3. On unoccupied land or lands on which no tenements are erected and water laid on the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual value shall be charged, minimum, Fifteen shillings per annum.

4. On unoccupied land on which no water is laid on or tenement thereon, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual value.

5. For water supplied to factories or trade premises using steam, the following amounts shall be charged in addition to the amount assessed on the annual value, viz., One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons per rated horse-power of the boiler or boilers up to 20 horse-power, on every horse-power in excess of 20, the sum of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, minimum, 10,000 gallons per horse-power in excess of 20.

6. For water supplied for irrigation for market gardens and orchards, the following charges shall be paid in addition to the amount assessed on the annual value of the land:—

For one half-inch service, £2 per acre; minimum, 15s.

For two half-inch services, £3 per acre; minimum, 20s.

For every additional half-inch service, £1 10s. per acre.

For one three-quarter-inch service, £3 per acre; minimum, 20s.

For two three-quarter-inch services, £4 per acre; minimum, 30s.

For every additional three-quarter-inch service, £2 per acre.

Not more than two services per acre to be allowed unless by written consent of the Commissioners, who shall have regard to the size and locality of the main to supply the extra services.

7. For water supplied to troughs in the streets of the Borough, Eighteen shillings per annum in addition to the amount charged for domestic purposes.

8. For water supplied to Government Departments:—

Railways, One shilling per 1,000 gallons by meter.

Post Office, One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per annum.

Police Station, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, minimum, 120,000 gallons per annum.

State School, One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 80,000 gallons per annum.

9. Provided the occupier or owner provides a suitable iron trough with ball-cock and locked cover, the following charges per annum shall be paid for stock purposes in addition to the amount charged on the annual value of the land:—

On land not exceeding 20 acres—Twelve shillings and sixpence.

On land above 20 and not exceeding 50 acres—Eighteen shillings.

On land above 50 and not exceeding 75 acres—Twenty-five shillings.

On land above 75 and not exceeding 100 acres—Thirty shillings.

On land above 100 acres—Forty shillings.

The rates and charges shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1925, at the Town Hall, Clunes, and if not paid within six months from due date will bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum.

The annual value of lands and tenements shall mean the net annual value of the properties as appearing in the valuation or rate-books of the Borough of Clunes adopted for the year ending 30th September, 1925.

7th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

8th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of land and tenements shall pay in advance in one instalment for the period from the first day of October, 1924, to the thirtieth day of September, 1925, in respect of water supplied by the Council (that is to say):—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Twelvence (1s.) for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) sterling.

(b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of October, or the first day of April, shall be charged two-thirds rate.

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelvence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(e) Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Council shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.

(f) For water supplied by the Council by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

(g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons, and the ratepayers shall be charged for a quantity of water, which at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from the stand-pipe.

(h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(j) For a supply of water for building purposes the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per centum on the contract price for all stonework, brickwork, and plastering, and in the absence of any such contract on the sum paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering. The Council may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement at the rate of 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons consumed. The minimum charge on the per centum basis to be 5s., and as per measurement 20s. Such charges to be paid by the owner of the building. Payment in either case to be made in advance.

(k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum of Five shillings. With paid meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Council shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Council before a supply can be taken or used.

(m) In the event of any dispute as to which subsection applies to any particular case, the Council shall have power to decide to make a special charge.

(n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons is equal to the amount of the assessed rate for the period which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(o) For water supplied to public parks and show grounds the charge shall be ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

(p) For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens, the Manifold-street Reserve, and Flagstaff Hill Reserve, the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

(q) The beforementioned rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January of the said year, and such charges shall be payable the fourteenth day of January of the said year.

(r) Such persons or person as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

BY-LAW UNDER THE WATER ACTS.

By-law No. 19.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year ending 30th September, 1925, on the valuation of each tenement built upon or to which water is laid on within the said Water Supply District of Ararat, with a minimum of One pound ten shillings sterling. On vacant allotments in streets where the Council's mains are laid, the rate shall be 5 per cent. on the municipal valuation of such allotments.

2. The foregoing rates shall be due and payable on the 5th day of January, 1925.

3. Such person or persons as the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat may appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1925.

THE Commissioners of the Benalla Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law for the making of the rate on all rateable properties within the Waterworks District of the Benalla Waterworks Trust:—

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Benalla Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being for all lands and tenements for the municipal rate for the Shire of Benalla, is hereby made for 1925, payable on the 1st day of January, 1925.

The minimum rate payable in respect of any property liable to be rated shall be One pound sterling for lands or tenements supplied with water from the pipes of the Trust, and Ten shillings for every piece of vacant or unoccupied land not so supplied, as fixed by the Governor in Council.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1925, No. 31.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law, viz.:—

A By-law for determining the rates which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the said Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Twenty pounds (£20).

2. A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Twenty pounds (£20).

3. On each unoccupied or vacant allotment or piece of land, a rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound on the net annual value of such rateable property, provided that no such allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).

4. Water to be supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for watering gardens, or for distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the water rate assessment of such land or premises for the time being, provided that the said assessment shall be the minimum charge for the year 1925, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such amount aforesaid.

5. For all lands and tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets on which the pipes of the water supply are laid, and which lands and tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such lands and tenements are over a quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of a mile and within half ($\frac{1}{2}$) a mile thereof, a quarter of the before-mentioned rates. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Donald for the time being.

Such rates are hereby made for the year 1925, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1925, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1925, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 1st day of January, 1925.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

THE BALLARAT SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

RATING BY-LAW No. 4.

The Ballarat Sewerage District.

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Sewerage Districts Act 1915*, No. 2761, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rates are hereby made under the provisions of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1915*, No. 2761, and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable properties within the Ballarat Sewerage District:—

1. Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District a Special Rate of Sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of all rateable properties within the said district.

2. Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District a Sewerage Rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable "sewered property" within the said district.

3. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1925, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1925, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of March, 1925, at the office of the Authority, situate Water Supply Office, Ballarat.

4. If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid Special Rate becomes during the year 1925 a "sewered property," there shall be levied

upon such property a proportionate part of the rate for unsewered properties for the portion of the year it remained an unsewered property and also a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.

5. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate or if there is no such valuation the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

6. Such person or persons as the Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Ballarat Sewerage Authority on the first day of December, 1924, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the eighteenth day of December, 1924.
