Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE GLUE AND GELATINE BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 2nd July, 1925, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the trade of manufacturing glue and gelatine,” has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 2nd July, 1925, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for the above holidays the special rate shall be payable only on the day so substituted.

(5) **DAY FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.**—Friday shall be the day for payment of wages.

SPECIFICATION FOR CASTINGS.

1. All Castings under this Contract shall be supplied subject to the approval of the Officer duly authorized by the Department for which the castings are required, to order or accept delivery of same.
2. Castings of a special character other than those provided for under this Schedule may be obtained locally without infringing this Contract.
3. All castings are to be clean, sharp, free from surface scale, shell, cold shuts, blow holes, honey-comb, cinder, or any other imperfections, and are to be sound in every respect, and thoroughly close in grain. When specially ordered, the castings are to be run with heads or runners of such weight as may be ordered, such heads and runners to be cut off by the Contractor before delivery is made, and the charge for the casting must be at the net weight only, trimmed and clean.
4. Whenever specially ordered, the iron castings shall be run from the very best "cold-blast iron" of such particular brand, quality, and mixture as may be described in the order; or of such other substituted mixture as may be approved or directed by the Officer of the Department ordering, so as to produce a hard, close, soft, or other description of metal, at the option and to the satisfaction of the Officer ordering.
5. Whenever castings are required and, in the opinion of the Officer ordering, they can be moulded from the broken originals, the Contractor will be bound to mould from such broken originals without requiring the Government to supply a wooden or other pattern for same, and without being allowed any extra rate.
6. All patterns lent by the Government will be delivered to the Contractor at his works, and all such patterns must be returned by and at the expense of the Contractor in good order and condition, and must be delivered together with the castings. In the event of the non-return of any of the patterns, or of their being damaged, the price, which will be fixed by the Officer ordering, shall be paid by the Contractor, or may be deducted from any money due to the Contractor or from his security money.
7. The Contractor shall, during the currency of this contract, furnish the Officer ordering with the address or addresses of the place or places at which the steel castings are being manufactured by the Contractor, and the Officer ordering, or any person appointed by him from time to time shall at all times during business hours have free access to such place or places, and shall be afforded every facility for inspecting the castings while in process of manufacture.

QUALITY AND TESTING OF STEEL CASTINGS.

9. *Process of Manufacture.* Steel for castings shall be made by the open hearth process, Acid or Basic, or by such other process as may be approved by the Officer duly authorized by the Department to accept delivery of the castings contracted for.

10. *ANNEALING.*—All Steel castings shall be thoroughly annealed in a properly constructed annealing furnace, which must permit of the whole casting being uniformly raised in temperature throughout its whole extent to the necessary intensity required for annealing purposes. The casting shall be allowed to cool down prior to removal from the annealing furnace; and if subsequently heated for any purpose it shall be again similarly annealed if required by the Officer duly authorized by the Department to accept delivery.

11. *TESTING AND INSPECTION.*—The following tests and inspections shall be made, preferably at the place of manufacture prior to despatch, but in the event of any casting proving unsatisfactory in the course of preparation, or fitting in its place, such casting shall be rejected, notwithstanding any previous certificate of satisfactory testing.

12. *TENSILE AND BEND TEST PIECES.*—The tensile strength and ductility shall be determined from standard test pieces, which are to be prepared from sample pieces cast on the casting. These sample pieces are not to be cut, or partially cut, from the castings until the annealing of such castings has been completed, nor until they have been stamped by the Officer duly authorized to accept delivery. The test pieces are to be stamped by the aforesaid Officer after the annealing. All test pieces shall be selected by the aforesaid Officer and tested in his presence, and he shall satisfy himself that the conditions herein described are fulfilled.

13. *NUMBER OF TESTS.*—At least one tensile test and one cold bend test are to be taken from each casting. In castings of complex design, at least two tensile and two cold bend tests are to be taken. Where a casting is made from more than one charge of steel, at least four tensile and four cold bend tests are to be taken from pieces cast as far apart as possible on the casting, some test pieces being taken from as near the top and others from as near the bottom of the casting as practicable.

14. *DIMENSIONS OF TENSILE TEST PIECES.*—The tensile test pieces are to be turned so as to have a diameter of .564 inch with a gauge length of 2 inches, or a diameter of .798 inch with a gauge length of 3 inches, or a diameter of .977 inch with a gauge length of 3 1/2 inches.

15. *DIMENSIONS OF BEND TEST PIECES.*—The bend test pieces are to be machined to a rectangular section 1 inch wide by 3/4 inch thick, with the edges rounded to a radius of 1/8 of an inch. They are to be bent over the thinner section. The bending may be performed either by pressure or blows.

16. *TENSILE TESTS.*—The tensile breaking strength determined from test pieces of standard dimensions is to be between the limits of 26 and 35 tons per square inch, with an elongation of not less than 20 per cent. measured on the standard test piece.

17. *BEND TESTS.*—The bend test pieces must withstand, without fracture, being bent cold through an angle of 120 degrees, the internal radius of the bend being not greater than 1 inch.

18. *ADDITIONAL TESTS BEFORE REJECTION.*—Should either the tensile or bend test, or both, fail, and should the Officer duly authorized for the purpose consider the fractured test piece or test pieces, or the results obtained therefrom, do not fairly represent the quality of the casting, a duplicate of the test or tests which failed shall be made if requested by the maker. In such cases the quality of the casting shall be judged by the result of the duplicate test or tests, and not by the original test or tests which failed.

19. *PERCUSSION TESTS.*—Stern frames cast in one piece to be let fall on hard ground (excavations to be made to take bosses and other projections) after being raised through an angle of 45 degrees. Stern frames cast in more than one piece, rudders, steering quadrants, crossheads, tillers, &c., are to be dropped on hard ground from a height of from 7 to 10 feet, according to the design, shape, and weight of the casting.

20. *CASTINGS OF COMPLEX DESIGN.*—Castings of complex design which are liable to be deformed if submitted to the drop or percussive test, may have this test dispensed with provided two tensile and two cold bend tests be made upon pieces taken from positions as far apart as possible on each casting; one tensile and one bend test being taken from as near the top, and the others from as near the bottom, of the casting as practicable.

21. *HAMMERING TESTS.*—After being subjected to the percussive test, the casting in each case is to be subsequently slung up and well hammered with a sledge hammer not less in weight than 7 lb., to satisfy the Officer duly authorized for the purpose that the casting is sound and without flaw. This hammering test is also to be applied to castings of complex design which may not have been submitted to a percussive test.

22. *DRILLING TESTS.*—In the case of large castings, the Officer duly authorized by the Department is to supplement the foregoing tests by drilling small holes at such parts of the castings as experience shows cavities and contraction cracks are most likely to occur, and at positions which are to be agreed upon between the aforesaid Officer and the manufacturer, in order to determine the soundness or otherwise of the casting. These holes are afterwards to be tapped and properly filled up with screw plugs.

The White Lead must be finely ground in the best quality of pure linseed oil, the proportion of which must not exceed seven and one half per cent. of the weight.

The surface of the lead when exposed to the air without water on the top of the lead shall not become brittle or crumbly after seven days' exposure.

INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS ORDERING OILS.

In ordering Oils under this schedule care must be taken by officers requiring same to ascertain for what purpose the Oil is to be applied.

If required, a sample of not less than 2 pints, properly labelled with Item No. and purpose for which the Oil is required, must be forwarded to the Tender Board by officers receiving the supply, for analytical and testing purposes.

Where safe storage capacity admits, Oils must be ordered for 12 months', 6 months', or 3 months' supply, as the case may be, so as to reduce the cost of testing to a minimum amount.

Care must be exercised to ensure economy with efficiency, and with this object in view, Oils once used on bearings and no longer suitable for the purpose for which it is ordered, where practicable, must be filtered and again used for less important lubrications, and in case such Oil cannot be used again it must be collected and arrangements made with the Tender Board for its sale at reasonable periods.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT FOR GENERAL STORES, 1925-26, &c.

1. Except where actual quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.
3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall if required by the Government bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.
4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedules, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
6. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office.
7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the goods.
8. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 8.
10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.
12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 8.
13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 15 and 16 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor upon report from the Tender Board to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.
14. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly written business label.
15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Commonwealth departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 16. (In the case of the Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 13 of these conditions.
16. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted, as in Clause 8.
17. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide in writing on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.
18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.
19. The contracts entered into under these conditions are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works through the Board of Land and Works or State Rivers and Water Supply, Forests, and Electricity Commissioners, or on account of the Land Settlement and Purchase Board or for the Federal Government, or for the Railway Department, or for supplies for Technical, High or Higher Elementary Schools, or for the Metropolitan Parks and Gardens, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings for Drills and Batteries; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.
20. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice to the opposite party, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.
21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in Clause 20, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
