BY-LAW NO. 1661.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.— MITIAMO URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

- 1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Mitiamo Urban District within the Loddon United Waterworks Trust District
  - (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
  - (2) Of lands in which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
  - (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building, situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of January, 1926, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1926, and shall be payable on the 28th day of May, 1926, at the office of the Commission, at Pyramid Hill.
- 3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.
- 4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.
- 5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

BY-LAW NO. 1662,-RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED .--QUAMBATOOK URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE AVOCA WATER TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

- 1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Quambatook Urban District within the Avoca Water Trust District.
  - (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty-three pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
  - (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty-three pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
  - (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of January, 1926, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1926, and shall be payable on the 28th day of May, 1926, at the office of the Commission's Collector, at Charlton.
- 3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.
- 4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fiftenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.
- 5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for mater supplied. water supplied.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

PROPOSED FISH POINT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

P URSUANT to the provisions of the Water Acts, I hereby declare that the lands included in the area defined hereunder, and shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted an Irrigation and Water Supply District.

The area hereinbefore referred to is defined as follows:--Commencing at the most easterly angle of allotment 5, section II., Parish of Boga, County of Tatchera; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 5, 5A, and 5B, lines connecting those boundaries and a line in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary, to the north-eastern boundary of allotment 21 of said section II.; thence south-easterly by that boundary to the most easterly angle of said allotment 21; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment and a line in continuation of that boundary to the eastern boundary of allotment 4 of section I.; thence southerly by that boundary and south-westerly by the eastern boundary of allotment 4A of the same section to the south-eastern angle of said allotment 4A; thence generally westerly by the southern boundaries of that allotment and allotment A (Murrabit P.R.) to a three-chain road running northerly through said allotment A; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of that road and a one-chain road in continuation thereof to the southern boundary of allotment 9c of said section. I.; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 9C. 9E, 9, and 9B, all of said section I., a line connecting those boundaries and a line in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary to the eastern boundary of allotment A2; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of that allotment to its south-eastern angle, all in the Parish of Roga; thence by a line bearing south to the shore of Lake Boga; thence generally westerly by the shore of that lake to a point bearing south from the south-eastern angle of allotment 7D, section I., Parish of Kunat Kunat; thence by a line bearing north to the last-mentioned angle; thence generally northerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 7p and 7c and a line connecting those boundaries to the most northerly angle of said allotment 7c, section I.; thence by a line bearing north to the Little Murray River; thence generally easterly by that river to a point due north of the most easterly angle of allotment 6, section I., Parish of Boga; thence by a line bearing south to that angle; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 6, 5, 20, and 21, all of said section I., and lines connecting those boundaries, to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of allotment 4A, section II.; thence south-easterly by a line and that boundary, and a line in continuation thereof, to the south-eastern boundary of allotment 4 of the same section; thence north-easterly by that boundary to the most easterly angle of said allotment 4; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of allotment 5 of said section II., all in the Parish of Boga, to the point of commencement.

The scheme of local works proposed for such district consists of off-take works at Lake Tutchewop and a system of channels and appurtenant works.

The estimated cost of such works, including portion of the cost of works for the distribution of water made available by Torrumbarry Weir for the supply of this and other districts,

The quantity of water proposed to be assigned to such district is twenty (20) cubic feet per second.

The sources of supply are to be the River Murray at Torrumbarry Weir and the Loddon River at Kerang Woir, by way of Lake Tutchewop, which is one of the Kerang North-West Lakes Works.

The season at which such supply is to be received is to be from 1st September in each year to the 1st May in the following year.

# Land Act 1915.

REGULATIONS-PART I., CHAPTER IV.-SURVEY.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne the eighteenth day of May, 1926.

### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS regulations were made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd August, 1920, and 27th September, 1922, respectively, providing for the mode in which any land and boundaries should be surveyed and boundaries adjusted: And whereas by section 192 of the Land Act 1915 (No. 2676), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power to make rules, regulations, and orders for the purpose of altering or rescinding such regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this order rescind the above-named regulations and make the following regulations in lieu thereof, to take effect from 1st June, 1926, that is to say:—

# CHAPTER IV .-- SURVEY.

- The methods to be employed in effecting surveys shall be those set forth in the Regulations of the Surveyors Board for the Guidance of Surveyors employed under the Land Acts.
- 2. In all surveys of subdivisions of township lands permanent reference marks shall be put in at the intersections of all streets or roads, and 10 links from one side thereof, such marks to consist of iron pins 18 inches in length by 1 inch square at top, or iron piping of similar length, and are to be driven under the surface of the ground, the position of such pins to be shown on plan and on field notes.
- 3. Every allotment shall, where it is practicable, contain at least two right angles, and be quadrilateral, and shall not have a shorter depth than double its frontage except where prevented by a boundary or natural feature, nor shall any allotment be allowed to cross a road or water-course that should reasonably form a boundary. If a narrow strip of land not less than 50 links in width be left between any allotment and a water frontage, the shortest side of the allotment shall front such strip of land, and where such strip is required for a roadway it shall be not less than 1½ chains in width. If an allotment abuts on a main road, the shortest side shall, where practicable, face such road. The boundary lines of allotments within a defined parish shall conform to the locally established meridian of that parish or as nearly thereto as circumstances will permit. Any departure from these instructions will necessitate a special report to be sent in with the plan.
- 4. Every allotment shall, where it is practicable, be surveyed as provided for in preceding clause; and no allotment shall be surveyed in a position or in a form which would, in the event of its being held separately, cut off access to water from any Crown land, or interfere with the profitable occupation of the same
- 5. When a creek is the boundary of an allotment, the traverse of the creek shall form part of the geometrical figure used in calculating the area, and the areas of the portions lying between the traverse lines and the creek shall be computed from the offsets and insets, the average length of which shall not exceed I chain, or be taken out by the planimeter from a careful plot on an enlarged scale. Allotments fronting creek or river reserves shall have their frontages defined by metes and bounds, and marked in the ordinary manner unless otherwise directed. When a stream which carries with it a permanent reserve is found to have altered its course, the old hed shall be shown on plan and field notes, and a report furnished.
- 6. The subject of the selection of roads being one of vital importance, the attention of surveyors is specially directed to the following instructions in reference thereto:—Every surveyor acting under the Department shall as occasion arises communicate with the municipal council or councils who may be interested in any road survey, and request the co-operation of their engineer in selecting the best routes for leading lines

of road through the unappropriated portions of the district. In the event of any municipal council neglecting or refusing to comply with his request, the surveyor shall proceed to select the best lines according to his own judgment; but the failure of the municipal authorities to co-operate shall not relieve him from the responsibility of making proper provision for all necessary roads; and in no case shall he survey a detached selection so as to block an existing track, or in a position likely to interfere with the public convenience, or block access to back country, until he has satisfied himself as to the road requirements of the locality in these respects, and make proper provision therefor. In cases where a difference of opinion may arise between himself and the municipal engineers, or where the surveyor has doubts in his own mind as to the proper course to pursue, he shall refer to the District Surveyor, and be guided by his directions. He shall also from time to time report to the District Surveyor any road which he may consider it desirable to survey, and if the District Surveyor deem it necessary, in the public interest, to traverse any track, leading feature, or permanently survey any line of road in advance of settlement, he shall consult the Surveyor-General

- 7. In addition to the necessary main roads, carefully selected accommodation roads leading thereto or to permanent streams shall be provided for as required or at intervals of from a mile to a mile and a half.
- 8. Every allotment shall have a road frontage, and wherever a road is shown on a plan it shall be laid off on the ground.
- 9. Surveyors shall be held responsible for any inconvenience that may arise either to the public or individuals through the improper blocking of existing tracks, the omission of necessary roads, or the selection of impracticable roads where practicable ones are possible.
- 10. In all cases where his measurements differ from those of any previous surveys, the surveyor shall furnish a special report with reference thereto.
- 11. Field books shall be the property of the Department, and shall be given up whenever demanded.

# Plans.

12. The surveyor shall supply a plan of the allotment, showing all features correctly and the course within its boundaries of any stream, race, road, track, and the position of any waterhole, dam, hut, fence, garden, old gold workings, and any other information that may help to distinguish the allotment. He shall also state on the plan whether the bearings of the boundary lines have reference to the true or the magnetic meridian, and how determined; or, if taken from an adjacent survey, the datum line adopted shall be shown on the face of the plan. The scale of the plan, where the area of the allotment is 100 acres or leas, shall be 8 chains to 1 inch; where the area is over 100 acres, 20 chains to 1 inch, unless a larger scale be required to show distinctly the matters hereinbefore directed to be shown. All plans shall be dated, below signature, as of the day when the survey was completed, and be certified as follows:—"I certify that this survey has been effected and marked on the ground in accordance with regulations, and that this plan is correct."

All plans on being completed shall be transmitted to the Department through the Land Officer for the district.

The types of plans issued with these Regulations shall be strictly adhered  ${f to}$ .

# Adjustment of Boundaries.

13. Whenever it may be necessary to adjust the boundaries of any surveyed land, the Surveyor-General shall on such adjustment certify as to the correct boundaries and area of the land or any portion or portions thereof, and for every such certificate there shall be charged such fee as he may direct. [5]. [2] [5].

# Survey Fees.

14. The survey fee payable on account of any portion of Grown land which has been recommended or is to be granted to any applicant shall be in accordance with the following Schedule of Fees and Scale applicable to the class of country in which such portion is situated, and the Surveyor-General shall determine the scale which shall apply to each district or locality of the State, and every such applicant shall pay the fee prescribed by these Regulations, even though the land has been previously surveyed and may or may not require further survey.

- (n) A travelling fee of 1s. 6d. per mile will be paid for surveys distant more than 10 miles from a central town in the district or from a railway station or from the last survey on the same trip. This travelling fee will not apply to extensive surveys or subdivisions.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF PORTION OF FORESHORE OF PORT PHILLIP BAY AND SITUATE IN THE PARISH OF PAYWIT, AND KNOWN AS "BATMAN PARK."

WE, Herbert H. Lewis, George Alexander Hood, Joseph Latrobe Hood, William Chalmers Forbes, Harry Parland Stephen, Edward Alfred James Harvey, James Gray, William Edward Rigby, and Stephen Wrathall, the duly appointed Committee of Management of that portion of the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay and situate in the Parish of Paywit as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked P/9.6.25 attached to Lands Correspondence C.74681, and known as "Batman Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915.

- HEGULATIONS.

  1. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Park may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Park.

  2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Park.

  4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fances in
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Park, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or n any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Park, nor leave or deposit any

glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein. Picnic parties must leave the Park in a clean condition; all paper, rubbish, or other débris must be cleared up.

- 5. No person shall put in the Park any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Park, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 6. No person shall camp in the Park, or light any fire, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Park without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Park.
- 9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Park, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Park.
- 10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Park on Sunday.
- or sport within the Park on Sunday.

  11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

  12. Persons camping in the Park shall pay such fees and
- 12. Persons camping in the Park shall pay such fees and comply with such conditions as may from time to time be determined by the Committee of Management.
- 13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- 14. No person shall erect any bathing-box or boat-house or shed on the Park without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed advisable by the Committee of Management, but no person shall cause to be used or use any bathing-box, boat-house, or shed for residential purposes.
- 15. Every person bathing from the Park shall be decently attired from the neck to the knee in a two-piece Canadian costume of dark-coloured material.
- 16. No person shall drive or ride any horse, motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle on the Park, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any member of the Police Force, doth not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
