Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BRICK TRADE BOARD.

NOTE.—(a) This Determination on the 22nd June, 1927, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(b) On 21st February, 1911, the powers of the Brick Trade Board were extended, so that it might fix "the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of sand, lime, or cement brickmaking."

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of brickmaking (including clay-digging)," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 22nd June, 1927, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) **TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK**—For any persons except burners, machine drivers, machine riggers, and pan or crusher attendants—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
7 a.m. ..	12 noon on Saturdays, or the day on which the half-holiday is locally observed.
7 a.m. ..	5 30 p.m. on each of the other five working days of the week.

(4) **OVERTIME**.—(a) Any employee who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours per week fixed by this Determination shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(b) Any employee (other than a burner, machine-driver, machine rigger, or pan or crusher attendant) who works outside the hours fixed in clause 3 shall be paid for such time at the rate of time and a half.

(5) **SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS**.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, and double time for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Eight Hours Day (21st April), Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day:—but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

PIECE-WORK PRICES WHICH MAY BE FIXED BY AN EMPLOYER.

(7) The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed in fire-brick making, or has a clayholeman, machine driver, machine rigger, wheeler of green bricks, or trucker, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK IN THE TOWN OF YARRAWONGA KNOWN AS "ALEXANDRA PARK."

W^E John Richard Rennie, John Charles Lowe, John Francis Cahill, William Wellesley Miller, John Bruce, Harrie Churchill Ball, and William Joseph Gorman, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Public Park in the Town of Yarrawonga known as "Alexandra Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord.
 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or vend or dispose of in the Reserve fruit, provisions, refreshments of any kind, or other articles of any description without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 8. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.
 9. No person shall enter any plots which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
 10. No person shall carry or discharge any firearms in the Reserve except for military purposes.
 11. No person shall make any holes or in any way interfere with the surface of the Reserve.
 12. Any person or society using the Reserve for fêtes or other special purposes shall hand over to the Committee of Management such sum or sums as it may determine, the whole of which shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve.
 13. The Committee of Management may impose and charge an annual fee, not exceeding Five pounds five shillings (£5 5s.) to any person, society, or club using portion of the Reserve for any purpose, and may in addition require such person, society, or club to deposit a sum, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee against damage caused during their occupancy of same.
 14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at the time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury, sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so

offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

SHIRE OF ALBERTON.

BY-LAW NO. 28.

A By-law of the Shire of Alberton made under the provisions of section 75 of the *Health Act* 1919, and numbered 28, providing for the provisions, use, and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish, and prescribing the size and shape of and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles, and the removal, cleansing, and disinfecting the same, and the use of disinfectants therein.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1919, and of any other powers thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Alberton, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall have operation within the proclaimed area of the Township of Yarram, in the Shire of Alberton, and apply to every shop, factory, office, garage, house, building, erection, and premises which may be in or have any frontage to any of the following streets or roads in the said township:—

Commercial-road from Hiho's-lane to the Tarra River, James-street from Commercial-road to the eastern boundary of the said township, Church-road from Commercial-road to Livingstone-street, and the whole of the following streets or roads:—Duke-street, Commercial-street, Montgomery-street, Dougherty-street, Campbell-street, Queen-street, Commercial-lane, Yarram-street, King-street, Gipps-street, Union-street, Nicol-street, Devon-street, Evelyn-street, Donald-street, Devonshire's-lane (being the road running northerly from Church-road and thence easterly to Commercial-road), Livingstone-street, Buckley-street, Wesley-street, Grant-street, Rodgers-street, Bland-street, Station-street, Access-road, Cyril-street, Enid-street, McLean-street, Kay-street, and Bruce-street.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place, or cause or permit to be placed, any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor shall cause, at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way, except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

14. 16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall, as far as practicable, be rendered water-tight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor, where as soon as practicable the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of fire or such other method as may be approved by the Commission, and in such manner as not to create a nuisance.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry, or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's depositing the contractor or the person or persons authorized or employed by the Council shall blind the surface with clean earth, lime, or other approved material, so as not to create any nuisance.

21. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops, or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

REGULATION No. 13.

Footpath Crossings.

A Regulation of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under section 26 of subdivision IV. of Part I of the 13th schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, by virtue of a By-law of the above-named shire, and numbered 13, fixing the width, inclination, and depression of crossings and materials of which same are to be constructed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg do hereby order and direct—

1. That Regulation No. 5 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. That crossings over or across footways shall be flush with the footways for one-third of the width of the footway, and shall then fall with a gradual inclination to 3 inches above the top of the reinforced concrete culvert, and shall be constructed of—

Type "A."—Four inches of consolidated metal, on which 2½ inches of tar or bituminous paving has been laid. Metal shall be of approved quality, free from dust or dirt, broken so that 90 per cent. shall pass through the 2½-in. ring. Tar paving to consist of bluestone screenings with dust left in, well mixed with hot distilled tar or bitumen. Paving to receive a seal coat of hot tar or bitumen fourteen days after laying. The whole to be thoroughly consolidated.

Type "B."—Six inches concrete, to consist of one part of Portland cement, two parts of clean sand, and four parts of 1½-in. approved metal, free from dirt or other impurities. To be reinforced with ½-in. m.s. bars at 9-in. centres, if required. Concrete to be laid on 2 inches of sand or ashes.

Type "C."—Square-dressed bluestone pitchers 8½ inches wide and not less than 6 inches deep, and from 8 inches to 12 inches long; to be laid in courses parallel to length of the footway, and bedded in good sand at least 3 inches deep; the whole to be well rammed and joints flushed with tarred sand.

All crossings shall be carried over channels or water tables by means of R.C. concrete culverts of approved manufacture and size.

Crossings to be graded with metal to the crown of the roadway.
