A By-law making rates and charges for water supplied within the Water Supply District of the Shire of Chiltern.

THE Council of the Shire of Chiltern, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (Nos. 2747 and 2852), do hereby make the following rates upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Chiltern for the year ending 31st December, 1925, and to come into operation on the 1st January, 1925, and to be due and payable half-yearly in advance on 1st January, 1925, and 1st July, 1925.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes :—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds and under, 10 per cent. per annum on the amount of 1915 valuation.

2. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds, One pound per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds but not exceeding Thirty, One pound five shillings per annum.

4. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Thirty pounds but not exceeding Forty, One pound ten shillings per annum.

5. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Forty pounds but not exceeding Fifty, One pound fifteen shillings per annum.

6. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Fifty pounds but not exceeding Sixty, Two pounds per annum.

7. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Sixty pounds but not exceeding Eighty, Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

8. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Eighty pounds but not exceeding One hundred pounds, Three pounds per annum.

9. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred pounds but not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds, Four pounds per annum.

10. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred and fifty pounds but not exceeding Two hundred and fifty pounds, Five pounds per annum.

11. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Two hundred and fifty pounds, Six pounds per annum.

12. Water from the stand-pipes and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates :—

Licence to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand-pipes, One pound per annum.

Licence to cart water (with horse and dray) for use of licensee only, Ten shillings per annum.

Licence to cart away water from the public taps other than by horse and dray, Five shillings per annum.

13. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.

14. Water troughs, Five shillings per annum (providing ball regulating taps are used).

15. Livery stables, Ten shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

16. Hotel with stabling, not being a livery stable, Four shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

BY-LAW NO. 45, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 1925.

THE Inglewood Borough Council doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rates from the 1st day of January, 1925, to the 31st day of December, 1925, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Inglewood as defined, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1. A rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the valuation of every house or tenement, with a minimum of Two pounds sterling. On vacant allotments in streets where the Council's mains are laid the rate shall be 5 per cent. on the municipal valuation of such allotments.

2. The foregoing rates shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July, 1925.

3. Such person or persons as the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Inglewood may appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

4. Owners of steam engines or other property, not being domiciles, requiring water for same may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council; and all persons whose tenements and property are outside the Water Supply District may be supplied by making special arrangements with the Council.

5. Water-troughs and stand-pipes on the footpaths, streets, or outside property will not be permitted without the permission of the Council.

6. The owner of any tenement or property permitting or allowing any person to carry away water, excepting for the use of the tenement or property belonging thereto, will be liable to have the water cut off.

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1925.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 16.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

(a) For every house, building, or tenement, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house, building, or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound five shillings and sixpence per annum, and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer owning or occupying one house, building, or tenement only shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation.

(b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.

(c) And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings, or tenements within the Waterworks District to each of which water meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed, either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of the said houses, buildings, or tenements (and in all cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure), shall for that part or the whole of the year, as the case may be, during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings, or tenements, but for no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of the total sum of the municipal valuations of all the said houses, buildings, or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantity be exceeded, the excess shall be paid for by measure at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(d) For water supplied by measure a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid. Provided that the minimum quantity to be charged

for shall not be less than 17,000 gallons per annum, and that the minimum charge for Government premises supplied with water shall be Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied by measure to all consumers outside the water area and Urban District, a rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum charge shall be Three pounds per annum for such service.

2. The rates and charges herein are made for the year ending on the 31st December, 1925, and shall be payable in one sum on the 14th day of January, 1925.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rates.

SECTION 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the actual amount of energy supplied to him, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For any amount up to three units per month, Three shillings and sixpence; and for each unit over three units per month, One shilling and twopence.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prohibit the selling or exposing for sale of

QUAIL, and
 WILD DUCKS and TEAL of all kinds,

from the first day of January, 1925, to the thirty-first day of December, 1925 (both days inclusive); and I do hereby prescribe the sum of Five pounds (£5) as the penalty for any contravention of this Proclamation.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE SWAN HILL PARK AND
RECREATION RESERVE.**

WE, Frank Robert Legge, Edward Pickering, Thomas Purton, George H. Rowe, and Michael Kevin Smyth, the Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Public Park and Recreation in the Parish of Castle Donnington, Township of Swan Hill, as notified in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th day of October, 1924, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise until sunset free of charge except as hereinafter provided.
2. The Reserve shall be divided as follows :—
 - (a) For recreation purposes, namely, tennis, croquet, and bowls.
 - (b) For parks and gardens.

3. No persons shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No fire shall be lighted in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in such places as may be indicated by the Committee of Management.

5. No persons shall damage the buildings, trees, shrubs, plants, flowers, beds, guards, poles, posts, fences, or other property in the Reserve.

6. No persons shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind.

7. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, goats, sheep, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. No person shall travel with horses or vehicles over any part of the Reserve except over such parts of Reserve set out for the purpose.

9. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure, nor fence off any portion of the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall play or take part in any games in the Reserve except in the portions set apart for the purposes nor then until such persons shall have first paid the prescribed fees and charges as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.

11. No persons shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. All persons and bodies including the members of any club, renting or hiring or being allowed the use of any portion of the land for any games or recreation purposes may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Five pounds, which the Committee of Management may determine by way of guarantee, that due care shall be taken of such buildings, erections, or enclosures, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and the Committee of Management may, if any loss or damage occur, deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person or body by way of guarantee, and all persons or bodies so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve, buildings, erections, enclosures, for the time being thereon, and all such renting or hiring, shall be subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

13. No person shall carry on any trade, business, or calling whatsoever on any portion of the Reserve other than upon such portions as may be specially set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose.

14. No amusements, games, or other sports shall be held or carried on in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained, and only on such conditions as shall be laid down by the said Committee of Management. No charge shall at any time be made for admission to such amusements, games, or other sports unless approved or sanctioned by the Committee of Management.

15. Any person committing in the Reserve or any division thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable in addition to any other penalty provided by these Regulations, to be removed from the Reserve notwithstanding that such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto:—

- (a) Assaulting any person.
- (b) Using threatening, abusive, or insulting words, or behaving improperly or riotously.
- (c) Being drunk.
- (d) Refusing when requested by the Committee of Management to quit, or to cease using any portion of the Recreation Reserve set apart for any particular game or sports, or any buildings erected on the said lands or portion thereof for the use of the public or any particular club or society who may occupy same, with the consent and approval of the Committee of Management.

16. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of Section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending

may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CONDITIONS.

1. No games or athletic sports shall be played in Yarra, Princes, Flinders, or Fawkner Parks without the written permission of the City Council first had and obtained, on the application of the secretary of any society or club, or of any person desiring to play such games or sports respectively, and then only in such portions of the Park as may be set apart for the purpose and indicated by the City Council's officers.

2. Such written permission shall be revocable at any time without notice upon breach of these conditions, or of any of the terms of such written permission as set out in the Schedule hereto (of which breach the City Council shall be the sole judge), by any person or persons playing such games or sports.

3. No person engaged in any game or athletic sport in any of the Parks shall use indecent, abusive, or insulting words, or otherwise behave in an offensive manner.

4. The fees payable for the use of cricket pitches and football grounds in the Parks shall be as follows:—

Asphalt.—Every Saturday afternoon—£4 4s. per season.

A By-law of the Town of Mordialloc, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 56, for the purpose of amending By-law No. 52 relating to the supply and distribution of water, &c.

1. Clause 10 of By-law No. 52 is hereby repealed.
2. The Council may, if it so thinks fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which, if inferential meters, shall be at the rate per annum of—
For ½-inch meter, Five shillings.
For ¾-inch meter, Six shillings.
For 1-inch meter, Eight shillings.
For 1½-inch meter, Ten shillings and sixpence.
For 2-inch meter, Fourteen shillings.

Such rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to, the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of January in every year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current year. Every meter must be fixed by a licensed plumber at the cost of the owner or hirer on his premises in the position directed by the Engineer.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
