Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922, No. 3195.
SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN ORDERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* (No. 3195) it is enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land from time to time to destroy all vermin on any land occupied or owned by him and on the adjacent half-width of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and to keep such land and half-width of roads clear and free of all vermin and for such purpose to do all necessary or proper acts or things: Provided that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert cutting embankment channel drain or work or any stone gravel wood or material deposited on the road to be used in the construction or maintenance thereof is a harbor or cover for vermin it shall be the duty of the council of the municipality in the municipal district of which such harbor or cover is situate to destroy all vermin therein and to keep the same clear and free of all vermin.

And whereas by section 12 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* specify a day on from and after which any duty specified in the next preceding section shall in the whole or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land within the whole or such part of Victoria (as the case may be):

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the eighteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, as the day on from and after which the duty specified by the said section 11 shall be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of land within the whole of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and in the fifteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

3. 4. BY-LAW No. 93.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 93, for repealing clause (7) of Part XII., and altering other parts of the By-law numbered 68, and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, prescribing the minimum area of land upon which certain dwelling houses may hereafter be erected; providing that certain dwelling houses hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof a prescribed area of open land providing in respect to buildings hereafter erected for means of escape from buildings in case of fire and the prevention of fire in buildings; and providing for the ventilation and lighting of certain buildings hereafter erected.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. *Repeal*.—Clause 7 of Part XII, subdivision 18 of By-law numbered 63 made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act* 1903 is hereby repealed.

2. That the By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 68, shall be altered as follows:—

(a) In Part I, subdivision 2 there shall be inserted—
"Residential Flat" means and includes a building erected, altered, occupied or intended to be occupied or used in separate Flats.

"Flat means a room or suite of rooms occupied or designed, intended or adapted to be occupied as a separate domicile. After the words "Fire Resisting" used with reference to any materials includes" there shall be inserted the words "For general purposes," and after sub-clause (f) there shall be inserted "For Special Purposes."

(g) In the case of stairs and landings, oak, jarrah, red gum, or other hard timber, the treads, risers, strings, and bearings being not less than two or one-half inches (nominal) thick, and the ceilings and soffits, if any, being or plaster or cement, approved asbestos sheeting, tongued and grooved jarrah, or other hardwood not less than seven-eighths of an inch thick, or iron not less than No. 26 Birmingham wire gauge.

(h) Jarrah, red gum, and other approved hardwood, when used for beams or posts, or in combination with iron or steel, the iron or steel, if any, being protected by plastering or other incombustible or non-conducting external coating, not less than two inches in thickness.

(i) In the case of floors—brick, tile, terra-cotta, or concrete, not less than four and one-half inches thick, in combination with iron or steel, and reinforced concrete not less than three inches thick.

(j) In the case of verandahs, outside landings, the treads, strings, and risers of outside stairs, outside steps, and porches, jarrah, red gum, or other hard timber not less than two and one-half inches thick (nominal).

(k) In the case of internal partitions forming party structures, enclosing walls to lifts, staircases, and passages—reinforced concrete not less than four inches thick, terra-cotta not less than six inches thick, brickwork, concrete, or other incombustible material not less than nine inches thick.

(l) In the case of glazing for vertical party structures and fixed borrowed lights in partitions of fire-resisting construction—two thicknesses of wired glass not less than one-fourth of an inch in thickness, fixed not less than two inches apart, in panels not exceeding thirty inches by twenty-four inches, the panels being secured in approved metal frames. In the case of glazing for horizontal party structures—floor lights of glass not less than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, or more than four inches square, set in metal or other incombustible frames; this shall only apply to floors of lobbies, passages, and landings.

(m) Any material from time to time approved by the Surveyor as fire resisting.

(b) In Part III., subdivision 8, there shall be inserted at the end of clause 5 the following clause:—

(5a) Concrete for hollow blocks, floors, backing of ashlar and reinforced concrete shall be composed of one part Portland cement, two parts

sand, and four parts broken stone or other aggregate approved by the Surveyor of gauge dimensions not exceeding three-quarters of one inch.

At the end of clause 6 the following clause:—

(7) The Council may permit the use of any new materials or methods of construction which may be approved by the Surveyor as being equal to or superior to those provided for in this By-law.

(c) In clause (1) and clause (2) of subdivision 12 of Part VI. of the By-law numbered 68, the words "two squares" shall be substituted for the words "one square."

(d) In Part VII., subdivision 13(a), at the end of clause 2, there shall be inserted the following:—

Hollow concrete blocks may be used for the construction of walls of buildings of one story, provided that such walls are not required by these Regulations to exceed nine inches in thickness.

The thickness of the concrete at face and back of such blocks shall be not less than two and a half inches with four-inch cavity between, and the thickness of the cross ties shall not be less than two inches for the full height of the block.

Ties shall be spaced not more than fifteen inches apart. Blocks requiring to be built up of special sections shall be rebated, dovetailed, or tongued together to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

Concrete blocks shall not be used green, and unless special permission is obtained no block shall be used within fourteen days from date of construction. The blocks shall be bedded and jointed in cement mortar.

Joists and beams shall not be let into hollow concrete walls.

(e) At the end of Part VIII., as altered by By-laws numbered 70 and 71, there shall be added the following clauses:—

16. Notwithstanding anything in this By-law contained, no building shall be erected, constructed, altered, or used as a Residential Flat unless such building be erected, constructed, or altered in accordance with the following conditions, viz.:—

(a) Such building shall be constructed of brick, stone, concrete or other fire-resisting material.

(b) Any building which is intended to be used as a Residential Flat shall be on an allotment of land exclusively belonging thereto having a clear frontage of not less than 50 feet, and a superficial area of not less than 6,000 square feet.

(c) The provisions of By-law numbered 68, relating to the distance from the building line of any street at which a dwelling house may be built shall apply to any building erected, constructed, altered, or used as a Residential Flat, and the external walls of such building shall not be nearer to the boundary of land not in the same occupation than 6 feet.

(d) Such building shall have in the rear an open space at the ground level and exclusively belonging thereto, of the extent of at least:—

(1) in the case of a two-flat building, 1,000 square feet; and

(2) for each flat more than two an additional 500 square feet, clear of any buildings erected thereon.

(e) Each flat in such building must be in itself a complete dwelling of not less than 600 square feet floor area, and must be provided with a bathroom, water closet, and sink, as specified under By-law numbered 68 for all dwelling houses.

(f) Each flat in such building must have a separate entrance to the open air for the use of the occupants thereof.

(g) Proper provision must be made for light and air to each flat to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

17. Notwithstanding the foregoing conditions no such building will be permitted to be erected, constructed, altered, or used in any unsewered area.

14a. *Prevention of Fire.*—Every builder shall comply with the following requirements for the prevention of fire:—

(a) Every building intended to be used as a public building shall have all walls, partitions, floors, and staircases constructed of fire-resisting materials. Roofs of hospitals shall be of fire-resisting construction unless otherwise permitted by the Council. All spaces used for

storage must have floors of fire-resisting construction above same. The floors of buildings not exceeding two stories in height may be of timber construction. Cellars and basements shall not be reckoned as a story if the floors immediately above them are of fire-resisting construction.

(b) Every building intended to be used as a hotel, lodging house, refuge, boarding house, apartment house, club, sanatorium, or similar institution, and any building intended to contain flats, shall, if more than three stories in height, have all walls, partitions, floors, ceilings, and staircases constructed of fire-resisting materials other than wood. If such building consist of three stories, or less, all walls and partitions shall be constructed of fire-resisting materials. Cellars and basements shall not be reckoned as a story if the floors immediately above same are of fire-resisting construction.

(c) No building of whatever class shall hereafter be erected or altered to contain more than four stories with floors of non-fire-resisting construction. All other stories or such buildings shall have fire-resisting floors.

All portions of the structure supporting a floor or roof of fire-resisting construction shall be of fire-resisting construction also, and all iron or steel work used for this purpose shall be fire protected.

(d) A water supply service for fire extinction, approved by the Surveyor, shall be provided in:—

1. Every building over three stories in height;
2. Every building proposed to be used as a factory;
3. Every building over twenty squares in area proposed to be used as a shop;
4. Every timber yard.

(e) Every building intended for use as a factory and every building which shall be more than two stories in height shall be provided with alternative stairways approved by the Surveyor, one or more of which shall be external fire escape stairways, or fire isolated stairways. The steps shall be of uniform dimensions throughout, and have treads not less than ten inches wide, exclusive of nosing, and risers not more than seven inches high. - (c) No signboards shall be erected across the roof of any verandah extending over the footpath in any street or road, nor shall any signboard erected in accordance with the preceding provisions project beyond the line of the street kerb.

(h) In Schedule "B," number 7, to the By-law numbered 63, the words "to Woodburn Road" shall be substituted for the words "to the south side of Burgess Street."
