum of £2 minimum per annum.

Vacant lands shall be rated at Two shillings and sixpence on the annual valuation, provided the sum paid shall not be less than Ten shillings.

The charges for water by measure shall be Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons.

3. The rates payable on properties not abutting on streets in which mains have been laid shall be as follows:—

On properties within a quarter of a mile of any main, one-half of the above rate; on properties more than a quarter of a mile and not more than half a mile from any main, one-quarter of the above rate.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1925.

THE Commissioners of the Merrigum Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Merrigum Waterworks Trust and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1925 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates and charges to be paid on the first day of December, 1925.

(1) For every house or tenement, whether vacant or unoccupied or not, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Seven shillings in the pound on such valuation, with a minimum of Seven pounds.

(2) For all vacant or unoccupied land, according to the municipal valuation of such vacant or unoccupied land during the said year, the sum of Seven shillings in the pound on such valuation, with a minimum of one pound.

(3) Water supplied to Government Departments, police stations, churches, court houses, post offices, schools, mechanics' institutes, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special arrangement.

(4) For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants the charge for every thousand gallons or portion of same shall be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons, with minimum of sixpence for any one tank or load.

(5) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work, brick work and plastering, or in the absence of a contract twenty shillings per cent. upon the sum paid for stone work, brick work and plastering.

(6) The charges for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons up to the amount of rate and thereafter at the rate of One shilling and ninepence per thousand gallons.

(7) Supplies of water for any purpose not specified herein and otherwise than by measure must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made to the Trust before a supply can be taken.

(8) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be, if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charges of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand

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gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise.

(9) Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by the owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste or to use it in an unauthorized manner, or does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be reconnected to the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of 8 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m. For the purpose of conserving the supply during dry weather the Trust, in its discretion, may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

(10) No hose or pipe is to be supplied to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants or washing house or cars or carriages or for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by meter, and any person committing a breach of this shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

(11) Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away water from the premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(12) The Trust may, by notice, intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within its Waterworks District using water for domestic or other than domestic purposes that the supply is to be charged for by measure, and by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within one month from the date of such notice; and thereupon such occupier or owner, within the time specified, at his own expense, shall provide such meter with a certificate from some approved authority that same is in proper order, and shall so maintain same, and if any person shall neglect to comply with such notice such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(13) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

MERRIGUM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Merrigum Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Merrigum Waterworks Trust and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1926 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates and charges to be paid half-yearly in advance in equal moieties on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1926. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum in advance on 1st January, 1926.

(1) For every house or tenement, whether vacant or unoccupied or not, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Six shillings in the pound on such valuation with a minimum of Six pounds.

(2) For all vacant or unoccupied land according to the municipal valuation of such vacant or unoccupied land during the said year, the sum of Six shillings in the pound on such valuation, with a minimum of One pound.

(3) Water supplied to Government Departments, police stations, churches, court houses, post-offices, schools, mechanics' institutes, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special arrangement.

(4) For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants the charge for every thousand gallons or portion of same shall be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons, with minimum of Sixpence for any one tank or load.

(5) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work, brick work, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract, Twenty shillings per cent. upon the sum paid for stone work, brickwork, and plastering.

(6) The charges for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons up to amount of rate, and thereafter at the rate of One shilling and ninepence per thousand gallons.

(7) Supplies of water for any purpose not specified herein and otherwise than by measure must be paid for at such rate

as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made to the Trust before a supply can be taken.

(8) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be, if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charges at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise.

(9) Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste or to use it in an unauthorized manner or who does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be reconnected to the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of eight o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m. For the purposes of conserving the supply during dry weather the Trust in its discretion may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

(10) No hose or pipe is to be supplied to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants or washing house or cars or carriages or for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by meter, and any person committing a breach of this shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

(11) Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away water from the premises or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(12) The Trust may by notice intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within its Waterworks District using water for domestic or other than domestic purposes that the supply is to be charged for by measure and by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within one month from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner within the time specified at his own expense shall provide such meter with a certificate from some approved authority that same is in proper order and shall so maintain same, and if any person shall neglect to comply with such notice such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(13) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

TOORA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Toora Waterworks Trust do hereby, under the provisions of the Water Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Toora Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, and with the minimum charges and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust:—

- (1) For every township residence, house, shop, garage, office, hotel, saloon, or coffee palace with an annual municipal valuation of not less than Eighteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in every pound of such valuation.
- (2) For every vacant township holding with an annual municipal valuation exceeding Five pounds, the rate shall be Two shillings and threepence in every pound of such valuation.
- (3) For every farm property with an annual municipal value of Eighteen pounds and over, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in every pound of such valuation.
- (4) For every dwelling, office, shop, or building with an annual municipal value of less than Eighteen pounds, the rate shall be Two pounds per annum.
- (5) For every vacant township holding with an annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the rate shall be Eleven shillings and threepence per annum.
- (6) The charge for water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be Five shillings for every 1,000 gallons; provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (7) In the event of any dispute which may arise regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (8) In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.
- (9) The rates and charges herein mentioned shall be payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of March, 1926, except in the cases of water supplied by measure, the charges for which shall be payable on demand in each year.
- (10) The Trust may, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for domestic or other purposes that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within twenty-one days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, and at his own expense, provide and affix an approved meter, failing which the property shall be disconnected until such meter is installed.
- (11) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1926.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law for the year 1926:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of Seventeen pounds or under municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any main or stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such main or stand-pipe, and within half a mile, one-fourth the before-mentioned rate.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate paid on such lands and tenements. All excess water supplied by measure by the Trust shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such owners or occupiers of lands or tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam-engines, or stock who are supplied by the Trust with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such owners or occupiers are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using, such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable in advance, on the first day of January and not later than the thirtieth day of June, 1926. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST:

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1926.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—

- (1) For every house and tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum as fixed by the Governor in Council, Thirty shillings.
- (2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Thirty shillings per boiler per annum.

(3) For each vacant allotment abutting on a water main, Five shillings.

(4) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

(5) Any person who shall obtain water, or shall be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Thirty shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be—

(a) If for domestic or other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per annum.

Stopping Places on Route.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR SHOW YARDS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF LEONGATHA.

WE, Edward Bawden, John Eccles, Robert Davison Forrest, Arthur John Wright Simmons, and George Wheadon Williams, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the fourth day of July, 1905, as a site for Show Yards in the Township of Leongatha, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. All persons shall be admitted to the Reserve (but not to any stand or buildings erected thereon) from sunrise to sunset free of charge except as hereinafter provided.

2. The Committee of Management may appoint not more than thirty days in any one year upon which the Reserve shall be set apart for the purpose of agricultural shows cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, races, or holiday amusements, and on any of the said days a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every person to the Reserve.

3. Any person club or association renting or hiring any stand building erection or enclosure on the Reserve for the occasion of any agricultural show cricket or football match fête sports races holiday amusement or other purpose may be required to deposit with the Committee of Management any sum not exceeding £20 which the Committee of Management may determine by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand building erection or enclosure and the Committee of

Management may repair or make good any damage caused or done to such stand building erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such renting or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such damage from the sum of money so deposited by way of guarantee as aforesaid and all persons clubs or associations so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the said Reserve or any stand building erection or enclosure thereon and every such person club or association shall see that all rubbish paper glass or other débris is removed from the Reserve at the conclusion of such renting or hiring.

4. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress language or conduct.

5. No person shall damage in any way any tree shrub flower tree-guard fence gate seat building or stand in the Reserve or jump or climb upon or over or stick bills upon any of the fences or gates of the Reserve or leave or deposit any rubbish paper or glass in the Reserve or roll or throw any stone or missile of any kind therein.

6. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses cattle sheep goats or pigs or train or exercise any horse or horses in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or for the holding of any performance or exhibition without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or make use of or enter into any building booth or stand on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management.

10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve.

12. Any person committing any of the following offences within the Reserve or any building booth or stand thereon shall (in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable therefor) be liable to be expelled from the Reserve namely:—

- (a) Being drunk.
- (b) Using profane abusive insulting threatening indecent or obscene language.
- (c) Assaulting any person or behaving in a riotous or disorderly manner.
- (d) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports or during practice at cricket or football or when crossing or trespassing thereon would be injurious to or an undue interference with the playing ground as a cricket football or sports ground.
- (e) Obtaining admission to or being found in any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission thereto under these Regulations.
- (f) Betting or attempting to bet publicly in the Reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who knowingly or wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
