APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RECOMMEND THAT CERTAIN TRADES BE PROCLAIMED APPRENTICESHIP TRADES.

NOTICE is hereby given, in pursuance of the provisions of section 13 (2) of the *Apprenticeship Act 1927*, that it is the intention of the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria to make a recommendation to the Minister of Labour that the trades set out hereunder be proclaimed apprenticeship trades under the said Act, viz.:—

Printing.—

- (a) Hand composition.
- (b) Hand and machine composition, and attending and adjusting slug-casting and type-casting machines.
- (c) Bookbinding and/or guillotine machine operating.
- (d) Paper ruling.
- (e) Edge gilding.
- (f) Letter-press printing.
- (g) Lithographic printing.
- (h) Process engraving.
- (i) Stereotyping and/or electrotyping.

Plumbing and gasfitting.

It is also notified that the 20th day of September, 1928, has been fixed as the date before which representations may be made to the said Commission, by or on behalf of employers or employees in any such trade, whether for or against any such trade being included in the said recommendation.

Country Roads Act 1915.

BY-LAW No. 3.—DAMAGE TO ROADS.

THE Country Roads Board, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 61 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635), and section 9 of the *Highways and Vehicles Act 1924* (No. 3379), doth hereby make the following By-law, viz.:—

1. This By-law may be cited as the "Damage to Roads By-law 1928," and shall come into operation upon the date of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. "The Board" in this By-law means the Country Roads Board.

3. No person shall by means of brakes, chains, or other devices lock the wheel of any vehicle when descending a hill upon any main road or State highway, unless there is placed at the bottom of such wheel during the time of its being locked a skid-pan, slipper, or shoe in such manner as to prevent the road from being injured by the locking of such wheel.

4. No person shall draw or trail any sledge, timber, or other heavy material upon any main road.

5. No person shall use on any main road or State highway any vehicle not having the nails on its wheels countersunk in such manner as to effectively ensure that the heads of such nails are flush with the bearing surface of the tire of the wheel.

6. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Board, use on any main road or State highway any vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, or other projections, unless the same has been submitted to an officer of the Board, and approved of by him.

7. Every person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Country Roads Board, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed the fifteenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, in the presence of —

APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO TRADE COMMITTEES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the

WHEREAS by section 39 (a) of the *Apprenticeship Act* 1927 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations with respect to providing any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission, in pursuance of section 38 (1) (a), has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations with respect to matters relating to the constitution of trade committees, the number of members thereof, the qualifications, appointment, removal, and term of office of members thereof, and the powers, duties, and procedure thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

TRADE COMMITTEES.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Trade Committees Regulations 1928."

2. In these Regulations—

"Act" means the *Apprenticeship Act* 1927.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

3. When a trade or group of trades has been proclaimed an apprenticeship trade or apprenticeship trades, a Trade Committee shall, wherever practicable, be appointed by the Commission, and shall consist of—

- (a) In the case of a single trade, not more than two representatives of employers and not more than two representatives of employees.
- (b) In the case of a group of trades, such number of members as shall be decided by the Commission, subject to the provisions of the Act.

4. The organized body or bodies of employers and the organized body or bodies of employees concerned shall be requested in writing to nominate within a period of 30 days such number of representatives as aforesaid.

5. Members of every Trade Committee shall be persons actually engaged in the apprenticeship trade or in any of the group of apprenticeship trades concerned, and shall as far as possible possess an expert knowledge of the trade which they represent: Provided that one member may be appointed as representing employers and one member as representing employees if (though not actually engaged in such trade at the time of his appointment) he has at any time prior to his appointment been engaged for five years in such trade.

6. Subject to the provisions of the next two succeeding Regulations, all members of Trade Committees shall be appointed by the Commission for a period of three years.

7. Where a vacancy occurs (otherwise than by the retirement of a member on the expiration of his term of office), the person appointed to fill the same shall be entitled to hold office during the residue of the term of the member whose office he fills and no longer, but at the expiration thereof shall be eligible for re-appointment.

8. A member of a Trade Committee shall vacate his seat—

- (a) by resignation under his own hand;
- (b) by absenting himself from three consecutive meetings without leave granted by the Commission;
- (c) on the expiration of the term for which he was appointed;
- (d) subject to the approval of the Commission, by the nomination of another member in his stead by the organized body of employers or employees by whom he was nominated;
- (e) by order of the Commission.

9. The duties of any Trade Committee shall be—

- (a) to confer with the Commission on matters relating to apprenticeship in the trade or trades concerned as provided for in the Act;
- (b) to endeavour to promote apprenticeship in apprenticeship trades up to the limit prescribed in Regulations made under the said Act for each such trade;
- (c) to keep in touch with the work of apprentices in the school by periodically visiting the school class rooms or workshops during hours of instruction;
- (d) to bring under notice of the Commission any matters concerning the equipment and staffing of technical schools for trade instructional work, which will make for the more efficient training of apprentices;
- (e) to assist the Commission as required in the preparation of information setting out the nature and possibilities of various skilled trades, the opportunities for employment therein, and the personal qualities, physical development, or peculiar skill required, to enable young persons to make an intelligent choice of occupation;
- (f) to bring under the notice of the Commission any matters conducing to increased efficiency in the training of apprentices;
- (g) subject to the Act, to exercise such powers and perform such duties as are delegated to it in writing by the Commission.

10. Each Trade Committee shall meet at such times and at such places as may from time to time be appointed by the Commission.

11. Minutes of meetings of each Trade Committee shall be kept by the Secretary to the Commission, or by such other person as the Chairman of the Committee may appoint.

12. The mode of conducting the business for which any Trade Committee is appointed may be determined by any such Trade Committee, or may be left to the decision of the Chairman.

13. The quorum for a Trade Committee shall be decided by the Commission when the number of members of such Trade Committee has been determined.

And the Honorable John Lemmon, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Act 1919 (No. 3041), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor, of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Meat Supervision Regulations 1928", and shall come into operation on publication in the Government Gazette.

2. Regulation (32) of the Meat Supervision Regulations 1923 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

In the case of any carcass or meat imported from any place outside Victoria, the person importing such carcass or meat shall take same or cause same to be taken to the Government Cool Stores, Victoria Dock, or to any other suitable place appointed by the Minister for the purpose of examination and branding, and send the certificate required by the provisions of Section 276, Health Act 1919, to the Secretary, Commission of Public Health, who shall take such action as may be necessary to have the carcass or meat examined by a meat inspector, and branded in accordance with the requirements of Schedule (3) to the Meat Supervision Regulations 1923, as amended by these Regulations.

3. Schedule (3) to the Meat Supervision Regulations 1923 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

MEAT SUPERVISION REGULATIONS 1928.

SCHEDULE (3).

Indicating Letters.

1. Every carcass and all meat, whether fresh, chilled, frozen, dried, or preserved, when examined and passed as fit for human consumption, shall, unless intended for export, be branded by or under the direction of an inspector by means of a heated appliance with a legibly seared brand which shall include letters in the form of Roman capitals not less than one-quarter of an inch in height indicating the Commission or the Municipal Council or other body under

whose authority the said carcass or meat was examined and passed. The letters indicating the several bodies under whose respective authorities the brands are applied shall be as set forth hereunder:—

Modes of Branding.

2. (a) Where the animal has been examined prior to slaughter and the carcass including the viscera has been examined after slaughter the outline of the brand shall be in the form of an interrupted circle not less than one inch and a quarter in diameter and within the circle so formed the letters shall be so arranged that the first or first two shall occupy the upper half of the circle and the rest the lower half as shown hereunder:—



(b) Where any carcass or meat has been examined at a meat inspection depot in accordance with the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*, the brand shall be in the form of a T of which the horizontal line shall be not less than one and a quarter inches long and the vertical line not less than five-eighths of an inch long. The outline of the T shall be interrupted and the letters shall be so arranged that the first or first two shall be above and the rest below the horizontal line of the T as shown hereunder:—



(c) In the case of a carcass or meat being frozen the brand shall have the outline of an interrupted triangle having the sides not less than one inch and a quarter in length and the letters shall be arranged within the triangle as shown hereunder:—



(d) In the case of any frozen or chilled or preserved carcass or meat imported into Victoria the letters of the brand shall be arranged above and below an interrupted horizontal line not less than one inch and a quarter in length as shown hereunder:—

(i) In the case of frozen meat—

(e) In the case of "Kosher" meat the brand shall be the word "Kosher" in Hebrew characters as shown hereunder:—

3. The brand shall be applied to not less than the following parts, viz.:—

- (a) In the case of beef and veal, on the upper surface of the tongue, and on each side of the carcass on the—
- (a) buttock;
 - (b) flank;
 - (c) outside of the ribs; and
 - (d) shoulder.
- (b) In the case of an unflayed carcass of veal, on each side of the carcass on the—
- (a) brisket; and
 - (b) inner surface of the flank.
- (c) In the case of mutton and lamb, on each side of the carcass on the—
- (a) shoulder; and
 - (b) leg.
- (d) In the case of pork, on each side of the carcass on the—
- (a) cheek;
 - (b) hand;
 - (c) loin; and
 - (d) leg.
- (e) In the case of parts of a carcass the brand shall be applied to such places as the meat inspector considers advisable.
- (f) In the case of "Kosher" meat the brand shall be applied to such parts as the Shouchet desires.

DECLARATION OF A DEVIATION FROM THE KORUMBURRA-WARRAGUL ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF KORUMBURRA.

BOROUGH OF CARRUM.

BY-LAW No. 16.

A By-law of the Borough of Carrum made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and every other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 16, for regulating traffic and matters necessarily incidental thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Carrum order as follows:—

1. No person shall park any vehicle, or suffer or permit the same to be parked in any of the streets, roads, or avenues, and/or such parts of such streets, roads, or avenues as are named and/or described in the first part of the schedule hereunder written, on such days as shall be named and appointed by the Council of the said borough.

2. On such days as are named and appointed by the Council as aforesaid, the Council shall place, or cause to be placed, in the said streets, roads, or avenues, or parts thereof, notices stating that the driver of any vehicle shall not park the same, or suffer or permit the same to be parked in any of such streets, roads, or avenues, or parts thereof.

3. The driver of any motor vehicle who drives the same, by way of Point Nepean-road, into the Borough of Carrum from the City of Mordialloc side of the said borough, and is travelling, or intending to travel, in the said motor vehicle as far as the Patterson Creek bridge, situate in Point Nepean-road, or to any point or place beyond or south of such bridge, shall not drive such motor vehicle along, on, or over that portion of Point Nepean-road described in the second part of the schedule hereunder written.

4. The driver of any motor vehicle who drives the same, by way of Point Nepean-road, into the Borough of Carrum from the Shire of Frankston side of the said borough, and is travelling, or intending to travel, in the said motor vehicle as far as the Mordialloc Creek bridge, situate in Point Nepean-road, or to any point or place beyond or north of such bridge, shall not drive such motor vehicle along, on, or over that portion of Point Nepean-road described in the second part of the schedule hereunder written.

5. At the hearing of any information laid under this By-law, proof that the defendant was driving a motor vehicle in a southerly direction along, on, or over that portion of Point Nepean-road described in the second part of the schedule hereunder written shall, unless the defendant satisfies the court to the contrary, constitute and be deemed sufficient proof that—

- (a) the defendant drove the said motor vehicle into the Borough of Carrum from the City of Mordialloc side of the said borough by way of Point Nepean-road;
- (b) the defendant was travelling, or intending to travel, in the said motor vehicle as far as the Patterson Creek bridge, situate in Point Nepean-road, or to a point or place beyond or south of such bridge.

6. At the hearing of any information laid under this By-law, proof that the defendant was driving a motor vehicle in a northerly direction along, on, or over that portion of Point Nepean-road described in the second part of the schedule hereunder written, shall, unless the defendant satisfies the court to the contrary, constitute and be deemed sufficient proof that—

- (a) the defendant drove the said motor vehicle into the Borough of Carrum from the Shire of Frankston side of the said borough by way of Point Nepean-road;
- (b) the defendant was travelling, or intending to travel, in the said motor vehicle as far as the Mordialloc Creek bridge, situate in Point Nepean-road, or to a point or place beyond or north of such bridge.

7. Throughout the provisions of this By-law—

“Council” shall mean the Council of the Borough of Carrum.

“Park” shall include standing or waiting for hire.

“Motor vehicle” shall include any vehicle propelled by steam, gas, oil, electricity, or any mechanical power.

8. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions of this By-law by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

9. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable upon each conviction to a penalty of not less than £10, and not more than £20.

First Part.

The whole of the street known as Roycroft-avenue, and situate at Aspendale.

Second Part.

All that portion of Point Nepean-road which is situated and lies on the eastern side of the Frankston-Melbourne Victorian Government railway line.

Health Act 1919.

SHIRE OF DONCASTER AND TEMPLESTOWE.

BY-LAW No. 4.

By-law relating to the Collection and Disposal of Night-soil.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Doncaster and Templestowe, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the main Doncaster-road, from Victoria and Wetherby roads on the eastern end to Petty's-lane on the western end, and for ten chains on the northern side, and ten chains on the southern side of such road, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.
4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or the control thereof.

"The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council, or otherwise, with a pan for the reception of night-soil, and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan, when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents, and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape, and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22-gauge, or other approved material, or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be water-tight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

Each pan shall have a capacity of 1½ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit the airtight lid to be affixed.

The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, or sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, saw-dust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place, or cause, or permit to be placed any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietors of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

- (a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair, and in a cleanly condition; and
- (b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal, and/or the contents thereof, and effect repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid, and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council, with its contents from the premises, and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled, to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the depot, and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such night-soil be disposed of in trenches, such trenches shall be not less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed 2 feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken-up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken up soil upon the night-soil and pan washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of night-soil and washings in any trench, such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by the excavation of another trench in a position parallel to, but not less than 12 inches from, the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used, and filled in a regular consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass, or any forage or cereal crops, or other form of vegetable life, as the Council may direct or approve, shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil has been deposited, provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings, or other filth, shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

21. Every pan after the disposal of its contents, and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid, and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground, shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

- (a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60 lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam-tight box or chamber; or
- (b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of acol, cyllin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or
- (c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or
- (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan shall, before it is first used, be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed, when deemed necessary, by the Council, but not less than once a month.

27. If any person, or the Council, commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall, for every breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
