#### Factories and Shops Acta.

## DETERMINATION OF THE TENTMAKERS BOARD.

Norg.—On the 11th day of November, 1923, the powers of the Tentmakers Board were extended to enable it to fix "the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of a maker of—

Horse rugs; Cow rugs; Water bags; Outside blinds (except Venetian blinds); Canyas or duck filters; Canvas or duck mail bags."

This Determination, on the 18th April, 1925, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

I N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of a maker of tents, tarpaulins, sails, or flags," has made the following Determination, namely:

(1) That on the 18th April, 1925, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination

#### PROPORTION (IN ANY PLACE).

Apprentices.

One male apprentice to every three or fraction of three male workers receiving not less than 89s. per week of 48 hours.

One female apprentice to overy three or fraction of three female workers receiving not less than 48s. per week of 45 hours.

Improvers.

One male improver to each male worker receiving not less than 89s. per week of 48 hours.

One female improver to each female worker receiving not less than 48s. per week of 45 hours.

Provided that one female improver in lieu of one male improver may be employed.

- (3) Time of Beginning 7.45 a.m. And Ending Work 7.45 a.m. .. 1 p.m. on Saturdays.
  .. 6 p.m. on the other working days of the week. (4) OVERTIME.—That the following rates shall be paid for all work done during the times specified bereunder, viz.:—
  - Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work

    Between 1 p.m. and midnight on Saturday Time and a half.

Between 6 p.m. and midnight on any other working day of the week Between midnight and 7.45 a.m.

.. Double time.

(5) Special Rates.—That double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines, under the provisions of Scotion 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person or persons or classes of persons employed at any work for which the Board has fixed the minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the carnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
