WHEREAS by section 1, sub-section (2) of the *Supreme Court Act 1923* (No. 3286) it is provided that the said Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix the first day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, as the date on which the said Act shall come into force in the State of Victoria.

PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 2 of the *Supreme Court Act 1923* (No. 3286) on the Governor in Council from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any Court in Ireland to be a Superior Court within the meaning of the said Act: Now be it known that I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland to be a Superior Court within the meaning of the said Act.

APPOINTMENT OF A COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO MATTERS CONCERNING THE BENDIGO SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 21st day of April, 1925, appointed

ALFRED ALDRIDGE KELLEY, Esq., P.M.,

to be a Commission to inquire into and report concerning certain complaints which have been made against the administration of the Bendigo Sewerage Authority and against the conduct of certain members and/or officials thereof, and against certain contractors in respect of the following matters, viz. :—

1. That in the tendering for house connexion contracts improper practices detrimental to the interests of taxpayers and property owners in the sewerage area have been resorted to by—

- (a) Contractors.
- (b) Employees of the Sewerage Authority, and
- (c) Tradesmen and merchants who assisted and aided and abetted the contractors therein.

2. That secret information in the possession of the house connexion branch of the Sewerage Authority has been disclosed by certain officials of the said Authority to certain contractors to their advantage.

3. That differential treatment of contractors has been meted out by officials of the said Authority in respect of house connexion contracts.

4. That unfair trick tests have been applied to flush cisterns submitted by Messrs. Osborn and Nesbit, plumbers, of Bendigo, for inspection, and that fittings and pipes of the said Messrs. Osborn and Nesbit have been improperly and wrongly rejected.

5. That the services of certain employees of the said Authority have been utilized for the furtherance of private enterprise.

6. (a) That certain members of the said Authority being shareholders and/or members of certain companies have acted as members of the said Authority in respect of contracts entered into by the said companies for work for or on behalf of such Authority.

(b) That certain members and officers of the said Authority who are alleged to be members and/or shareholders in certain companies in Bendigo and elsewhere have secured for these respective companies an undue advantage over outside contractors in the matter of tendering for and obtaining contracts from the said Authority to the detriment of its taxpayers generally.

7. That the contract price and money paid for the installation of the sewerage tanks at Epsom was increased for insufficient reasons from £3,000 to £6,250, more or less, or, alternatively, that the tender price originally accepted for the installation of the said tanks was increased to a greater sum for no sufficient reason.

8. That the conditions existing at the sewerage works, Epsom, are insanitary and offensive, and that this is directly due to the inadequate system installed there and the improper working thereof.

And His Excellency has further directed that the sum of £100 be fixed as the maximum expenditure to be incurred by such Commission.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE NETTING BOUNDARY AT THE MOUTH OF THE NICHOLSON RIVER.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke so much of the Proclamation relating to the alterations of netting boundaries of certain rivers which was made the eighteenth day of July, 1919, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of twenty-third July, 1919, pages 1073-4, as relates to the Nicholson River, and in lieu thereof by Proclamation to prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing for the whole of the year within an area at the mouth of the Nicholson River bounded as follows:—

CITY OF BENDIGO.

REGULATION No. 52.

A Regulation of the City of Bendigo made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and clause 48 of Part X. of the 13th Schedule to the said Act which said clause is in force in such City by virtue of a By-law of the said City numbered 1 and this Regulation is for fixing within the limits of the said City the local matters mentioned in the said section and subdivision of the said 13th Schedule to the said Act that is to say:—“The standings of certain borough stage carriages to wit motor omnibuses whether separately or otherwise and the mode in which such omnibuses are to stand thereon and the time during which each such omnibus shall be allowed to remain at any such place.”

IN pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1915* and the By-laws made thereunder the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Bendigo make the regulation following:—

1. *Application of Regulation No. 25.*—That Regulation No. 25 of the said City shall continue to apply and be in full force and operation with respect to all hackney carriages and borough stage carriages not being motor omnibuses but that the said regulation shall so far as relates to motor omnibuses but no further be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. *Stands for Motor Omnibuses.*—(a) Every motor omnibus standing or plying for passengers on the main road between Bendigo and Eaglehawk and/or California Gully or any other place or places intervening on the said main road shall have for its standing that portion of Charing Cross known as View Point in front of the buildings now known as the Commercial Bank the Royal Bank and the A.M.P. Buildings and shall stand facing View-street.

(b) Every motor omnibus standing or plying for passengers on the main road between Bendigo and Kangaroo Flat and Golden Square or commencing its journey to any other place or places by travelling along High-street shall have for its standing that portion of Bath Corner in High-street 30 feet from the corner of Mitchell-street and extending to the Lyric Theatre and shall stand facing towards High-street.

(c) Every motor omnibus standing or plying for passengers on the main road between Bendigo and White Hills and Huntly or between Bendigo and North Bendigo or any other place or places in a similar direction or directions shall have for its standing that portion of Pall Mall on the Conservatory side of Pall Mall and shall stand facing towards Bridge-street.

(d) Every motor omnibus standing or plying for hire between Bendigo and Kennington or Quarry Hill or any other place or places in the said direction or directions shall have for its standing that portion of Hargreaves-street on the north-west side and being opposite the State Savings Bank of Victoria commencing from the corner of Mitchell-street and shall stand facing Mitchell-street aforesaid.

Each and every such stand shall be as close as reasonably possible from the left-hand kerb stone of the street or place indicated herein.

3. Any person being the driver or proprietor of any motor omnibus plying for passengers for the places mentioned in clause 2 hereof or any place or places in a similar direction or directions who commences the journey from any place or stand other than the prescribed stand shall be guilty of an offence.

4. Where there is more than one such omnibus standing on such stand at the same time each shall be drawn up behind the other at a distance of not less than 2 feet and the foremost thereof shall be at the furthest forward portion of the said stand and shall move off to its destination in priority to those behind it and each other such omnibus shall thereupon move forward to the same relative position lately occupied by its preceding one.

5. Any such omnibus which shall arrive at the said stand there being another or other omnibus or omnibuses being or standing thereon and shall take up its position at the rear of the then rear omnibus and shall move forward in its turn or order in accordance with clause 3 hereof.

6. No such motor omnibus shall be or be permitted to stand at any such stand or ply for passengers therefrom without having first obtained from the City Council of the City of Bendigo a permit in writing so to do. All such permits shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in each year and may be renewed by the City Council annually.

7. The time or times during which any such motor omnibus shall be or remain on such stand shall be as fixed by the permit from time to time.

8. Every motor omnibus shall include any motor vehicle used for the conveyance of passengers.

9. In the event of the contravention of these Regulations or any of them the driver or proprietor of such motor omnibus shall be guilty of an offence.

10. This regulation shall apply throughout the City of Bendigo and shall come into operation as and from the first day of May One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.
