TOOLEYBUG BRIDGE, RIVER MURRAY.

REGULATIONS and signals for the control of road and river traffic and the passage of vessels through opening span from half-an-hour before sunrise to half-an-hour after sunset, or by special arrangements at night.

Signals.—When approaching the bridge vessels are to sound three whistles when not less than half-a-mile from the bridge. During daylight a red signal will be shown from the centre of the opening span to indicate that vessel's whistle signal has been heard.

Vessels must bring up not nearer than 200 yards from the bridge until the red signal at bridge is changed to green, when, after sounding two whistles, they may proceed straight through the opening. During night-time vessels are to whistle and bring up as before provided, and send a messenger to the caretaker. Thirty minutes' notice is necessary. When bridge is ready a green light will be shown, and vessels may then, after sounding two whistles, proceed straight through.

Waiting for Vessels.—If vessels are not ready to proceed through within thirty minutes after the three-whistle signal the bridge will be closed, and fresh notice by the vessel must be given.

Towing.—No vessel travelling down stream will be allowed to tow punt or barge through bridge.

Making Fast.—No vessel will be allowed to make fast to the bridge.

Damage by Vessels.—Any damage caused to bridge by boats is to be repaired by the Government, and cost thereof to be paid by owners of vessel.

Road Traffic and Barriers.—When bridge is to be opened barriers will be placed across the roadways, and a red light shown on barriers at night. No person will be allowed to pass when barriers are in place.

Ladder and Opening Span.—No person will be allowed to climb ladder, tower, or any other portion of the bridge, or to be on opening span when it is being opened.

Storing Articles.—No goods or articles will be allowed to be placed or stored on any part of the bridge.

Camping.—No person will be allowed to camp or light fires in the vicinity of the bridge.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREAS FROM THE SHIRES OF DANDENONG, MOORABBIN, AND MULGRAVE, AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute majorities of the rate-payers in the respective portions of the Shires of Dandenong, Moorabbin, and Mulgrave, which are described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shires of Dandenong, Moorabbin, and Mulgrave respectively, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Borough of Clayton."

AREA DESCRIBED IN PETITION.

Commencing at a point on the Dandenong-road at the intersection with McNaughton-road; thence north-westerly along the said Dandenong-road to a point formed by the intersection of the said Dandenong-road with Box Hill-road; thence south along the said Box Hill-road, Victoria-avenue, and Clarinda-road to a point formed by the intersection of the said Clarinda-road with the old Dandenong-road; thence south-easterly along the said old Dandenong-road to a point formed by the intersection of the said old Dandenong-road with Kingston-road; thence east along the said Kingston-road to the south-east corner of allotment 3, section XI., Parish of Mordialloc; thence north by the eastern boundaries of that allotment and allotment 3, section VI., to Centre-road; thence west along Centre-road to a point formed by the intersection of the said Centre-road with McNaughton-road; thence north and easterly along the said McNaughton-road to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that their reasons for desiring severance are:—

(a) That the area comprised in the proposed new borough is portion of the extremities of three shires, viz., the Shires of Dandenong, Moorabbin, and Mulgrave, and that every part of such area is remote from the head-quarters of the existing shire of which it now forms a part, and that there is a community of interest in the area proposed to be constituted a borough.

(b) That the greater portion of each of the said Shires of Dandenong, Moorabbin, and Mulgrave is devoted to agricultural purposes, but that the greater portion of the proposed new borough will be devoted to residential purposes, and consequently the due adherence to the requirements of the *Health Act* 1915 is of greater importance in the area comprised in the proposed new borough than in the area comprised by the three said shires.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described, and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Borough of Clayton," to be subdivided into three Wards. THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz.:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1925. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable, in advance, on the first day of January, 1925, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by four quarterly instalments, payable on the first January, first April, first July, and first October of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate, that is to say:—
2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Two shillings and one penny in the pound on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty-five shillings.
3. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty-five shillings.
4. On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory using water in connexion with its machinery or treatment, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour-mill a sum of Fifteen pounds. The supply shall in every case be by or through a meter fixed in the manner provided in clause 12.
5. On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.
6. On every horse-trough, a sum of Ten shillings.
7. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement paying the ordinary rate herein imposed shall not exceed one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood. Only one service-pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement rated herein, and such service-pipe shall not exceed three-quarters of an inch in diameter.
8. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings and/or additions and/or alteration to existing buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for concrete, stonework, brickwork, and plastering shall be made; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or on amount charged or paid for concrete, stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention so to do. The minimum charge under this clause shall be Five shillings.

Cases where Water is Not Laid On.

9. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Fifteen shillings, and that no new service be connected to the Trust mains unless a standard fitting, known as a "lead connexion," be fitted, and in the case of renewal or repairs to old service connexion to the Trust mains a "lead connexion" must be fitted.
10. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any above-mentioned tenement, and facing a street or land in which a water main is laid contiguous thereto, the sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Ten shillings. If water be laid on such land described in this clause the minimum charge shall be Thirty-five shillings.
11. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust's secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water Supplied by Measure.

12. The charge for water supplied to nurseries and market and other gardens over one-quarter of an acre in area, and to all lucerne, sorghum, and other fodder crops whatsoever, shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and such supply shall be in every case by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the customer, after being approved by the Trust. Such meter shall in every case be fixed as near to the tenement boundary as convenient, and no supply pipe shall be affixed between such meter and the Trust mains. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be thirty-five thousand (35,000) gallons. The service-pipe for the supply of such water shall not exceed 1 inch in diameter. The minimum charge under this clause to be Thirty-five shillings (35s.).

12a. Where charge for water as in clause 12 exceeds the rate as in clause 2, then a refund not exceeding Thirty-five shillings (35s.) may be made.

13. No person shall irrigate from the Trust water mains or service-pipes any nurseries or market or other gardens over one-quarter of an acre in area, or any lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crops whatsoever without permission of the Trust, and save through or by an approved meter provided and affixed by the customer as provided by clause 12 hereof. Any person committing or suffering a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

14. The charge for water supplied to any "bowling club" shall be £10 per annum, and to "grass tennis courts" £20 per annum, such supply to be by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer in each case after being approved by the Trust.

15. The Trust may require a meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any house or tenement in any case where it deems the same necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply to such house or tenement.

16. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12, 13, or 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

17. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each one hundred (100) gallons.

18. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, or other By-laws complied with, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid or such By-laws complied with.

19. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the above-mentioned rates and charges.

20. In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1925; the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust; and the word "tenement" as used herein shall be deemed to include the whole of the land held or used by or on behalf of one person, as one contiguous property, whether divided into two or more parts by fences or not.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust on the 23rd February, 1925, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

RATING BY-LAW No. 38 FOR 1924-1925, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES, FIXING A SCALE OF CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE, AND REGULATING THE TIMES OF PAYMENT.

THE Council of the Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rates and charges upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Beechworth, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

On every house and tenement of the annual value of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under, a rate of £1 2s. 6d. per annum.

On every house and tenement and allotment above the annual value of Fifteen pounds (£15), a rate of 1s. 6d. in the £1 on the amount of annual valuation as per rate book.

On every vacant allotment or allotments enclosed by one fence, under the annual value of £15, a minimum charge of 10s. per annum where no connexion to main, and £1 per annum where connected to main, will be made.

This rate shall be payable in one instalment on and after the 9th day of January, 1925.

Water supplied by measure to any owner or occupier of any land or tenement, or to any other person (except in cases of special agreement with the Council), shall be supplied, charged, and paid for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 100 gallons.

The minimum of water to be charged and paid for in such case where water is supplied by measure shall be 500 gallons.

Water supplied by measure shall be paid for half-yearly on the 31st March and 30th September in each year.

This By-law shall be deemed to have come into operation and shall take effect from the ninth day of January, 1925.

The foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Beechworth at the Council meeting held on the fifth day of December, 1924, and confirmed on the ninth day of January, 1925, by special resolution, and the common seal of the said Council was hereunto fixed in the presence of—

Fruit Acts 1917 (Part II.) and 1923.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of March, 1925.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Fruit Acts to make Regulations for or with respect to standards and methods of packing fruit or vegetables for sale, and for other purposes, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

GENERAL.

1. The Regulations made under the provisions of the above-named Acts on the 14th May, 1918, 18th March, 1919, 9th April, 1923, and 6th March, 1924, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

SHORT TITLE AND CONSTRUCTION.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Fruit and Vegetable Packing Regulations 1925, and shall be read and construed as applying to fruit and vegetables for sale, and to the grading, packing, and marking of same, and shall come into operation on and from the first day of April, 1925.

DEFINITIONS.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—

“Advertising Matter” means any paper, card, slip, or anything inserted into any package of fruit or vegetables, and which bears any written or printed statement used for the purpose of advertising.

“Chat Potatoes” mean small potatoes such as are used for stock food purposes, and “Chat” shall have a similar meaning.

“Diameter of Tubers” in relation to potatoes means the size of the tuber measured from side to side at right angles to the axis of the stem and the apex.

“Factory” means any building or erection where fruit is processed for sale.

“Falsely Packed” means packed in any way other than is prescribed.

“False Mark” means any marking or description which by reason of anything contained therein or omitted therefrom is likely to mislead in a material respect as regards the weight, grade, or variety of any fruit or vegetables, or the description, kind, capacity, materials, dimensions, measurements, or conditions of any package to which it is applied, and includes every alteration of any mark or description whether by way of addition or effacement or otherwise which makes the marking false or likely to mislead in a material respect.

“Foreign Substances” means any earthy matter, stones, sand, or gravel, and, in the case of onions, an excess of loose skins.

“Fruit” means any fruit declared by the Governor in Council, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to be fruit for the purposes of the Fruit Acts.

“Grade” shall have relation to colour (when so required), maturity, variety, number, size, soundness, and packing, and “graded” and “grading” shall have a similar meaning.

“Inspector” means any inspector appointed under the provisions of Part II. of the *Fruit Act* 1917.

“Marks” in relation to fruit or vegetables, or (when so required) package means any description, information, statement, words, or marks, or any suggestions, direct or indirect—

(a) as to the colour, kind, number, size, soundness, variety, or weight of the fruit or vegetables and the capacity, dimensions, or measurements of packages;

- (b) as to the place or locality in or at which the fruit or vegetables were produced or packed or the packages were made;
 - (c) As to the name, address, and guarantee of the manufacturer of the package or the name and address of the producer of the fruit or vegetables or the person by whom they were selected, packed, or in any way prepared for market; and
 - (d) includes any mark, which according to the custom of the trade or of common repute is taken to be an indication of the above matters, and "marked" and "marking" shall have a similar meaning.
- "Mechanical Means" means any injury arising from cuts, fork-stab or bruising.
- "Open Package" means any package which has been left unclosed from the time in which the fruit has been packed therein until such fruit is sold for retail distribution.
- "Package" means any box, case, sack, or receptacle used or capable of being used or intended to be used for containing fruit or vegetables.
- "Packed" means packed as prescribed.
- "Packing Material" means straw-board, wood-wool, wrapping paper, or other material used in packing fruit or vegetables.
- "Practically Free" means that the appearance shall not be injured to an extent readily apparent upon casual examination of the lot and that any damage from cuts, fork-stab, or bruising can be removed by the ordinary processes of paring, without appreciable increase in waste over that which would occur if the potato were perfect. Loss of the outer skin only shall not be considered an injury to the appearance.
- "Prescribed" means prescribed by these Regulations.
- "Registered Brand" means any brand which has been registered with the Department of Agriculture in pursuance of these Regulations.
- "Sell" includes barter or exchange; and also includes agreeing to sell, or offering or exposing for sale or having in possession for sale or receiving, sending, forwarding, or delivering for or on sale or exporting from Victoria to any other part of the Commonwealth or causing, suffering, or attempting any of such acts or things, and "Sale" has a corresponding interpretation.
- "Sound" means freedom from damage or decay and from any abnormal condition of or in fruit or vegetables, whether consisting in the presence of or caused by or due to the operation, development, growth, or decay of any insect or fungus, and "Soundness" shall have a similar meaning.
- "Size" in relation to fruit means the diameter or size of any fruit measured from side to side at right angles to the axis of the stem and the calyx or apex.
- "Standards" means the standards set out in these Regulations.
- "Vegetables" means any vegetables declared by the Governor in Council, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to be vegetables for the purposes of the Fruit Acts.

GRADING, PACKING, AND MARKING OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES FOR SALE.

General Requirements.

4. Excepting where otherwise provided, the following standards and methods are prescribed as those to be observed and followed in connexion with the grading, packing, stacking, arranging, and sale of fruit or vegetables.

5. Fruit, or vegetables contained in any package of any description or size, or comprised in any lot shall be so packed, stacked, or arranged that each external layer on the top, bottom, and sides of the fruit or vegetables shall be uniform in respect to grade and shall be a true indication of—

- (a) The average grade, throughout, of the whole of the fruit or vegetables contained in such package or comprised in such lot;
- (b) The manner in which the whole of the fruit or vegetables contained in such package or comprised in such lot are packed, arranged, or stacked; and
- (c) The presence of any foreign substances contained in such package or comprised in such lot.

6. All fruit or vegetables contained in any package or comprised in any lot shall be sound.

7. The package in which fruit is contained for sale shall conform with one of the standards set out in the First Schedule hereto, provided that the packages described in the said Schedule as "Grape cases" shall be used for the packing for sale of grapes only.

8. All packages containing fruit or vegetables shall be reasonably free from dirt, stains, or unsightly markings from any cause whatsoever.

9. In the case of any fruit or vegetables contained in any package of any description, or size, or comprised in any lot—

- (a) The proportion of foreign substances in any package containing fruit or vegetables for sale excepting potatoes and onions or in fruit comprised in any lot for sale shall not exceed $2\frac{1}{2}$ per centum by either weight or measurement of the total contents of the package or lot.
- (b) The proportion of foreign substances contained in any package of potatoes or onions shall not exceed $3\frac{1}{2}$ per centum by either weight or measurement of the total contents of such package.

10. Packages containing any fruit or vegetables for sale shall not contain a greater proportion of—

- (a) Packing material than is sufficient to cover the top and bottom of the package to a combined thickness of one half-inch, excepting in the case of grapes packed in packages of the sizes shown in the First Schedule hereto, when granulated cork may be used throughout the package, but the maximum quantity of granulated cork to each package shall not exceed 5 lb.
- (b) Wrappers than is sufficient to effectually wrap or cover each fruit, and the maximum number of such wrappers shall not exceed two to each fruit.
- (c) Advertising matter than can be shown on one slip, label, or sheet of paper, or other suitable material of the maximum thickness of one-sixteenth of an inch, and of no greater size than is sufficient to cover the top layer of fruit or vegetables in any package.

11. All packages containing fruit for sale shall have conspicuously marked on the outside of the package itself or on a ticket or label affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of the package—

- (a) the initials of the christian name and the full surname of the owner of the fruit, or his registered brand, or in the case of a firm or corporation with the firm or corporate name or registered brand.
- (b) the name of the variety or varieties of the fruit.
- (c) in the case of apples, citrus fruits, pears and tomatoes, the designation of the grade of the fruit.

Such marking as aforesaid shall be in letters of not less than three-quarters of an inch in height if stencilled on the packages, and not less than one-quarter of an inch in height if printed on a ticket or label.

12. All potatoes or onions contained in any package shall be graded in accordance with one of the standards set out in the Sixth or the Seventh Schedule hereto, and such package shall, if required, after the conditions set out in the Regulations made on the 9th October, 1916, under the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1915*, with respect to marking of packages and other matters have been complied with; be marked with a designation of the grade of potatoes or onions in accordance with the provisions set out in the Sixth Schedule or the Seventh Schedule hereto.

13. Apples, citrus fruits, pears, and tomatoes shall be graded in accordance with the requirements set out in the Schedules hereto.

HANDLING, STACKING, LOADING, OR UNLOADING FRUIT AND VEGETABLES.

14. No person shall handle, stack, load, or unload any fruit or vegetables for export in such a manner that such fruit or vegetables are subjected to shock or pressure sufficient to bruise or injure.

EXEMPTIONS.

15. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Regulations, the following exemptions from the foregoing provisions relating to grading, packing, and marking of fruit or vegetables for sale may be permitted:—

- (a) Open packages of a size set out in the First Schedule hereto containing fruit for sale packed in accordance with the

provisions of the Second, Third, Fourth, and Fifth Schedules and paragraph 5 hereof need not be marked with the owner's name or address nor with the grade designation.

- (b) None of the foregoing provisions shall apply to any package of fruit or vegetables sold for manufacturing purposes to any factory provided that the words "For factory use only" are legibly stencilled in letters of not less than one inch in length on a conspicuous part of the outside of such package.
- (c) None of the foregoing provisions shall apply to any package of fruit or vegetables sold for rabbit poisoning provided that the words "For rabbit poisoning only" are clearly stencilled in letters of not less than one inch in length on a conspicuous part of the outside of the package.
- (d) Paragraph 11 hereof shall not apply to blackberries, cherries, currants (red and black), cape gooseberries, loganberries, raspberries, and strawberries when contained in punnets as prescribed by the First Schedule hereto.

PENALTIES.

16. The following penalties are hereby prescribed as those to be inflicted for a contravention of these Regulations (that is to say):—

- (a) In the case of a first offence any sum not exceeding One pound (£1).
- (b) In the case of a second or subsequent offence, any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

SECOND SCHEDULE.

GRADE STANDARDS FOR APPLES AND PEARS.

Apples or pears intended for sale shall comply with the following provisions:—

- (a) Apples or pears described as "Special" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed apples or pears of one size and one variety free from broken skins and from disease. Superficial blemishes caused by hail-marks, limb-rubs, and sprays shall not be allowed to a greater extent than 5 per centum (by number) of the total fruit in any case. The fruit shall not measure less than two and one-quarter inches in diameter, and shall be of good colour for the variety.
- (b) Apples or pears described as "Standard" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed apples or pears of one size and one variety free from broken skins and from serious blemishes, but fruit slightly blemished by rubbing, black-spot fungus, or caterpillars may be sold, provided that—

- (i) the proportion of such fruit does not exceed 10 per centum (by number) of the apples or pears in any case,

- (ii) the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple or pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of one-quarter of an inch.

Russetting of the surface shall not be deemed to be a blemish if the skin is unbroken. The fruit shall be not less than two and one-quarter inches in diameter, except in the case of varieties which are normally small, in which case the fruit shall be not less than two inches in diameter.

- (c) Apples or pears described as "Plain" shall consist of apples or pears of one variety and one size, free from broken skins, and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease, but fruit slightly blemished by rubbing, black-spot fungus, or caterpillars may be sold provided that—

- (i) the proportion of such fruit does not exceed 30 per centum (by number) of the apples or pears in any case.

- (ii) the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple or pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of three-eighths of an inch.

- (d) Apples or pears sold in open packages shall consist of apples or pears of one variety and one size free from broken skins and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease, but fruit slightly blemished by rubbing, black-spot fungus, or caterpillars may be sold provided that—

- (i) The proportion of such fruit does not exceed 30 per centum (by number) of the apples or pears in any case.

- (ii) the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple or pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of three-eighths of an inch.

Russetting of the surface shall not be deemed a blemish if the skin is unbroken. In the case of apples the diameter shall be not less than two inches.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

GRADE STANDARDS FOR CITRUS FRUITS.

Oranges, lemons, mandarins, and grape fruit intended for sale shall comply with the following provisions:—

- (a) Oranges, lemons, mandarins, and grape fruit described as "Special" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed, unblemished, fully-matured, and wholly-coloured fruit, free from disease, of one size and one variety, and packed as prescribed.
- (b) Oranges, lemons, mandarins, and grape fruit described as "Standard" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed, fully-matured, and wholly-coloured fruit, free from disease, of one size and one variety, of good weight for the variety, and packed as prescribed.
- (c) Oranges and mandarins described as "Plain" shall consist of sound, clean, fully-matured, and wholly-coloured fruit, free from disease, of one size and one variety, of good weight for the variety, and packed as prescribed.

- (d) Oranges, lemons, and grape fruit shall be packed only in any one of the cases having the following dimensions (inside measurements clear of divisions):—

"Export case" 23 inches long x 11½ inches wide and 11½ inches deep. "Bushel case" 18 inches long x 14½ inches deep x 8½ inches wide. "Half-bushel case" 18 inches long x 7½ inches deep x 8½ inches wide.

Fruit showing superficial blemishes caused by limb-rubs, sprays, thrips and oil markings arising from exudation of the natural oil of the rind shall be allowed provided that the total area covered by such blemishes of any one fruit does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of one-half of an inch.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

Tomatoes intended for sale shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) "First Grade."—First grade "ripe" tomatoes shall be from two-thirds full-coloured and shall be free from blemish and disease and be of good shape.
First grade "medium ripe" tomatoes shall be from two-thirds coloured and shall be free from blemish and disease and of good shape.
First grade "green" tomatoes shall be green in colour, excepting that a little pink to red colour is allowed at the blossom end of the tomatoes and shall be free from blemish and disease and be of good shape. Each case shall contain tomatoes of one size only.
- (b) "Second Grade."—Second grade "ripe" tomatoes shall be from two-thirds to full colour, and shall be sound and free from disease.
Second grade "medium ripe" tomatoes shall be from half to two-thirds coloured, and shall be sound, and free from disease.
Second grade "green" tomatoes shall be green in colour excepting that a little pink or red colour is allowed at the blossom end of the tomato and shall be sound and free from blemish and disease.

FIFTH SCHEDULE.

SIZE REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLES, PEARS, CITRUS FRUITS AND TOMATOES.

Apples, pears, citrus fruits and tomatoes must be sized into the following six sizes, viz.:—

- "Small," 2 inches, 2½ inches, 2¾ inches, 2½ inches, and "large."
"Small" shall include fruit under 2 inches.
2 inches shall include fruit of 2 inches or greater diameter, but less than 2½ inches.
2½ inches shall include fruit of 2½ inches or greater diameter, but less than 2¾ inches.
2¾ inches shall include fruit of 2¾ inches or greater diameter, but less than 3 inches.
3 inches shall include fruit of 3 inches or greater diameter, but less than 3½ inches.
"Large" shall include fruit 3 inches or over in diameter.

SIXTH SCHEDULE.

GRADE STANDARD FOR POTATOES.

"No. 1 Grade."—This grade shall consist of sound potatoes of similar varietal characteristics having regard to colour, shape and general appearance and of normal shape, practically free from insect or fungus diseases, and practically free from dirt or other foreign matter and damage caused by mechanical means or blemishes, including second growth, frost, sunburn, greening through exposure, sprouting, or other injury or deterioration.

The diameter of tubers of the round varieties shall be not less than 2½ inches, and of potatoes of the longer varieties not less than 2 inches.

Provided always that 7½ per centum by weight of any grower's lot may be ½ inch below the prescribed size, and further that not more than 5 per centum by weight may be below the remaining requirements of this grade except any defect due to disease or insect pest.

"No. 2 Grade."—This grade shall consist of sound potatoes of similar varietal characteristics having regard to colour, shape and general appearance and of normal shape, practically free from insect or fungus disease and practically free from dirt or other foreign matter and damage caused by mechanical means or blemishes including second growth, frost, sunburn, greening through exposure, sprouting, or other injury or deterioration.

The diameter of potatoes in this grade shall be not less than 1½ inches.

Provided always that 7½ per centum by weight of any grower's lot may be ½ inch below the prescribed size, and further that not more than 5 per centum by weight may be below the remaining requirements of this grade except any defect due to disease or insect pest.

These grades do not apply to potatoes intended for seed purposes, in which case the words "seed potatoes" shall be legibly stencil-branded on the containers.

"Ungraded" shall consist of tubers that do not fulfil the requirements of "No. 1" and "No. 2" grades, provided they are of good shape and sound and are not less than 1½ inches in diameter, and so packed that the outer or shown surface shall be a true indication of the whole of the contents of the package or lot.

"Chats".—Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing Regulations, sound potatoes of less than 1½ inches in diameter may be sold for table use, provided they are packed in separate cases or containers, or are exposed for sale apart from any potatoes specified in the foregoing grades.

SEVENTH SCHEDULE.

GRADE STANDARDS FOR ONIONS.

Table onions shall consist of sound bulbs of over 1½ inches in diameter.

Pickling onions shall consist of sound bulbs of 1½ inches in diameter, or under.

The whole of the above routes are prescribed for the period ending the 31st December, 1925, and will be reviewed at the end of the period specified.

Stopping Places on Routes.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

His Excellency doth by this Order further provide, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 11 (1) (b) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924 (No. 3378)*, that the Order in Council approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 28th January, 1925, prescribing routes within the Metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the said Act may ply for hire, shall be amended in the manner following:—

For Route No. 9 there shall be substituted the following route:—

"Commencing at the Melbourne Public Library, via Swanston-street, St. Kilda-road, Toorak-road, Elizabeth-street, Silver-street, Parlson-street, Milton-parade, Tooronga-road, and Malvern-road, to Burke-road, Malvern.

Route No. 10A.—Under the heading "Time Tables to be observed"—

For "Minimum service, 5 minutes" there shall be substituted "Minimum service, 10 minutes";

and under the heading "Maximum number of motor omnibuses to be licensed on route"—

For the figure "15" there shall be substituted the figure "8".

Pursuant to the provisions of section 11 (1) (c) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924*, the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the licensing authority full power and authority for carrying into effect by the said licensing authority all of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE EDENHOPE TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 19th October, 1915, the managers of the Edenhope Town Common having drafted the following Regulations for the management of the said Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

REGULATIONS.

No. 1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within the Township of Edenhope may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle or four (4) head of small cattle, but no greater number than four (4) head of any stock to be depastured by any one person.

No. 2. No person shall be allowed to depasture stock on the Common of which he is not the bona fide owner. If the management doubt the ownership of any cattle, the person wishing to register same must make a statutory declaration as to the ownership of any cattle if asked to do so by the management of the Common.

No. 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year, and the owners of stock registered during the currency of any quarter shall pay the agistment fees for the whole of the quarter:—

- (a) For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule—3s. 6d. per quarter.
- (b) For every cow or heifer—2s. per quarter.
- (c) For every steer—4s. 6d. per quarter.
- (d) Fillies, colts, and calves shall run free on the Common until weaned from their mothers, provided the mother is registered on the Common.

No. 4. No entire horse over the age of six (6) months shall be allowed on the Common, nor any bull over the age of six (6) months, nor any other animal which, in the opinion of the managers, is likely to prove a nuisance.

No. 5. All stock depastured on the Common and registered the previous quarter on which the fees shall remain unpaid for a period of seven (7) days after the commencement of the next quarter, shall be liable to be treated as trespassers, and all stock not registered the previous quarter shall forthwith be treated as trespassers.

No. 6. All cattle, after the fees in respect have been paid, shall have proper tags attached by the owners, unless instructions have been given by the managers to the herdsman to attach the tags to such cattle before being placed on the Common.

No. 7. No bullocks or horses belonging to carriers, unless entitled to commonage, shall remain more than twelve (12) hours on the Common, unless detained by accident or stress of weather.

No. 8. No person shall remove registered stock from the Common without the consent, in writing, of the herdsman or the managers.

No. 9. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the Common, and any animal so affected, if not removed by the owner thereof within 24 hours after notice to do so, shall be liable to be destroyed at the discretion of the managers.

No. 10. All cattle trespassing on the Common shall be treated as such, and will be liable to be impounded by the herdsman or the managers.

No. 11. The managers shall release from the pound any registered stock which may be impounded, unless such stock shall have been considered a nuisance and has been registered at the risk of the owner.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

- In clause (2) of Part VIII. after the words "There shall be provided in each dwelling room" there shall be added the words "including the bathroom"; and at the end of the said clause (2) there shall be added the words "no bathroom shall have a floor area of less than thirty-five (35) square feet and in no case shall the outlet vents of any bathroom be less than twelve inches clear of any bars or ornamentation likely to obstruct the outlet. All vents in walls and/or ceiling shall be properly framed in order that the laths may be cut away and a clear opening left as an outlet for impure air from the room."
- In clause (3) of Part VIII. after the word "roof" there shall be inserted the words "and those on floors above the ground floor."
- At the end of clause (4) of Part VIII. there shall be added the words "and every habitable room on floors above the ground floor not wholly or partly in the roof shall be at least nine feet in height from floor to ceiling."
