Factories and Shope Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE PAPER BOARD.

NOTE .- (1) This Determination on the 30th March, 1925, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(2) On the 4th July, 1916, the Paper Board was given exclusive power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed as storeman, packer, or sorter in connexion with making paper, cardboard, carpet felt, or any similar products.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed making paper, cardboard, carpet felt, or any similar products," has made the following Determination, namely:—


