Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE PASTRYCOOKS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 19th July, 1927, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a pastrycook,” has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 19th July, 1927, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

PROPORTIONATE NUMBER.
Apprentices.
 One apprentice to every two or fraction of two workers receiving not less than the minimum wage.
 An indenture of apprenticeship prescribed was approved on 15th February, 1916.
Improvers.
 One improver to the first three workers receiving not less than 10s. 3d. per week of 48 hours, and thereafter one improver to every four additional such workers.

(3) That, wherever occurring in this Determination, the expression “General Work” shall include—

(5) OVERTIME—

Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work, in excess of 48 hours in any week—

(b) Thereafter	Double time.

(6) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT—Employees who have worked for one week or longer shall give or receive one week's notice of termination of employment.

(7) SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—That double time shall be the special rate for all work (except making fermented doughs) done on Sundays before 10 p.m., and for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-mentioned holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
