STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION ACTS.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council has, by Order dated 30th day of January, 1923, approved of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria undertaking the supply of electricity in bulk or otherwise in accordance with the provisions of the State Electricity Commission Acts to persons and bodies of persons (including if the case so requires undertakings and public statutory corporations) in the Northern and North-Eastern Districts of Victoria: And whereas pursuant to the *State Electricity Commission Act 1922* (No. 3265), application has been made to the Commission by the Municipal Council of the Shire of Chiltern for the supply of electricity by the Commission to persons or bodies of persons corporate or unincorporate other than undertakers or public statutory corporations within the following area, comprising parts of the Municipal District of that Shire, that is to say, within the Township of Chiltern: And whereas the Commission having as required by that Act inquired into the subject-matter thereof and determined a scale of charges to be made for electricity supplied in accordance with the application is satisfied that the probable demand for electricity within the area will be such that the annual revenue obtainable from the supply of electricity according to the scale of charges so determined will be sufficient to pay the total annual cost to the Commission of or incidental to the supply, and had reported to the Minister the result of such inquiry and determination, and has recommended that the necessary works be provided and constructed by the Commission in connexion with the undertaking above referred to for the supply of electricity by the Commission in the Northern and North-eastern Districts of Victoria: It is recommended for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council that the necessary works be provided and constructed by the Commission for and in respect of the supply of electricity by the Commission in accordance with the application above recited.

The minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for such premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Meter rent shall be at the rate of Seven shillings per annum.

By-law No. 22.

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year ending the 31st December, 1927. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable in advance on the first day of January, 1927, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by two instalments payable on the 1st January and the 1st July of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate. The rates and charges are as follow, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of £22 or under, situated on any street or road in which water supply pipes are laid, or, if not so situated, supplied with water from such pipes by reticulation, Fifteen shillings.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of £22, situated on any street or road in which water supply pipes are laid, or, if not so situated, supplied with water from such pipes by reticulation, a rate of Eightpence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation: Provided that any land in excess of two roods, rated in one assessment with a house or tenement under this or the preceding clause, shall be subject, in addition, to the minimum rate imposed by clause (c) hereunder.
- (c) On every vacant piece of land (being any area in one contiguous holding) situated on any street or road in which water supply pipes are laid, a rate of Eightpence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation, with a minimum charge of Six shillings.

- (d) On every piece of land supplied with water, whether rated with a house or not, on which there is a trough or other facility for watering stock, a rate of Eightpence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings.
- (e) On all land and tenements situated elsewhere than in a street in which water supply pipes are laid down, but being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, a charge of one-half of the rates above specified; and on all such land and tenements situated over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from any such stand-pipe, a charge of one-quarter of the rates above specified.
- (f) For water supplied by measure, One shilling per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of the quantity allowed on the ordinary rate; such allowance to be 1,000 gallons for every shilling of the rate amount.

2. The Trust may require a meter to be affixed to the service pipe of any consumer; and upon a consumer being requested in writing from the Trust so to do, he or she shall forthwith arrange for a meter to be installed at his or her own cost. Should the consumer fail to comply with the request within one month after receiving notice the Trust may cut off the water.

3. For special services the Trust may supply water, by agreement, at special rates.

4. The secretary of the Trust for the time being is hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover, on behalf of the Trust, the rates and charges imposed by this By-law.

- (b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £24 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of Six pounds five shillings (£6 5s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Three pounds two shillings and sixpence (£3 2s. 6d.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Thirty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Ten shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
- (f) For water supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic purposes, not including garden use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) Water supplied by meter and consumed for domestic and garden purposes shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate due for the year in respect of the premises supplied, and for all water used in excess the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (h) For water supplied by meter solely for purposes other than domestic, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons per half-year. The Trust may, in cases where deemed necessary, supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (f) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1927, and the first day of July, 1927, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Wangaratta Waterworks Trust this 4th day of October, 1926.

REGULATIONS.

VICTORIAN DRIED FRUITS BOARD ELECTION.

WHEREAS it is provided by the *Dried Fruits Act 1924* that all elections of members of the Victorian Dried Fruits Board shall be held at such times as are prescribed: And whereas the Governor in Council is empowered under the said Act to make Regulations for or with respect to the election of members of the Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. The term of office of the present elected members of the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, namely, James Milne, Red Cliffs; Edward Thomas Henderson, Walnut-avenue, Mildura; and Alexander Smart Lockhead, Benetook-avenue, Mildura, shall expire on the thirty-first day of December, 1926.

2. Nominations from candidates for election to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board shall be lodged with the returning officer before or at Twelve noon on Wednesday, the first day of December, 1926.

3. The time and date for the close of the election shall be Four o'clock in the afternoon of Wednesday, the fifteenth day of December, 1926.

4. The term of office of the members so elected as above shall be for a period of two years from the first day of January, 1927.

These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the *Dried Fruits Act 1924* (Election of Board Regulations).

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT CASTERTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieutenant-Colonel the Right Honorable Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Military Cross; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Poisons Act* 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2707) it is among other things enacted that the several articles mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the *Poisons Act*; and, on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, amend the said Schedule by adding to any part of such Schedule or removing therefrom any article specified in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and pursuant to section 4 of the above-named Act; do by this my Proclamation declare that the said Second Schedule shall be amended as herein set forth, and that the articles set forth hereunder shall be deemed to be poisons under the second part of the Second Schedule, namely:—

SECOND SCHEDULE.—PART II.

Add new item—

Paraphenylenediamine or similar irritant organic bases and preparations and admixtures thereof.

The foregoing amendments of the Second Schedule of the *Poisons Act* 1915 were recommended by Resolution of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria at its meeting held on the thirteenth day of October, 1926, at Melbourne.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK, RACE-COURSE, AND PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF KERRIE, KNOWN AS "THE RIDDELL RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE AND PUBLIC PARK."

WE, Patrick Thomas Murphy, Hugh James Spencer, William Simpson Richardson, Jack Skinner Ferguson, John Straughan Amess, and William McKay, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Park, Race-course, and Public Recreation, Parish of Kerrie, at Riddell, known as the "Riddell Race-course and Recreation Reserve and Public Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding forty (40) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for horse racing, football or cricket matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions sums as follows may be charged and taken for the admission to the Reserve of all persons over 16 years of age:—

On days set apart for racing—a charge of not more than 5s.

On days set apart for other forms of sport—not more than 2s. 6d.

2. The Reserve, including all buildings, enclosures, fences, and improvements thereon, shall at all times be under the control of the Committee of Management, which body may, in its discretion, exempt any persons, body, or club, from payment of any of the aforesaid charges or fees. Persons, clubs, or public bodies renting, hiring, or using the Reserve for any purpose shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve, and the buildings, and any other structures for the time being thereon.

3. No person shall enter, or remain in, the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct; and no person shall take any dog into any part of the said Reserve, or into any building or enclosure thereon.

4. No person shall damage in any way any trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall any fire be lighted within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any dwelling, booth, or other structure or stand, for the purpose of offering for sale any articles or for any other purpose, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall offer for sale any goods, chattels, articles, or provisions, on any part of the Reserve without having first obtained permission, in writing, from the Committee of Management, or some person authorized by them.

9. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

10. Any person committing in the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall, together with any live stock, vehicles, or goods and chattels in his possession or care, be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and is, or may be, in possession of a ticket of admission to any or all parts of the Reserve:—

- (1) Assaulting any other person. (2) Being drunk. (3) Riding, crossing, or trespassing on the racing track, or any part of it, during a race meeting. (4) Crossing or trespassing upon the arena or playing ground during the progress of a football or cricket match, or sports, or during practice at football or cricket. (5) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language. (6) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words. (7) Behaving improperly or riotously. (8) Being found in any part of the said Reserve and not producing on demand, or, if required, not surrendering to any gatekeeper, or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand production of same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management, or some person authorized by them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by such person, and that such person's ticket has been lost. (9) Obtaining admission to any part of the said Reserve when disentitled to such admission under these Regulations.

11. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all the power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.

12. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any races, sports, matches, fêtes, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. Racing Clubs, bodies, or persons desiring the use of the race-course in this Reserve in connexion with any race meeting shall pay to the Committee of Management for the privilege of using such race-course such a sum as the said Committee of Management may determine from time to time, not exceeding five per cent. of the gross amount received by such club, body, or person as admission charges to such race meeting. Provided that the minimum charge for the use of this race-course on any and every such occasion shall be Five pounds (£5).

15. Clubs, other than racing clubs, making regular use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, shall pay fees as follows:—Football clubs, £5 per annum; cricket clubs, £3 per annum; tennis clubs, £1 per annum; other clubs, £2 per annum; sports gatherings, £1 per day. The minimum charge for the use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, by two visiting clubs or bodies shall be £1 per day.

16. All fees charged and taken in respect of the Reserve shall be applied towards permanent improvements on the Reserve, or the erection, maintenance, or repair of buildings and fences, or improving the racing track, or otherwise improving the Reserve, as the Committee of Management may determine.

17. No person shall use the Reserve or racing track for the purpose of training or exercising horses without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. The said Committee of Management may, in its discretion, allow horses to be trained or exercised on the racing track when weather and other conditions are such that the track would not be damaged thereby, and, further, the said Committee of Management may demand the payment of a fee for such privilege, not exceeding Ten shillings for a term of three months for each horse trained or exercised on the racing track or within the Reserve.

18. No person shall discharge any firearms in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management in writing first obtained.

19. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

20. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker on any portion of this Reserve other than in the areas delineated and set apart for bookmakers, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or those authorized by such Committee of Management.

21. The following persons shall not be admitted to any part of this Reserve:—

- (a) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to have been at any time guilty of malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been disqualified by any competent racing tribunal, and whose term of disqualification has not expired.
- (b) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to be a defaulter.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THAT PORTION OF THE RESERVE
FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES, IN THE PARISH OF
NEPEAN, KNOWN AS THE RYE FORESHORE.

WE, Edward Baker, John Mackay, John Albert Fordham, James Sullivan, and Herbert G. Wills, being a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management for that portion of the Reserve for Public Purposes, in the Parish of Nepean, known as the Rye Foreshore, as is indicated by red colour on plan marked R/13.3.23, attached to Lands Department correspondence No. C.73593, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve, exclusive of the beach.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle, as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the reserve on Sundays.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
