In accordance with the custom followed at Levees held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of the services and of public bodies group themselves together as far as is possible. It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress do so. On the occasion of the King's Birthday, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desirable that gentlemen attending the Levee should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting, their name, to facilitate in announcing them to His Excellency the Governor.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the legislature of Gilbert and Ellice Islands Colony (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the *Imperial Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1920* extends) for the enforcement within such

part of Maintenance Orders made by the Courts within Victoria, do now, under the powers conferred by section 12 of an Act of the Victorian Parliament intitled the *Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1925*, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare Gilbert and Ellice Islands Colony to be a reciprocating State within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act last referred to.

## WAHGUNYAH WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1927.

THE Commissioners of the Wahgunyah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Rating By-law:—

Such occupiers or owners as are supplied with water per meter shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

It is recommended for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council that the necessary works be provided and constructed by the Commission for and in respect of the supply of electricity by the Commission, in accordance with the application above recited, to date as from the 1st September, 1927.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE AND PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF SOUTH HAMILTON, KNOWN AS THE "TARRINGTON PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, Johannes Schurmann, Carl Friedrich Mibus, August Johannes Peterson, Edward Dennert, and Paul Anders, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Public Park and Recreation in the Parish of South Hamilton, known as the "Tarrington Public Park and Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges from entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 16 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 2s. may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in and around the Reserve, or pollute any water in the Reserve, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, manure, plants, or trees.

4. No person shall interfere with or injure the trees, shrubs, flowers, or other property in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles therein, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, rubbish, or any litter in the Reserve.

5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or hawk or offer for sale any goods or articles of any description, without permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, and no person shall light any fires in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management, save and except in fireplaces erected or set apart for such purpose.

6. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

7. Public betting in any part of the Reserve (including all buildings and enclosures) shall not be permitted, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from buildings or enclosures in the Reserve.

8. No person shall bring any dog into the Reserve unless held by a chain or a cord.

9. No person shall bring or drive in the Reserve any sheep, cattle, horses, goats, or any live stock without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, and any live stock trespassing thereon shall be liable to be removed.

10. Any horses ridden or driven into the Reserve shall be securely fastened or tethered at the place set apart for that purpose by the person riding or driving the same into the Reserve.

11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any firearms or other lethal weapon, and no person shall discharge any firearms or air-gun projectile therefrom in the Reserve.

12. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being therein, any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve:—

- (a) Being drunk or using profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the *Health Act 1919*, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.
3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.
4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; supplies for a.s. *Rip* and *Dredges* are to be delivered to the *Dredging Dépôt*, Footscray-road, Victoria Dock, or River Yarra wharfs, as ordered; the *Ararat*, *Beechworth*, and *Ballarat* Districts will include the *Hospitals for the Insane*, *Gaols*, and *Police Gaols* at these places; and the *Geelong* District embraces a radius of 2 miles from the Post Office; *Lara*, the *Inebriates' Institution*; *Greenvale*, the *Sanatorium*; *Rutherglen*, the *Viticultural College*; *Wahgunyah*, the *Vine Nursery*; and *Creswick*, the *School of Forestry*. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules.
5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps); jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.
6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.
7. The supplies coming under the head of *Rations and Medical Comforts* are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him.
8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
9. For the supplies coming under the head of *Rations and Medical Comforts* (except for the gaols) the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor.
10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the *Stores and Transport consignment note*, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the *Stores and Transport Department*. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the *Tender Board Offices* the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the *departmental consignment note* is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the *Tender Board* may recommend under clause 19 of these conditions.
11. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, or any like supplies suitable for the Service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.
12. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores; or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
13. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the *Tender Board*.
14. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a *Board of Survey* composed of persons named by the *Treasurer of the State* for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 11.
15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a *Board of Survey*, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 11. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.
16. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 11.
17. In the case of supplies for *Hospitals for the Insane*, it will be competent for a *Board of Survey*, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the *Treasurer of the State* for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.
18. 19. ## SHIRE OF MILDURA.

## BY-LAW No. 53.—BUILDING REGULATIONS.

## Introductory.

By-law of the Shire of Mildura, made under sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, Part V. of the 13th Schedule thereto, sections 8.20 (inclusive) of the *Local Government Act 1918*, and section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1924*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 53, for—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings, or fences, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council of the municipality for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- (e) Prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes.
- (f) Regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.
- (g) Regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys and the materials for and the mode of enclosing the same.
- (h) Regulating the erection of tents.
- (i) Appointing referees as provided by and exercising all the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1918*.
- (j) For repealing all By-laws and Regulations inconsistent therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the above-mentioned enactments and of all or any other powers thereunto then enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura order as follows:—

1. The whole of By-law No. 36 is hereby repealed.
- 1A. The whole of By-law No. 51 is hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after the day of its publication in the *Government Gazette*, as provided by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

## PART I.

## Definitions.

3. In this By-law and the Schedule thereto, save when the context is inconsistent therewith—
  - "Approved" means approved by the Council by resolution (or, in cases where the surveyor is authorized by the Council in that behalf, approved, in writing, by the surveyor).
  - "Building line" shall be the line which the surveyor shall certify to be the true boundary line between a street or road and private land abutting thereon.
  - "Council" means the Council of the municipality.
  - "Lane" and "Right-of-way" mean a street or road less than 33 feet wide.
  - "Person" includes corporation.
  - "Surveyor" means the building surveyor or acting building surveyor for the time being of the municipality, or other officer of the municipality having, for the time being, with the authority of the Council, the administration of this By-law.
  - "Street" or "road" means and includes "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road," as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 3.

## PART II.

## Fees and Permits.

4. No person shall commence, erect, build, construct, or make, or cause to be commenced, erected, built, constructed, or made, any building or erection, or any alteration or addition to any building or erection, unless and until—
  - (a) There have been submitted to the Council or the surveyor the plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection, alteration, or addition, together with particulars, in writing, in the forms Nos. 1 and 2 in the Third Schedule hereto, and together with such further particulars, in writing, as may be necessary to enable the Council or the surveyor to ascertain whether all the provisions of this By-law which are applicable to the case are being or will be complied with.
  - (b) Such plans, specifications, and particulars have been approved by the Council.
5. No person shall commence, erect, build, construct, or make, or cause to be commenced, erected, built, constructed, or made, any building or erection or tent, or any alteration or addition to any building or erection or tent, without first obtaining the written permit or licence of the Council so to do and paying to the Council in respect thereof the fee appointed by the scale set out in the First Schedule hereto.
6. All plans, specifications, and particulars approved by the Council shall be kept by the person applying for such approval at the site of the building, erection, alteration, or addition therein referred to, and shall there be available for inspection by the surveyor or other authorized officer of the Council at all reasonable times in the daytime, on demand, during the construction, erection, alteration, or addition, and for fourteen days after the completion thereof.
7. A permit or licence obtained as aforesaid shall lapse and be deemed of no effect at the expiration of six months from its issue, unless extended by resolution of the Council or unless the works covered by such permit or licence have been duly completed.
8. The surveyor, at all reasonable times in the day time, before or after the completion of any building or erection, alteration, or addition, may enter and inspect such building or erection, alteration, or addition for the purpose of ascertaining whether such of the provisions of this By-law as are applicable or any conditions upon which the observance of any such provisions may have been dispensed with are being or have been complied with.
9. No person shall hinder or obstruct the surveyor in or about such entry or inspection.

## PART III.

## General Provisions as to Buildings, &amp;c.

10. No building which is intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house and no addition to any such building shall be built, constructed, or erected so that any part thereof is within a distance of 15 feet, measured horizontally, from the building line of the street or road when such building is intended to front or will front.
  11. Except as hereinafter provided, no building with an external wall of wood which is intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition with an external wall of wood to any such building, shall be built, constructed, or erected so that any part thereof is—
    - (a) Within 4 feet, measured horizontally, from any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the rear or side of such building; or
    - (b) within a distance of 4 feet, measured horizontally, from any land not in the same possession or occupation as the land on which such building is or is to be erected.
- Provided always that any such building or addition may abut on the building line of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the rear or side thereof, or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom or from land not in the same possession or occupation, if the wall or walls which so abut on or are within such less distance from such street, road, lane, right-of-way, or land, is or are of concrete at least 6 inches in thickness, or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness, projecting in all cases at least 1 inch beyond any wooden part of the building, and at least 1 foot 6 inches through the roof covering of gutter adjoining the same.
12. The roof of every building shall be covered on the outside with incombustible covering or with material approved by the Council. No wood, shingle, or hessian shall in any case be allowed.
  13. Stables, coach-houses, garages, and outbuildings shall be subject to the same conditions as are imposed with regard to dwelling-houses by the two last preceding clauses, except that clause 11 shall not apply to them so far as it relates to distance from any lane or right-of-way.

14. A manure pit of approved capacity, and built of brick, stone, or concrete, with an impervious floor of brick, concrete, or other approved materials, must be constructed in conjunction with any stable to be erected.

15. No stable shall be erected or placed within 20 feet of any dwelling-house.

16. (a) Every dwelling-room in every building hereafter built shall be in every part not less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling. Provided that in the case of buildings of more than one story dwelling-rooms wholly or partly in the roof may be less than 10 feet in height throughout not more than two-thirds of the area.

(b) No dwelling-room shall have less floor area than 100 square feet.

(c) Every dwelling-room and every kitchen in every building intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air, with a total superficies of glass, clear of sash-frames and free of obstruction to light, equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room, and so constructed that a substantial part of the window or windows equal to at least one-twentieth of the floor area of the room can be opened for ventilation. The requirements of this sub-section may, under special circumstances, be dispensed with by the Council by resolution, if other approved provision for lighting or ventilation is made.

(d) The provisions of this clause with reference to the ventilation and lighting of dwelling-rooms and of kitchens in dwelling-houses shall extend and apply to shops, save that the windows need not be constructed to open if other approved provision for ventilation and lighting be made.

17. (a) The interior of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house shall be constructed of lath and plaster or of approved wood or fire-resisting materials.

(b) The foundations or footings of buildings other than wood shall not be less in width than 8 inches wider than the wall standing thereon, and shall not be less in depth than an average of 18 inches below the natural surface of the ground.

(c) Bricks used in any buildings shall be good, hard, and well burnt, and if old or second-hand shall be thoroughly cleaned and approved by the Council or the surveyor before being so used.

(d) All brick or stone chimneys shall be constructed of ample flue, to be well plastered or pargetted inside for the full height, and no timber of any description shall be built into the brickwork. The Council may approve of the erection of iron chimneys outside the special area referred to in the Second Schedule, but in the erection they shall be laid on base of either stone or concrete and free from all woodwork.

(e) Hearths of stone, brick, or iron of approved dimensions shall be placed in front of all fire-places.

(f) All timbers used in any buildings shall be of good, sound material, free from rot, free from large and loose knots and free from shakes, and free from any imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

(g) The following conditions shall apply as to spacings and scantlings of timber:—

(i) Stumps shall not be less than 4 inches by 4 inches red gum, jarrah, or other approved timber, spaced to 4-ft. centres, and fixed on 6-in. by 1½-in. by 12-in. sole plates.

(ii) Studs and ceiling joists shall not be less than 4 inches by 1½ inches, spaced not more than 24 inches apart, centre to centre, properly secured.

(iii) Rafters shall not be less than 4 inches by 1½ inches, spaced not more than 3 feet to centre in the case of iron roofs, and 18 inches, centre to centre, in the case of slate, tile, or other similar roofs, securely braced with purlins and collar ties.

(iv) Floor joists shall not be less than 4 inches by 2 inches, spaced 18 inches apart, centre to centre, on 4-in. by 3-in. bearers spaced 6 feet apart.

(h) Floors shall be fixed level, and in all dwellings shall be in no part less than 12 inches above the surface of the ground.

(i) The space under the ground floor of every dwelling shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

(j) Vermin plates shall be provided to all walls other than those of brick, stone, or concrete.

(k) Every wall of brick or stone shall have an approved damp-proof course or courses of asphalt, lead, or malthoid, or other approved impervious material, above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor, and, in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level, then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same material.

18. (a) No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection which shall or may, in the opinion of the Council or the surveyor, be intended to be used as a dwelling-house unless the site or curtilage of such building has a superficial area of

not less than 6,500 square feet, and has a frontage to a street of not less than 50 lineal feet, and has a depth of not less than 130 feet.

(b) Every dwelling-house shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an area of open land of not less than 2,000 square feet.

19. No shop shall be built except upon land having a frontage of not less than 15 feet to a street or road in the township of Red Cliffs, a depth of not less than 130 feet, and a total area of not less than 1,950 feet, and back or side access from a lane or right-of-way 10 feet in width at the least; nor shall any shop be built in any other portion of the shire except upon land having a frontage of not less than 16 feet 6 inches to a street or road, a depth of not less than 130 feet, and a total area of not less than 2,145 feet, and back or side access from a lane or right-of-way 10 feet in width at the least. Provided that when any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore prescribed was owned by any person prior to the coming into operation of By-law No. 36, and not part of any allotment of which a portion has been alienated or excised since the coming into operation of the said By-law No. 36, and, in the opinion of the Council, further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of the land, or where any such allotment is shown on a plan of subdivision heretofore approved by the Council, the Council, on application in writing, may, by resolution carried by an absolute majority of the whole of the members of the Council, at a meeting of which due notice has been given, permit a shop complying with the building regulations of the Shire to be erected upon such land.

20. No land upon which any dwelling-house or shop shall have been erected shall be reduced in area below the minimum required by this By-law. Provided that the Council may on application, in writing, setting forth the grounds of such application, under special circumstances, at a meeting of which due notice has been given, dispense with the requirements of this clause in respect of any particular area of land.

21. No building shall be erected in such a position that it shall lie between another building or any part thereof and a street or road unless such other building has a direct and unobstructed access to some other street or road at least 16 feet wide.

22. (a) No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any portico or verandah over the footway of any street in the municipality without first obtaining the approval of the Council; such portico or verandah shall be of a shape, figure, dimensions, and materials adopted by resolution of the Council, and the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than 8 feet 6 inches above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

(b) No opening shall be made in the roof of such portico or verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such openings be properly framed and glazed with approved glass protected underneath with a fine-mesh wire or armoured glass.

23. No fowl-house or building intended or adapted for the use of poultry shall be erected at a less distance than 25 feet from any dwelling-house or building intended or adapted to be used or used as a dwelling. No building of the description referred to in this clause shall be erected except to the rear of any dwelling-house on the same allotment.

24. Privies, Closets, &c.—

(a) Privies and closets shall be erected with the back of same abutting on a lane or right-of-way. The side of such privies or closets must not be closer than 2 feet, measured horizontally, from land not in the same possession.

(b) They shall be built of brick, stone, wood, or other approved material, and be provided with adequate pan doors and fastenings.

(c) No closet or privy shall be erected of hessian or bags or of short boards or packing-cases.

(d) No closet or privy shall be erected within 20 feet of any door or window of a building used as a shop or dwelling or intended or adapted to be so used.

(e) All urinals shall be of a design to be submitted to and approved by the Council. The floor thereof shall be constructed of cement, concrete, or other approved impervious material.

25. If, in the opinion of the Council, any building, erection, or hoarding has been allowed to fall into an unsafe or insanitary condition, or if any building, erection, or hoarding has been erected contrary to or without complying with any of the provisions of this By-law, the Council may, by notice in writing, require the owner thereof, within a reasonable time to be specified in the notice, to pull down and remove such building, erection, or hoarding, and the owner shall, within the time aforesaid, pull down and remove such building, erection, or hoarding.

26. If any building, erection, or hoarding has been erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or has not been pulled down and removed as required by or under the last preceding clause of this By-law, the Council may pull down and remove such building, erection, or hoarding, and may sell the

materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such building, erection, or hoarding, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by such owner.

27. No building or erection or alteration or addition to any building or erection shall be commenced, erected, constructed, built, or made without effective and proper provision for the removal of water and sanitary and other drainage from such building or erection and the site thereof.

28. All drains shall be of approved materials and design.

29. No hoarding shall be erected unless and until a plan of the position and construction thereof has been submitted to and approved by the Council.

**PART IV.**

*Tents.*

30. No tent shall be erected or used on the site or curtilage of any dwelling-house except for the exclusive use of members of the household of the owner or occupier of the site or curtilage upon which the tent is proposed to be erected, and no tent shall be erected except at the rear of the dwelling-house on such site or curtilage, and no person shall be permitted to erect more than one tent on one allotment.

31. No tent shall be erected within 20 feet of any street or road, nor within 10 feet from an adjoining allotment.

32. No tent shall be erected or used unless it is proved to the satisfaction of the surveyor—

- (1) That there are proper permanent and sufficient sanitary conveniences for the use of prospective occupiers of the tent and all other occupants of the property on which the tent is to be erected.
- (2) That there is an open space of at least 500 square feet for each tent within the same fence. This clause does not apply to working men's allotments, unless the same shall have been subdivided.

33. The proprietors or representatives of all circuses, merry-go-rounds, and other travelling shows shall give at least 24 hours' notice of their intention to erect a tent or other structure, and also comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) Furnish the surveyor with the approval of the owner of land upon which they intend erecting same.
- (b) Satisfy the surveyor that satisfactory arrangements have been made for living and sanitary purposes during the period of their stay.
- (c) Give guarantee, accompanied by a deposit of £1, that the land will be properly cleaned up before they leave the same.
- (d) Satisfy the engineer or other officer appointed by the Council that the seating, lighting, and construction are safe to the public. The Council may grant a permit for a stipulated time, subject to the compliance with the foregoing provisions, but may cancel the permit if any breach of the Council's By-laws or Regulations is made.

**PART V.**

*Removal of Buildings.*

34. If any building or erection within the municipal district, whether erected before or after the coming into operation of this By-law, is contrary to or does not comply with any of the requirements of this By-law, such building or erection shall not be re-erected after removal within the municipal district.

35. No person who has removed any building or erection within the municipality shall re-erect the same within the municipality except upon compliance with all the requirements of this By-law which would apply if the removed building to be re-erected were a new building to be erected.

36. Any building which shall be re-erected or commenced to be re-erected, wholly or partially, shall be subject to this By-law in all respects to the same extent as if it were a new building.

**PART VI.**

*Exemptions and Special Areas.*

37. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, fernery, greenhouse, or aviary, or to outbuildings on an area of not less than 2½ acres used for horticultural or similar purposes only, or to temporary and removable offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding six months.

38. This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Commonwealth of Australia, the State of Victoria, or the municipality.

39. No person shall erect, build, construct, or make, or cause to be erected, built, constructed, or made, any building or any addition to any building except in brick, stone, or concrete, or other approved material, on any of the allotments mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto.

**PART VII.**

*Referees.*

40. The Council shall appoint a referee, as provided by the Local Government Act 1918, to act with a referee appointed by the Governor in Council and exercise the powers provided in the said Act.

41. If any doubt, difference, or dissatisfaction in respect of any matter as to which provision is made by or under this By-law arises between any parties concerned or between any party and the surveyor for the municipality as to—

- (a) Any act done or to be done in pursuance of this By-law;
- (b) the effect of the provisions of this By-law;
- (c) the mode in which the provisions and directions of this By-law are or ought to be carried into effect;
- (d) whether the requirements implied in terms of qualification applied to sites, to soils, to materials, or to workmanship or otherwise, and denoting good, sound, fire-proof, fit, proper, or sufficient, are fulfilled in certain cases;
- (e) the expenses to be borne by the respective owners of premises parted by the same party walls or the proportions thereof;
- (f) the proportions of expense to be borne by the occupiers or by the owner of premises in respect of any works executed;
- (g) any other matter whatever—

any party concerned may require the referees, on appeal, to determine such matter upon a requisition, by notice in writing, to the Shire Secretary, setting forth either generally or otherwise the matters in respect of which the determination of the referees is required, and the referees shall, subject to the Local Government Act 1918, hear and determine the same.

**PART VIII.**

*Penalties and General.*

42. For the purposes of computing distances from any buildings, the furthest outside edge of the verandah spouting or other projection shall be taken as the point from which the measurements are to be taken.

43. No person shall erect, build, construct, or make, or cause to be erected, built, constructed, or made, any building, erection, hoarding, or tent contrary to or without complying with any of the provisions of this By-law.

44. Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful act or default, contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than £1 and not more than £20. If such offence is a continuing offence, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1 per day for each day the offence is continued.

45. In addition to any penalties, any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, or in the execution of work directed by this By-law to be executed by any person and not executed by him, shall be paid by the person committing such breach or failing to execute such work.

46. The fees appointed by the First Schedule hereto shall be deposited with the Shire Secretary on the lodgment of plans.
