Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the State Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Monday, the 24th October, 1927. An entry on the proper form must also, on or before the 31st October, 1927, be lodged with the Registrar of the Melbourne University, and candidates must state therein that they have entered for the Public Service Examination, and indicate the subjects they desire to be examined in for that examination.

The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School Leaving or School Intermediate Examination, as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which and forms of application (both Public Service and University) may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, on or before Wednesday, the 23rd November, 1927, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for fifteen shillings (15s.). No fee is payable to the University if a candidate enters for the Public Service Examination only.

Sixty (60) candidates will be selected for registration for appointments as Clerks to fill vacancies as they occur during the ensuing year (30 from those who pass the School Leaving and 30 from those who pass the School Intermediate Examination). Candidates must, on the first day of the examination, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty-one years at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £91 (£208 on attaining age of twenty-one years), rising to a maximum of £299 a year, with a long-service increment of £13 a year.

## DECLARATION OF THE COALVILLE-MOE ROAD, IN THE SHIRE OF NARRACAN.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby:—

#### REGULATION XXXVIII. (A)—STUDENT-TEACHERS IN TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

(a) Rescind Regulation XXXVIII. (A)—Student-teachers in Technical Schools, of the Regulations under the *Public Service Act 1915*, and substitute in lieu thereof the following regulation, that is to say:—

1. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, establish courses, to be conducted in such technical schools, junior technical schools, and other institutions as the Director may determine, for persons desirous of qualifying as teachers in technical schools.

2. These courses shall be under the supervision of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, the Inspector of Art, the Inspector of Technical Schools, and such other officers as may be instructed by the Director.

3. The number of persons to be admitted to these courses shall be determined from time to time by the Minister.

4. The qualifications for admission to these courses shall be—

(a) Applicants shall be not less than sixteen years of age.

(b) They shall have passed successfully through the full course of study at a junior technical school, or hold an approved equivalent qualification.

(c) They shall furnish satisfactory evidence that they are of good moral character, and that they exhibit aptitude and general suitability for the work of teaching.

(d) They shall, on the certificate of a school medical officer or of a medical practitioner approved for the purpose by the Director, be of sound constitution, and free from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.

5. When the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of persons to be admitted to these courses, admission shall be determined by the following considerations:—

(a) The educational qualifications of the applicants as shown in their school records.

(b) The special qualifications of the applicants in respect of any special branch of technical work.

(c) The aptitude of the applicants for the work of teaching.

(d) The personal qualities of the applicants.

6. The selection of applicants for admission to these courses shall be made on the recommendation of the committee, consisting of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, the Inspector of Art, and a third person nominated by the Director.

7. Persons admitted to these courses shall be known as student-teachers.

8. (a) The course for student-teachers shall, except in cases mentioned in clause 9 below, extend over five years, or such longer time as may be necessary, and shall include—

(i) A course of study in English as prescribed for the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne.

(ii) The principles and practice of teaching.

(iii) A technical course in an approved branch of industry.

(iv) Approved workshop or other technical experience.

(b) Student teachers shall be required to attend such classes of instruction, pass such examinations, perform such duties, and undergo such workshop or other technical experience as may be prescribed.

9. The Minister, on the recommendation of the Director, may, in cases where student-teachers at the time of admission possess special qualifications, reduce the period of the course from five to four years, in which case each student-teacher shall, on admission to the course, receive the same benefits as student-teachers in the second year of the course.

10. The Minister may at any time require a student-teacher to withdraw from his course if he is satisfied—

(a) That the student-teacher is not carrying out satisfactorily the prescribed conditions of his course; or

(b) that the aptitude, attendance, conduct, or progress of the student-teacher is unsatisfactory; or

(c) that the student-teacher is not of sound constitution, or is suffering from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher;

and thereupon all advantages and allowances under this regulation shall cease and determine.



11. Student-teachers shall, subject to their compliance with the prescribed conditions, be paid an allowance during the period of their course. Such allowance shall be at the rate of £40 per annum during the first year of the course, and may be increased annually at the rate of £10 per annum until a maximum of £80 per annum is reached. A student-teacher shall not be granted an annual increase in his allowance unless, in the opinion of the Director, his examination results and the reports of his work warrant such increase.

12. No student-teacher may proceed to higher grades in any subject without having passed in the lower grade, except where special permission has been granted by the Director.

13. Each student-teacher shall be required to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety that he will observe the conditions of his course, that he will not relinquish his course without the permission of the Minister, and that for the three and one-half years next after the termination of the period of his course he will, if required, teach in any school to which he may be appointed by the Minister. Women student-teachers may, in the event of their marriage, be permitted to resign at the expiration of three years' service after the termination of the period of their course.

14. In the case of a student-teacher who has been required under clause 10 above to withdraw from his course, or who fails to carry out the terms of the agreement under clause 13 above, the Minister shall determine the amount of the allowance paid under clause 11 above to be refunded by such student-teacher.

15. Student-teachers who are certified by the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools as having completed satisfactorily the course as prescribed in clause 8 above shall be granted the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate.

16. Student-teachers shall, at the commencement of the third year of their course, be regarded as having been awarded studentships at a prescribed institution for the training of teachers, and shall thereupon be placed on the Classified Roll for the Secondary Schools' Division provided, however, that their retention on such Classified Roll shall be subject to their compliance with the conditions of tenure of their studentships.

17. (a) Upon successfully completing the course as prescribed in clause 8 above, student-teachers shall be placed in the subdivision of the Fifth Class in the Secondary Schools' Division and paid the corresponding initial salary, as shown hereunder:—

(b) Student-teachers who have undergone the full course as prescribed in clause 8 above, but who have not completed such course successfully, shall be placed in the subdivision of the Fifth Class in the Secondary Schools' Division and paid the corresponding initial salary, as shown hereunder:—

18. Notwithstanding anything contained in this or any other regulation—

- (a) student-teachers who at the beginning of the years 1924, 1925, and 1926 respectively entered upon the third year of their course shall be placed on the Classified Roll for the Secondary Schools' Division as from the fourteenth day of December, 1926;
- (b) student-teachers who at the beginning of the year 1927 entered upon the third year of their course shall be placed on the Classified Roll for the Secondary Schools' Division as from the first day of January, 1927; and
- (c) the provisions of clause 17 above shall apply to those student-teachers who completed the period of their course at the end of the year 1926.

#### ADDITIONS TO REGULATION XII. (A)—TEACHERS' COLLEGES.

(b) Make the following additions to Regulation XII. (A)—Teachers' Colleges, of the Regulations under the Public Service Act 1915, that is to say—

Add the following sub-clause to clause 25:—

- (c) Each year students (not exceeding four in number) who have qualified for the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate and are recommended by the Board of Examiners as exhibiting special merit and aptitude for further training may have their studentships extended by the Minister for one year for the purpose of undertaking a special course in such branch or branches of study as the Director may determine.
