NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RESTRICT THE USE OF MESH OR SET NETS IN WESTERN PORT BAY.

I T is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the Victoria Government Gazette, to move His Excellency, the Governor in Council, to make a Proclamation restricting the use of mesh or set nets in the waters of Western Port Bay as follows:—

- The maximum length of mesh or set net to be used at any one time by any person shall not exceed six hun-hundred (600) fathoms, provided that where two licensed fishermen are working together as a crew in any fishing boat, the maximum length of mesh net, which they may together use, shall not exceed 900 fathoms
- The use of mesh or set nets having any meshes measuring less than one and three-quarter (12) inches shall be prohibited. STANLEY S. ARGYLE, Chief Secretary.

Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, State or Commonucath Treasury bonds or Government debentures, or references to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertuined as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application

The amount of the deposit required with each tender must be enclosed and the amount must be carefully written in and the designation stated, whether marked cheque, bank draft, or bank notes, as the case may be.

Security will be required, either in Victorian or Commonwealth Government debentures, Savings Bank deposit book, or bank deposit receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or eash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT,

- 1. Except where actual quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
- 2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.
- 3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of lifferent makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.
- 4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
- 5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
- 6. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office.
- 7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the goods.
- 8. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 8.
- 10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
- 11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods

objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

- 12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 8.
- 13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 15 and 16 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.
- 14. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted, as in Clause 8.
- 17. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.
- 18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

#### INTRODUCTORY.

1. All By-laws in force prior to the date of the coming into operation of these By-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.

2. These By laws shall come into operation on the date of the publication of the same in the Government Gazette.

3. In these By-laws the word "Contributor" shall have the same meaning as in the Act.

The words "The Act" shall mean the Hospitals and Charities Act 1922, or any amendment thereto.

4. The objects of the Geelong and District Hospital (Kitchener Memorial) shall be:—

- (a) To afford charitable relief, including maintenance and the treatment or cure of, or attention to, any disease or ailment, or any injury consequent on any acci-dent, medical and/or surgical attendance, medicine, nursing assistance, support or aid of any kind or in any form to such persons as are entitled thereto,
- under the Act.

  (b) To provide facilities for a Training School for Nurses. (c) To provide for carrying out investigation into allments, diseases, injuries or other matters affecting the human body.

5. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept by the Secretary, and shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument or writing except by order of the General Committee at a meeting at which seven members at least are present at the time

of making such order.

6. The incorporated institution shall consist of a President two Vice-Presidents, and the members of the Committee hereinafter referred to, Honorary Treasurer. Governors and Contributors.

7. (a) Any person who was a life governor or life contributor (or life subscriber) prior to the commencement of these By-laws shall continue to be such life governor or life

(b) Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on

contributor.

(b) Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital, irrespective of subscription, may be elected life governors or life contributors at any meeting of the General Committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all General Meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and two out-patients in every year.

(c) Any person who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to the institution at least Fifty pounds in one donation shall be entitled to be elected a life governor.

(d) Any person who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to the institution at least Twenty pounds in one donation shall be entitled to be elected a life contributor.

(e) Any person who at any time within the twelve months next preceding the date of any meeting or election or any other date in respect of which the question of his being a contributor arises has on his own behalf contributor arises has on his own behalf contributed to the institution at least. One pound in one donation or produces evidence to the Committee that he has on his own behalf contributed to the institution at least one pound in donations of a less amount shall be a contributor.

(f) Any person nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company or firm which at any time within the twelve months aforesaid has contributed to the institution at least One pound in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company or firm, shall he a contributor.

(g) Any person nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company or firm which at any time has contributed at least Twenty pounds to the institution in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company or firm which at any time has contributed at least Twenty pounds to the institution in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company or firm, shall be elected a life contributor.

(h) Any person nominated as a contributor by the employees of any corporation, company or firm, company or firm, company or firm, shall be

elected a life contributor.

(h) Any person nominated as a contributor by the employees of any corporation, company or firm, or employer who at any time have contributed at least Twenty pounds to the institution in one donation shall be entitled to be a life contributor, or who have at any time within the twelve months aforesaid contributed to the institution at least One pound, whether in one sum or in donations of a less amount. shall be a contributor shall be a contributor.

(i) Any person nominated as a contributor by the executors or trustees under any will who have allocated at least Twenty pounds to the institution in one donation out of any moneys of the testator not specifically directed to be paid to the institution under the will, shall be entitled to be elected a

8., Governors and contributors shall be entitled to the follow ing privileges:

- (a) Annual Contributors, one vote and one in and two out-patients annually.
- (b) Life Contributors, two votes and recommend one in and two out-patients annually.
- (c) Life Governors, three votes, and recommend four in-patients and eight out-patients annually.

9. Recommendations of patients shall be made by tickets as referred to in By-law S, and shall be used only for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance privately: the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the House Committee, and provided that the funds and accommodation of the institution admit of their reception.

funds and accommodation of the institution admit of their reception.

When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the contributor. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to contributors at the time of payment of contributions. Contributors shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients, and vice versa, one in-patient ticket being equivalent to two out-patients.

10. Every yearly contribution shall be paid in advance and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment.

of such payment.

11. On all occasions when a poll is taken. Life Governors shall have three votes: Life Contributors, two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 5s. and upwards, three votes; £3 3s., two votes; and £1, one vote.

#### MEETING OF CONTRIBUTORS.

12. All Annual Meetings of contributors shall be advertised by the Secretary at least twenty-one days, and all special meetings at least seven days before the day on which such meeting is to be held, in a newspaper circulating in Geelong.

13. The Annual General Meeting of Contributors shall be held on some day (except the last) during the month of August in every year, at such time and place as shall be determined by the General Committee, for the following nurnoses: purposes :-

- (a) To confirm the minutes of the previous Annual Meeting and special meetings, if any, no discussion being permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.
- (b) To receive the report of the General Committee and audited statements of receipts and expenditure, for the year, to the 30th June preceding.
- (c) For the election of President, two Vice-Presidents, Honorary Treasurer and Auditors for the ensuing year.
- (d) The election of members of the General Committee for the ensuing year in place of those retiring.
- (e) For the transaction of any business of which at least fourteen days' notice has been given.

14. On the day of the annual meeting of contributors, the President, two Vice-Presidents. Honorary Treasurer and one-third part of the number nearest to one-third part of the elected members of the General Committee shall retire from office, but may nevertheless be re-elected. The members of the General Committee who so retire shall be

- (a) All members temporarily appointed by the Committee under By-law 17 (a).
- (b) The Members who have been the longest in office without re-election.

15. Any contributor may be elected to any elective office

of the Institution.

16. No person shall be elected unless at least fourteen days before the day of the Annual General Meeting, there has been delivered to the Secretary a written nomination of such person. signed by at least two contributors thereto and also the writ-

signed by at least two contributors thereto and also the written consent of such person.

17. (a) In the event of any casual vacancy in the Committee the remaining members of the Committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor. Such contributor so appointed may continue to be a member of the Committee until immediately before the next annual meeting for the election of the Committee, when he shall retire therefrom as one of those persons who are required to go out of office.

(b) In the event of a casual vacancy in the office of President, Vice-president or of any elective officer, the Committee may temporarily appoint to such office some one of its members; and the person so appointed may continue in office until

may temporarily appoint to such office some one of its members; and the person so appointed may continue in office until the next annual meeting.

18. If required by the Committee, or upon the requisition in writing of seven members of the Committee, or of 25 contributors, the Secretary shall, as provided for in By-law number 12, convene a special meeting of contributors, the occasion for calling such meeting being stated in such requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, excepting that for which it shall have been summoned.

19. At all meetings of contributors, the President, or, in his absence, one of the Vice-presidents, shall take the chair, but in their absence, the meeting shall choose its own chairman. The presiding officer shall have a casting vote only.

20. If at any Annual or Special Meeting of the Contributors, 20. It at any Annual or Special Meeting of the Contributors, at least ten Contributors do not assemble and proceed to business within one hour from the time fixed for the meeting, no business shall be transacted at that meeting, but in such event there shall be another meeting of Contributors at the same place and the same hour of the same day in the following week, and at this meeting, any number of Contributors exceeding seven, shall constitute a meeting.

21. At all meetings of Contributors all questions, except 21. At all meetings of Contributors all questions, except questions involving contested elections, shall be decided by a show of hands, unless before or on the declaration of the result a ballot of contributors is demanded by seven Contributors, in which event, it shall be decided by a ballot. A declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has, on a show of hands been carried or otherwise, and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting, shall be conclusive evidence of the fact; provided however, that where at least seven Contributors so demand, any resolution confirming a Bv-law shall be decided by noll as hereinafter provided. By-law shall be decided by poll as hereinafter provided.

22. When a poll is duly demanded, the Chairman shall adjourn the meeting, to admit of the ballot being taken, to a day to be fixed by him, not more than 21 days, or less than fourteen days, after the day of the adjournment, notice of which shall be advertised in a paper circulating in Geelong, at least seven days before the day so fixed. At the meeting, each Contributor has one vote, but on ballot each to have the number of votes to which he is entitled under By-law No. 11.

23. At all elections or when a poll shall have been demanded as provided for in By-law number 22, the election or poll as the case may be, shall be conducted at the institution or at such other place as the General Committee may deem advisable, at least one clear day before the day appointed for declaring such election or poll.

Governors and Contributors shall be allowed to vote by post if living outside the three mile radius from the Geelong Post Office. Ballot papers with a special envelope on the inside of the flap of which the Governor or Contributor must sign his name shall be sent out by the Secretary seven clear days before the day of the election.

Subscribers within the three mile radius shall record their votes at the polling booth set aside for the purpose, or they may be allowed to vote by post on applying to the Secretary who will issue the necessary ballot papers and special envelope which must be signed on the inside of the flap by the Governor or Contributor.

All postal ballot papers must be in the hands of the returning officer at the close of the poll.

Governors and Contributors voting shall vote for the full number of candidates to be elected, otherwise the vote shall be declared informal.

24. The General Committee shall appoint from amongst the members a returning officer, who shall conduct the election, and he shall be empowered to appoint deputy returning officers, if such be considered advisable by him.

25. Each candidate may appoint a scrutineer for such election.

## MEETINGS OF GENERAL COMMITTEE.

26. The General Committee shall meet at the hospital for general business on the second Wednesday in each month at 3.30 p.m., or at such other time and place as the Commit-

at 3.30 p.m., or at such other time and place as the Committee may by resolution decide, and for special purposes at such time and place as may be necessary. Seven members of the General Committee shall form a quorum.

27. Notice of all meetings shall be sent to each member by the Secretary at least 24 hours before the time of meeting, stating any special business to be considered.

28. The Committee shall proceed to business as soon after the time notified as there is sufficient number of members present to form a quorum; but if at the expiry of 30 minutes from the time specified there is not a quorum present the meeting shall stand adjourned to such day as the members then present shall direct, not more than fourteen days from the day appointed for such meeting.

the day appointed for such meeting.

29. No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting have been confirmed, and the minutes of the House and Finance Committees since the previous regular meeting have been read for information, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

30. No resolution of the Committee shall be varied or re-

scinded until one month after such resolution has been passed, and then only by an absolute majority of the Committee.

## GENERAL COMMITTEE,

31. Subject to the provisions of Section 52 of the Act the General Committee shall consist of 21 Contributors, comprising the President, two Vice-Presidents and Honorary Treusurer ex-officio and seventeen elected members.

32. Any general meeting of Contributors called for the purpose may alter the number of the members of the General Committee, and every such alteration shall take effect immedi-

Committee, and every such alteration shall take effect immediately before the annual election of members of the Committee next following the making of the alteration.

33. The General Committee shall have power to appoint such sub-committees in addition to the House and Finance Committees as may be considered necessary.

34. The President and Vice-presidents shall be ex-officio members of all sub-committees, and the Treasurer shall be a member of the Finance Committee.

35. No paid officer of the institution shall be entitled to be elected to any elective office.

36. The maximum number of legally qualified Medical Prac-

36. The maximum number of legally qualified Medical Practitioners who may be members of such committee shall be one-fourth part of the members of the committee or the integral number nearest to such one-fourth part.

37. No person shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation or be concerned or participate in any wise in any contract with the General Committee or in the profit thereof, or of any work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such General Committee, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership or association, consisting of more than twenty members when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association, nor to any person by reason of his being interested in any public journal publishing advertisements.

by reason of his being interested in any public journal publishing advertisements.

But no members of the General Committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the General Committee in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

38. The General Committee shall control the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all officials and distribution for funds, regulations for the management of the hospital, present a report to the annual meetings, and servants, frame rules and/or regulations for the management of the hospital, present a report to the annual meetings, and manage the affairs of the institution generally. 39. All accounts for payment shall be passed by the General Committee and the list signed at the meeting by the Chairman.

#### House Committee.

40. The General Committee shall, at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of Contributors, appoint from amongst themselves a House Committee of five members—three to form a quorum. The House Committee shall elect its own Chairman at its first meeting.

41. The House Committee shall meet once at least in each week and often if precess and the little and often in section.

A1. The House Committee shall meet once at least in each week, and oftener if necessary, and shall have power to admit patients and to confirm or otherwise, the admission of any cases received during the intervals between meetings; they shall inquire into all complaints, and be empowered to dismiss patients for misconduct or breach of the rules of the institution, recording in the minutes the reasons for the non-admission or for dismissal. The House Committee may suspend any officer of the institution, pending inquiry by the General Committee; it may engage and discharge nurses, trainees and servants, order necessary supplies, call for and inspect the half-yearly or yearly tenders, and recommend any to the General Committee for acceptance; it shall inspect all books connected with the admission and discharge of patients, receipt and issue of stores, medicines, medical instruments, furniture, bedding, and supplies generally.

Some of its members shall weekly inspect the wards, kitchen and other portions of the institution; it shall check the tradesmen's monthly bills, and other accounts for supplies, and recommend the same to the Finance Committee for payment; and generally shall supervise and regulate the interval management of the institution, under the direction of the General Committee.

#### General Committee. FINANCE.

42. A Finance Committee consisting of the Treasurer and four other members shall be elected annually by and from the General Committee, at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of Contributors. The Finance Committee shall elect its own chairman at its first meeting and three members shall form a quorum.

form a quorum.

43. The Finance Committee shall meet at least once in each month and shall examine the Secretary's cash and other books of account, and compare same with bank pass book: it shall also compare the Collector's books and receipt butts with list of contributions and donations; check additions and see that the totals correspond with each other and with the amounts acknowledged by the Treasurer; it shall give all needful instructions to the Secretary and Collector, with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of contributions and donations, and shall monthly prepare an abstract of all accounts for payment, and submit the same to the General Committee at the monthly meetings, and shall, in conjunction with the President or a Vice-Fresident and Secretary be empowered to make necessary special payments In conjunction with the President of a vice-fresident and Secretary be empowered to make necessary special payments in the intervals between the monthly meetings; it shall see that the vouchers connected with the previous abstract have been properly receipted, and shall also examine the returns prepared for Government, and annual statements of accounts.

44. In all cases where books and vouchers are checked by the House or Finance Committees, the signature of some member thereof shall be appended with the date of examina-

45. The Secretary shall receive all moneys on account of the institution. and issue the official receipt forthwith. Such moneys to be deposited without delay to the credit of the institution in such bank as the General Committee may from

time to time determine.

46. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the President or a Vice-President, the Treasurer and countersigned by the Secretary.

47. Previous to signing any cheques for payment, the Treasurer shall require a warrant signed by the President or Chairman of the meeting of the General Committee, at which the accounts were passed, and countersigned by the Secretary: special payments may nevertheless be made during the month in accordance with By-law No. 43, such special payments to be

included in the next warrant passed by the Committee.

48. If any vacancy shall occur in the office of Treasurer, the General Committee may appoint another to hold office

until the next annual meeting.

49. Two Auditors, shall be elected at the Annual Meeting each year, and remuneration to be paid to them, if any, shall be then fixed.

be then fixed.

In default of such appointment, the General Committee shall make the appointment and in the event of any vacancy occurring, the General Committee shall fill same.

50. The Auditors shall have access to the books and accounts of the institution at all times, and shall if they consider it necessary, report to the General Committee.

51. The Auditors shall, during July in each year, examine the Treasurer's Annual Financial Statement, with all books, accounts and documents relating thereto, and List of Contributions and Donations and shall verify to their correctness, and make any special report thereon, which they consider and make any special report thereon, which they consider necessary, to the Annual Meeting.

#### SUPERINTENDENT AND SECRETARY.

52. The Superintendent and Secretary shall be the chief executive officer of the Institution, and he shall be responsible

executive officer of the Institution, and he shall be responsible for the due observance by the co-operate body of the provisions of the Act in force for the time being relating to hospitals; regulations under the Act; conditions of grant; and all other regulations that may from time to time be issued.

He shall attend all General and Special Meetings of Contributors, all meetings of the General and other committees; take minutes of the proceedings; and shall transcribe them into books to be kept for that purpose; he shall keep the records of the institution, conduct all correspondence; call all meetings, giving proper notice thereof; and carry out the directions given to him by any of the Committees.

53. He shall be responsible for the conduct of all clerical business, and shall keep the necessary books of accounts, under the direction of the Pinance Committee.

54. He shall compile all necessary returns, statements and reports required by the Government, and by any of the Committees.

Committees

committees.

55. He shall devote his time exclusively to the service of the hospital; and, under the direction of the General Committee he shall, as Superintendent, be responsible for the proper government and due observance of all By-laws and Regulations of the Institution; he shall comply with the regulations which may from time to time be made, with respect to the discharge of the duties of his office.

56. He shall enter into a guarantee for the sum of £250 in some Guarantee Company approved of by the General Committee. The General Committee shall be responsible for the payment of the premium on such guarantee.

57. He shall have the power to suspend any member of the Nursing Staff after consultation with the Senior Resident Medical Officer and the Matron. He shall have the power to suspend or dismiss any other employee, and if necessary appoint a temporary substitute. Any such suspension or dismissal shall be reported to the House Committee, at its next meeting.

next meeting.

58. He shall also hold the position of house steward, and shall order, receive, examine, take charge of, and distribute all articles supplied, and be responsible for the cleanliness and good order of the buildings and grounds.

## COLLECTOR.

59. The Collector shall, under the direction of the Secretary and Finance Committee, canvass for subscriptions and donations to the funds of the institution, and shall not engage in any private business. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt in a book which shall be provided for that purpose by the Committée. He shall furnish to Contributors from whom he receives contributions of £1 and upwards, the necessary he receives contributions of \$1\$ and upwards, the necessary admission tickets. He shall enter all subscriptions received by him in a book specifying dates of receipt, and once at least in every week, he shall copy all entries in a duplicate book to be kept at the institution. He shall pay to the Secretary once in every week, and oftener if the receipts exceed £20, all moneys received by him, and shall furnish

to the Secretary a list of contributions so paid, and shall

to the Secretary a list of contributions so paid, and shall obtain the Secretary's receipt in his book for such payments. 60. The books used by the Collector shall be provided by the Committee, and shall be deemed to be the property of the institution, and the Collector shall at any time, upon demand, deliver up to the Secretary, his books and butts, for examination or retention. He shall, when required, be in attendance at the meetings of the Finance Committee, and shall act in the discharge of his duties under their instructions. He shall give as a security for the faithful discharge of his duties, the sum of £150 in some Guarantee Company, to be approved of and paid by the General Committee.

#### HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

61. The Honorary Medical Staff shall consist of duly qualified medical practitioners as follows:—

Six In-patient Medical Officers, viz.:-Three Physicians

and three Surgeons corresponding to each other.

Three Out-patient Medical Officers—each one corresponding to an In-patient Physician and an In-patient Surgeon, and act as anesthetists to such.

One Eye, Ear. Nose and Throat Specialist.

One, Radiologist.

The General Committee shall have power at any time to increase such staff.

62. The Honorary Medical Staff shall be elected by the General Committee after receiving the report of the Advisory

General Committee after receiving the report of the Advisory Board.

63. The Advisory Board shall consist of seven members; four, one of whom shall be the President, being chosen by the General Committee from amongst its members, but excluding committeemen practising as medical practitioners; two shall be chosen by the members of the Honorary Medical Staff from amongst themselves, and one by the Geelong Branch of the British Medical Association.

The members of the Advisory Board shall be chosen in the month of September of each year, and shall hold office until their successors shall have been elected. Any casual vacancy may be filled for the remainder of the annual term from the body amongst whose representatives the vacancy has occurred. Four members to form a quorum. The President, who

the body amongst whose representatives the vacancy has occurred. Four members to form a quorum. The President, who shall be chairman, shall have a deliberative vote, and, if necessary, a casting vote.

64. Should any of the appointments to the Advisory Board not be made by the Honorary Medical Staff, or the Geelong Branch of the British Medical Association, within four weeks of the vacancy occurring, the General Committee shall have power to fill such position or positions from amongst its own manulons.

65. The Advisory Board shall meet within four weeks of 65. The Advisory Board shall meet within rour weeks or its appointment, and as often as convened by the President, in order to make arrangements for a report to be submitted to the General Committee, on applications for positions on the Honorary Medical Staff, and on the applications for the positions of resident medical officers.

66. Within four weeks after these By-laws come into operations the Advisory Reard as appraised for in By-law 63, shall the staff of the positions of the staff of the positions of the staff of the positions of the staff of the staf

66. Within four weeks after these By-laws come into operation, the Advisory Board as arranged for in By-law 63, shall be appointed: the positions of the Honorary Medical Staff be declared vacant on a date to be fixed by the General Committee, and the Honorary Medical Staff appointments be made in accordance with the By-laws.

67. The first three in-patient physicians and three inpatient surgeons and out-patient medical officers elected under these By-laws shall hold office for a period of one, two, and three years respectively, and shall be eligible for re-election. The order of retirement shall be determined by lot immediately after the first election. Thereafter all in-patient medical officers except those appointed to casual vacancies, shall be elected for a period of three years: in the case of a casual vacancy the method of election shall be as already provided for and the Medical Officers so appointed shall hold office for the unexpired portion of the term of the Medical Officer to whose position he has been elected, but shall be eligible for re-election. for re-election.

of the Honorary Medical Staff neglect to perform or fulfil his duties satisfactorily, the General Committee after having referred such matter to, and having received a report thereon from the Advisory Board, shall have the power to remove such medical officer, and appoint a substitute for the unexpired portion of his term.

69. Each corresponding in-patient physician and surgeon shall take a receiving week in rotation, and during this week, shall attend the institution daily before 12 noon, and when called on urgently. The receiving Honorary Medical Officers shall be accompanied by the Resident Medical Officer on his daily rounds: the remaining in-patient Honorary Medical Officers shall attend the institution to visit their patients twice every week and oftener if necessary. Each Honorary Medical Officer shall give the necessary attention to, and instructions regarding the patients under his care, and shall record in a book kept for the purpose, the date and hour of each visit; he shall also see that the necessary history sheets and records concerning his patients are properly kept. concerning his patients are properly kept.

70. Every Honorary Medical Officer on the staff shall vacate such office, and be ineligible for re-appointment on attaining the age of 60 years.

71. The General Committee may appoint as consulting Medical Officer any Medical Officer who has served as an Honorary Medical Officer to the institution, for a period of ten years, and has ceased to hold such office.

72. The consulting Medical Officer shall only attend the hospital in consultation with, and at the request of the Medical Officer in charge of the case.

73. All appointments on the Honorary Medical Staff except those first appointed under By-law 66, shall commence from 1st January in each year.

The members of the Honorary Medical Staff shall meet at the institution on the first Friday in every month, and oftener if necessary, to consider matters which may be referred to them by the Superintendent or which may arise the course of their professional duties at the institution.

They shall appoint their own chairman, who shall have a deliberative vote and, if necessary, a casting vote; and the Superintendent shall act as secretary.

Minutes of the proceedings shall be kept by the Sccretary and any necessary reports made through him to the House or General Committees.

74. The Honorary Medical Staff shall in all respects, com-

ply with the By-laws and regulations of the institution.

Each Honorary Out-patient Medical Officer shall carry out the duties of his corresponding In-patient Physician and Surgeon in their absence, and shall have allotted to him one surgical and one medical bed.

#### RESIDENT MEDICAL STAFF.

75. The Resident Medical Staff shall consist of one Senior 75. The Resident Medical Stati shall consist of one Senior Resident Medical Officer and one Junior Resident Medical Officer, but such staff may be varied from time to time by the General Committee when deemed necessary.

76. The appointment of each shall be for a period of twelve months, or such other period as the General Committee may determine.

determine.
77. The General Committee shall reserve the right to terminate the appointment, on giving four weeks' notice of in-

tention to do so.

78. The appointment of Resident Medical Officers shall be made by the General Committee, after receiving a report on the applicants from the Advisory Board.

#### SENIOR RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

79. The Senior Resident Medical Officer shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner who shall not engage in private practice, but shall devote his whole time and attention to the duties of his office.

80. He shall attend to the surgical patients and visit each

80. He shall attend to the surgical patients and visit each one of them every morning before twelve noon and evening not later than 10.30 p.m., and keep such books and records as may be required by the House Committee.

81. He shall be responsible, under the Honorary Medical Officers, for the carrying out of such instructions as are given in regard to the treatment of cases, and shall at once report to the Honorary Medical Officer in charge of a case any special circumstances or conditions which may arise and act to the best of his judgment pending the attendance of the Honorary Medical Officer.

82. He shall attend all accident cases and other urgent cases without delay, and, if necessary, report same to the Honorary Surgeon or Physician receiving for that week.

83. He shall at once report in writing to the Superintendent. any misconduct or neglect of duty which may come to his knowledge, and if such complaint be not attended to, he shall report the same in writing to the House Committee at their next meeting.

report the same in writing to the House Committee at their next meeting.

84. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments and apparatus issued throughout the institution and shall submit an inventory of same to the House Committee, through the Superintendent, at least once a quarter.

85. He shall from time to time requisition to the House Committee for such surgical instruments and apparatus as may be required; such requisition to be countersigned by an Harceton Language.

Committee for such surgical instruments and apparatus away be required; such requisition to be countersigned by an Honorary In-patient Surgeon.

S6. He shall not conduct or allow any post-mortem examination without first notifying the Superintendent, and obtaining the written authority of the Honorary Medical Officer who attended the deceased, or of the House Committee (unless directed by the Coroner); but in the event of such Honorary Medical Officer requiring such examination, the whole of the Honorary Medical Staff shall be notified of the time of same. A post mortem may only be carried out providing no objection has been lodged by a responsible relative within 12 hours of death, or by the patient to a responsible officer of the institution prior to his death.

S7. He shall be responsible for all matters connected with the care of the patients and the sanitary arrangements of the hospital; he shall attend to out-patients in the absence of the Honorary Medical Officer, and he shall make such arrangements as will ensure that he and the Junior Resident Medical Officer are not absent from the institution at the same time.
