THE CONSTITUTION ACT AMENDMENT ACTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation (hereinafter referred to as "the said Proclamation"), made in pursuance of The Constitution Act Amendment Acts on the eleventh day of January, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fourteenth day of January, 1927, the several Electoral Districts of the Legislative Assembly were divided into subdivisions as set out in the schedule to the said Proclamation with the names and boundaries specified:

And whereas by section 9 of the *Electoral Act 1923* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation divide any Electoral District into subdivisions, and that the boundaries and name of each subdivision shall be as specified by such Proclamation:

And whereas it is desirable to divide the Electoral District of Walhalla into the subdivisions as set out in the schedule to this Proclamation in lieu of the subdivisions as set out in the schedule to the said Proclamation:

Now therefore I, the Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation divide the Electoral District of Walhalla into the subdivisions as set out in the schedule hereto in lieu of the subdivisions as set out in the schedule to the said Proclamation.

SCHEDULE.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF WALHALLA.

Names and Boundaries of Subdivisions. ✓

Subdivisions of Toongabbie, Walhalla, and Warragul, as set out in the schedule to the Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th day of January, 1927.

SUBDIVISION OF TRAPALGAR. ✓ DETAILED DESCRIPTION.

Commencing on the west boundary of the Township of Darlimurla at its intersection with the railway line to Mirboo North; thence north by that boundary to the south boundary of the Parish of Narracan South, County of Buln Buln; thence

west by that boundary and north by part of the west boundary of that parish to the north-east corner of portion 98, Parish of Allambee East; thence west by a road to the south-east corner of portion 97; thence north and west by the east and north boundaries of that portion to the south-eastern boundary of portion 93; thence south-westerly by part of that boundary and the south-eastern boundaries of portions 92 and 91 to a road forming the south-western boundary of the latter portion; thence north-westerly by that road to the west corner of portion 48A; thence south-westerly by a road to the south corner of portion 33A; thence north-westerly and southerly by a road to the south-western boundary of that portion to the north corner of portion 30A; thence south-westerly by the north-western boundaries of portions 30A and 30B to the west corner of the latter portion; thence south-easterly by a road to the east corner of portion 15 and south-westerly by a road to the north corner of portion 14; thence generally south-easterly by north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of portions 14 and 13 to the Tarwin River; thence upwards by that river and south-easterly by a road to the south corner of portion 13B, Parish of Allambee East; thence south-westerly by the south-east boundary of the Parish of Allambee to a road forming the northern boundary of portion 44C; thence generally north-westerly by that road to the north-eastern boundary of portion 40; thence south-easterly by part of that boundary and south-westerly and north-westerly by the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of that portion to the north-east corner of portion 79A; thence northerly and easterly by a road to the south-east corner of portion 20B; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that portion to the south boundary of portion 22; thence easterly by that boundary to a road forming the eastern boundary of that portion; thence northerly by that road, south-easterly by Macdonald's Track and generally northerly by a road, part of which forms the eastern boundary of portion 120, Parish of Warragul, to the Moe River; thence downwards by that river to the main Melbourne to Sale Railway; thence north-westerly by that railway to the north-western boundary of portion 50B, Parish of Darnum; thence north-easterly by the north-western boundaries of portions 50B and 50 and south-easterly by a road to the south-east corner of portion 49; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that portion and westerly by a road to the south-east corner of portion 48; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that portion and westerly by a road to the south-east corner of portion 83C; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that portion, the eastern boundaries of portions 83B and 43 and a road to the south boundary of portion 88C; thence westerly, northerly, and north-westerly by a road to the west corner of portion 35A; thence north-easterly by a three-chain road to the south-west corner of portion 5, section A, Parish of Neerim East; thence northerly and easterly by the western and northern boundaries of that portion to the Red Hill Creek; thence upwards by that creek to the western boundary of portion 44; thence northerly by that boundary to a two-chain road and north-westerly by that road to the west corner of portion

44A; thence generally northerly by the western boundary of the Parish of Neerim East to the Latrobe River; thence upwards by that river to its source; thence generally easterly by the northern boundary of the County of Buln Buln to the head of the Tyers River; thence downwards by that river to its intersection with the south boundary of portion 49, Parish of Tanjil East; thence westerly by that boundary and the south boundary of portion 71A, its prolongation westerly, and a road to the south boundary of portion 60; thence generally south-westerly by the road known as Campbell's Track and forming a western boundary of the Parish of Tanjil East to the bridge known as Beck's Bridge on the Latrobe River; thence upwards by that river and the Narracan Creek to the main Melbourne to Sale Railway; thence generally south-easterly by that railway to the Morwell River; thence upwards by that river and Middle Creek to the Morwell to Mirboo North Railway; and thence generally south-westerly by that railway to the point of commencement.

SUBDIVISION OF YALLOURN.—DETAILED DESCRIPTION.

Commencing on the Latrobe River at its junction with the Tyers River; thence upwards by the Latrobe River to its junction with the Morwell River; thence upwards by the Morwell River to the main Melbourne to Sale Railway; thence north-westerly by that railway to the Narracan Creek; thence downwards by that creek and the Latrobe River to the bridge known as Beck's Bridge at the south-west corner of the Parish of Tanjil East; thence generally north-easterly by the road known as Campbell's Track, being a western boundary of the Parish of Tanjil East, to the south boundary of portion 60 of that parish; thence again north-easterly by Campbell's Track to its junction with a one-chain road from the east at the south-eastern corner of portion 60; thence easterly by that one-chain road to its intersection with the prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of portion 71A; thence easterly by that prolongation and the southern boundaries of portions 71A and 49 to the Tyers River; and thence downwards by the Tyers River to the point of commencement.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RECREATION RESERVE AT MINYIP.

WE, James Barnes, Robert Dickson Young, Arthur George Julian Naylor, Johann Gustav Gormann, and Charles William Potter, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Parish of Nullan, Township of Minyip, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
- For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1915.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each offer.
3. Offers must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge, and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 2nd December, 1928, and the second payment covering all bark stripped by 28th February, 1929, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, a valid reason.
8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.
9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.
10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.
11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.
12. No live trees, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.
13. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Forests Commission shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown, and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Chairman being made known.

- (f) Requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials within such time, or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council.
- (g) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council, by resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case.

- (l) Regulating the construction, materials, and enclosing by building or otherwise of fire-places or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam, or in any mill, brewery, bake-house, or gas works, or in any manufactory whatsoever, although a steam engine may not be used therein respectively.
- (m) Repealing the whole of By-law No. 14, and any other subsequent By-laws, or part or parts thereof inconsistent with or repugnant to this By-law.

(h) Regulating the height from the ground of porticoes, and appointing the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials of such porticoes.

(i) Prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes.

(j) Regulating the distance from any building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

(k) Regulating the height, thickness, construction or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials for and mode of enclosing the same.

(l) Regulating the construction, materials, and enclosing by building or otherwise of fire-places or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam, or in any mill, brewery, bake-house, or gas works, or in any manufactory whatsoever, although a steam engine may not be used therein respectively.
