GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has by an Order made on the twenty-third day of August, 1927, directed that the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts be amended as follows, as and from the 1st day of July, 1927, that is to say:

Clause 40-

For the words "As regards pensions other than pensions under Act No. 3408, payment may be made on the last working day other than Saturday of each month."

Substitute the following:—"As regards pensions other than pensions under Act No. 1997, payments will be made direct to the persons concerned fortnightly, by means of not-negotiable cheques through the post or otherwise."

Clause 57-

Clause 57 of the Regulations is hereby repealed and the following new clause is substituted in lieu thereof:—

"57. Accounts for pensions under the South African Contingents Pensions Act (No. 1997) shall be prepared upon Form L8 or L9, whichever is applicable. As regards all other pensions and retiring allowances, &c., it will not be necessary for the persons concerned to render claims, as payments will be made as provided for in Clause 40 ante." Education Act 1915.

THE COUNCIL OF PUBLIC EDUCATION. REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by section 103 of the Education Act 1915 upon the Council of Public Education, enabling the Council to make regulations (with the approval of the Governor in Council) "for determining the courses of study and training and the examinations entitling persons to be registered as teachers; regulating the granting by the Council of certificates of registration of teachers or of schools, and the form of such certificates; providing for the keeping of the registers and mode of registering and making additions or revisions defining what schools shall for the purposes of this Act respectively be sub-primary schools, primary schools, or secondary schools (as the case may be); regarding the reciprocal admission of teachers from other States; for or relating to the time and place of meetings of the Registration Committee and the management and conduct of business thereat; and generally for carrying these Acts into effect," the Council doth hereby rescind Regulation III. (17) approved by the Governor in Council on the 21st September, 1914, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulation:—

17. Any person who is at least sixteen years of age and

Any person who is at least sixteen years of age and has passed the Intermediate Examination or the Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne may receive the permission of the Registration Committee to be employed as a junior teacher in an approved school for the purpose of undergoing a course of training extending over at least two years. If at the end of such course of training such person has qualified for Matriculation at the University of Melbourne has passed the examination in the Theory and Practice of Teaching for the Primary Teacher's Certificate (Second Class) of the Education Department and has passed in Arithmetic at the Intermediate Examination of the University of Melbourne or at the examination for the Primary Teacher's Certificate (Second Class) of the Education Department he may be registered as a Primary teacher.

Notice to Boatmen, &c.

POATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association. in connexion with the Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley Course on the Upper Yarra on the 22nd October, 1927, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations. viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit is to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagi. gs (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the River Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such boats as have permission of the River Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the River Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

No motor or other boats will be allowed to ply for hire between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Healey Day.

All motor boats shall be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m., and shall remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

All motor boats on south bank must moor bow up stream, and all motor boats on north bank must moor bow down stream.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the River Officer, 110 Spencer-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, or with a beam exceeding 9 feet overall, unless the River Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is assued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the River Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, and must moor at post bearing same number as shown on permit.

Mooring or holding on to the booms or buoys is strictly forbidden.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 8 feet.

The use of paddles as a means of propulsion for rowing boats is preferred.

Boats over 25 feet in length or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under twelve years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

His Excellency, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 4 (1) of the Motor Omnibus Act 1925 (No. 3439), doth by this Order prescribe the above routes developmental routes.

His Excellency doth by this Order further provide, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 11 (1) (b) of the Motor Omnibus Act 1924 (No. 3378) that the Order in Council approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 21st December, 1926, prescribing routes within the metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the said Act may ply for hire, shall be amended in the manner following:—

For Route No. 17 there shall be substituted the following route:-

"Commencing at terminus of cable tramway in Johnston-street, Collingwood, via Johnston-street, Johnston-street Bridge-road, and Studley Park-road to High-street, Kew."

For Route No. 27A there shall be substituted the following route:-

"Commencing at corner of Kambrook-road and Glen Eira-road, Caulfield, via Glen Eira-road, to Ripponlea Railway Station."

Under the heading "Fares to be charged," for the words and figure "Maximum through fare, 3d.," there shall be substituted the words and figure "Maximum through fare, 4d."

Route No. 32A.—Under the heading "Maximum number of Motor Omnibuses to be licensed on route," for the figure "1" there shall be substituted the figure "2."

For Route No. 47A there shall be substituted the following route:-

"Commencing at corner of Box Hill and Dandenong Roads, Oakleigh, via Atherton-road, Station-street, Portman-street, Warrigal-road, Castlebar-road, Dandenong-road, and Koornang-road, to Carnegie Railway Station."

Pursuant to the provisions of section 11 (1) (c) of the Motor Omnibus Act 1924 (No. 3378) the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the Licensing Authority full power and authority for carrying into effect by the said Licensing Authority all of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

And the Honorable John Percy Jones, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor creet therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any bond of music or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. The Committee of Management shall have full power, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the méaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1915.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

(h) Not use any flap, shelf, or other device on his cart whereby the length, width, or height thereof is increased beyond the measurements specified in section 7 hereof.

(i) Not sell at any place other than at the stand he is licensed to occupy.

(j) Not paint or write on his cart, or display, or affix, or carry thereon, or suspend therefrom, any trade or other advertisement, or any placard, poster, streamer, flag, sign, or sign-board of any kind whatsoever.

7. No eart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle shall be used on any appointed stand unless the same shall—

(a) have been previously approved by the health inspector or other appointed officer and
(b) be not greater in length than 10 feet and in width 4 feet.
