I have the honour to transmit to you for the information of your Ministers the accompanying copy of a Warrant passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet authorizing the wearing of a special Badge by Knights Bachelor.

2. It is not proposed that the Badge, the price of which has been fixed at £7 7s., should be issued at the public expense either to existing Knights Bachelor or to those appointed in the future.

3. The Badges are being manufactured by His Majesty's Mint, and will be issued through the Home Office; but I understand that none will be available before the autumn.

GREETING :

Whereas We having taken into Our Royal Consideration certain circumstances humbly represented unto Us and being desirous of enhancing the State and dignity of the ancient and honorable degree of knight bachelor, have thought fit to grant and prescribe a Badge which may be worn by those of Our loving subjects who have from time to time been advanced to the separate and singular degree of knight bachelor or may hereafter be so advanced :

Now Know Ye that We of Our Princely Grace, Special Favour and Mere Motion have for Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors given and granted and do by these Presents give and grant unto all such persons as aforesaid Our Royal Licence and Authority, that they may henceforth upon all appropriate occasions wear upon the left side of the coat or outer garment a Badge measuring approximately three inches in length and two inches in width, as hereinafter described, and as shown in the painting hereunto annexed, that is to say:—

“Upon an oval medallion of vermillion, enclosed by a scroll, a cross-hilted sword, belted and sheathed, pommel upwards, between two spurs, rowels upwards, the whole set about with the sword-belt, all gilt.”

Our Will and Pleasure therefore is that you, Edmund Bernard Viscount FitzAlan of Derwent, Deputy to Our said Earl Marshal, to whom the cognizance of matters of this nature doth properly belong, do require and command that this Our grant and prescriptions be recorded in Our College of Arms to the end that Our Officers of Arms and all others upon occasion may take full notice and have knowledge thereof :

And for so doing this shall be your Warrant.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twenty-first day of April, 1926, in the sixteenth year of Our Reign.

REGULATIONS.—APPOINTMENT OF POLICE MAGISTRATES.

CHAPTER I.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Chapter I. of the Public Service Regulations as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

Where at any examination a candidate fails to secure the required number of marks in either Statute Law or Text-books, he may, provided that the number of marks obtained by him in the subject in which he failed is not less than forty-five per cent. - (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Eighteenpence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Eighteenpence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1926, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1927, and shall be payable on the 1st day of October, 1926, at the office of the said Commission, at Wonthaggi.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

The foregoing By-law was made by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on the 20th day of September, 1926, and the common seal of the said Commission was hereunto affixed the 24th day of September, 1926, in the presence of—

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amending Regulation under the *Public Service Act 1915 (No. 2713)*, that is to say:—

**REGULATION XX.—STAFFS, APPOINTMENTS, AND TRANSFERS OF
TEACHERS AND MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCES.**

For Regulation XX. there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

1. In accordance with the ratio for teachers of different classes as specified in the Teachers Act (No. 3416), staffing of schools shall, until further notice, be as follows:—

2. Head Teachers may be appointed to or retained in schools in accordance with the following scale:—

A head teacher of the First Class in a school with an attendance of at least 586 pupils.

A head teacher of the Second Class in a school with an attendance of at least 211 pupils.

A head teacher of the Third Class in a school with an attendance of at least 86 pupils.

A head teacher of the Fourth Class in a school with an attendance of at least 40 pupils.

A head teacher of the Fifth Class in a school with an attendance not exceeding 39 pupils.

3. Assistant teachers, junior teachers, and sewing mistresses may be appointed to or retained in schools in accordance with the following scale:—

And thereafter an additional assistant of the Fifth Class for each increase in attendance of 50 pupils.

When in the opinion of the Director it is in the public interest or in the interests of efficiency, a teacher of one class may be substituted for a teacher of another class as provided for in the above scale.

4. (a) When the requirements of a school justify such a course, a female junior teacher may be appointed to any school in lieu of a sewing mistress, a female assistant of the Fifth Class may be appointed to any school of from 51-60 pupils in lieu of the junior teacher and the sewing mistress, and a male assistant of the Fifth Class may be appointed in place of a female assistant of the corresponding class.

(b) In a school held in buildings situated at a distance apart an additional assistant or an additional junior teacher may be appointed.

(c) A sewing mistress may be appointed to any school which has a male head teacher, and which has a net enrolment of fifteen girls above Grade I.

(d) A half-time sewing mistress may be appointed to two schools each of which is in charge of a male head teacher and has a net enrolment of ten girls above Grade I.

5. Should the number of teachers of any given class which would be required for the staffs of schools as allotted by clauses 2 and 3 above exceed the proportion of teachers in such class as determined by section 13 of the Teachers Act (No. 3416), a teacher of a lower class may be appointed to or retained in any school in the position of head teacher or assistant, as the case may be.

6. The number of teachers employed in any school will be increased or reduced from time to time as the attendance may render necessary.

7. In the case of a new school, a staff of teachers will be allotted upon the expected attendance at the school.

8. (a) Vacancies in schools for head teachers and assistants will be advertised from time to time in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*; and teachers desiring to apply for such vacancies shall make application within the period allowed by the Department.

(b) Teachers in classes above the Fifth class may be required to furnish from time to time on a prescribed form a list of the schools to which they desire to be appointed, whether as head teachers or assistants, and whether by way of transfer only or transfer accompanied by promotion. The applications contained in these forms will be registered, and teachers will be required to take up any positions to which they may be nominated in accordance with such applications.

9. Whenever, and so long as, the teaching staff of a school is reduced below its proper strength by the death, resignation, absence on leave, or transfer of any assistant or junior teacher employed in a school, or by the withdrawal of a First grade junior teacher to act temporarily as assistant or head teacher, the head teacher of the school may, subject to the approval of the Minister, appoint a temporary junior teacher in the stead of each assistant or junior teacher deceased, resigned, absent on leave, transferred, or withdrawn.

10. During the absence of, or pending the permanent appointment of, a sewing mistress, the head teacher may, subject to the approval of the Minister, and provided the attendance is sufficient, appoint a temporary sewing mistress.

11. In addition to their salaries, head teachers of day schools will be paid fortnightly allowances for maintenance expenses, as may be determined by the Minister.

12. In consideration of the maintenance allowances, the head teacher will be required—

- To have the floors of all schoolrooms, classrooms, porches, out-offices, &c., properly swept and thoroughly scrubbed out, the walls brushed down, and the paint washed with sufficient frequency to keep the rooms clean and healthy. To keep all eaves, spouting, down-pipes, and iron tanks free from leaves and dirt, and all drains clean and free from stoppages.
- To provide water for the use of the children for drinking and washing; also drinking cups, soap, basins, and towels.
- To keep the chimneys and windows clean, and all locks, latches, stoppers to basins, keys and handles, &c., to doors and cupboards, and glass in windows in proper repair.
- To keep properly emptied, disinfected, and attended to, the pans in earth-closets, and the cess-pits where there are no earth-closets, and also urinals.
- To provide ink, chalk, and any necessary stationery.
- To provide fuel for warming the schoolrooms, and to keep them properly warmed.

All articles must be provided, and the duties specified must be performed, to the satisfaction of any officer of the Education Department who may be authorized by the Minister of Public Instruction to visit and examine the schools. On leaving a school, the teacher will be required to furnish a report signed by his successor and himself as to the condition in which everything is left.

13. Teachers in charge of State schools, and in receipt of the allowance for maintenance expenses, are required to keep a detailed account of the expenditure of the allowance for carrying out the requirements set forth under the various heads of clause 12 above. This account should show fully the items and amounts of expenditure, and be accompanied, where practicable, by vouchers for each item, duly receipted by the persons entitled to payment. It should be available for the information and perusal of the district inspector or other authorized officer of the Department, and of the school committee.

14. An allowance of 2s. 6d. per meeting will be made to head teachers of State schools in which school committees hold their meetings; and, in consideration of such amount, they will be required to provide lights and fires when necessary, and to supply pens, ink, &c. Except in special circumstances, the allowance will be paid for only one meeting per month.

And the Honorable A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Crimes Act 1915 and Indeterminate Sentences Act 1915.

REGULATIONS AS TO INDETERMINATE SENTENCES.

State Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of September, 1926.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 541 of the *Crimes Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2637), and section 11 of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2758), the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

GENERAL.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Regulations made under section 541 of the *Crimes Act 1915*, and the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1915*, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The Regulations entitled Regulations as to Indeterminate Sentences made on the seventeenth day of July, 1916, and all amendments of the same, and additional Regulations made on the fifth day of February, 1923, pursuant to the provisions of section 541 of the *Crimes Act 1915*, and section 11 of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1915*, are hereby repealed.

3. In these Regulations—

“Board” means the Indeterminate Sentences Board.

“Inspector-General” means the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments.

“Superintendent” means the officer for the time being in charge of a reformatory, and includes the matron in charge of a reformatory for females.

“Inmate” means any person detained in a reformatory.

“Parole” means leave granted to an inmate under section 10 of Act No. 2758, or any Act amending the same.

“Reformatory” means any prison or place set apart as a reformatory prison under the provisions of the *Crimes Act 1915*.

THE BOARD.

4. The Board shall meet from time to time as may be necessary. Minutes of each meeting shall be kept by the secretary and signed by the chairman.

5. The Board, or two members thereof, shall visit each reformatory at least once a month, and may see all the inmates detained therein.

6. The Board shall have free access to every part of the reformatory, and may see any inmate in private, and inspect the diets, and examine any books kept relating to inmates. The Board may call for reports from officers on the conduct, industry, and progress of inmates; inquire generally into the treatment of the inmates, and the operation and effect of these Regulations; shall satisfy itself that the reformatory is properly conducted, and the Regulations duly enforced, and that proper attention is given to the health of the inmates, and to the sanitary requirements, and shall report to the Minister any matter which the Board considers should be brought under his notice.

7. The Board shall inquire into and adjudicate on all charges preferred against inmates not declared to be habitual criminals, that may be reported to it, and shall impose such punishments as may be authorized by these Regulations, and for the purpose of such adjudication, may examine witnesses on oath.

8. The Board shall be empowered to authorize the detention in any reformatory set apart for the detention of habitual criminals, or persons of any prescribed class, of persons declared to be habitual criminals, and other such criminals as the Board may deem unsuitable by reason of age, history, tendencies or disposition to be detained in a reformatory not so set apart.

SUPERINTENDENT.

9. The Superintendent shall furnish the Board with a full report on each inmate admitted to the reformatory, together with a report from the medical officer; and shall furnish such other information as the Board, from time to time, may require.

10. The Superintendent shall keep a record of the conduct of each inmate, and the amounts earned as the result of his work, and the amounts (if any) deducted as payment for food or clothing, or the purchase of extras; and the amounts (if any) applied towards the maintenance of any persons dependent upon the inmate for support, or deducted by way of punishment, and any inmate shall be entitled to a monthly statement of the balance to his credit in his account.

MEDICAL OFFICER.

11. The medical officer of each reformatory shall medically examine every inmate as soon after admission as practicable, and shall furnish a written report of the mental and physical condition of such inmate to the Superintendent, and shall, from time to time, when so requested by the Board, examine and report on the mental and physical condition of any inmate.

CLASSIFICATION.

12. Inmates shall be classified into three grades, viz., the first or highest grade, the second grade, the third or lowest grade. The highest grade shall, except at Castlemaine, consist of two divisions—lower and special. Every inmate on first admission shall be placed in the second grade.

13. The classification, promotions, and reductions of inmates in grade shall be made by the Board as occasion may require. Promotion to the higher grade must be earned by good conduct, including prompt and cheerful obedience to all reformatory rules and regulations, loyalty to the government of the reformatory, faithful and diligent performance of work, sustained efforts to acquire skill and rapidity thereat, attention to and interest in any lectures and classes in the reformatory for the inmates' benefit, and generally the manifestation of a proper spirit and promise of reform.

14. The Board, in determining an inmate's eligibility for the special division shall, in addition to consideration of his previous criminal history and of his conduct reports, have regard to his habits and disposition, his powers of self-control, and the probability of his refraining from any violation of the law, in the event of his release on probation or parole.

15. Reduction to a lower grade of any inmate may follow upon idleness, misconduct, or behaviour which, in the opinion of the Board, is likely to be injurious to discipline, or to the well-being of other inmates, and shall be for such period as the Board thinks fit.

16. Any inmate reduced to the third grade as punishment for misconduct shall, before becoming eligible for the first grade, be required to serve in the second grade such period as the Board thinks fit.

GRADES AND THEIR TERMS.

17. Unless the Board otherwise determines in any particular case, the time of detention in each grade shall be as follows:—

(a) For inmates declared to be habitual criminals while detained at Pentridge:—

In the second grade—18 months.

In the first grade, lower division—12 months.

In the first grade, special division—6 months.

(b) For inmates not declared to be habitual criminals, while detained at Pentridge:—

In the second grade—15 months.

In the first grade, lower division—9 months.

In the first grade, special division—6 months.

(c) For inmates detained at McLeod Settlement:—

In the second grade—12 months.

In the first grade, lower division—9 months.

In the first grade, special division—6 months.

(d) For young inmates not declared to be habitual criminals and who, in the opinion of the Board, on account of their criminal record or their conduct in prison, are not suitable for detention at Castlemaine, or those inmates whose

criminal record is not such, in the Board's opinion, as to require the full term of detention prescribed by sub-clause (b) hereof:—

Two-thirds of the time so prescribed for each grade.

- (e) For inmates not declared to be habitual criminals, and detained at Castlemaine:—

In the second grade—6 months.

In the first grade—6 months.

- (f) For inmates placed in the third grade, such additional detention as hereinafter prescribed.

- (g) For inmates undergoing a definite sentence, transferred to a reformatory:—

Such term as the Board shall in each case determine, having regard to the age of the prisoner, the time already served in prison, and to be served under the sentence of the Court, his previous history, and his conduct while in prison.

GRADE PRIVILEGES.

18. The gaol Regulations under the Gaols Act shall apply to the second grade inmates in regard to dietary, correspondence, and visits from relatives and friends.

19. Second grade inmates shall be privileged, while their conduct is satisfactory, to be present at lectures or addresses that may be given in the reformatory, to change their library books thrice weekly, and, under proper supervision, to associate for recreation outside working hours at such times and under such conditions as may be sanctioned by the Inspector-General.

20. First grade inmates may be permitted to dine in association, and to spend such portion of their earnings in the purchase of extras included in the indulgence list under these Regulations, or clothing, as may be recommended by the Inspector-General, and approved by the Board.

21. Subject to the conditions contained in the Rules and Regulations under the Gaols Act, and with the approval of the Inspector-General, first grade inmates may be allowed to receive and write one letter fortnightly, and to have visits from relatives and friends at intervals of not less than two weeks.

22. First grade inmates shall attend lectures, and also approved meetings that may be held in the reformatory, and shall be given facilities for changing their library books as often as may be reasonably required. They may be granted extended privileges in regard to association and recreation in the discretion of the Inspector-General.

23. Inmates in the special division, shall, as far as practicable, be kept apart from the other inmates. They shall enjoy all the privileges of the first grade, and be given access to such weekly journals and newspapers as may be sanctioned by the Inspector-General. The Inspector-General may permit them to receive and write a letter at any time, and may allow them to receive visits at frequent intervals from relatives and friends likely to take a desirable interest in them on liberation, and to be of use to them in finding employment, or in assisting them to lead honest lives.

24. Third grade inmates shall be treated in accordance with the Regulations under the Gaols Act.

25. No inmate under the age of eighteen years, shall be entitled to a ration of tobacco.

26. Any second grade inmate detained in the Castlemaine reformatory, whose conduct has been satisfactory for at least three months, may be permitted to spend such portion of his earnings in the purchase of extras included in the indulgence list under these Regulations, or clothing, as may be recommended by the Inspector-General, and approved by the Board.

27. Any first grade inmate detained in the Castlemaine reformatory, whose conduct has been satisfactory for at least three months, may be allowed to receive and write letters, and have visits from reputable persons at such times as may be authorized by the Inspector-General.

EMPLOYMENT.

28. Every inmate shall work at some trade or vocation, or be employed at some labour.

(a) A first grade inmate employed at a trade in which he is proficient, whose conduct is satisfactory, and the products of whose work are sold or disposed of, shall be credited with one-half of the net proceeds remaining, after deducting the cost of his maintenance in the reformatory. Second grade inmates shall be credited in like manner with not more than one-fourth, and third grade inmates with not more than one-eighth of the net proceeds remaining, after deducting the cost of their maintenance.

(b) A first grade inmate employed as a skilled artisan or tradesman, whose conduct is good, and the products of whose work are not sold, shall be credited with an amount not exceeding 1s. 6d. per diem, according to the nature and the quality and quantity of the work. A first grade inmate employed in the internal work of the reformatory, or at gardening, or at other unskilled labour, or at any trade in which he is not a skilled worker, whose conduct is good, and whose work is satisfactory in quality and quantity, shall be credited with an amount not exceeding 1s. per diem. Second grade inmates shall be credited in like manner with not more than one-half and third grade inmates with not more than one-fourth of the above rates.

(c) Provided that after an inmate has been in the lower division of the first grade for a period of two years, the amount with which he is to be credited, as herein provided, may be reduced by one-half, and, after remaining in the lower division of the first grade for four years may be reduced by three-fourths.

29. For the purposes of these Regulations, the cost of maintenance of each inmate in the reformatory shall be from time to time fixed by the Inspector-General.

DISCIPLINE.

30. The Superintendent may curtail the privileges of an inmate in regard to indulgences, recreation, attendance at lectures, visits, and letters, for inattention or want of interest in work, disobedience and unsatisfactory conduct not amounting to a definite breach of discipline. Provided always that full particulars of the circumstances in each case shall be reported to the Inspector-General.

31. Any inmate guilty of a serious breach of discipline, or of any conduct which makes it inadvisable that he should associate with other inmates, may be kept in separate confinement until further dealt with.

32. The Superintendent may hear and determine all charges against any inmate for any minor breach of discipline, such as, under the Gaols Act Rules and Regulations, are directed to be submitted to the Governor of a gaol, and may punish such inmate by solitary confinement for any term not exceeding forty-eight (48) hours, or by close confinement on half rations for any term not exceeding four days, or by separate confinement for any term not exceeding seven days, or by stoppage of privileges in regard to indulgences, recreation, attendance at lectures, visits, and letters for any period not exceeding fourteen days. Provided always that a record of all such punishments shall be kept in a book, and a copy forwarded every month to the Inspector-General and the Board.

33. The Visiting Justice shall have power, in addition to, or in substitution for, any punishment he is empowered to inflict, to punish any inmate for any breach of discipline by imposing a fine not exceeding 20s., to be deducted from any sum at the time standing to the credit of such inmate in the account kept at the reformatory, and to order that an inmate's earnings be debited with such sums as may be necessary to replace or repair any furniture, equipment, utensils, or implements the property of the reformatory, destroyed or damaged by him.

34. The Board may inquire in a summary way into any charge brought against any inmate of idleness, misconduct, breaches of discipline, of escaping or attempting to escape from any reformatory. And the Board may, in its discretion, punish such inmate by solitary confinement, either continuously, or at such intervals as it may see fit, for any period not exceeding three weeks, or by close confinement on half rations for any period not exceeding six weeks, or by separate confinement for any period not exceeding eight weeks, or by reduction to any lower grade for such a period, and with such terms of solitary, close, or separate confinement, limited as above, and with deprivation or curtailment of such indulgences and privileges as the Board may see fit; provided always that, in addition to or in substitution for any such punishment, the Board may impose a fine, to be deducted from any sum at any time

standing to the credit of such inmate in the account kept at the reformatory, and to order that such inmate's earnings be debited with such sum as may be necessary to repair or replace any furniture, equipment, utensils, or implements, the property of the reformatory, destroyed or damaged by him.

RELEASE ON PAROLE OR PROBATION.

35. An inmate shall not be released on parole or probation unless—

- (1) The Board considers that his release would not be detrimental to the welfare of society. The judgment of the Board shall be based on the following considerations:—
 - (a) His record and character as shown in the reformatory.
 - (b) The nature, character, and number of his convictions.
 - (c) His previous record and environment, and his probable surroundings, if released.
 - (d) His powers of self-control, and the probability of his leading a useful and industrious life, and abstaining from crime.
 - (e) Any other facts bearing on the advisability of release on parole or probation.
- (2) He shall have been promoted to the special division, or, in the case of an inmate of the Castlemaine reformatory, to the first grade, and shall have shown good conduct in that grade.
- (3) He shall have assurance of immediate employment; or
- (4) He shall have standing to his credit money sufficient to maintain him for four weeks, or in the case of inmates of the Castlemaine reformatory, for two weeks after release; and
- (5) He shall have reasonable prospects, in the opinion of the Board, of earning an honest livelihood.

Provided that the Board may recommend the suspension of any of these conditions except condition (1) in regard to any inmate in the special grade, or the first grade in the case of an inmate of the Castlemaine reformatory, who is considered deserving of exceptional treatment.

36. Any person who violates the conditions of his probation and is returned to the reformatory, and any person who, having once been released on probation, is again convicted and dealt with under the Crimes Act shall, on readmission to the reformatory, be placed in the third grade. Except under special circumstances, he shall not be eligible for promotion to the second grade until he has served at least six months at Pentridge, or three months at Castlemaine in the third grade, with a good conduct record, nor be eligible for promotion to the first grade until he has served two years at Pentridge, or nine months at Castlemaine as the case may be, with a good conduct record in the second grade. Provided always that when in any case the Board considers it necessary or desirable, the Board may increase or reduce the term of detention in any grade.

37. Any inmate released on parole who has been returned to a reformatory on conviction or for breach of the conditions of his parole, shall be placed in such grade and shall be kept in the grades such time as the Board may determine, having regard to the nature of his offence or of his breach of conditions and of his conduct while on parole and the prospect of his reform.

38. Every inmate released on parole or probation shall be given a certificate with a full statement thereon of the conditions of release, which he is required to observe during the period of his parole or probation.

and other such articles, including clothing, books, as may from time to time be recommended by the Inspector-General and approved by the Board.

40. Any inmate may receive such dental attention as the Inspector-General approves, the pay for which may be authorized by the Board out of the inmate's earnings.

41. The Rules and Regulations made under the Gaols Act and general orders in regard to prisons shall, as far as practicable, and when not inconsistent with these Regulations, or with any regulations which may hereafter be brought into operation, apply to every reformatory.

42. The secretary of the Board shall receive, on behalf of the Board, all sums standing to the credit of each inmate on his release, and shall keep an account thereof and the disbursements made by the Board, in accordance with the provisions of the *Crimes Act* 1915 or any other Act amending the same.

43. The Superintendent may, subject to these Regulations, exercise all or any of the powers conferred on the Governor of the gaol, under the Gaols Act, for the purpose of dealing with breaches of discipline.

44. In every reformatory, the hours of rising, the time for meals, the hours of work and of instruction, the time allowed for reading and exercise, the hours for lights and bed, the hours to be spent at drill and at school, and the arrangements therefor, the clothing of the inmates in each grade, together with the internal arrangements as may be necessary and not provided for in these Regulations, shall be in the discretion of the Inspector-General.

Any order made by a Court of Petty Sessions under the provisions of section 516 (1) of the *Crimes Act* 1915, shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto or to like effect.

46. Any order made by a judge of the Supreme Court or chairman of a Court of General Sessions of the Peace under section 516 (3) of the *Crimes Act* 1915 shall be in the form of the Second Schedule hereto or to like effect.

47. Any order made by the Indeterminate Sentences Board under section 528 of the *Crimes Act* 1915 shall be in the form of the Third Schedule hereto or to like effect.

48. Any warrant by the visiting justice under section 13 of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act* 1915 shall be in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto or to like effect.

49. Any order made by the Indeterminate Sentences Board under section 14 of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act* 1915 shall be in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto or to like effect.
