## APPOINTMENT OF A TRAMWAY CONVERSION BOARD AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SUCH BOARD AND OF THE TRAMWAY BOARD.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of December, 1925.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

- (1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the occupation of converting cable tramway lines to electric traction, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Carters and Drivers Board.
- (2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the occupation of converting cable tramway lines to electric traction, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Carters and Drivers Board.

Also that such Wages Board may, in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Tramway Conversion Board, and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts.

- (3) Adjust the powers of the Tramway Board and of the Tramway Conversion Board by depriving the said Tramway Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the occupation of converting cable tramway lines to electric traction, and conferring such power exclusively on the Tramway Conversion Board.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PREScribing ROUTES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN AREA ALONG WHICH MOTOR OMNIBUSES FOR WHICH "REGULAR SERVICE" LICENCES ARE GRANTED MAY PLY FOR HIRE.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924*, No. 3378, doth by this Order prescribe the routes within the metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the *Motor Omnibus Act* may ply for hire, also sections and terminal points and stopping places on such routes, time-tables to be observed by owners of motor omnibuses plying for hire, fares to be charged and the maximum number of motor omnibuses which may be licensed to ply for hire on any prescribed route, as set forth in detail in the Schedule hereunder:—

*Stopping Places on Routes.*

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

*Fares to be Charged.*

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 11 (1) (c) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924*, the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the Licensing Authority full power and authority for carrying into effect by the said Licensing Authority all of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

And the Honorable George Louis Goudie, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
