Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE LEATHER-GOODS BOARD

Note.—This Determination on the 11th March, 1927, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warraambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of manufacturing—

(a) Articles made of leather or a substitute for leather, such as—

Bags, braces, cases, cricket balls, pads, or other sporting goods, garters, pocketbook covers, portmanteaux, purses, trunks, wallets;

(b) Machine belting;

(c) Any other kind of leather goods;

but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boot Board, the Rubber Trade Board, or the Saddlery and Harness Board," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 11th March, 1927, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination. (2)
