## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to amend the Forests Acts and for other purposes".
- "An Act to prohibit the making of certain Charges or Deductions in connexion with the Sale of Swine".
- "An Act to enable Advances to be made on certain Terms to Cultivators of Land and for other purposes".
- "An Act relating to Municipal Endowment".
- "An Act to increase the Borrowing Powers of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works and to further amend Section Forty-seven of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1915*".
- "An Act to approve an Agreement between the Commonwealth of Australia and the States of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, and Tasmania concerning the Adjustment of the Financial Relations of the Commonwealth and the said States, and to amend certain Acts, and for other purposes".
- "An Act to further amend Section Four of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1924*".
- "An Act to authorize Councils of Municipalities to borrow Money by the Issue of Debentures for the purpose of defraying the Cost and Expenses of Works under Section Five hundred and thirty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915*".
- "An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Public Works and other purposes and to sanction the Issue and Application of such Money".
- "An Act to provide for Contributions by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works to certain Municipalities and for expenditure by the Board in connexion with the Maintenance of certain Roads, and for other purposes".
- "An Act to amend the Dried Fruits Acts".
- "An Act to validate the Appointment of William Montgomery Shannon as a Victorian Railways Commissioner and for other purposes".
- "An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Sewerage Works in Country Districts and to sanction the Issue and Application of such Money".
- "An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament".

- "An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Railways and for other purposes".
- "An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Nowingi to Millewa South".
- "An Act to authorize the Raising of Money for Works and Undertakings of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria and to sanction the Issue and Application of such Money".
- "An Act relating to the Chairman of the Railways Classification Board".
- "An Act to authorize the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board to borrow a further sum not exceeding Fifty thousand pounds".
- "An Act relating to Commission payable to Municipalities under the Country Roads Acts and to Hoardings and Advertisements on or in the vicinity of State Highways".
- "An Act relating to the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board".
- "An Act to amend the Geelong Harbor Trust Acts and for other purposes".
- "An Act to make provision for Harbor Boards for certain Ports and for other purposes".
- "An Act to amend the Law relating to Dentists and for other purposes".
- "An Act to provide for the Temporary Suspension of Payments in pursuance of certain obligations in the case of certain Persons affected by Conditions arising from Drought or Frost in the Mallee Country and certain other parts of Victoria, and for other purposes".
- "An Act to further amend the *Vehicles Act 1924* and for other purposes".
- "An Act to make provision with respect to buses operating mainly in Urban and Suburban Districts and for other purposes".
- "An Act to make provision with respect to the Construction and Maintenance of a Road between Melbourne and Footscray and Matters incidental thereto".
- "An Act to amend the Factories and Shops Acts".
- "An Act to amend the Law relating to Fees payable in the Office of the Registrar-General".

## MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

## METROPOLITAN DRAINAGE AND RIVERS ACTS.

**N**OTICE declaring that an existing drain within the Cities of Melbourne, South Melbourne, St. Kilda, and Prahran, and within the metropolis shall be a main drain, and that an area within the Cities of Melbourne, South Melbourne, St. Kilda, and Prahran, and within the metropolis shall be a watershed area (area No. 1).

Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, under the powers conferred upon it by the *Metropolitan Drainage and Rivers Act 1926* and otherwise, doth by this Notice declare:—

1. That the existing drain (or portion thereof) within the metropolis, as the same is defined and described hereunder, shall be a main drain; and
2. That the area, the outer boundaries of which are described hereunder, shall be a watershed area,

under and for the purposes of the *Metropolitan Drainage and Rivers Act 1923* as amended by the *Metropolitan Drainage and Rivers Act 1926*.

## EXISTING DRAIN ABOVE REFERRED TO.

The following is a description of the course of and a specification of the points of commencement and termination of the said existing drain, that is to say:—

(a) Commencing at the south bank of the River Yarra about 350 feet east from Clarendon-street; thence south-easterly along Hanna-street to Park-street; thence south-easterly along Roy-street to the south building line of Albert-road; thence southerly about 1,400 feet and south-easterly about 440 feet across a public park to the corner of Queen's-terrace and Arthur-street; thence easterly along Arthur-street to the east side of St. Kilda-road; thence southerly along St. Kilda-road to and terminating at the east building line of St. Kilda-road at Commercial-road, and a branch drain from the corner of Queen's-terrace and Arthur-street westerly to Albert Park Lake.

**U**NDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, No. 3041, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say) :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Camping Regulations 1927," and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations all Regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.

3. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Camp" means any place (not being a substantial edifice) where one or more persons stay for part of a day or night or for one or more days, for the purpose of preparing meals; and includes tents, shelters, huts, bivouacs, and vehicles, and the land in the immediate vicinity of same, but does not include the wayside camps, &c., of drovers, teamsters and others whose occupations necessitate such halts.

"Council" means Council of a Municipality; and "the Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Municipal District to which the provision in which the term is used applies.

"Occupier" includes all persons occupying the camp.

"Owner" of any land includes any corporation or public body under whose control such land is placed.

"Refuse" includes waste food, tins, boxes, straw, paper, rags, bags, bottles and all discarded matter used in relation to any camp.

"Sanitary Conveniences" includes urinals, water-closets, earth-closets, privies, ash-pits, ash-tubs, and all other receptacles used for the deposit of night-soil or refuse.

"Source of Water Supply" includes river, creek, stream, water-course, lake, lagoon, swamp, marsh, spring, reservoir, or well if the water therein or therefrom is or is likely to be used for drinking purposes by man or for domestic purposes, or for any purpose in connexion with the preparation, manufacture, or sale of food or in connexion with a dairy-farm or dairy.

4. No camp shall be established, occupied, or maintained on any land without the consent of the owner thereof, and subject to such conditions as he imposes. Consent of owner.

5. No person shall establish, occupy, or maintain any camp in any place where any source of water supply is liable to be polluted. Protection of water supplies.

6. The occupier of every camp shall—

- (a) maintain such camp in a clean and sanitary state;
- (b) provide sufficient sanitary conveniences in accordance with the by-laws of the Council and maintain them in such a manner as not to be offensive or likely to become offensive or injurious to health; and Sanitary maintenance.
- (c) dispose, in accordance with the by-laws of the Council, of all night-soil, refuse, offensive matter or any matter likely to become offensive or injurious to health.

Penalties.

7. The Council of every Municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters and things as are necessary for the purpose.

Council to execute Regulations.

8. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, in pursuance of the provisions of section 15 of the Cultivation Advances Act, hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. Applications by cultivators for advances under the provisions of the *Cultivation Advances Act 1927* shall be made in the form contained in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be verified by statutory declaration.

2. Such applications when duly completed shall be forwarded to the District Inspector of Closer Settlement who shall report thereon in the place provided for that purpose and forward the same to the Secretary for Lands.

3. The Secretary for Lands shall submit all applications received by him to a Board consisting of not less than three nor more than five persons appointed by the Minister, which, after due inquiry and investigation, shall report thereon to the Minister, who shall thereupon approve or refuse the same.

4. Where an application is made by a cultivator for an advance of seed, fodder, manure, building or fencing materials, or of all or some or any of them, and the same has been approved by the Minister, the cultivator shall, upon giving to the Board of Lands and Works security as hereinafter provided for the repayment of the amount of such advance and interest thereon at the rate of six per centum per annum, receive from the Secretary for Lands an order in accordance with the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto, entitling him to purchase such things as are indicated, and to the value of the sum shown therein.

5. Where an application is made for an advance for the purpose of effecting necessary improvements or for the sustenance of the cultivator and his dependants while work on fallowing or on cropping or on the said improvements is being done by him and the same has been approved by the Minister as aforesaid, the cultivator shall, upon giving security as is hereinafter provided receive payment of the amount of money which the Minister has thought fit to approve.

6. The improvements referred to in regulation 4 shall be deemed to include the erection of buildings or fences, the clearing of land, and the sinking of tanks or dams and such other improvements of a permanent character as may be from time to time decided upon by the Board referred to in regulation 3.

7. In order to secure the repayment of any advance as aforesaid and the payment of interest thereon a cultivator shall, to the necessary extent, give to the Board of Land and Works where possible a mortgage over his farm or a licence lien or lien on improvements and also a preferable lien (in the form contained in the Fourth Schedule hereto) on the crop or crops of such cultivator.

8. Where the land or improvements of a cultivator is or are subject to any mortgage or encumbrance legal or equitable no advance shall be made to a cultivator until he has obtained and forwarded to the Secretary for Lands the written consent of each mortgagee or encumbrancer of such land or improvements in the form contained in the Third Schedule thereto. Provided, however, that the regulation shall not apply to cases to which the Minister has agreed to extend the provisions of section 6 of the said Act.

9. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations any person who (whether before or after the commencement of the said Act) has entered into an agreement with the owner or occupier of a farm to cultivate the same or any part thereof on shares or under a lease and whose application for an advance has been approved shall only be required to give to the Board of Land and Works as security for the repayment thereof and the payment of interest thereon a preferable lien in the form contained in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

10. If required by the Minister a cultivator shall before any advance is made to him in pursuance of the said Act and these Regulations execute any security or securities lawfully required of him to secure not only the repayment of the amount of the said advance and the payment of interest thereon, but also the repayment of any previous advance or advances or part thereof (with interest) made to him by the Board of Land and Works in respect of seed or fodder or manure or any of them.

11. District inspectors of closer settlement shall make regular inspections of the farms of cultivators to whom advances under the provisions of the said Act have been made, and shall forthwith report to the Secretary for Lands any contravention of the said Act.

12. The addressee of any order as aforesaid may, upon receipt of the same, supply to the cultivator whose name appears therein any seed, fodder, manure, or building or fencing materials therein described to the value of the amount set forth in the body thereof.

13. Any person who has supplied to a cultivator the articles described in any such order shall, upon forwarding to the Secretary for Lands the said order supported by a statutory declaration duly completed in the form contained in the Second Schedule thereto and accompanied by the receipt of the said cultivator and a claim upon the authorized form (L2A), shall receive a remittance for the amount due.

14. If a cultivator prior to the harvesting of any crop, the subject of a registered preferable lien given in pursuance of the said Act and these Regulations, shall have effected the repayment of any advance as aforesaid and interest thereon at the rate provided, the Board of Land and Works shall cause a request to enter satisfaction on the said lien (in accordance with the form contained in the Sixth Schedule hereto) to be forwarded to the Registrar-General.
