FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the seventeenth day of February, 1925 :  
Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the seventeenth day of March, 1925.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and in the fifteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
