NORTHERN RHODESIA DECLARED A RECIPROCATING STATE WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE JUDGMENTS (RECIPROCITY) ACTS.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.,

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of Northern Rhodesia (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth of Australia) for the enforcement within such part of judgments as defined by section 2 of the Supreme Court Act 1923 so far as the same relate to Victorian Judgment Orders and Awards do now under the powers conferred by section 3 of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Act 1925, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, declare Northern Rhodesia to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Acts, and that the said Acts shall extend and apply to all parts of Northern Rhodesia.

FEDERATED MALAY STATES DECLARED A RECIPRO-CATING STATE WITHIN THE MEANING OF ACT No. 3397.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth, of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of the Federated Malay States (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the Imperial Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1920 extends) for the enforcement within such part of Maintenance Orders made by Courts within Victoria, do now, under the powers conferred by section 12 of an Act of the Victorian Parliament intituled the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1925, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare the Federated Malay States to be a reciprocating State within the meaning and for the purpose of the Act last referred to.

That.on and after the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, the pilotage rate from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, for steamships or ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power up to 5,000 tons of the vessel's burthen, shall be One penny and thirteen-sixteenths of a penny (1 13-16d.) per ton calculated on the vessel's net registered tonnage, and for every additional ton, One penny (1d.), subject in any case to a minimum charge of Two pounds ten shillings (£2-10s.).
- 2. The provisions of these presents shall take effect on and from the ninth day of April, 1927.

- 6. The owner of any tenement or property permitting or allowing any person to carry away water, excepting for the use of the tenement or property belonging thereto, will be liable to have the water cut off.

On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Seventeen shillings shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Seventeen shillings be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid.

6. Every consumer of water must provide meters; all excess water over allotment covered by the valuation rate to be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per I,000 gallons.

The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1927.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per one thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st day of December. 1927, and the rates shall be payable in advance on 1st day of January, 1927.

7. Such person or persons as the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS OF THE SWAN HILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Swan Hill Water-works Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been preclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by the said Water Acts, make the following Regulations for the maintenance and management of the said waterworks:—

- 1. Water supplied from the stand-pipes shall be charged for at the rate of Twopence per 100 gallons.
- 2. Except where otherwise permitted by the Trust, all water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall be lined with metal so as to be water-tight, and shall be fitted with proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. Should any trough or fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.
- 3. On all buildings in the course of erection where water is used for building purposes the following rates shall be charged for temporary supply:—

For brickwork, concrete, stonework, or plastering in the course of erection where water is used, 10s. on the first £500 on the contract and 1s. for every £100 additional.

For wooden buildings, the rate to be a minimum charge of 5s. on a building having one chimney, and 2s. 6d. for every additional chimney up to the maximum of 15s.

In cases where the cost of the building is not deternined the Trust may fix the charge to be made.

- 4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take or carry away from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 5. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- All service-pipes and fittings must be provided by the persons requiring such service, and must be of galvanized wrought iron of the best quality and approved of by the Trust.
- 7. Save where permission has been granted by the Trust, one service-pipe only for the supply of water for each tenement will be allowed, and the maximum size of such pipe shall be 4-inch bore, except by special consent of the Trust.
- 8. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall unlawfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, engine, or other work the property of the Trust, shall for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 9. All service-pipes laid along or across any public street, road, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic, shall be laid not less than twenty-four inches below the surface of the ground. All service-pipes shall have gate valves twelve inches from the building line and a ferrule cock fixed at the main.
- 10 Any person requiring to lay any service or other pips to communicate or connect with or tap the pipes or mains of the Trust, or to communicate or connect with or tap any service-pipe connected therewith, shall give at least two days' notice in writing to the Sceretary of the Trust of any such requirement, and any such communication, connexion, or tapping, if approved of by the Trust, shall be made by an officer of the Trust, or, if the Trust shall permit in writing, by a person licensed as hereinafter provided under the superintendence and according to the direction of the proper officer of the Trust. In all cases the person requiring such communication, connexion, or tapping, shall pay in advance to the Trust the expenses of such communication, connexion, or tapping, including the costs of the stop-cock and ferrulo for 4-inch pipe.
- 11. Any person, whether licensed (as hereinafter provided) or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with or tap the pipes or mains of the Trust or any service-pipe connected therewith without giving two days' notice of his requirement to the Secretary of the Trust, or who shall make any such communication or tapping without first obtaining the permission of the Trust in writing, or who shall make any such communication or tapping except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 12. Any person licensed (as hereinafter provided) or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipes or mains of the Trust without the permission of the Trust in writing first obtained, or who shall lay down or fix any pipe, valve, or other fitting to communicate or connect with the pipes of the Trust of a size, strength, or material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each oftence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust,

- 13. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipes, valve, cock, or fittings of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connecting with the pipes of the Trust, he must obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipes, valves, cock, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 14. Such licence shall be for one year only, but may be renewed from time to time as the Trust may deem fit. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be the sole judge.
- 15. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is fully competent to exercise such works covered by such licence, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the Regulations of the Trust relating to water supply and with the Water Acts so far as they apply to town supplies. The Trust may if it so sees fit refuse to grant such licence. For each licence and renewal thereof the licensee shall pay the sum of One pound.
- 16. Each licensed plumber must report to the secretary of the Trust the completion of any new work or extension or repair in connexion with any service within twenty-four hours of effecting the same.
- 17. No extension of private services will be allowed except by the consent of the Trust, and any person making extensions without such consent shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Pive pounds.
- 18. Any person who shall waste or misuse, or permit, suffer, or allow to be wasted or misused, any water supplied to him by the Trust, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and a further penalty of Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after notice from the Trust.
- 19. If any person supplied with water by the Trust causes or suffers any pipe, valve, tap, cock, cistern, or other fitting, apparatus, or receptacle to be out of repair, or to be so used or contrived so that the water supplied to him by the Trust is or is likely to be wasted, misused, or unduly consumed, he shall for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 20. Every person supplied with water by the Trust shall keep his service-pipes and fittings, meters, and other apparatus in good repair, and shall be responsible for any loss of water or damage which may be caused by reason of any such service-pipe, fitting, meter, or other apparatus being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken.

  21. The owner or occupier of any tenement supplied with water by the Trust shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipes, fittings, meter, or apparatus requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair same, and in default of such repairs being effected he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice from the Trust that such service-pipe, fitting, meter, or apparatus requires repairing, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust seems fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected, or the Trust may by its employees enter on the premises whereon repairs may be required, and repair or replace or refit and cleanse such of the pipes, fittings, meter, or apparatus as may require to be repaired, replaced, refitted, or cleansed, and the costs, charges, and expenses of so doing shall be paid by the owner or occupier of such premises, and in depault of payment, in addition to any penalties incurred, the Trust may recover the amount of such costs, charges, and expenses in any Court of competent jurisdiction as money paid for the owner or occupier, as the case may be, and in such proceedings the Trust may proceed against the owner or occupier individually or as co-defendants.
- pier individually or as co-defendants.

  22. The Trust may by notice intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises using water for domestic or other than domestic purposes that the water supply is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within seven days from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner shall within the time specified, at his own cost and expense, provide such a meter, and if any person neglects to comply with such notice and provide such meter, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The Trust may, in the event of any person neglecting to comply with such notice, or neglecting to provide such meter in the time stated, cut off the supply of water to such premises, and may discontinue the supply until such meter is provided, and such cutting off or cessation of the water supply as aforesaid shall not relieve any person of his liability to pay water rates during such period of cessation of supply.

22. All meters shall be affixed by the proper officer of the

water rates during such period of cessation of supply.

23. All meters shall be affixed by the proper officer of the Trust, and at the cost and expense of the owner or occupier of the premises affected, and such owner or occupier shall maintain and keep any such meter in good repair and condition. All such meters shall be affixed in such position as the Trust by its proper officers shall determine.

24. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is supplied by measure shall be the quantity the charge for which at Eightpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for such premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

25. No meter shall be affixed until it has been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Trust, and if any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall, during the time such meter is out of order or undergoing repairs, estimate and charge the water consumed by taking it as equal to the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

26. No person shall use or permit to be used, or allow or permit to run on any premises the water supplied by the Trust for other than strictly domestic purposes between the hours of 9 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m., and any person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence. Domestic purposes under these Regulations shall not include hosing down or washing horses, motor cars or other vehicles, or the watering of gardens or lawns.

27. Where the Trust supplies water to buildings, tanks, or other places, or to any tenement or premises not valued for municipal rating, the Trust may make such a charge for water so supplied as it may deem reasonable.

28. The minimum annual charge for water supplied shall be One pound.

29. Any person using water supplied by the Trust for irrigation purposes or for the purpose of growing vegetables, lucerne, or other crop or grasses, may be directed by the Trust to install a meter.

30. Where the water supplied by the Trust is used to water trees or gardens which (including all buildings and erections) exceed a quarter of an acre, the Trust may make an extra charge for such excess at the rate of Five shillings per annum for each sixteenth of an acre or part thereof.

31. The Trust may by its officers or servants enter upon any land or tenements at any reasonable time for the purpose of inspecting or repairing any pipe or fittings thereon, or to ascertain if there be a waste of water, and any person who shall wilfully obstruct or interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. pounds.

32. The water supplied by the Trust in the above Waterworks District shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, and should any person so supplied not pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or do or cause or permit to be done anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fail to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done, or allow any water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, and may cense to supply such premises or such person with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

33. In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, company, or firm, whether aggregate or sole. The expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Trust, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust.

34. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing addressed to the secretary of the Trust and delivered to his office at such length of time as is mentioned in the By-law, and in no case less than two days' notice prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified.

35. Any person guilty of an offence against these Regulations not otherwise specifically provided for shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, in addition to being liable to make good any damage or loss sustained by the Trust.

W HEREAS by section 12 of the Realfulding Inspection Act
1922 (No. 3269), it is enacted that the Governor in
Council may make Regulations resoluting one adding varying,
or adding to the Regulations in the Schorble to the said Act,
and prescribing penalties of not more than 'rea pounds for
any breach of any Regulations as so amended, varied, or added
to: And whereas His Excellency the Governor in Council,
being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that additional
Regulations should be made to give effect to the objects of
the said Act, doth by this Order make the following additional
Regulations (that is to say):—

LIGHT DUTY SWINGING SCAFFOLDING REGULATIONS:

LIGHT DUTY SWINGING SCAPFOLDING REGULATIONS.
The following Regulations shall apply to the use of Light Duty Swinging Scaffolding:— Use.

The use of the light duty swinging scaffolding shall be permissible only where, in the opinion of the inspector, such scaffolding and the framework or building on which it is to be used are suitable for the work contemplated. Permission by the inspector to use this type of scaffolding in no way relieves the builder of any responsibility.

With the exception of overhead construction and attachments to outriggers and of wire cables where the factor of safety shall be at least five (5), each part of the light duty swinging scaffolding shall be of sufficient strength to sustain without failure at least three (3) times the stress induced in that part by the maximum load proposed to be used on the scaffold.

by the maximum load proposed to be used on the scaffold.

Outriggers.

For the installation of "L" hook. Each outrigger shall consist of two oregon planks, each not less than 6 inches x 2 inches, of a minimum length of 16 feet; they shall be fixed and loaded with a counter weight to the approval of the inspector. At all times when walls or parapets are less than 9 inches thick, and whenever considered necessary by the inspector when walls or parapets are not less than 9 inches thick, each outrigger shall be placed centrally on a plank 9 inches x 2 inches and 5 feet long, perpendicular to which shall be secured by three (3) 4-in. bolts a 6-in. x 2-in. plank to form an "L" section 9 inches x 8 inches. The vertical leg of the "L" is to bear against the side of the parapet or wall remote from the wire cables supporting the scaffolding.

A suitably shaped packing piece shall be inserted between the outriggers and the plank resting on top of the wall or parapet.

A shitting shaped may be consisted to outriggers and the plank resting on top of the wall or parapet.

The "L" hook shall be belded to outriggers by at least one (1) § in. bolt. and shall be held in position by a flexible steel wire at least § in. diameter, which shall in turn be bound to approval to the balance weight.

The steel flexible wire shall be lashed at intervals of not less than 3 feet by approved lashing rope to the outrigger.

The balance weights shall consist of sand or other approved material contained in jute bags fastened to approval to both the steel flexible wire rope and extreme inner end of outrigger.

The "L" hook shall consist of a wrought-iron or mild steel solid forging of approved design, and shall have a cross section of dimensions not less than 2; inches x § inch. Each end of the book shall be turned to form a complete eye. To the eye resting on top of the outrigger shall be attached the steel wire rope passing round the balance weight. The other eye of the "L" hook shall be attached by means of an improved shackle and bolts to the vertical steel wire rope supporting the machine.

Outriggers shall be spaced not more than 13 ft. 6 in. apart. and shall not project more than 2 feet from the point of support. Additional provision for chocks or chafing pieces shall be made as determined by the inspector.

Shackles

Shackles shall consist of wrought-iron or mild steel not less than 14 inches x 3 inch in cross section, and shall be of approved design. Not less than 3 inch of metal shall be provided between side of shackle and nearest edge of bolt hole, nor less than 3 inch of metal between the top or bottom of shackle and nearest edge of bolt hole.

Top and bottom bolts shall be not less than 3 inch diameter.

Only flexible steel wire cables shall be used on the scaffolding, and shall have a breaking strength of not less than five (5) times the load to be put on them, and shall be at least 3-in, diameter of a brand approved by the inspector, and no cable shall be of a greater length than 100 feet. All spliced eyes shall be round thimbles and have not less than three full tucks.

All wire cables shall be kept in good condition and examined by the builder once every fourteen days.

When any cable shows signs of bunching, stranding, excessive wear, or breaking, it shall be at once discarded.

All wire cables shall be secured to winch drums and shackles to the satisfaction of the inspector.

Stirrups.

Stirrups shall be composed of wrought-iron or mild steel forgings with minimum dimensions of 1½ inches x ½ inch, bent to approved shape, to support side or longitudinal timbers carrying platform and secured to machine supports by two bolts, each not less than ½-in. diameter, spaced and secured to approval of inspector. All forgings to be solid; no welding of any description will be allowed.

Platform shall be in one length, not exceeding 19 ft. 6 in in length, and shall consist of side timbers composed of not less than 4 inches x 2 inches oregon. The width of the platform shall not exceed 2 ft. 4 in. overall. The side timbers shall be secured with rungs at least 12 inches diameter, spaced 18 inches apart centre to centre; also with ties of wroughtiron not less than 3-in. diameter secured to approval by means of washers and nuts.

After nuts have been tightened up. ends of ties shall be burred so that nuts cannot be removed.

Ties shall be placed at both ends, and at least four other places between evenly spaced. The recess in side timbers for housing the rungs shall not extend more than 3 inch on either side of centre line of side timbers.

The platform shall consist of four planks of oregon, to be each not less than 6 inches x 3 inch, in single pieces of full length of platform to rest on rungs and secured thereto to approval of the inspector.

The platform shall be secured to the stirrups to the approval of the inspector, and shall not project more than 3 feet.

inspector.

Machines shall be placed vertically below outriggers, and shall be spaced not more than 13 ft. 6 in. apart.

All pawls shall be provided with efficient locks to prevent pawls inadvertently getting out of engagement. All handles shall be kept in position with nuts, proper pins, or collars. Faces of ratchets, clutches, gear locks, and collars shall be kept square. Wheels and pinions shall be kept in good condition, properly keyed up, and in correct gear relation. Wheels, worn gears, and pinions with broken teeth shall be immediately discarded and replaced; pegs of dovetailed teeth shall not be allowed.

Efficient means shall be provided for lubricating all working

parts of machine

Machine and all other parts shall be kept clean and free from accumulation of rubbish, dust. or dirt.

#### Protection of Workmen.

No load at any time (except a bona fide test load) shall exceed 500 lb. on one bay, including both live and dead load. On the outside and at each end of the platform a guard rail shall be affixed not less than 3 feet high and composed of timber of approved size, but not less than 2 inches x 1 inches, and fixed with suitable supports to the approval of the inspector. inspector.

On the outside and at each end of the platform a fender board shall be affixed, composed of timber of approved size, but not less than 4 inches x'l inch.

A wire mesh netting shall also be affixed to the platform between the guard rail and fender board to the approval of the inspector

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Compulsory Voting (Assembly Elections) Regulations 1927.
- 2. In these Regulations the "Act" means the Compulsory Voting-(Assembly Elections) Act 1926, and any reference to a form shall be a reference to a form in the schedule hereto.
- "Chief Electoral Officer" means the Chief Electoral Officer for the State of Victoria.
- 3. (1) The marked roll on which the Returning Officer (or Substitute Returning Officer) is required to indicate by a distinguishing mark, pursuant to section 4 of the Act, the names of the electors who have not recorded their votes at the election, shall be a fair copy of the roll for each subdivision of the electoral district for which the Returning Officer (or substitute) has been appointed.
- (2) The marked roll for each district shall be certified by statutory declaration in accordance with Form C.V. 1.
- (3) All the subdivision rolls for an electoral district shall together form the roll for that electoral district.
- 4. The notice which the Chief Electoral Officer is required, pursuant to section 5 of the Act, to send by post to each elector who has failed to record his vote shall be in accordance with Form C.V. 2.
- 5. The form of reply of any elector, pursuant to section 6 of the Act, shall be witnessed by an elector, or a person qualified to be an elector in the State of Victoria, and shall be in accordance with Form C.V. 3.
- 6. (1) Where the reply of the elector states a reason for his failure to record his vote which, in the opinion of the Chief Electoral Officer is not a valid and sufficient reason for that failure, the Chief Electoral Officer shall, after indorsing on the marked roll his opinion in accordance with section 6 of the Act, notify the elector, in accordance with Form C.V. 4, of his opinion, and inform him that he has the option of having the matter dealt with by the Chief Electoral Officer or by a Court of Petty Sessions.
- (2) Before sending the notice referred to in regulation 4 or that provided for by regulation 6 (1), the Chief Electoral Officer shall insert therein a date (not being less than twenty-one days after the date of the posting of the notice) before, or on which the form at the foot of the notice, duly filled up and signed by the elector and witnessed, is to be in the hands of the Chief Electoral Officer.
- (3) Any elector to whom a notification has been sent pursuant to regulation 6 (1), who desires the matter to be dealt with by the Chief Electoral Officer, and who is prepared to abide by the decision of that officer, may notify the Chief Electoral Officer in accordance with Form O.V. 5.
  - 7. Pursuant to section 8 of the Act-
    - (a) The Chief Electoral Officer may make an order in accordance with Form C.V. 6 requiring the elector to pay a sum not more than Ten shillings.
    - (b) If the sum as stated in the order of the Chief Electoral Officer is not paid within fourteen days after the date of the order, the Chief Electoral Officer may forward to a Clerk of a Court of Petty Sessions a certificate under his hand in accordance with Form C.V. 7.

- 8. The Chief Electoral Officer may, pursuant to section 8 of the Act-
  - (a) Authorize in writing, in respect of any electoral district, some person to institute proceedings for the enforcement of penalties under the said section.

(b) Such person shall, for the purposes of these Regulations, be

called a "Prosecuting Officer".

(c) Such authorization shall be in accordance with Form C.V. 8. 9. (1) In any proceedings in a Court of Petty Sessions against an elector for a contravention of section 6 of the Act, there shall be served on the defendant a notice, in accordance with Form C.V. 9, that the defendant may attend the Court and answer the charge in person, or may, at any time, not less than seven days before the date fixed for the hearing, lodge with or send by post to the Chief Electoral Officer, a statutory declaration setting out any matter which he desires to set out in answer to the charge, and unless the said Chief Electoral Officer after inquiring into the truth of the statements therein set out, so far as it is practicable for him to do so, is satisfied with the explanation given, and authorizes the withdrawal of the charge, the matter shall be proceeded with, and the said statutory declaration may thereupon be put to such use at the hearing as may be necessary and permissible for the proper determination of the offence.
