THE Governor directs the publication, for general information, of Crown Office Rules (No. 2) Order, 1927, relating to the above-mentioned subject, as appended hereto.

PRESENT:

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Royal Proclamation made in pursuance of section 1 of the *Royal and Parliamentary Titles Act 1927*. His Majesty has appointed and declared, amongst other things, that henceforth, so far as conveniently may be, on all occasions and in all instruments wherein the style and titles appertaining to the Crown are used, the following alteration shall be made in the style and titles now appointed, namely, for the words "the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of," there shall be substituted the words "Great Britain, Ireland and":

And whereas it is provided by section 2 of the said Act that Parliament shall hereafter be known as and styled the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and that in every Act passed and public document issued after the passing of that Act the expression "United Kingdom" shall, unless the context otherwise requires, mean Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

And whereas it is provided by section 3 of the *Crown Office Act 1877*, that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make and when made from time to time revoke, add to, or alter Rules prescribing the form in which documents to which that Act applies, are to be worded:

And whereas it is necessary, on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order, that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now therefore His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following Rule shall apply to any document of such a character or belonging to such a class as would, when this Order comes into operation, be required to be, or usually would be, authenticated by being passed under the Great Seal:—

RULE.

Where any of the expressions set out in the first column of the schedule hereto occurs in the prescribed or customary form of any document to which this Rule applies, then the corresponding expression or one of the corresponding expressions set out in the second column of that schedule may be substituted therefor, if the context so permits, for the purpose of documents issued after this Rule comes into operation.

2. The Rules made from time to time under section 3 of the *Crown Office Act 1877*, so far as they are still in force, shall have effect as amended by the Rule prescribed by the last preceding paragraph.

3. This Order may be cited as the Crown Office Rules (No. 2) Order, 1927, and shall come into operation as from the date hereof, in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of the *Rules Publication Act 1893*.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING-BY-LAW FOR 1927.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Eleven pounds (£11) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1927.
2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Eleven pounds (£11) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).
3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.
4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to what the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises; and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the above-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.
5. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge shall be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than equal to Two shillings (2s.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Shepparton for the year 1927 of the property so supplied.
6. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.
7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show grounds, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.
8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.
9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works, or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust's officer or officers. The applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized, in writing, so to do. The Trust's officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.
10. Such rates are hereby payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1927. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.
11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and the Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Water Acts, on the evening of Thursday, the ninth day of August, 1927.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

PROPOSED COREENA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Water Acts, I hereby declare that the lands included in the area defined hereunder, and shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted a Waterworks District.

The area hereinbefore referred to is defined as follows:— Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 28, Parish of Annuello, County of Karkaroc; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment and the southern boundaries of allotments 27 and 26, all of the Parish of Annuello, and a line in continuation thereof to the eastern boundary of allotment 17, Parish of Wemen; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of that allotment and westerly by its southern boundary to the south-eastern angle of allotment 18, Parish of Wemen; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment and northerly by its western boundary to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 10, Parish of Liparoo; thence westerly by a line and a road and a line in continuation thereof to a point in the western boundary of the Parish of Liparoo; thence northerly by that boundary to the left bank of the Murray River; thence generally easterly by the left bank of that river to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Nenandie; thence southerly by that boundary to the south-eastern angle of allotment 90, Parish of Nenandie; thence south-westerly by a road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 13 of that parish; thence generally westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 13, 14, and 15, all in the Parish of Nenandie, and a line in continuation thereof to the eastern boundary of allotment 7, Parish of Margooya; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of that allotment and westerly by its southern boundary and a line in continuation thereof to the south-eastern angle of allotment 8, Parish of Margooya; thence generally southerly and south-westerly by a road, to the south-eastern angle of allotment 35 of the same parish; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment and northerly by its western boundary to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 17, Parish of Annuello; thence westerly by a line and the southern boundary of that allotment and northerly by its western boundary to the south-eastern angle of allotment 20, Parish of Annuello; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment and northerly by its western boundary to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 22 of the same parish; thence south-westerly by a road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 23, Parish of Annuello; thence south-easterly by a line and the north-western boundary of allotment 28 and southerly by its eastern boundary to the point of commencement.

The scheme of works proposed for such district consists of a pumping plant, rising main, and a system of main and tributary channels for domestic and stock supply.

The estimated cost of the proposed works is £38,720.

WHEREAS by Part 1 of the *Stock Diseases Act 1915* among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make Orders and Regulations for the purpose therein mentioned: And whereas it is desired to proclaim certain parts of the State of Victoria to be Quarantine Districts for Stock (Pigs): And whereas it is further desired to remove quarantine restrictions from certain parts of the State of Victoria, which, by Regulations made on the 31st May, 1927, and the 6th July, 1927, were proclaimed Quarantine Districts for Stock (Pigs): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-mentioned Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. All those portions of the State of Victoria situate in the Parishes of Newmerella, Orbost, and Orbest East of the Municipal District of Orbost Shire, are hereby proclaimed a Quarantine District for Stock (Pigs).

2. Regulations made on the 31st May, 1927, and the 6th July, 1927, are hereby rescinded in so far as they relate to the following districts:—

Stock Foods Acts 1915 and 1926.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the above-mentioned Stock Foods Acts to make Regulations for or with respect to prescribing the official methods of analysis to be applied in the analysis of any stock food and for other purposes, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth Order as follows:—

OFFICIAL METHODS OF ANALYSIS OF BRAN AND POLLARD.

Preparation of Sample.

The sample shall be ground as finely as possible.

*Determination of Crude Protein.**Reagents required.*

Standard sulphuric acid—N/10.

Standard sodium hydroxide solution—N/10.

Concentrated sulphuric acid—1.84 Sp. Gr., free from nitrates and ammonium sulphate.

Copper sulphate—crystallized.

Sodium hydroxide solution.—Dissolve approximately 450 grams of commercial sodium hydroxide, free from nitrates, in 1 litre of water. This solution should have a specific gravity of 1.43—1.48.

Cochineal indicator.—Digest 3 grams of pulverized cochineal in a mixture of 50 cc. of 95 per cent. alcohol and 200 cc. of water for one or two days at ordinary temperature with frequent agitation, and then filter.

Potassium sulphate or anhydrous sodium sulphate—pulverized.

Test reagents previous to use by a blank determination with sugar, and allow for any blank so obtained.

Apparatus required.

(a) Kjeldahl flasks for digestion.—Total capacity of about 550 cc., made of hard, moderately thick, and well-annealed glass.

(b) Distillation flask.—For distillation, any suitable flask of about 550 cc. capacity may be used. It is fitted with a rubber stopper through which passes the lower end of a Kjeldahl connecting bulb to prevent sodium hydroxide being carried over mechanically during the distillation. The bulb should be about 3 cm. in diameter, and the tubes should be of the same diameter as the condenser tube with which the upper end of the bulb tube is connected by means of rubber tubing.

Method.

Place 2 grams of the substance to be analysed in a digestion flask. Add 10 grams of powdered potassium sulphate or anhydrous sodium sulphate and 15—25 cc. (ordinarily about 20 cc.) of concentrated sulphuric acid. (0.1—0.3 gram of crystallized copper sulphate may also be added).

Place the flask in an inclined position and heat below the boiling point of the acid until frothing has ceased. (A small piece of paraffin may be added to prevent extreme foaming.) Increase the heat until the acid boils briskly and digest for a time after the mixture is colourless, or nearly so, or until oxidation is complete. The digestion usually requires not less than two hours.

After cooling make up to 200 cc. with distilled water, and take 100 cc. for distillation. Transfer to distillation flask.

Add sufficient sodium hydroxide solution to make the reaction strongly alkaline (50 cc. is usually enough), pouring it down the side of the flask so that it does not mix at once with the acid solution. Connect the flask by means of a Kjeldahl connecting bulb with the condenser, the tip of which extends below the surface of the standard acid in the receiver; mix the contents by shaking, and distil until all ammonia has passed over into a measured quantity of the standard acid. Titrate with standard alkali solution, using the cochineal indicator.

Multiply cc.'s N/10 acid used by .0014 by 100 by 6.25 to obtain percentage of crude protein.

*Determination of Crude Fat or Ether Extract.**Reagent.*

Anhydrous ether.—Wash commercial ether with two or three successive portions of water, add solid sodium or potassium hydroxide, and let stand until most of the water has been extracted from the ether.

Decant into a dry bottle, add small pieces of carefully cleaned, bright, metallic sodium, and let stand (have bottle lightly stoppered) until there is no further evolution of hydrogen gas. Keep the ether, thus dehydrated, over metallic sodium in a loosely stoppered bottle.

Method.

Weigh 2 grams of substance, dry at 100° C. to constant weight, transfer to a paper Soxhlet thimble, place in Soxhlet apparatus, and extract with anhydrous ether for 16 hours.

Dry the extract (after distilling off ether) at the temperature of boiling water for 30 minutes; cool in desiccator and weigh. Repeat at 30 minutes intervals until weight is constant (usually 1 to 1.5 hours is required). Weight of extract multiplied by 50 gives percentage of ether extract.

*Determination of Crude Fibre.**Reagents required.*(a) Dilute sulphuric acid solution.—Contains 1.25 grams of sulphuric acid (H₂SO₄) per 100 cc.

(b) Dilute sodium hydroxide solution.—Contains 1.25 grams of sodium hydroxide per 100 cc., free, or nearly so, from sodium carbonate.

The strength of these solutions must be accurately checked by titration.

(c) Asbestos.—Digest on a steam bath or at an equivalent temperature for at least eight hours with an approximately 5 per cent. sodium hydroxide solution and thoroughly wash with hot water; then digest in a similar manner for eight hours with dilute hydrochloric acid (1 plus 3) and again wash thoroughly with hot water; dry, and ignite at bright red heat.

Apparatus required.

(a) Condenser.—Use a condenser that will maintain a constant volume of solution throughout the process of digestion.

(b) Digestion flasks.—The digestion flasks should be of such size and shape that the solution will be not less than 1 inch nor more than 1½ inches in depth. A 700—750 cc. Erlenmeyer flask is recommended.

(c) Filtering cloth.—The filtering cloth should be of such character that while filtering is rapid, no appreciable solid matter passes through. Butcher's linen, dress linen, or Indian head cloth with about 45 threads to the inch, or its equivalent, may be used.

Method.

Use the residue from the ether extract determination and transfer the residue, together with about 0.5 gram of asbestos, to the digestion flask. Add 200 cc. of the boiling dilute sulphuric acid, immediately connect with the condenser, and heat. It is essential that the contents of the flask come to boiling within one minute and that the boiling continue briskly for exactly 30 minutes. Rotate the flask about every five minutes, in order to mix the charge thoroughly. Care should be taken to keep the material from remaining on the sides of the flask out of contact with the solution. (A blast of air introduced into the flask will serve to reduce frothing of the liquid.) At the expiration of 30 minutes remove the flask, immediately filter through linen in a fluted funnel, and wash with boiling water until the washings are no longer acid. Bring a quantity of the dilute sodium hydroxide solution to boiling and keep at this temperature under a reflux condenser until used. Wash the charge and asbestos back into the flask with 200 cc. of the boiling dilute sodium hydroxide solution, using a wash bottle marked to deliver 200 cc. (The boiling sodium hydroxide solution is conveniently transferred to the 200 cc. wash bottle by means of a bent tube, through which the liquid is forced by blowing into a tube connected with the top of the reflux condenser attached to the sodium hydroxide flask.) Then connect the flask with the reflux condenser and boil for exactly 30 minutes. The boiling with the alkali should be so timed that the contents of the different flasks will reach the boiling point approximately three minutes apart, which permits sufficient time for filtration. At the expiration of 30 minutes remove the flask and immediately filter through a Gooch prepared with an asbestos mat, through an alundum crucible, or through the filtering cloth in a fluted funnel. If the filtering cloth is used, thoroughly wash the residue with boiling water and then transfer it to a Gooch crucible prepared with a thin, but close, layer of ignited asbestos. After thorough washing with boiling water, wash with about 15 cc. of 95 per cent. alcohol. Dry the crucible and contents at 110° C. to constant weight. Cool in an efficient desiccator and weigh. Incinerate the contents of the crucible in an electric muffle or over a Meker burner at a dull red heat until the carbonaceous matter has been consumed—twenty minutes is usually sufficient. Cool in a desiccator and weigh. Report the loss in weight as crude fibre.

MAFFRA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.—DISTRICT EXTENDED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

That the Maffra Irrigation and Water Supply District be extended by adding to the same the lands set out and described hereunder, and as on and from the first day of July, 1927, such District shall be deemed to be so extended, viz:—

**MAFFRA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT
SUBDIVIDED AND MAFFRA AND SALE IRRIGATION
AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICTS CONSTITUTED
THEREOUT.**

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

That as on and from the first day of July, 1927, the Maffra Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be subdivided, and that two Irrigation and Water Supply Districts be constituted thereout, to be known, respectively, as Maffra Irrigation and Water Supply District and Sale Irrigation and Water Supply District, and that the boundaries of the said Maffra Irrigation and Water Supply District (hereby constituted) shall be those set out and described in the First Schedule hereto, and that the boundaries of the said Sale Irrigation and Water Supply District (hereby constituted) shall be those set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

*Boundaries of the Maffra Irrigation and Water Supply District
(constituted by this Order).*

Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 2, section 2, Parish of Wa-de-lock, County of Tanjil; thence easterly by the northern boundary of said allotment 2 to the Avon River; thence generally south-easterly by that river to a point in line with the eastern boundary of allotment 4, section 9, Parish of Bundalagah; thence southerly by a line and the eastern boundaries of allotments 4, 12, and 19 of that section and a line connecting those boundaries to the southern boundary of said allotment 19; thence westerly by that boundary and the northern boundary of a road to the south-western angle of allotment 5B, Parish of Wa-de-lock; thence northerly by the western boundaries of allotments 5B and 5A and a line in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary to the south-eastern angle of allotment 9B; thence westerly by the northern boundary of a road to the Maffra to Briagolong railway reserve; thence generally northerly by that reserve to the southern boundary of allotment 13B; thence easterly by the northern boundary of a road to the south-western angle of allotment 23; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of allotment 14B to the south-eastern angle of allotment 18; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment to its south-western angle; thence northerly by the western boundary of said allotment 18 a distance of 2,500 links; thence westerly by a line to a point in the western boundary of allotment 17, distant 2,500 links northerly from the south-western angle of that allotment; thence northerly by the western boundary of said allotment 17 to the south-eastern angle of allotment 16B; thence westerly by the southern boundary of said allotment 16B to the south-western angle thereof; thence northerly by the western boundary of that allotment and a line in continuation of that boundary to the south-western boundary of allotment 46, section A, Boisdale Estate; thence north-westerly by that boundary to the most westerly angle of said allotment 46; thence westerly by the southern boundary of a road to the north-western angle of allotment 44, Parish of Maffra; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of a road to the Macalister River; thence generally south-westerly by that river to a point in line with the eastern boundary of allotment 10D, Parish of Tinamba; thence southerly by a line and that boundary to the northern boundary of allotment 11A; thence easterly by the southern boundary of a road to the eastern boundary of allotment 12; thence generally southerly by that boundary to a point therein distant about 4,048 links north of and at right angles to the southern boundary of that allotment; thence by a line bearing west a distance of about 6,400 links; thence by a line bearing 178 deg. 57 min. 4,048 links to the southern boundary of said allotment 12; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 12, 10, 11B, 65C, 65BB, 71BB, 71C, and lines connecting those boundaries to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by the western boundaries of allotments 71C and 71B and a line connecting those boundaries to the Macalister River; thence generally westerly by that river to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 34, Parish of Maffra; thence northerly by a line and that boundary and easterly by the northern boundary of that allotment to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 29, section 6, Parish of Wa-de-lock; thence northerly by a line and that boundary and north-easterly by the western and northern boundaries of allotment 1 of said section 6 to the southern boundary of the Parish of Wa-de-lock; thence generally easterly by that boundary to the south-western angle of allotment 110A, Parish of Maffra; thence generally easterly by the northern boundary of a three-chain road to the western boundary of allotment 40; thence northerly by that boundary and a line in continuation of it to the southern boundary of allotment 10, section 3, Parish of Wa-de-lock; thence easterly by the northern boundary of a road to the south-western angle of allotment 45, section A, Boisdale Estate; thence generally north-westerly by the western boundary of that estate to a point in line with the eastern boundary of allotment 18 of said section A; thence northerly by a line to the

south-eastern angle of that allotment; thence south-westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment to its south-western angle; thence generally northerly and north-westerly by the eastern boundary of a road to the point of commencement.

Skipton Road in the Shire of Ripon.—All that piece of land in the Parish of Yangerahwill, the boundaries of which are as follow:—Commencing at the the south-western angle of allotment 4A, section 8, of the said parish; thence by lines bearing respectively 360 deg. 0 min. 107.6 links, 147 deg. 3 min. 128.3 links, and 270 deg. 3 min. 69.8 links to the point of commencement, which said piece of land is particularly delineated and coloured red on survey plan No. 1983, lodged in the office of the Country Roads Board.

Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne, in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and other public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof.

THESE Regulations shall, from and after the date of the same coming into operation, be read and construed as one with the Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne on the third day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, intituled "Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne in pursuance of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and other public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof."

2. Sub-clause (6) of clause 2 of the above-mentioned Regulations shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and there shall be inserted and read in lieu thereof the following, that is to say:—

"(6) Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another, drive or ride upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving and parallel to the kerb alignment of the footway upon the left or near side of such street until he is as near as practicable to the footway on the left-hand side of the street which he is entering as shown in the subjoined diagram."

3. Clause 14 of the said Regulations, as already amended by the Regulations passed on the ninth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, shall be further amended by adding at the end thereof the following words:—

"Nothing herein contained or implied shall prevent the application of the provisions of sub-clause 6 of clause 2 of these Regulations to the streets and parts of streets named and specified in this section."

BY-LAW No. 187.

By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 187, to further amend or add to the provisions of By-law number 179, with reference to street traffic.

WHEREAS it is desirable to further amend or add to the provisions of By-law number 179: Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Act 6 George V. (No. 2686), and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. 2. Sub-section 6 of section 4 of the said By-law number 179 shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and there shall be inserted and read in lieu thereof the following, that is to say:—

"(6) Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another, drive or ride upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving, and parallel to the kerb alignment of the footway upon the left or near side of such street until he is as near as practicable to the footway on the left-hand side of the street which is entering as shown in the subjoined diagram."

3. Section 16 of the said By-law number 179, as already amended by By-law number 184 shall be further amended by adding at the end thereof the following words:—

"Nothing herein contained or implied shall prevent the application of the provisions of sub-section 6 of section 4 of this By-law to the streets and parts of streets named and specified in this section."

4. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

5. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. All road traffic in Broadway, Jeparit, proceeding in a south-easterly direction between Sands-avenue and John-street, shall travel on the north-east roadway of Broadway.

5. The two roadways in Federal-street, Rainbow, lying respectively to the north and south of the Centre Reserve shall, between a point where Federal-street intersects with a continuation of the east building line of Railway-street and the west building line of Taverner-street, Rainbow, each be deemed to constitute a one-way road for traffic.

6. All road traffic in Federal-street, Rainbow, proceeding in a westerly direction between Railway-street and Taverner-street, shall travel on the south roadway of Federal-street.

7. All road traffic in Federal-street, Rainbow, proceeding in an easterly direction between Taverner-street and Railway-street, shall travel on the north roadway of Federal-street.

SHIRE OF KILMORE.

A By-law of the Shire of Kilmore, made under section 75 of the *Health Act 1919*, and all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, and numbered 9, for the provision, use and control of receptacles for the deposit, collection, and disposal of refuse and rubbish (whether temporary or otherwise), and prescribing the size, shape of, and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Kilmore, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township of Kilmore, and, unless exempted by the Council, shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.

5. The proprietor of any house, buildings, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle, in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge, or other approved material, in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 3 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid, with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectively wrapped in waste paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor shall cause, at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited inside the yard of such house, building, or premises at a distance not exceeding 10 feet from the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, land, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, land, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

14. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall, for every breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, or, in the case of a continuing offence, a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

(b) All work done within the times of beginning and ending work in any week in excess of the number of hours determined for a week's work shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

(7) ALLOWANCES.—The following allowances shall be paid to persons employed on work away from their employers' place of business :—

- (1) The fares, exceeding 4d. per day, necessarily expended in going from and to the employee's residence to and from his work.
- (2) For work done at a distance from the employer's place of business, if the employee is unable to return to his home the same night :—

- (a) 6s. per day for the first seven days, and thereafter 30s. per week extra.
- (b) Freight necessarily incurred for transport of tools to or from work.

(8) PUBLIC HOLIDAYS AND SUNDAYS.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th day of January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, the 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted. (9) CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work) who have not been summarily dismissed for misconduct or incompetence, or who have not voluntarily left their work, shall be paid at the rate of 3d. per hour extra.

(10) TOOLS AND APPLIANCES.—If any employee is required to provide any of the following tools :—Dogs and cramps of all descriptions, bars of all descriptions, augers of all sizes, bits not ordinarily used in a brace, all hammers except claw hammers, glue pots and brushes, dowel plates, tamels, hand and thumb screws, spanners and soldering irons, 6d. per hour, in addition to the ordinary rates fixed by this Determination, shall be paid by the employer.

(11) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—All payments of wages shall be made not later than the hour of ceasing work on Friday of each week.
