Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE COUNTRY KNITTERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on 7th March, 1927, applied to the whole of the State OUTSIDE AND EXCEPTING the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Raglehawk and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the process, trade, or business of knitting or crocheting any article for human wear," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That this Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after the 7th March, 1927.

TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

(3) That the times of beginning and ending work shall be :--Time of Beginning.

Time of Ending.

7.30 s.m.

12 noon on Saturday or the day on which the half-holiday is locally observed, and 6 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

OVERTIME.

- (4) That time and a half shall be paid for all work done-

 - (a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause 3.
 (b) Within such hours in excess of 45 hours in any week.

SPECIAL RATES.

(5) That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on-

Sunday, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday,

Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day;

but it any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

PIECE-WORK.

(6) The Board determines, under the provisions of section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

NOTE.—The employer shall supply all necessary materials free.
