Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE LIMEBURNERS BOARD.

Note.-This Determination, on the 5th July, 1926, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making lime," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 5th July, 1926, the previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

Any of the above times of beginning and ending may be varied on any job by mutual consent of the employer and the majority of the employees, but in no case shall the total length of any shift be increased.

⁽³⁾ Shifts.—That---

⁽b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee before or after his shift shall be time and a quarter for the first two hours, and thereafter time and a half.

⁽⁴⁾ Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and a third per centum.

⁽⁵⁾ Special Rates for Sundays and Public Holidays.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Good Friday, or Easter Monday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
