ST. ARNAUD BOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1926.—BY-LAW No. 31.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, do hereby make the following By-laws:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1926 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

The rates and charges specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.

On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Nine pounds and under, the sum of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence per annum (£1 12s. 6d.).

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Nine pounds, and not exceeding the annual municipal value of Fourteen pounds, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings per annum (£1 15s.).

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Fourteen pounds, and not exceeding the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds, the sum of One pound seven shillings and sixpence per annum (£1 7s. 6d.).

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds, the sum of Two shillings and threepence in the pound sterling upon the amount of the annual municipal valuation.

On every unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated from the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district separately from any buildings, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling upon the amount of the municipal valuation.

On every house, tenement, or land situated otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which house or tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such house, tenement, or land is over a quarter of a mile of such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

For every quarter acre or less of garden and lawn, 10s. per annum.

The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance in one amount on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

In construction of this By-law the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 28.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the *Water Acts*, and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said *Acts* been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

(1) Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Each licence shall be for the period ending 31st December next ensuing after the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the *Water Acts* or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of Two pounds ten shillings, and for each renewal Ten shillings.

(3) Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant such licence.

(4) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice in writing to the Trust or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence.

(5) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence. Galvanized wrought-iron piping of approved quality will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services.

(6) All service-pipes laid in the ground on private property shall be laid at a depth of not less than 10 inches below the surface. The portions of the service-pipe laid along or across any public street, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic, shall be laid not less than 18 inches below the surface of the ground.

(7) A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed to each service at a distance of not more than 3 feet from the building line, properly secured, and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

(8) The service-pipes from the mains being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier or owner shall, in every instance in which any damage is caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be guilty of an offence.

(9) If any person neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from the proper officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may see fit until the necessary repairs have been effected.

(10) Except with the consent of the Trust, one service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement shall be permitted, and not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may, in special cases, consent to two or more houses or tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house or tenement shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such service.

(11) Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be guilty of an offence.

(12) Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be guilty of an offence.

(13) Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Trust or its proper officer.

(14) No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Trust. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch meter, Ten shillings.

For any meter of larger size than $\frac{1}{4}$ inch, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

(15) Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of January in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Trust, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

(16) In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of the meter hired from the Trust, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired

and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof, at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust, who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least two days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

(17) If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and re-fixed, by taking it as equal to the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

(18) Meters used for measuring the water supplied to consumers, other than such as are hired from the Trust, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Trust; a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

(19) The Trust, by its officers, may at any time after six days' notice in writing of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer, and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

(20) Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Trust, on which such waste is continued.

(21) All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. Should any trough or fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

(22) Any person, having received a supply of water from the Trust, allowing any other person who has not agreed to be supplied by the Trust to use such water, shall be guilty of an offence; and any such last-mentioned person so using such water shall be guilty of an offence.

(23) If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, the Trust may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

(24) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall be as follows:—

Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, would give the amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Trust for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.

(25) No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

(26) No person, other than an employee of the Shire Council, shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs or stand-pipes.

(27) Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

(28) In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole. The expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Trust authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice, or to execute any function on behalf of the Trust.

(29) The By-law No. 4 made by the Trust on the 23rd November, 1899, and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council on the 8th February, 1900, relating to water supply, is hereby repealed.

BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD.

BY-LAW NO. 46, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 1926.

THE Inglewood Borough Council doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rates from the 1st day of January, 1926, to the 31st day of December, 1926, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Inglewood as defined, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the valuation of every house or tenement, with a minimum of Two pounds sterling. On vacant allotments in streets where the Council's mains are laid the rate shall be 5 per cent. on the municipal valuation of such allotments.
2. The foregoing rates shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July, 1926.
3. Such person or persons as the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Inglewood may appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.
4. Owners of steam engines or other property, not being dwellings, requiring water for same may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council; and all persons whose tenements and property are outside the Water Supply District may be supplied by making special arrangements with the Council.
5. Water-troughs and stand-pipes on the footpaths, streets, or outside property will not be permitted without the permission of the Council.
6. The owner of any tenement or property permitting or allowing any person to carry away water, excepting for the use of the tenement or property belonging thereto, will be liable to have the water cut off.

APOLLO BAY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1ST JANUARY TO 31ST DECEMBER, 1926.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Apollo Bay Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-law No. 2.

The following are the rates and charges which occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year ending 31st December, 1926, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District of the said Trust:—

- (1) For every house and tenement up to £16 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £2 (Two pounds) per annum.
- (2) For every house and tenement of £17 annual value and upwards, an amount of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- (3) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the first day of July, shall be charged two-thirds rates.
- (4) For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Fifteen shillings sterling per annum.
- (5) For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, the amount of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- (6) Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show grounds, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement at 1s. 6d. (One shilling and sixpence) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 15,000 gallons.
- (7) For a supply during the erection of new buildings there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
- (8) Except hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at

One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rates which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

(9) The fees to be paid for plumber's licence shall be £1; renewals, 5s.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance, and the first payment be made on 1st January, 1926 for the year ending 31st December, 1926.

Such person or person as the Commissioners of the Apollo Bay Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Apollo Bay Waterworks Trust.

SHIRE OF COLAC.

BY-LAW No. 99.

A By-law for the regulation and management of the abattoirs of the Shire of Colac and for fixing the dues and fees to be charged thereat.

Preamble.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of the *Butchers and Abattoirs Act 1915*, No. 2623, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Colac (hereinafter called the Council) makes the following By-law:—

Management.

1. The land of the Council held for abattoir purposes, and all buildings and structures thereon and appurtenances thereto, hereinafter called the establishment, shall be under the charge, care, management, and direction of the manager appointed thereto by the Council, with one or more assistants as the Council have appointed or shall appoint for that purpose.

Assistant Manager, &c.

2. During absence of the manager his duties shall devolve upon and be performed by the assistant or other person in the service of the Council then in charge of the establishment, and such assistant or person shall for the time being have all the power, authority, and duty of the manager.

Hours for Use.

3. The establishment shall be open for slaughtering every day, not being Sunday, Good Friday, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Easter Monday, or such other public holidays as may be determined by the Council, from half-past Seven o'clock in the forenoon until Five o'clock in the afternoon, except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from half-past Seven o'clock in the forenoon until Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, and at no other time, except upon special occasions, and then only upon such special conditions as may be prescribed in writing under the hand of the Shire Secretary.

Use on Payment of Dues.

4. Every person who shall pay the dues and fees as herein-after fixed shall be entitled to the use for a reasonable time of such portion of the establishment as shall be available and be assigned to him. No person shall use any portion of the establishment except for such purpose or at or for such time as the manager shall approve.

Stock to be Reported.

5. Every person who shall bring any animals to the establishment shall forthwith inform the manager of the number and description thereof, together with the name and address of the owner thereof, and the locality or district from which the same were brought, and the manager shall thereupon cause such particulars to be entered in a Record Book to be kept at the abattoirs, and every such person shall place such animals in such portion of the establishment as directed by the manager, and in no case shall any animals, once brought into the establishment, be removed without the consent of the manager.

Fees and Dues Payable.

6. The following fees and dues shall be payable to the Council for the use of the public abattoirs:—

Food for Stock.

7. The owner of all animals placed in the establishment shall provide the same with good and sufficient food at least once in every twenty-four hours, and shall provide that all milch animals shall be duly milked, and in case he shall

fail to do so the Council may do so, and such owner shall pay to the Council all expenses incurred in connexion therewith, provided that no animal shall be allowed to remain in the establishment for a longer period than forty-eight hours, nor any carcass or portion of any carcass for a longer period than eighteen hours, unless with the consent of the manager.

Diseased Animals.

8. No animals visibly or known to be affected with any contagious or infectious disease shall be received into the establishment except with the express permission of the manager.

Liability.

9. The Council shall have a lien on all animals, carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and/or offal for the time being in the establishment of any person indebted to the Council, and if any person shall make default for seven (7) days in payment of any fees or sums due by him, the Council may (without any demand or giving any notice) sell by public auction or private contract all or any part of such animals, carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and/or offal, and after deducting all fees and sums due the Council shall pay the surplus thereof to the owner of such animals, carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and/or offal.

Liability for Death, Injury, or Escape.

10. The Council will take all reasonable care of stock brought into the establishment for slaughter, but will not be responsible for any injury to or for the death or escape of any stock.

Liability for Loss of Carcass.

11. The Council will take all reasonable care of carcasses and offal while in its possession, but the Council will not be responsible for any loss thereof or any damage thereto.

Liability for Bone-taint, Hides, and Skins.

12. The Council will take no risk or responsibility with respect to carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and/or offal of animals slaughtered at the establishment, and the Council will under no circumstances whatever be responsible for bone-taint or for any other condition which may occur in carcass meat in the chilling chambers.

Hours for Opening and Closing of Chilling Chamber.

13. The chilling chambers at the establishment shall be opened and closed daily at such times as the manager shall direct, and at no other times, and all persons doing business at the establishment in connexion with the chilling chambers shall conform to the directions of the manager or the inspector or other person on duty at the time.

Carcass to be Examined and Passed before Removal.

14. No person shall remove from the establishment any carcass of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the inspector and passed by him as fit for human food, and branded by him with the regulation brand.

Slaughtermen.

15. No person shall be permitted to commence or continue to work at the establishment as a slaughterman, unless his name shall be entered in the Register of Slaughtermen hereby required to be kept by the manager, and he shall have signed an undertaking to observe, comply with, and obey each and every one of the rules of the establishment under pain (apart from any other penalty) of having his name expunged from the Register of Slaughtermen.

15A. All slaughtering shall be carried out in good and sufficient light, and no slaughtering shall be done during the last hour before the closing time hereinbefore prescribed. The manager shall cause that carcasses of large animals before the cutting of the throats thereof be lifted by the hind leg or legs and thoroughly drained of blood, which shall as far as practicable be thereupon caught in suitable receptacles. The skins of all carcasses shall as far as practicable be kept from contact with blood or flushing water, and that all carcasses, whether hung in the pre-cooling or in the chilling room, shall be so hung as not to touch any other carcass, or any wall, door, or window of any such room. No sheep skin shall be removed from the establishment with the head attached.

Diseased Animal to be Reported.

16. Immediately any animal slaughtered is discovered to be diseased, the slaughtermen in charge shall immediately stop the work of dressing such animal for food and report the fact to the manager or inspector on duty at the time, and shall not proceed further with such dressing until authorized to do so.

Organs of Diseased Carcasses.

17. It shall be the duty of slaughtermen to see that the organs of diseased carcasses are not mixed with the organs of healthy carcasses.

Disfiguring Walls, &c.

18. No slaughterman or other person shall—

- (a) Write on, soil, or disfigure any of the walls, floors, ceilings, fittings, or fixtures of the establishment, or remove, deface, or disfigure any sign board, or written or printed matter or notice on or in the establishment.
- (b) Except with the permission of the manager, interfere in any way with the electric light, switches, motors, fans, ventilation arrangements, or the steam or water pipes or other appliances whatsoever in the establishment.
- (c) No slaughterman shall leave the establishment attired in his slaughtering clothes. Every slaughterman shall keep such, when not in use, in such part of the establishment as shall be made available and assigned to him for such purpose by the manager.

Mess-room for Meals.

19. Every slaughterman and every other person having meals at the establishment shall use the mess-room provided for the purpose, and shall not use any other portion of the establishment for the purpose.

Cruelty to Animals.

20. No person shall ill-treat or unnecessarily frighten or irritate any animal or resort to unnecessary cruelty in slaughtering any animal at the establishment.

Dogs.

21. No dogs, other than cattle or sheep dogs, shall be brought upon or allowed to remain in the establishment, and every such cattle and sheep dog, when not in use, shall be securely tied up by the person in charge of such dog in such place as is assigned for that purpose by the manager. All other dogs found in the establishment, whether in charge of any person or not, will be destroyed.

Liability for Breakages, &c.

22. Every person using the establishment who shall do any breakage, injury, damage, or destruction thereto, or to any of the appliances used in connexion therewith, whether accidentally or otherwise, shall make good the same to the satisfaction of the manager, and if he shall have so acted wantonly or maliciously he shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Persons Illegally on Premises.

23. No person, unless having lawful business to transact at the establishment shall enter thereon or remain therein, and if any such person do not leave immediately upon being requested to do so by the manager, the assistant, or other person in charge thereof for the time being, he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and may be forcibly removed.

Drunkenness, Offensive and Indecent Behaviour, &c.

24. Any person who shall be drunk, or who shall be guilty of profane swearing or of foul or abusive or offensive language or conduct, or of obscenity or indecency, or who shall conduct himself riotously or create disturbance, or who shall obstruct in the execution of his duty any manager, inspector, or other officer or person appointed by the Council to conduct or aid in the good management of the establishment, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with any request of any such manager, inspector, officer, or other person, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and may be forcibly removed from the establishment.

Deposit Offal, &c.

25. Any person who shall deposit or cause to be deposited any blood, offal, filth, or refuse matter upon any portion of the establishment, or on any road or land abutting thereon, save in the pits, bins, or receptacles provided for same, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law. The manager shall cause all heads, horns, shanks, skins, hair, bristles, blood, and other offal to be removed from the establishment daily.

Urinals, Use of.

26. No person shall, without the consent of the manager, place any insoluble or germicidal or other foreign matter in any urinal or water-closet at the establishment. Every person using any such urinal or water-closet shall use only the sanitary roll paper provided therein by the Council, and shall before leaving such convenience use the flushing water provided for the discharge of the excrement deposited in such convenience.

Clean Clothing.

27. The manager, assistant, or other person in charge for the time being may refuse to allow any person not wearing clean clothing or clean overalls to load or handle any meat in the establishment.

Penalty.

28. Any contravention of this By-law or any part thereof, by act or omission, shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Operation of By-law.

29. This By-law shall apply to and have effect throughout the whole of the Shire of Colac.

Resolution adopting this By-law agreed to by the Council the fourteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and confirmed the eighteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

*SHIRE OF KYNETON.**BY-LAW No. 33.*

A By-law of the Shire of Kyneton made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1919, numbered 33, for the purpose of altering By-law No. 31, and for prescribing the fee for registration of certain premises as required by the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1919 and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kyneton order as follows:—

“That the fee for registration of piggeries (other than butchers’ piggeries) shall be Two shillings and sixpence, and that sub-clause (b) of By-law No. 31, fixing the fee for registration of ‘other piggeries’ at One shilling, be and is hereby repealed.”

The foregoing By-law shall be effective throughout the Shire of Kyneton, and shall be subject to the same conditions and limitations as expressed in By-laws Nos. 30 and 31 regarding the registration of premises, excepting the clause herein repealed, and the said By-law No. 33 shall be operative from the first day of January, 1926.

The resolution for the passing of this By-law was agreed to at a meeting of the Council on the fifth day of December, 1925, and confirmed at a meeting of same on the 9th day of January, 1926, and the common seal of the Council was affixed this fifteenth day of January, 1926, in the presence of—

*SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.**BY-LAW No. 37.*

A By-law of the Shire of Lillydale made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1919, and numbered 37.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1919, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale make the following By-law:—

(1) This By-law shall repeal section 2 (b) of the Shire of Lillydale By-law No. 30, and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Lillydale.

(2) No person shall carry on a business, trade, or calling specified hereunder unless the same is registered with the Council and registration fee paid as set out:—

*OFFENSIVE TRADE PREMISES.**(a) Piggeries—*

Where one to five pigs are usually kept—Two shillings and sixpence per annum.

Where six to ten pigs are usually kept—Five shillings per annum.

Where eleven to twenty pigs are usually kept—Ten shillings per annum.

Where more than twenty pigs are usually kept—One pound per annum.

(b) For all other offensive trades premises—One pound per annum.

(3) Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law, or is guilty of neglect or disobedience thereof, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day the offence continues.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to on the 18th day of December, 1925, and confirmed on the 25th day of January, 1926.

DECLARATION OF A DEVIATION FROM THE POOWONG-RANCEBY ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF KORUMBURRA.

WHEREAS by section 58 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) (as amended by section 10 of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944)) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Acts has by Resolution declared that a deviation to be a developmental road the said Board may also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of any existing road or part thereof named in such Resolution and that on publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order confirming such Resolution the existing road or part thereof shall cease to be a developmental road or be discontinued as provided in the Resolution: And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such Resolution to be a developmental road and has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule to the said Resolution and that such part of the existing road shall be discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS.**CERTAIN PARAGRAPHS REGARDING GUARDING OF MACHINERY AMENDED.**

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and revoke Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: And whereas it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, if the Minister has certified that any manufacture, plant, process, or labour used in factories is dangerous to life or limb generally, may make such Regulations as may be deemed necessary and reasonably practicable to decrease or prevent danger from such manufacture, plant, process, or labour: And whereas the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, has certified that the plant named in certain certificates, dated respectively the 30th day of March, 1921; and the 31st day of March, 1924, is dangerous to life or limb generally: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited, as well as under all other powers by the said Acts him enabling in that behalf; doth by this Order revoke the paragraphs dealing with belts or ropes and chaffcutting machines in the Regulations made on the 8th day of April, 1924, under the provisions of the said Acts, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulations regarding such belts or ropes and chaffcutting machines; that is to say:—

REGULATION REGARDING CERTAIN DANGEROUS PLANT. GUARDING MACHINERY.**Belts or Ropes.**

(8) Where in any factory belts or ropes are used for transmitting power—

- no such belt or rope, when not transmitting power, shall be allowed to rest on any revolving shaft;
- no such belt or rope shall be joined or mended while the machinery is in motion, unless such belt or rope is suspended on a suitable and efficient perch during the whole of the time occupied in such joining or mending;
- no such belt or rope shall be placed by hand on any revolving pulley in the power transmission line between the primary motive power and the first driven pulley of any machine. Nothing in this paragraph shall prevent belts running on stepped or cone pulleys from being shifted by hand.
- Any person who contravenes any of the foregoing provisions and the occupier of the factory shall be severally guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5.

Chaffcutting Machines.

The occupiers of all places where power-driven machines are used for cutting chaff shall equip each of such machines with—

- a guard which will at all times cover the feed-box for a distance of twenty-five (25) inches from the centre of the feed rollers; the height of this guard measured from the bottom of the feed-box to the top of the guard shall not in any case exceed 20 inches (inside measurement);
- a reversing lever which must be carried over the top of the guard, in line with and three (3) inches above the edge of the guard nearest the operator;
- guards which will efficiently cover all gear wheels, so as to prevent bodily injury to any person in the vicinity thereof.
