2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1925, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1925, and shall be payable on the 15th day of May, 1925, at the office of the said Commission's collector, at Charlton.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

## BY-LAW NO. 1527.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—QUAMBATOOK URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE AVOCA WATER TRUST DISTRICT.

**T**HE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Quambatook Urban District within the Avoca Water Trust District:—

(1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty-three pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.

(2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty-three pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.

(3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building, situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1925, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1925, and shall be payable on the 15th day of May, 1925, at the office of the Commission's collector, at Charlton.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

WHEREAS by section 40 of the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1915* the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, and repeal Regulations made under the said Act: And whereas an election held on the 3rd March, 1925, for a member of the Council of Agricultural Education for the eastern part of Victoria was invalid owing to the nominators of the candidate being non-resident in that part: And whereas it is necessary that another election for that part be held: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. Clause 4 of the Regulations of 11th day of July, 1916, is hereby repealed, and the following clause substituted therefor:—

4. The election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education shall take place on the 24th day of June, 1925, and on the fourth Wednesday in the month of June in every succeeding third year.

2. Clauses 2 and 3 of the Regulations of 18th day of February, 1919, are hereby repealed, and the following clauses are substituted therefor:—

2. The returning officer for each of such parts shall give forty-one days' notice of his intention to proceed on the day appointed to hold an election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education, and such notice shall be given by advertisement in the *Government Gazette*, and the returning officer shall also in such advertisement name the day appointed by him as the day of nomination, being not less than twenty-six nor more than twenty-nine days prior to the day named for holding such election, within which all candidates must be nominated as herein-after provided; and he shall also in such advertisement name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date on which it is given.

3. Any member of an agricultural society subscribing not less than Ten shillings per annum to any such society, and resident within any of the parts into which Victoria is divided for the purpose of the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1915*, whose name is on the Roll of Members of Agricultural Societies for such part, and being desirous of nominating any person as a candidate for election by such part as a member of the Council of Agricultural Education, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form in the First Schedule hereto, stating therein the Christian name and surname of such candidate, together with other particulars required by the said Schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than four other persons whose names are on such roll as aforesaid, and also by the person named therein as a candidate accepting nomination. Such nomination paper must be lodged or delivered by post at the place appointed not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed as the day of nomination.

For the regulation and government of the General Market of the Corporation of the City of Melbourne upon the lands mentioned and referred to in the 5th section of the *Melbourne General Market Site Act 1877*, and in Crown grant entered in the Register-book, volume 4776, folio 955117, respectively situate at and to the south-west of the intersection of Queen-street and Victoria-street, and called "The Queen Victoria Market," and also of the General Market of the said corporation upon the land to the eastward thereof bounded by Queen-street, Therry-street, Elizabeth-street, and Victoria-street, and called "The Meat Market."

THE amended rules for the regulation and government of the General Market of the Corporation of the City of Melbourne passed by the Council of the City of Melbourne the twenty-seventh day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, as hereby amended, shall extend and be deemed to apply to all that piece of land mentioned or referred to in the Crown grant entered in the Register-book, volume 4776, folio 955117, and vested in the said corporation in trust for market purposes pursuant to the *Melbourne General Market Lands Act 1917*.

2. Rule 3 (1) of the above-mentioned rules is hereby repealed, and the following rule shall be inserted and read in lieu thereof:—

"3 (1). The Market standings, shops, stalls and enclosures, and spaces shall be appropriated to the sale of marketable commodities, garden, farm, and dairy produce goods, wares and merchandise, and such standings, shops, stalls, enclosures, and spaces shall be let to occupiers for such days or periods and on such terms (except as to the sums payable for the same) as the City Council or the Market Committee thereof shall from time to time resolve. The dues, rents, and charges payable for the same shall be as the City Council shall from time to time by special order determine."

3. Rule 4 of the above-mentioned rules is hereby repealed, and the following rule shall be deemed to be inserted and read in lieu thereof:—

"4. Any person occupying any enclosed stall, store, or shop in the Market premises shall pay therefor in advance such sums for such periods as the City Council shall from time to time by special order determine."

4. Rule 35 of the above-mentioned rules is hereby repealed, and the following rule shall be deemed to be inserted and read in lieu thereof:—

"35. The permanent holders of standings, being bona fide growers or producers of fruits, vegetables, esculent roots, or other garden produce, selling or offering for sale their own produce, either personally or by their servants, shall pay in advance for such standings such rents for such periods as the Council shall from time to time by special order determine. In the event of any cart, waggon, wheelbarrow, or basket being found to contain other produce for which a higher payment is prescribed by special order of the Council, then the owners thereof shall pay any surplus dues over and above the previous payment. Any persons not the holders of permanent standings shall occupy such places on the Market as may be pointed out to them by the Market Inspector or any of his assistants, and shall pay such dues as are prescribed by special order of the Council."

5. Rule 36 of the above-mentioned rules is hereby repealed, and the following rule shall be deemed to be inserted and read in lieu thereof:—

"36. Wholesale agents for and dealers in fruit, vegetables, esculent roots, and garden produce occupying permanent standings shall pay therefor in advance such sums for such periods as the City Council shall from time to time by special order determine, and any wholesale agents, dealers, and vendors of produce as aforesaid not having permanent standings shall take up such positions as shall be pointed out to them by the Market Inspector or any of his assistants, and shall pay therefor in advance for every standing such sum as the City Council shall from time to time by special order determine, and no standing shall exceed eight and one-half feet of frontage."

6. Rule 41 of the above-mentioned rules is hereby repealed, and the following rule shall be deemed to be inserted and read in lieu thereof:—

"41. The retail vendors of marketable commodities, goods, wares, and merchandise shall take up such positions during the continuance of the wholesale vegetable market and at other times as the Market Inspector or his assistants shall assign to them, and they shall pay as market dues a sum not exceeding 2s. 6d. for each time of occupying a standing, which shall not exceed eight and one-half feet of frontage."

## TOWN OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

## BY-LAW No. 14.—RESIDENTIAL AREAS.

A By-law of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, numbered 14, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1921* (No. 3167) and the *Local Government Act 1924* (No. 3388), for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of such residential areas the erection, adaptation for use, or use of any building, or the use of any land for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 13 is hereby repealed.

2. The areas within the municipal district herein specified shall be and are hereby prescribed as residential areas, that is to say, all properties situated in or having frontages to the following streets:—

Aberdeen-street, from Latrobe-terrace to Pakington-street to a depth of 250 feet; Skene-street, from Latrobe-terrace to Pakington-street to a depth of 200 feet; Elizabeth-street to a depth of 150 feet; Virginia-street to a depth of 120 feet on the north side, and 250 feet on the south side; Regent-street to a depth of 100 feet; Laurel Bank-parade to a depth of 170 feet; Buckland-avenue to a depth of 110 feet; Austin-street, north side, to a depth of 110 feet; Latrobe-terrace, from Aberdeen-street to Austin-street to a depth of 220 feet; Pakington-street, east side, from Aberdeen-street to Austin-street to a depth of 190 feet; Pakington-street, west side, from Aberdeen-street to Mercer-parade to a depth of 266 feet; Aberdeen-street, from Pakington-street to George-street to a depth of 190 feet; Hermitage-road to a depth of 130 feet; Retreat-road to a depth of 200 feet; Aphrasia-street, from Pakington-street to Talbot-street to a depth of 155 feet; Talbot-street, from Aphrasia-street to Noble-street to a depth of 160 feet; Prospect-road to a depth of 175 feet; Mercer-parade, from Talbot-street to Pleasant-street to a depth of 160 feet; Noble-street, north side, from Shannon-avenue to a point 190 feet west of Pleasant-street to a depth of 200 feet; Noble-street, north side, from Shannon-avenue to a point 1,250 feet to a depth of 200 feet; Noble-street, south side, from Miles-street to a point 1,250 feet west of Shannon-avenue to a depth of 300 feet; Claremont-avenue to a depth of 185 feet; Shannon-avenue, east side, from William-street to a point 53 feet north of High-street to a depth of 200 feet; Shannon-avenue, from Nantes-street to Bayswater-road to a depth of 200 feet; Wallace-street to a depth of 155 feet; Miles-street to a depth of 120 feet; Fairview-avenue, north side, from Fairview-street to Cairns-avenue to a depth of 200 feet; Nantes-street to a depth of 200 feet; Stephen-street to a depth of 240 feet; Aphrasia-street, north side, from Ruthven-street to Shannon-avenue to a depth of 150 feet; Aphrasia-street, south side, from Shannon-avenue 1,000 feet west to a depth of 180 feet; Minerva-road, from Upper Skene-street to Read-street to a depth of 1,600 feet; Minerva-road, from Read-street to Fransford-road to a depth of 200 feet; Read-street, north side, to a depth of 185 feet; Elderslie-terrace to a depth of 120 feet.

3. The erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building, or the use of any land, for the purpose of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements within such residential areas shall be and is hereby prohibited.

4. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law was in the same ownership.

5. Provided that the provisions of this By-law shall not apply to any lands or buildings used or hereafter to be used for the purposes of a school or church, nor shall they apply or be deemed to apply so as to in any manner affect the right of any person being a barrister or solicitor, or a medical practitioner, dentist, or teacher, to carry on the practice of his profession or business in any dwelling-house, or prevent him so doing.

6. Any person who is guilty of any wilful or negligent act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence, and in addition to a further penalty of Ten pounds per day for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after conviction or order of any Court (as the case may be).

## SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

## By-Law No. 80.

## REGULATING BATHING IN THE FAIRFIELD SWIMMING BASIN.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 80, for regulating bathing in the Fairfield Swimming Basin.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order and direct as follows:—

1. The Swimming Basin shall be open to the public from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m.

2. No male person above the age of 16 years shall bathe in the Swimming Basin.

3. No person shall bathe in the Swimming Basin unless such person be properly attired from neck to knee in a bathing costume as shall preserve public decency.

4. No person shall dress or undress, or remove any part of his or her bathing costume, except within that portion of the building set apart for such purpose.

5. No male shall enter the portion of the building set apart for a dressing-room for females, and no female shall enter any dressing-room provided and reserved for males.

6. Any person in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the said Swimming Basin and the precincts thereof by any constable, officer or employee of the Council, and in addition may be prosecuted for any breach of this By-law.

7. No person shall play any game, make any wager for money, loiter, sit, or stand within the precincts of the Swimming Basin upon being required by any member of the Police Force or any officer or employee of the Council of the aforesaid shire to discontinue playing such game, loitering, sitting, or standing.

8. No person shall bathe any animal in the Swimming Basin.

9. No person shall deposit any rubbish or filth or other offensive matter in the Swimming Basin, nor shall he in any way disfigure, damage, write, or paint upon either the Swimming Basin or the dressing-rooms connected therewith any figure, device, poster, or advertisement.

Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

## Local Government Act 1915, Fourteenth Schedule.

## SHIRE OF OXLEY.

A By-law of the Shire of Oxley, made under sections 197, 497, and 498, and Part I., clause 9, of the *Thirteenth Schedule*, numbers 41, 42, 43, 44, and 45 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 7, for regulating the conditions under which cattle may be driven on to any road or street within the shire for the purpose of grazing there with the Council's consent.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Oxley order as follows:—

## By-Law No. 7.

1. That any ratepayer of the Shire of Oxley shall be entitled to and may apply to register a number not exceeding twenty-five head of horned cattle and twelve head of horses in each of the quarters of the year provided in clause 7 hereof.

2. Applications to be registered shall be in the form in the schedule hereunder, supplied by the Council, and shall be signed by the applicant, and the applicant shall make a statutory declaration as to the bona fides of his ownership of the animals sought to be registered.

3. Such form shall specify (inter alia) the particulars and descriptions and brands or apparent brands and marks, age, and sex of the stock desired to be registered, and the roads or streets and the riding or ridings of the shire on which the applicant desires to graze such stock.

4. Such form of application shall be submitted to the Council for approval.

5. If the Council approve the application it shall issue a consent in the form to be approved by the Council to the applicant.

6. The charges or fees subject to increase or decrease by a resolution of the Council from time to time for grazing shall be—

(a) For each head of horned cattle above the age of six months, Four shillings per quarter.

(b) For each horse above the age of six months, Six shillings per quarter.

7. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly in advance to the herdsman of the Council, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.

8. Any person entering stock during the currency of any quarter shall pay for the unexpired portion of the quarter, but not less than one month's fee shall in that case be accepted.

9. The Council shall have a discretion as to the number of horned cattle or horses which each applicant shall be entitled to register under clause 1 hereof, or to graze upon certain roads or streets from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the numbers to be grazed in any quarter.

10. No consent shall be given to any person to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any road or street within the Shire of Oxley, and any such animals found upon any road or street will be impounded by the Council's herdsman, as will any horned cattle or horses found grazing upon any road or street without the Council's consent under this By-law.

11. The Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to or straying of any animal grazing under the aforesaid consent, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the consent to graze shall be applied for and obtained strictly under these conditions.

12. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that age limit.

13. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, nor shall the Council be responsible or accountable in any way to the owner of an animal for any penalty incurred by such owner under such section, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon any road or street in the shire, or by any other person.

14. Every animal registered must have a tag attached thereto as may be directed by the Council or its herdsman, such tag to be supplied by the Council at the time of registration, and to be and remain the property of the Council, and must be returned to the Council or its herdsman by the registered owner at the termination of any grazing period or earlier if so determined by the Council or in the event of such animal being sold, and any animal found grazing on any road or street in the shire without the prescribed tag attached shall be conclusively deemed to be unregistered.

15. A registered owner of animals shall acquaint the herdsman of the fact of the sale or death or removal or withdrawal of any registered animal, and in case of sale, of the name and address of the purchaser.

16. Any consent given by the Council may in its discretion be withdrawn either wholly or in part and either as to all or any of the animals included therein, or as to all or any of the roads and streets covered thereby at the end of any quarter then current or earlier on a report by the herdsman that in his opinion any animal is suffering from any form of complaint or disease, or is a nuisance or dangerous, or is in the habit of breaking or getting through fences, or that feed or water are scarce or insufficient.
