For the regulation and government of the General Market of the Corporation of the City of Melbourne upon the lands mentioned and referred to in the 5th section of the Mel-bourne General Market Site Act 1877, and in Crown grant entered in the Register-book, volume 4776, folio 955117, re-spectively situate at and to the south-west of the intersection of Queen-street and Victoria-street, and called "The Queen Victoria Market," and also of the General Market of the said corporation upon the land to the eastward thereof bounded by Queen-street, Therty-street, Elizabeth-street, and Victoria-street, and called "The Meat Market."

THE amended rules for the regulation and government of the General Market of the Corporation of the City of Melbourne passed by the Council of the City of Melbourne the twenty-seventh day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, as hereby amended, shall extend and be deemed to apply to all that piece of land mentioned or referred to in the Crown grant eniered in the Register-book, voluine 4776, folio 955117, and vested in the said corporation in trust for market purposes pursuant to the Melbourne General Market Lands Act 1917.

2. Rule 3 (1) of the above-mentioned rules is hereby repealed, and the following rule shall be inserted and read in lieu thereof :-

"3 (1). The Market standings, shops, stalls and enclosures, and spaces shall be appropriated to the sale of marketable commodities, garden, farm, and dairy produce goods, wares and nerchandise, and such standings, shops, stalls, enclosures, and spaces shall be let to occupiers for such days or periods and on such terms (except as to the sums payable for the same) as the City Council or the Market Committee thereof shall from time to time resolve. The dues, rents, and charges payable for the same shall be as the City Council shall from time to time by special order determine."

3. Rule 4 of the above-mentioned rules is hereby repealed, and the following rule shall be deemed to be inserted and read in lieu thereof:—

"4. Any person occupying any enclosed stall, store, or shop in the Market premises shall pay therefor in advance such sums for such periods as the City Council shall from time to time by special order determine."

4. Rule 35 of the above-mentioned rules is hereby repealed, and the following rule shall be deemed to be inserted and read in lieu thereof:—

"35. The permanent holders of standings, being bona fide growers or producers of fruits, vegetables, esculent roots, or other garden produce, selling or offering for sale their own produce, either personally or by their servants, shall pay in advance for such standings such rents for such periods as the Council shall from time to time by special order determine. In the event of any cart, waggon, wheelbarrow, or basket being found to contain other produce for which a higher payment is prescribed by special order of the Council, then the owners thereof shall pay any surplus dues over and above the previous payment. Any persons not the holders of permanent standings shall occupy such places on the Market as may be pointed out to them by the Market Inspector or any of his assistants, and shall pay such dues as are prescribed by special order of the Council."

"36. - 3. The erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building, or the use of any land, for the purpose of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements within such residential areas shall be and is hereby prohibited.
- 4. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law was in the same ownership.
- 5. Provided that the provisions of this By-law shall not apply to any lands or buildings used or hereafter to be used for the purposes of a school or church, nor shall they apply or be deemed to apply so as to in any manner affect the right of any person being a barrister or solicitor, or a medical practitioner, dentist, or teacher, to carry on the practice of his profession or business in any dwelling-house, or prevent him so doing.
- 6. Any person who is guilty of any wilful or negligent act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence, and in addition to a further penalty of Ten pounds per day for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after conviction or order of any Court (as the case may be).

3. Such form shall specify (inter alia) the particulars and descriptions and brands or apparent brands and marks, age, and sex of the stock desired to be registered, and the roads or streets and the riding or ridings of the shire on which the applicant desires to graze such stock.

7. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly in advance to the herdsman of the Council, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.

8. Any person entering stock during the currency of any quarter shall pay for the unexpired portion of the quarter, but not less than one month's fee shall in that case be accepted.

9. The Council shall have a discretion as to the number of horned cattle or horses which each applicant shall be entitled to register under clause 1 hereof, or to graze upon certain roads or streets from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the numbers to be grazed in any quarter.

10. No consent shall be given to any person to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any road or street within the Shire of Oxley, and any such animals found upon any road or street will be impounded by the Council's herdsman, as will any horned cattle or horses found grazing upon any road or street without the Council's consent under this By-law.

11. The Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to or straying of any animal grazing under the aforesaid consent, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the consent to graze shall be applied for and obtained strictly under these conditions. conditions.

12. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to-that age limit.

13. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of the Police Offences Act 1915, nor shall the Council be responsible or accountable in any way to the owner of an animal for any penalty incurred by such owner under such section, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon any road or street in the shire, or by any other person.

14. Every animal registered must have a tag attached thereto 14. Every animal registered must have a tag attached theretoas may be directed by the Council or its herdsman, such tag
to be supplied by the Council at the time of registration, and
