Private entrée cards will admit recipients at the south door of the Spring-street entrance to Parliament House at a quarter to One p.m.; all others will enter by the north door of the Spring-street entrance at One p.m.

In accordance with the custom followed at Levees held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of the services and of public bodies group themselves together as far as is possible. It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress do so. On the occasion of the King's Birthday, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desirable that gentlemen attending the Levee should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting, their name, to facilitate in announcing them to His Excellency the Gavernor. Governor.

For the purpose of this paragrapia and paragraphs (b) and (c), "hoarding" means structures used for the exhibition of advertisements, and includes sky signs.

(a) Regulating, restricting, or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places and in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape.

(f) Regulating and controlling all advertisements, attached or fixed to or painted on any hoarding, or on any building, or on any fence, rock, cliff, or tree.

(g) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done, or to be done, by any of the officers under such By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

(h) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage on which any dwelling house or any shop, or any dwelling house and shop combined, may be erected.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts the President. Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. The following By-laws of the Shire of Heidelberg, viz.:—

#### By-Law No. 12.

A By-law of the Shire of Charlton made under sections 197 and 198 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 12, for carrying out the purposes provided for in the Thirteenth Schedule to the Act aforesaid relating to the breaking, displacing, and removing the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the Council, and the laying of temporary crossings.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Charlton order as follows:—

- 1. An authority or a permit may be given or issued by the proper officer of the Council to plumbers, builders, or other persons or firms requiring to break, displace, or remove the surface of soil of any street, road, or footway belonging to or under the control or management of the Council and situate within the boundaries of the Township of Charlton, subject to the following conditions: the following conditions :-

- (a) All new or replaced pipes for water, gas, and other services shall be laid at least eighteen (18) inches below the surface level of the road or footway.

  (b) The person requiring the permit shall deposit with the proper officer a sum of Twenty shillings, which shall be retained for a period of at least fourteen days.

  (c) After a permit has been issued to break, displace, or remove the surface of the road of any road or footway as aforesaid, the work shall be proceeded with and completed without any unnecessary delay.
- 2. The licensee shall complete to the satisfaction of the proper officer the following works :-
  - (a) The earth used for filling excavations or trenches shall in all cases be thoroughly wetted and filled m.in 6-inch layers and thoroughly rammed with a heavy

rammer.

(b) In relaying pitchers they are to be set on at least 3 inches of good sand with close joints properly flushed up, with sand and well rammed and back rammed with a 56-lb. weight pavior's rammer.

(c) All holes required in kerb shall be neatly cut to the size of the pipe or shoot to come through the joints. One-half of the opening to be in each stone.

(d) Whenever a metal roadway is disturbed the trench or excavation shall be filled as described in sub-clause (a) of clause 2 of this By-law, and afterwards covered with 6 inches of good clean metal properly spread and left clear of all obstructions.

3. A minimum fee of Two shillings and sixpence shall be made and deducted out of the deposit (even when no repairs have been found necessary) to cover the cost of inspection.

4. The following minimum charges for repairs when a trench or excavation has been left in good order to the satisfaction of the proper officer shall be made and deducted out of the deposit lodged, viz.:—

Sixpence per square foot on metalled roads Eightpence per square foot on tar-paved footpaths.

Such charges are to be in addition to the fee of Two shillings and sixpence mentioned in clause 3 hereof. In all cases where the cost of repairs exceeds the said minimum charge, a charge to be fixed by the proper officer shall be deducted out of the deposit lodged.

5. In the event of the charges for repairs being in excess of the deposit of Twenty shillings lodged, the licensee shall pay such charge within seven days from the date of demand for payment, and if not paid the same shall be recoverable as a debt due to the Council.

6. An authority or a permit for a period not exceeding thirty.

6. An authority or a permit for a period not exceeding thirty days may be issued by the proper officer to any person desiring to cart across a footway subject to the following conditions:—

The licensee shall form a temporary crossing by placing a bridge over the channel and covering the footway with boards not less than 1 inch thick, backed up with feather-edged pieces lying close on the footpath and securely bound with wire or hoop-iron so as not to prevent any obstruction to traffic, and the licensee shall not cart along the footpath.

7. At the expiration of the said period of thirty days the licensee shall pay for any necessary repairs to the footway, and the cost and expense of such repair shall be recoverable from the licensee as a debt to the Council.

8. "Proper officer" for the purpose of this By-law shall mean the engineer and/or the shire secretary for the time being of the Council of the Shire of Charlton. "Licensee" shall mean any person or firm to whom a permit or authority has been granted.

The proprietor shall cause every pan closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of night-soil and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan closet and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours gases or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

  8 Such pan shall be evilindrical in shape and formed of

Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than twenty-two gauge or other approved material or materials presenting on the inside and outside an impervious hard smooth and durable surface and those surfaces which come into contact with the night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be water-tight strongly constructed with metal bands where necessary and provided with properly attached side lifting handles.

Each such pan shall have a capacity of 11 cubic feet and shall have an internal depth of fourteen inches a diameter of not less than fourteen inches and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an air-tight lid to be affixed.

The seams of the pan shall be folded grooved and sweated with solder.

- 9. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime sawdust or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan. contents of such pan.
- 10. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.
- 11. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops water or rubbish in any pan.
- 12. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan closet or urinal shall:----

  - (a) Maintain such pan closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition and
     (b) When required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.
- 13. At least once a week and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within two and a half inches of the brim thereof the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place. in its place.
- 14. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be thoroughly cleansed.
- 15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance danger to health or offensiveness and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.
- 16. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.
- nanner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

  17. If such night-soil be deposited in trenches such trenches shall be not less than nine or more than eighteen inches in depth not exceed two feet width and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than six inches deep and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least six inches in depth of clean thoroughly broken up soil upon the night-soil and pan washings when covered in.

18. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable

material.

19. Immediately after the deposit of the night-soil and washings in any trench such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than twelve inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive

be excavated and used and little in in regular consecutive order.

20. Seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil has been deposited provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such lead.

three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such lend.

21. Every pan used for the reception or convevance of night-soil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

22. Every pan after the disposal of its contents and after being cleansed in the manner aforesaid and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by:—

(a) Immediately after washing and scrubbing with water subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60 lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam tight box or

- (b) Thorough washing and scrubbing in water then rinsing in clean water and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than one per cent. of accol, cyllin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency or. ciency or
- (c) Thorough washing and scrubbing in water and after-wards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water or
- (d) Any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

23. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council but not less than once a month.

24. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean and disinfected daily at the depot and maintained in a proper state of repair.

25. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any night-soil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

26. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury nor cause to be buried any night-soil in any yard garden or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

27. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises yards or lands at any time for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

28. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in case of continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

#### SHIRE OF NUMURKAH. BY-LAW No. 34.

A By-law of the Shire of Numurkah made under Part VII. of Division 1 of the Local Government Act 1915, and also as rules and regulations under section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1915, and numbered 34, for the regulation of street traffic.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, and by every other Act and power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Rate payers of the Shire of Numurkah order as follows:—


. Whereas it is desirable to make special regulations as to the traffic in the Townships of Numurkah, Nathalia, Picola, Strathmerton, and Wunghnu.

- 1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires-
- "Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or motor car, or traction engine.


  Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within that part of the Townships of Numurkah, Nathalia, Picola, Strathmerton, and Wunghnu, affected by this By-law habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.
- "Motor-our" means any conveyance propelled by mech-anical power, and includes a motor cycle.
- "Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

  "Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Townships of Numurkah, Nathalia, Picola, Strathmerton, and Wunghnu, other than a footway.
- "Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.
- Reserve" means any piece of a road or street enclosed or partially enclosed by a fence other than a tree

- 2. The driver of a vehicle or motor car or traction engine upon any of the streets within the said boundaries, and the rider of a horse or other animal upon any of the streets within the said boundaries, shall, except as shall be necessary for the purposes of avoiding a collision or for the justifiable cause—
  - (a) Before stopping or turning round in any street or turning from one street into another, or turning into or from any passage through any reserves, give notice of his intention so to do by holding up his whip or his hand so that the same may be seen by any person following him, and (in the case of the driver of the vehicle or motor car) upon stopping so place his vehicle or motor car as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle or motor car, he shall, upon being requested so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or motor car, or by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, remove his vehicle or motor car so as to permit such other vehicle or motor to pass, and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic, remove his vehicle or motor car so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.
  - (b) Before turning to the right or off side from one street to another, drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left hand side off the street which he is entering, and shall while so turning from one street to another so drive his vehicle, motor car, or traction engine, and so ride his horse or other animal as to pass throughout such turning and entering as aforesaid to the left of the spherical structure, colored white, embedded in the roadway at the diagonal intersection of such streets, and known as "Silent Cops" as shown in the subjoined diagram.



(a) Where there are no such spherical structures embedded in the roadway or "silent cops" as aforesaid, before turning to the right or off side from one street to another or from or into any passage through any reserves into any street, drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left hand side of the street which he is entering, and shall while so turning from one street to another drive his vehicle, motor car, or traction engine, and so ride his horse or other animal as to pass throughout such turning and entering as aforesaid to the left of the diagonal intersection of such streets, as shown on the subjoined diagram, or in the case of any passage as aforesaid drive or ride parallel to the near side (left side) of the street or passage (as the case may be) which he is entering, as shown on the subjoined diagram.



- 3. The driver of every motor car shall at all times pass to the left of the spherical structures or "silent cops" aforesaid, and shall further when approaching any intersection where such spherical structures aforesaid are embedded in the roadway, if he intends to continue his journey in a straight line, give warning of his approach by sounding the bell, horn, or other instrument of his motor car capable of giving audible and sufficient warning as aforesaid.
- 4. The driver of any vehicle or motor car shall not bring such vehicle or motor car to a standstill and shall not allow it to stand in any of the streets unless the wheels or the left or near side of such vehicle or motor car, or in the case of a motor cycle, unless the two wheels thereof are not more than 2 feet distant from the footway or from the outer edge of any water channel or gutter (if any) by the side of such footway on the left or near side of such vehicle or motor car.

5. No horse, vehicle, or motor car shall be drawn up or stopped on the outer edge of anyother horse, vehicle, or motor car already standing in any street or roadway in the Townships of Numirkah, Nathalia; Picola, Strathmerton, and Wunghus.

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of clauses 4 and 5 hereof, where there is a formed gutter between any of the said reserves fand the road, the portion of the street between such gutter and the reserve shall be deemed a parking area, and the cars may be left there unattended providing that such cars shall be left facing the direction of the traffic correctly proceeding on the part of the road nearest such gutter. For the purpose of this clause such parking areas shall be shown on and determined by a plan deposited in the office of the secretary of the said Shire, which plan is open for inspection.

7. No horse, vehicle, or motor car, shall be drawn up or stopped in the passage between any reserves.

8. Any constable or douncil officer may remove such unattended or unlawfully placed horse, vohicle, or motor car from the place where the same has been left by the person in charge, and may deposit the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and the costs incurred in so removing the said horse, vehicle, or motor car, and of placing and storing the same, may be recovered from the person in charge, in addition to any fine.

9. Any person committing an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
