ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1927.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Urban District of Alexandra Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Twenty pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings in the £1 of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Twenty pounds sterling annual valuation, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two pounds sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said District in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation by such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within a mile thereof, Six shillings and threepence per annum.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1927, shall be as follows:—

- (a) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.
- (b) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessable rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) If other than domestic purposes solely, 30,000 gallons per half year.

Water supplied to the Government departments, police station, court house, churches, post-office, State School, show-grounds, shire hall, bowling green, saleyards, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to carriers and livery stables by the Trust the charge shall be Seven shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box. In open sheds used for stabling each space of five feet shall be used as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1927. Such rates shall be paid by equal moieties half yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the first day of July of such year, and such charges shall be payable on the 1st day of July and on the 31st day of December of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

All water troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball-taps to prevent overflow.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1ST JANUARY TO 31ST DECEMBER, 1927.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Apollo Bay Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-law No. 2.

The following are the rates and charges which occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year ending 31st December, 1927, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house and tenement up to £16 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £2 10s. (Two pounds ten shillings) per annum.
2. For every house and tenement of £17 annual municipal value and upwards, the amount of Three shillings in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.
3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing from the first day of July, shall be charged two-thirds rates.
4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and upwards, the amount of Three shillings in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Five pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Fifteen shillings sterling per annum.
6. Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs and to Government departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show-grounds, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement at 1s. 6d. (One shilling and sixpence) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 15,000 gallons.
7. For supply during the erection of new buildings there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
8. Except as hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rates which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.
9. The fees to be paid for plumber's licences shall be £1; renewals, 5s.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance and the first payment to be made on 1st January, 1927, for the year ending 31st December, 1927.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Apollo Bay Waterworks Trust from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Apollo Bay Waterworks Trust.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if in the absence of a contract, on the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be made by measurement. Minimum charge, One pound.

The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1927, and shall be due and payable on the first day of July, 1927. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect rates and charges hereby made.

ORDER IN COUNCIL PROHIBITING THE KEEPING, GRAZING, OR MILKING OF COWS WITHIN CERTAIN SPECIFIED AREAS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

WHEREAS by section 31, sub-section (a), of the *Dairy Supervision Act 1915*, the Governor in Council is empowered, on the application of the Council of any municipal district, whether wholly or partly within a Milk Area or not, if approved by the Minister, to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows on any part or parts or in any part of such area or district: And whereas the Council of the municipal district of the City of Williamstown has applied to the Governor in Council to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows in the following specified areas of such municipality:—

Commencing at the junction of the northern and western boundaries of the city; thence southerly along the western boundary to Junction-street; thence easterly along Junction-street to William-street; thence southerly along William-street to Mason-street; thence westerly along Mason-street to the western boundary; thence continuing along the western, southern, and eastern boundaries and The Strand to the intersection of The Strand with North-road; thence westerly along the south side of North-road to Rupert-street; thence northerly along Rupert-street to Collingwood-street; thence easterly along Collingwood-street to Douglas-parade; thence northerly along Douglas-parade to Burleigh-street; thence westerly along Burleigh-street to Hall-street; thence northerly along Hall-street to Hudson-road; thence easterly along Hudson-road to the River Yarra; thence along the River Yarra and the northern boundary of the city to commencing point.

And whereas the Minister administering for the time being the *Dairy Supervision Act 1915* has approved of such application to prohibit as aforesaid: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this Order prohibit any person on and after the 1st day of July, 1927, keeping, grazing, or milking cows on any part or parts or in any part of such specified areas of the municipal district of the City of Williamstown, in the State of Victoria aforesaid.

And the Honorable Murray William James Bouchier, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary direction herein accordingly.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924* (No. 3378), doth by this Order prescribe a further route within the metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the *Motor Omnibus Act* may ply for hire, also sections and terminal points and stopping places on such route, time-tables to be observed by owners of motor omnibuses plying for hire, fares to be charged, and the maximum number of motor omnibuses which may be licensed to ply for hire on such prescribed route, as set forth in detail in the Schedule hereunder:—

Stopping Places on Route.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

His Excellency, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 4 (1) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1925* (No. 3439), doth by this Order prescribe the above route a developmental route.

His Excellency doth by this Order further provide, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 11 (1) (b) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924* (No. 3378), that the Order in Council approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 21st December, 1926, prescribing routes within the metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the said Act may ply for hire, shall be amended in the manner following:—

Route No. 4.—Under the heading "Maximum number of Motor Omnibuses to be licensed on Route," for the figure "9" there shall be substituted the figure "8".

Route No. 8A.—Under the heading "Maximum number of Motor Omnibuses to be licensed on Route," for the figure "7" there shall be substituted the figure "6".

Pursuant to the provisions of section 11 (1) (c) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924*, No. 3378, the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the Licensing Authority full power and authority for carrying into effect by the said Licensing Authority all of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR PUBLIC PARK IN THE TOWN (NOW CITY) OF NORTHCOTE, AND KNOWN AS "NORTHCOTE PARK."

THE Council of the City of Northcote, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserves for Public Park in the Town (now City) of Northcote, and known as "Northcote Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates of the Reserves, or cut or in any way remove or damage any of such fences or gates or any of the buildings or seats in the Reserves, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any such fences, gates, buildings or seats, or roll or throw stones or missiles, or remove any soil, or enter any plots which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees, shrubs, or plants, or commit any nuisance in the Reserves, or destroy any property or thing in the Reserves.

2. No person shall throw or deposit any filth, rubbish, or refuse, or cause any filth, rubbish, or refuse to fall or to be thrown or deposited in the Reserves.

3. No person shall throw, distribute, deposit, or cause to be thrown, deposited, or distributed upon the Reserves any handbill or any other printed matter.

4. No person shall throw or discharge in the Reserves any missile to the damage, danger, or annoyance of any person.

5. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the Reserves.

6. No person in the Reserves shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency, or offend against decency in dress, language, or conduct.

7. Persons using the Reserves for any purpose shall, prior to leaving the ground, collect or remove, or cause to be removed or collected, all waste material, scraps, or litter of any kind brought or made by them.

8. No person shall ride a bicycle or tricycle in or through the Reserves, and no motor car or any delivery cart, or any vehicle shall enter or pass over or through the Reserves.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord.

10. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserves except as provided in clause 9, and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in the Reserves shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation to be recovered before any justice for any damage done.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserves, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserves.

12. No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserves, or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any servant or a person acting under the authority of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.

13. No person shall remain when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the Reserves.

14. No person shall put in the Reserves any cattle, sheep, or any other animals.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserves, nor erect in the Reserves any tent, booth, building, stand or any other structure.

16. No person shall sell or hawk in the Reserves anything of any description or offer the same for sale therein.

17. No person shall assemble in the Reserves for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meeting of a like character, without the consent of the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall play any musical instrument or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserves without the consent of the Committee of Management.

19. No person shall play or practise cricket or football or any other game, or engage in any sport in the Reserves.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
