## RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

## ORDERS OF 2ND JUNE, 1925.

## Relating to—

(1) Certain matters arising out of Awards (No. 3, No. 6, No. 8, No. 11, and No. 13) of the Railways Classification Board.

(2) A difference between the Victorian Railways Commissioners and the grade of the said Commissioners known as Slaters.

(3) A difference between the Victorian Railways Commissioners and the grade of the said Commissioners known as Boilermakers' Helps and employed at the Bendigo North Workshops.

(4) A correction of Award (No. 13) of the Railways Classification Board dated 19th December, 1924.

In the matter of the Railways Classification Board Acts  
and

In the matter of references by the Victorian Branch of the Australian Railways Union for interpretations of certain matters arising out of Awards (No. 3, No. 6, No. 8, No. 11, and No. 13) of the Railways Classification Board.

These references having come on for hearing before the Railways Classification Board, and the said Board having heard the representations made on behalf of the parties concerned, it is ordered that the matters referred to be and the same are hereby interpreted as follows:—

## AWARD No. 3.

## Division VIII.—Overtime.

The provisions of sub-clause (f) of clause 1 are not applicable in respect of the broken shifts extending over 11 hours worked by porters and other employees at Spencer-street, Flinders-street, Prince's-bridge, and North Melbourne during the period from 1st July, 1919, to 31st December, 1920.

## Division IX.—Sunday Duty.

(1) In the case of the Sunday shifts worked by the station-master and assistant stationmaster at Dandenong during 1919 and 1920, the provisions of paragraph (ii) of sub-clause (a) of clause 2 prescribing payment for continuous time are applicable, provided that the break of duty was less than four (4) hours.

(2) The provisions of sub-clause (c) of clause 2 are applicable to the Sunday shift, viz., from 9.15 a.m. to 1.15 p.m. at Mentone, and from 5.50 p.m. to 8.50 p.m. at Cheltenham, worked by Signalman F. Stuart during the period from 2nd November, 1919, to 28th November, 1920.

## Division XIV.—Travelling and Incidental Expenses.

In the case of Skilled Labourer C. E. Irwin, who was required to undertake duty at Lilydale on certain dates between 9th November, 1920, and 17th December, 1921, the provisions of clause 11 are applicable, on the basis that his headquarters were at Yarra Glen, and that he was not entitled to the payment of the camping allowance in respect of any of the dates concerned.

## AWARD No. 6.

## Salaries and Wages.

The work of oiling and packing axle-boxes performed during the currency of Award No. 6 by Labourers F. J. Blay, W. Haurahan, G. Gunn, and W. McKenzie shall be regarded as that of a pitman within the meaning of that award.

## Rolling-stock Branch—Allowances.

The allowance of 6d. per day, in addition to the ordinary wage, granted to fitters' assistants when employed in a running shed, is applicable in the case of such employees when engaged on breakdown work away from a running shed.

## AWARD No. 8.

## Division VII.—Minimum Allowances.

The provisions of this Division are applicable to all employees.

## Division IX.—Sunday Duty.

The provisions of sub-clause (b) of clause 2 are applicable in the case of—

- (1) the Sunday shift, viz., from 10.50 a.m. to 1 p.m., from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., and from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m., worked by the operating porter at Bayswater;
- (2) the Sunday shift, viz., from 11.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m., and from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m., worked by the station-master at Wandin.

## Division X.—Holiday Duty.

The provisions of this Division are not applicable in the case of an officer or employee who, when instructed to report for duty on one of the prescribed public holidays, is informed, on so reporting, that he is not required to work on such public holiday.

## Division XII.—Travelling and Waiting Time.

A suburban relieving guard is not entitled, under the provisions of clause 5, to be credited with any time occupied in travelling except in respect of the day on which he takes up duty at a new location.

## Division XIII.—Relieving Expenses.

(1) The provisions of clause 2 are not applicable in the case of Mr. J. E. Mills, relieving clerk of the Electrical Engineering Branch and attached to the head office, when required to undertake duty at the Newport power-house.

(2) In the case of relieving guards under the metropolitan superintendent who, on the completion of their shift at a station other than their head-quarters, remained away from home overnight and took up duty at such station on the following day, in such cases as the following:—

- (1) Sign off at Williamstown at 4.22 p.m., Sunday, 25th November, 1923,  
Sign on at Williamstown at 4.38 p.m., Monday, 26th November, 1923,
- (2) Sign off at Frankston at 4.5 p.m., Sunday, 20th January, 1924,  
Sign on at Frankston at 6.20 p.m., Monday, 21st January, 1924,

the provisions of clause 2 are not applicable.

## Division XIV.—Travelling and Incidental Expenses.

(1) In the case of permanent-way gangs located at State Mine, who were required to travel to Nyora in November and December, 1923, the provisions of clause 4 are applicable in respect of the period between leaving State Mine until taking up duty on the ballast train, and between the finish of such duty and the return to State Mine, and the provisions of clause 11 are applicable in respect of the period while on duty on such ballast train.

(2) The provisions of sub-clause (a) of clause 5 are not applicable in the case of Signalman D. Kerr when performing duty at Burnley and Box Hill.

(3) The provisions of clause 9 are not applicable in the case of the shift, viz., from 6.30 a.m. to 4 p.m., worked by Signalman E. H. Truman on 18th October, 1923.

(4) In the case of a guard who, after running a trip, is unexpectedly called upon to run a further trip during which he is obliged to purchase a meal away from home, the provisions of clause 12 are applicable, provided that any such guard is not entitled to payment of the trip allowance in respect of such duty.

(5) The provisions of sub-clause (b) of clause 13 are not applicable in the case of an officer when engaged in assisting a paying officer to pay special gangs within the suburban area, unless sanctioned by the Commissioners.

## Division XV.—Transfer Expenses, &amp;c.

The provisions of clause 6 are not applicable in the case of Repairer W. Kelly on his resumption of duty at Inverleigh in September, 1923, after having been absent on twelve months' extended leave.

*Division XIX.—Relieving in Higher Positions.*

In the case of an officer (other than an officer on the regular relieving staff) performing the duties of a position higher than that in which he is classified, the period of two (2) months prescribed in clause 2 must be served within the preceding twelve months before such officer becomes entitled to payment of the higher rate.

*Division XX.—Conditions Associated with the Running of Trains.*

In the case of certain guards stationed at Dimboola who work the following shift, viz.:—

SHIRE OF DUNMUNKLE.  
BY-LAW No. 15.

**I**N pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto, enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Dunmunkle, in the name of and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Townships of Murtoa, Minyip, Rupanyup, and Lubeck, the townships being defined as follows for the purpose of this By-law.

*Minyip.*—The whole of the Township of Minyip as set out in the Government plan of subdivision.

*Murtoa.*—The boundaries of the Township of Murtoa shall be as follows:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 138, Parish of Ashens; thence by a line bearing due west along the southern boundary of said allotment for a distance of three thousand nine hundred and thirty-three links; thence by a line bearing 175 degrees 38 minutes a distance of five thousand three hundred and seventy links; thence by a line bearing 92 degrees 35 minutes for a distance of three thousand nine hundred and forty-seven links; thence by a line bearing 175 degrees 27 minutes for a distance of seventy-five links to south-west angle of allotment 160, Parish of Ashens; thence by a line bearing easterly along the southern boundary of said allotment a distance of four thousand six hundred and nineteen links; thence by a line bearing 333 degrees 56 minutes a distance of eight thousand two hundred and ninety-three links; thence by a line bearing due west for a distance of two thousand three hundred and eighty-nine links; thence by a line bearing 180 degrees 21 minutes a distance of one thousand eight hundred and forty-two links to the point of commencement.

The occupier of every house building or premises within the areas above defined in the Shire of Dunmunkle shall provide and keep therein a receptacle of the kind hereinafter specified, and shall cause all house refuse and rubbish (except offal or putrid matter) produced or accumulated in or about such house building or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle provided for the purpose.

5. Every such receptacle shall be of a size not exceeding 4 (four) cubic feet in content and shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and shall be maintained in good order and condition, and shall be fitted with handles for the convenience of moving and emptying same and also with a close-fitting galvanized iron cover approved of by the Council's inspector.

6. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or rubbish is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

7. Once in every week on such day as may be appointed from time to time by the Council the occupier of every house building or premises within the area defined for the above townships cause such receptacle to be placed between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. in the yards of such house building or premises at a distance not exceeding 10 feet from the

entrance to such yard from a street lane or right-of-way so that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the person or persons appointed by the Council for this purpose and no such occupier shall place any such receptacle or permit same to be placed in or on any street lane or right-of-way.

8. All refuse collected by the Council will be carted to the dépôt and treated in a manner instructed by the Health Inspectors. Such dépôt will be kept locked under the supervision of the Council employees. One day in each week to be fixed from time to time by the Council the gate will be opened to permit of persons wishing to deposit rubbish not collected by the Council. All such persons shall deposit such rubbish where and in such a manner as instructed by the Council's employee.

On any other day other than that set apart by the Council for admission of rubbish to the rubbish dépôt any person may make arrangements with the employee of the Council to supervise the tipping of such rubbish.

10. If any person commit a breach of this By-law, for every such breach he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 and not less than Five shillings for each and every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Townships of Minyip, Murtoa, and Rupanyup, such townships being defined by the boundaries set out hereunder for the purpose of this By-law.

*Minyip.*—The whole of the Township of Minyip as set out in the Government plan of subdivision.

**Lubeck.**—The boundaries of the Township of Lubeck shall be as follows:—Commencing at the N.E. angle of allotment 105n, Parish of Marma; thence by a line bearing due west a distance of four thousand five hundred and fifty links; thence by a line bearing due south a distance of two thousand five hundred and thirty links; thence by a line bearing due east a distance of four thousand five hundred and fifty links to the eastern boundary of allotment 106v, Parish of Marma; thence north along eastern boundary of allotments 106A and 105D a distance of two thousand five hundred and thirty links to the commencing point.

4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double pan system hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service. The orifice in the closet seat must be at least  $\frac{3}{4}$  inches behind the riser or casing, more or less, surrounding the pan. The space under the seat must not allow for a larger interval than  $\frac{1}{4}$  inches between the pan and the seat, and it must so fitted with guides and stops that the pan may be easily introduced into its proper position. The orifice in the closet seat shall be provided with a hinged lid or cover, which must be closed down immediately after use.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control and management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth or ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed and tar painted inside or cleansed by some other equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to closets connected with an approved septic tank or chemical closet installed in accordance with the provisions of section 58 of the *Health Act 1919*.

11. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier or owner for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

12. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Resolution adopting this By-law was passed on the 21st day of April, 1925, and confirmed on the 19th day of May, 1925.

# SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

By-law No. 38.

A By-law of the Shire of Swan Hill made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and any amendments thereof, and numbered 38, for regulating traffic and processions.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, for regulating traffic and processions, and in pursuance of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Swan Hill order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill.

“Cattle” includes every animal of the horse, ass, mule, ox, sheep, goat, and swine species respectively.

“Driver” means any person in charge of a vehicle or motor car.

“Footway” includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the shire habitually used by pedestrians, and not by vehicular traffic.

“Horse” includes mule and donkey.

“Motor car” means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

“Rider” means any person in charge of a horse.

“Street” includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the shire other than a footway.

“Vehicle” means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine gender, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

## Regulation of Traffic Generally.

3. The driver of a vehicle or a motor car upon any street and the rider of a horse or other animal upon any street shall, except in so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause—

(a) Keep the same as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side.

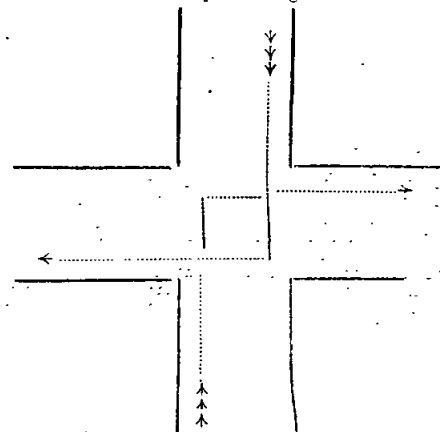
(b) When meeting a vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian, keep on the left or near side of the street.

(c) When passing by any motor car, horse, or pedestrian going in same direction, go on the right or off side of such vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian.

(d) When being passed by any other vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian going in the same direction, permit such other vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian to pass on the right or off side.

(e) Before stopping or turning round in any street, or turning from one street into another, give notice of his intention so to do by holding up his whip or his hand, so that the same may be seen by any person immediately following; and (in the case of the driver of a vehicle or a motor car) upon stopping so place his vehicle or motor car as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle or motor car he shall, upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or motor car, or by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, remove his vehicle or motor car so as to permit such other vehicle or motor car to pass, and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic he shall remove his vehicle or motor car so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

(f) Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another, drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left-hand side of the street which he is entering, as shown in the subjoined diagram:—



- (g) In the case of a driver of a motor car or bicycle, shall sound a horn or bell on approaching intersections.
- (h) Not leave the same unattended in Campbell-street, from Pritchard to McCrae streets, except for a few minutes only, and except it is left in such a position as not to obstruct traffic.
- (i) Cause the same to be drawn up with front-wheel against kerb on his left or near side of the street, and at an angle of 45 deg. with street, and brought to a standstill on the approach of, and during the passing of, any fire engine or other vehicle apparently proceeding in charge of a fireman to the scene of any fire.
- (j) In the case of a rider of a horse or other animal, shall not tether or leave the same tethered in Campbell-street between Pritchard and McCrae streets, and in McCallum-street between Beveridge and Campbell streets, for a longer period than ten minutes, and shall remove same upon being requested so to do by any member of the Police Force or an officer of the Council.

4. The driver of a vehicle or a motor car upon any street shall—

- (a) When stopping for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passengers, do so as near as may be to the footway on his left or near side.
- (b) Not drive the same in competition with or to the annoyance of any person so as to block, or immediately and closely precede or follow, or intentionally conform to the progress of any other vehicle or motor car.

5. Every driver of a motor car or bicycle upon any street shall, within reasonable distance and before passing any other vehicle or motor car, horse, or pedestrian, give audible and sufficient warning of his approach by sounding a horn, bell, or other instrument.

6. No person shall between sunset and sunrise drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street, or permit any vehicle or motor car to be upon any street, unless a good and serviceable lamp suitable to such vehicle or motor car is securely fixed at the driver's side of the front of such vehicle or motor car, and is lighted and is so placed that the light therefrom is distinctly visible both to persons in front of and to persons at the rear of such vehicle or motor car, provided that in case where a tail light is used and is visible from the rear as aforesaid it shall not be necessary that the light fixed as aforesaid shall be visible from the rear.

7. No person shall drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street, or permit any vehicle or motor car to be driven upon any street, unless such vehicle or motor car is constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full and uninterrupted view of the street traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle or motor car, and no person while driving any vehicle or motor car upon any street shall occupy such a position as will prevent or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid.

8. No person shall ride any horse or drive any vehicle or motor car along any street in such manner or in such order that more than two horses, vehicles, or motor cars are travelling side by side in the same direction. The foregoing provisions of this section shall not apply to horses, vehicles, or motor cars which form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.

9. No person shall ride any horse or other animal, or drive or impel any vehicle or motor car upon any footway. Provided, however, that a bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.

#### *Pedestrian Traffic.*

10. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his right-hand side of the footway, and shall, when meeting or overtaking any person, pass on the left-hand side of such person.

11. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon.

#### *Street Processions.*

12. No procession of persons, or of vehicles or motor cars, or of any combination of persons, vehicles, or motor cars, shall, except for military or funeral purposes, parade or pass through any street unless particulars of the proposed procession specifying the purpose thereof, the route proposed to be followed, and the day and hour of the day at which it is to commence shall be given in writing to the President or Shire Secretary two clear days before the commencement of the proposed procession. The said President or Shire Secretary may impose such conditions as he thinks fit with a view to securing freedom of traffic and preserving order and decency in the conduct of the proposed procession, and more particularly may by notice in writing given one clear day beforehand to the person furnishing the said particulars, direct the proposed procession to be held in certain streets therein named, and at an hour of the day therein named, and such procession shall not be held in streets or at a time other than as named in such last-mentioned notice. For purposes aforesaid the President or Shire Secretary may prohibit the holding of any proposed procession on the day specified in the said particulars if he be of the opinion that such procession will conflict with any other procession for the holding of which on that day consent has already been obtained, or that the combined effect of the processions will tend unduly to delay or hinder traffic. A

copy of such particulars and directions (if any) shall be furnished by the person giving the said particulars, or to whom the said directions have been given, to the officer in charge of the police station at Swan Hill, at least one clear day before the commencement of the proposed procession.

13. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

14. Every person who is guilty of any offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

15. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the Town of Swan Hill.
