FIXING THE TIME FOR HOLDING THE FIRST SESSION OF THE TWENTY-NINTH PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieutenant-Colonel the Right Honorable Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Military Cross; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation, fix Wednesday, the sixth day of July, 1927, as the time for the commencement and holding of the First Session of the Twenty-ninth Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, at the hour of half-past Ten o'clock in the forenoon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Spring-street, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the eighteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
